**N**EARLY a decade ago, three young musicians banded together to become one of the most famous groups of singers and instrumentalists ever known in the field of Western music. They called themselves the Sons of the Pioneers, a name that was singularly appropriate for a Western group—and one that describes them collectively.

As a group, the Pioneers are credited by music critics with having collected and preserved for America the best of the songs of the old West, and have, in addition, contributed many new tunes of their own which take their place in American folk music. More than twenty per cent of the cowboy and Western music currently popular is the original work of the Pioneers, who include among their songs “Tumblin’ Tumbleweed,” “Cool Water,” “Way Out West,” “The Timber Trail,” and scores of others.

**100 Pictures Made**

Rogers left the group to sign a contract at Republic Studios, where he has become the “King of Cowboys,” and the Pioneers appear in all his films. They are the only cowboy singing group under movie contract. They have more than 100 movies to their credit.

Nolan was born in the timber country of northern Canada, but moved with his family to Tucson, Arizona, when he was a small boy. He left school to wander into Mexico where he worked on ranches and in the silver mines. On the advice of a Hollywood producer visiting in the area he decided to try his luck in the movie capital, but each of the small Western bands he joined prior to joining the Pioneers was unsuccessful. He worked at odd jobs, including being a life guard at a California beach, and a golf caddy.

# She's LULU BELLE to You

*Also One-Half of Professional-Marital Duo, the Scotty Wisemans, Mother of Two, and Cornbread Baker Par Excellence*

**W**HY OF COURSE I can make cornbread," was the amiable reply of the attractive young woman, slim and tall in her pale green gabardine suit. "But tell me, how do you make tortillas? My ten-year-old daughter wants to learn."

It was hard to believe that this smartly dressed and very gracious young woman was not only the gum-chewing, calico-clad charmer, Lulu Belle of the "National Barn Dance," but also the young matron, Mrs. Scott Wiseman, who prefers to do her

own cooking and supervises first-hand the upbringing of her two youngsters, Linda Lou and Steven, ten and five years old respectively.

But the effervescence typical of Lulu Belle is evident whether she's cutting capers before the "Barn Dance" microphone or cakes in the Wiseman kitchen, for she's equally at home both places. "I do a little of everything," says Lulu Belle, "but nothing really well. I'm enrolled in a sewing class now. If I can knit a suit (she's knitted three), why can't I sew one?"

Any story that involves the life of Lulu Belle, also includes the story of

"Skyland Scotty" Wiseman, for theirs is not only a professional duo, famed for their songs and capers on the "National Barn Dance", but a matrimonial duo — Mr. and Mrs. Scott Wiseman — as well.

Unlike many couples whose popularity slides when they marry while portraying sweetheart roles, their marriage in 1933 added new fans and the fan mail bag grew bigger every week. With the arrival of their daughter, Linda Lou, in 1936, new fan mail poured in—not only for Lulu Belle and Scotty, but for Linda Lou as well. When Steven was added to the family in 1941, the Wiseman mail was again augmented, not only with letters but gifts. Now each youngster has a sizeable scrapbook of his own even though neither has ever been heard on the air.

The flame-haired charmer of the "National Barn Dance" had done no professional work when her father decided that Lulu Belle could sing the old mountain songs her mother had taught her as well as any singer on the air. He wangled an audition, and Lulu Belle at nineteen proved that he was right.

### Both North Carolinians

Lulu Belle was born (as Myrtle Cooper) the day before Christmas in Boone, N. C.—but when she was sixteen, the family moved to Evanston on the outskirts of Chicago. Scotty, too, was born in North Carolina, in Ingalls where his father farmed and taught the country school. As a student at Fairmont Teachers College (W. Va.) he sang the old songs of the hills over a local radio station.

As program director of a small station following his graduation, he performed about as many functions

What you can't tell by looking at his picture is that he has a keen insight into people's characters, which helps him bring to listeners the feeling that maybe this old world isn't such a bad place to be after all.

# Tempus Fidgets . . . But Not With Henry

**T**HERE'S a time for some things;  
There's a time for all things.

A time for great things;  
And a time for small things."

Cervantes said it, and occasionally one or two of us might think about it. But one wise mother has taken verse to heart, and converted rhyme into reason. She's Mrs. Blair, parent of fourteen-year-old Henry, who plays "Little Beaver" on Don Lee network's three-times-weekly "Red Ryder" adventures.

When Henry first added radio to his already young-but-busy life, he had so much to do that his folks sat down with him for a frank family conference. "Now, you want to keep up with this and that; and at the same time, you want to have time to play."

Determined to have Henry grow up like any normal boy, in spite of his rather unusual curriculum, the Blairs decided to work out a thorough "improve your time" schedule. From the minute he gets up in the morning to the end of his crowded day, every inch of Henry's "24" has been

"budgeted" with an eagle eye to personal advancement. It goes something like this, during a regular school day . . . (in vacation Henry relaxes, but not much!):

7:00 a.m.—Henry wakes up . . . and gets up. ("Possuming" in bed is strictly "against the rules"). He says "hello" to Hilo Cat and his variety of dogs, including his cocker, Richelleu. As soon as he slams the back door his pinto pony, Denver Papoose, whinnies from the stables, so he hurries out to hitch on his bareback riding pants, and jog through the La Tuna Canyon, where the Blairs have their home. His morning ride over, it's about

7:30 a.m.—and his mother has his breakfast all ready. He takes a shower, and gets dressed for school; then eats an unhurried morning meal. At 8:30 he gets together his books, and his mother drives him down to school. During the half-hour ride, Henry peruses the day's script, and goes over any pressing study assignments.

From 9 to 3, he's in school, where he's particularly good in his music studies, and "keeping up" with the rest.

3:30 p.m. finds Henry at home, or if he has a program, at the studio. When he hasn't a show, he uses his time at home like an energetic

mathematician. He practices an hour on his music; then in the time before dinner, joins the neighborhood youngsters at play, reads his favorite comic books, or rides his horse again. While at KHJ on "Red Ryder" he makes use of the hour-and-a-half break in rehearsal by playing handball in the back lot, reading, or otherwise constructively relaxing.

9:00 or 9:30 at the latest is bedtime. Henry has a special bunkhouse which his folks have just fixed up for him, as well as bunks in the tack room near Denver Papoose, so

He not only has a wide experience in both radio and the theater, but throughout that experience he has been a magnet for "the darndest things happen!"

For instance, Zeke has always been a terrific admirer of Fred Allen. For ten years, while he was in New York with Zeke Manners and his Gang, Zeke wanted to be on the Allen show. Finally the big chance came. And Zeke had to turn it down—because he was flying to the coast the preceding day!

Only Zeke could have made the sensational trip across continent that

he and his "gang" took in 1934. Deciding to crack East-coast radio, six of them piled into a Model A Ford and took off. They pooled all their money and put it in a separate bag. Somewhere between Tucson and San Bernardino, the bag was lost—nobody knew where. Rather than turn back and try to find it, they decided to keep going and make their way by their wits. Needing the money badly, they agreed and went off to scratch up what they could that night. They found a large building which looked like a hotel with about 200 people gathered around it. Setting up their instruments, they began to play. They played for nearly an hour; nothing happened, so they played a little louder. Finally a man came out from the building.

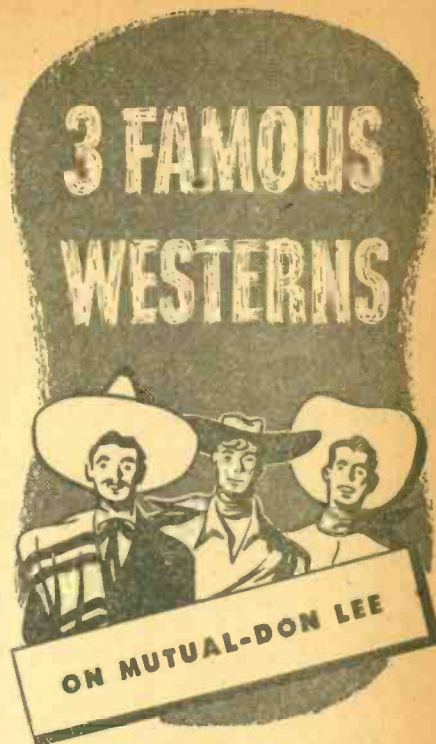

presented Gene Autry, Roy Acuff, Ernest Tubb, Roy Rogers, Ozie Waters, Ezra, Tex Ritter, Wesley Tuttle, Merle Travis, Dick Thomas, Curt Barrett, Smiley Burnette, T. Texas Tyler, Paul Westmoreland and others in songs of the sagebrush.

Spade's unselfishness in paying for radio time which airs the music of bands competitive to him is certainly proof that the spirit of friendly neighborliness of the Old West is still alive.

### Old Cowhand

A product of the West himself, and a former cowhand, Spade Cooley is steeped in the music and tradition of the wide open spaces.

An Oklahoman who is part Cherokee Indian and can trace his ancestry to the famed Geronimo, Cooley punched cows on his dad's ranch when not playing for barn dances.

His musical talent was further developed at the Chemawa Indian School in Oregon, where he became a cellist of concert ability, only to return to his first love, the fiddle.

Knowing the classics as he does, he certainly gives the lie to those who class all Western musicians as musically untutored "ear" players.

Spade's own band is a musical aggregation which numbers men who have played with top "name" bands in its personnel, and the "fiddles" used by his boys actually are rare violins. Spade, himself, owns a Stradivarius.

The Western swing king's most recent movie stint was at Universal, where he was signed for a second musical short by Producer Will Cowan, after the fan response to his first short for U was so terrific. Ironically, Spade and the boys were filmed on a set representing a picnic grounds.

"It wasn't exactly a picnic," Spade grinned ruefully. "At the time, we were recording for Columbia, and playing nights at Santa Monica Ballroom, when we weren't working on the Universal lot. We didn't get much rest."

From the show Spade put on at the ballroom, the dancers would never know he and his boys had been working literally day and night.

blue-eyed, good-looking singer has been with WSM, he and his Texas Troubadours have traveled an

average of 3,500 miles per week on personal appearance tours.

His recordings for Decca have sold more records than any other artist except Bing Crosby. During 1944, his biggest record year, his records sold around 1,500,000 copies. He is the only folk artist who has a five-year contract with Decca with a guaranteed salary. The Tubb recording of his own composition, "Walking the Floor Over You," issued three or four years ago, has sold a million copies.

The last time he counted it, his fan mail was at the 7,700 mark.

From his eighty-odd published songs and his songbooks, he gets about \$65,000 a year. Record royalties bring him about \$20,000, radio programs another \$15,000, and personal appearances about \$50,000.

Like most every other true folk singer, who picks up songs by listening to the oldtimers, Tubb can't read a note of music and refuses to learn. "I figure I would sing automatically," he says, adding, "Crosby doesn't read music either, you know." When he composes a new tune, he hires someone else to translate it into musical notes. He sings most songs by memory and estimates that he knows more than 2,000.

Ernest describes himself as an "inspirational" songwriter; he has spent as much as two hours at a hitch for several weeks on a tune, but his big hits have been turned out in half an hour. According to Tubb, he gets his inspiration for his songs from "people I meet; things they tell me." They tell him their troubles and he sets them to music. "There's Gonna Be Some Changes Made Around Her," for example. He has been to school a total of fifteen months in his life, has never been known to refuse a friend who was hard up for cash.

"Could you boys be a little more quiet?" he said. "There's a funeral going on inside."

But of all the experiences Zeke has had, the saddest was connected with laughs. Within twenty-four hours after he hit New York following that epochal trip cross-country, he was signed on the Rudy Vallee show.

"But we were too early for that time," Zeke recalls. "Radio then was a very formal thing. While our act was on, the audience laughed, and the producers didn't know what to do about it. They finally rang down a glass curtain so that although the audience could still see what was happening, their laughter wouldn't be heard over the air. That was enough for us. We left and went over to another station—because America's fifth freedom is Freedom of Laughs."

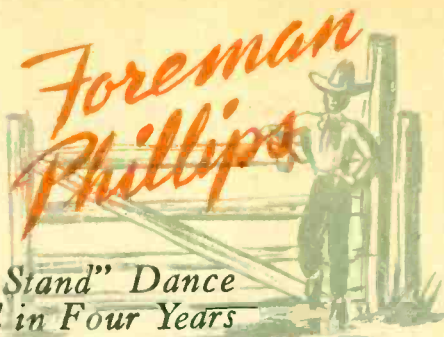

ORIGINATOR of what are nationally recognized as the biggest Western dances in America, Bert A. (Foreman) Phillips is himself a real Westerner. And the Foreman attributes the success of his popular dances to the fact that he

understands and is constantly guided by the entertainment likes and dislikes of the genuinely "folksy" kind of people who likewise have their origin on the prairies, farms and ranches of the West and Middle West.

In four short years, the Foreman Phillips County Barn Dances have mushroomed from what originally was planned as a single "one night stand" to four permanent locations, with from one to all of them playing a regular schedule of seven nights a week.

As a matter of fact, Foreman Phillips disclaims full credit for originating the County Barn Dance idea, explaining that he organized the first of these dances purely and simply in answer to the demands of radio listeners to his famous "Western Hit Parade".

Born in Texas, schooled in Texas and Oklahoma, Foreman Phillips was raised on Western and country music where the true American songs of prairie, range and mountain had their simple, sincere origin. And when later Foreman entered the radio broadcasting business, he was able to realize a dream of many years.

### Develops Idea

That dream was the origination of a radio program made up entirely of the best recorded Western and hill-billy music. Almost overnight, the program known as "The Merry-Go-Roundup" soared to the top of the list in popularity among Southern California radio listeners. Then Phillips developed the idea of a weekly broadcast of the week's most popular Western recordings.

This was the start of the now nationally famous "Western Hit Parade" which recently celebrated its 275th consecutive weekly broadcast. This outstanding program, the only Western Hit Parade on radio, is

## A Realist's Realist

Producer J. C. Lewis' Most Frequently Used Rehearsal Words: "I Don't Understand"

DON'T UNDERSTAND. He falls in a well twenty feet deep and his leg isn't broken."  
"I don't understand. When, what time of day is it that we're meeting these bandits—day or night?"

"I don't understand. Is Cisco on horseback now, or did his horse run away and leave him standing there?"

When J. C. Lewis, Jr., producer of "The Cisco Kid", prefaces a statement with "I don't understand", the cast can start looking for changes in the script. And "I don't understand" is the most frequently used remark in rehearsal. For J. C. is a perfectionist, and his slogan is "If I don't

understand it, how can I expect the audience to?"

There are two types of producers in Hollywood radio — the impressionist variety, and the realist. J. C. is a realist's realist. When the script calls for Cisco to ride up to a house, dismount, walk to the door, and enter, J. C. is not satisfied with the ordinary run of sound effects which cover such an incident. In a "Cisco Kid" script, the sound effects men—there are three on the half-hour show—ride the horse up, slow him down, squeak leather as Cisco jumps off, thud when he hits the ground, walk him up to the door over gravel, knock him over wood up the steps, knock

on the door, footsteps fade in to answer it, the door opens, closes, Cisco walks in, pulls up a chair, and sits down. No wonder "Cisco Kid's" sound men call themselves the busiest in radio!

### Humor Like Wine

When J. C. doesn't hear all of the sound effects he thinks should be there, he has his own way of quietly letting the men know it. "Make him comfortable, fellows," he'll say. "Pull up a chair for him. I hate to see a man have to stand up while he's talking."

That humor of J.C.'s—dry as wine and twice as sparkling — is what

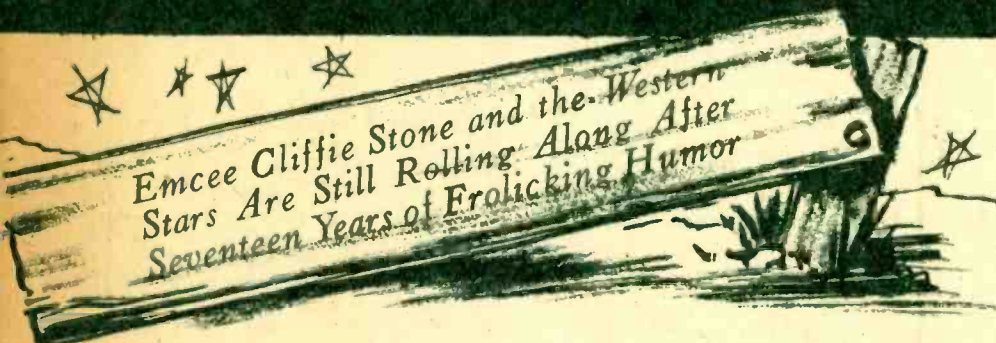

HEN Fehr Gardner conceived the original Western Stars program seventeen years ago, it is doubtful if he realized at that time the huge entertainment snowball he was setting in motion. # "King of Western Swing"

*Ex-Cowhand Spade Cooley, Now Owner Of a Stradivarius, Wants to Play Western Music with a Popular Touch, Popular Music with a Western Touch*

**I**T'S AN amusing fact that Spade Cooley, who gives so generously of "Spade Cooley Time" on KFVD, in the interests of Western music, has little time for Spade Cooley, personally. He's that busy.

The Cooley career, with radio, record and reel chores, personal appearances, and a ballroom stint at Santa Monica Ballroom crowding Spade's schedule, is going "great six-guns." It's a seven-days-a-week job that doesn't leave much Spade Cooley time for the "King of Western Swing."

"Spade Cooley Time" (the radio program, that is) is a seven-days-a-week affair, too. Featuring on record and transcription the top stars in the field of Western music, it is sponsored by Spade as his contribution to the elevation of Western folk music to its rightful place in Americana. The show, since its recent inception, has received thousands of letters praising Cooley's gesture of good-will. "What we are trying to do with the show," he explained, "is to bring Western music to the point of popularity where it will become the kind of American institution it deserves to be. We're out to prove to the listening public that Western folk music makes an important contribution to American music and is

worthy of recognition by everyone."

"I think we are succeeding, too," Spade grinned. "You may be surprised to know that there are Western music fans who don't know a surcingle from a branding iron."

To people who associate Western style music only with square dances and hoe-downs, the Cooley band, with its sax and brass sections, comes as a pleasurable surprise on first hearing of the newly-styled Western swing.

Spade explains the new departure in Western band instrumentation as exemplified by his orchestra by saying:

"Western music was ready for a new touch, and my boys and I were happy to take the lead in providing it. The many fine letters our fans have written, tell us we are on the right track in giving them what they want."

Cooley wants it distinctly understood that he is not abandoning Western swing, but only modernizing it in keeping with public taste. His new band slogan aptly describes what he is trying to do musically. That is—play "Western music with a popular touch, and popular music with a Western touch."

On wax, "Spade Cooley Time" has

**D**UDE MARTIN'S Radio Round-Up" crew, who have long been popular with young and old alike in Northern California and the Bay area, are an extremely versatile outfit. The seven entertainers play twenty-seven different musical in-

No strangers to radio, Dude Martin and his gang have been broadcasting over various stations in the San Francisco Bay area since 1932. Their last broadcast over KGO-ABC (then the Blue) was a barn dance program, aired on the Pacific Coast network, which was terminated in December, 1944, with Dude's impending entrance into military service.

Dude's own recording company, which he organized in 1942, sold more than 60,000 records on the Pacific Coast, a figure which was held at that point only because material shortages made it impossible to meet the demand. Martin's folios of Western songs have sold more than 100,000 copies.

Tall, handsome, with a mellow baritone voice, Tex puts a sob in a sad ballad and a kiss in a love ballad. He sings with a freedom of feeling that makes him a hit with gals and guys, old and young alike. He also plays a snappy bass fiddle and a good rhythm guitar.

He was born in Ramsey, Ill., August 23, 1917, attended Prairie Mound Grade and Bingham High, stands six feet tall, weighs 175 pounds, has brown hair, gray eyes and an engaging smile.

Tex took his first music lessons from his brother, starting when he was in knee pants. He made his professional debut when he was thirteen on Station WJBL, Decatur, Illinois, and has been going strong ever since, playing in thirty of the United States and throughout Canada and Mexico with such groups as the Colorado Hillbillies, the Rhythm Rangers, the Reno Racketeers and many others.

Since his father was a fiddler—and a good one—Tex leans heavily to folk type music, both instrumental and vocal, and was a definite asset to Spade Cooley's Western Dance Gang when he joined that group at the time of its formation.

heard each Friday at 10:00 p.m. over KRKD, Los Angeles, and KXLA, Pasadena, with a rebroadcast over KRKD the following Monday noon, and the program has regular listeners in every state in the Union, in Canada, Alaska and the Hawaiian Islands. During the war and since, an appreciable amount of fan mail has come from members of the armed forces in the Pacific.

In all, with the "Western Hit Parade" and other record programs, from live "remotes" from the four County Barn Dances, Foreman Phillips programs more than twenty-five hours of broadcasting each week, and the entire schedule is composed strictly of Western and country music.

The dances, incidentally, feature only nationally famous Western and country music recording dance bands. Thousands are in attendance every week at the four Southern California locations where Ted Daffan and his Texans, Dolf Hofner and his San Antonians, Happy Perryman and his Happy-Go-Lucky Mountaineers, and Curly Williams and his Georgia Peach Pickers play the kind of music everyone loves. The latter group was recently imported from Nashville, Tennessee, where for five years they were starred on NBC's "Grand Ole Opry".

### Into Radio

To get back to Foreman Phillips

himself, he lived in Texas and Oklahoma until the first World War, when he enlisted in the Navy and was sent to Yerba Buena Island in San Francisco Bay. Liking what he saw on the West Coast, he entered the radio broadcasting business at the end of the war. In 1926 he was associated with KFVB in Hollywood, then joined the sales force of KFRC, San Francisco, and KHJ, Los Angeles, later becoming sales manager of the Don Lee Network and the Columbia Broadcasting System on the West Coast.

During his association with the networks he developed and sold for coast-to-coast broadcasts, programs featuring such now famous talent as the Sons of the Pioneers, Roy Rogers, Cliff ("Ukelele Ike") Edwards, and Jack Ross and the Ranch Boys, helping many such individuals and groups to get their start on radio.

Later, Foreman Phillips established his own advertising agency, and it was during this time that he finally established his own Western programs.

His home in Compton, California—thirty minutes from downtown Los Angeles—reflects this side of his personality in its unpretentious ranch-type architecture — in the alfalfa fields which surround it in moderate acreage, in the old Southern rose garden and in the great Texas barbecue pit, which, under the shade of a giant pepper tree is the scene of most of the entertaining, both business and social, which Foreman and Mrs. Phillips, wife and business partner, do at their home.

knits the "Cisco Kid" cast together. Actors have termed him the fastest, most unpredictable humorist they've ever worked with—and no wonder, for J. C.'s humor is not the patterned gags so often heard around radio stations. It's personal humor — sparked in an instant for an instant and then forgotten.

### Whoa or Go

One actress, for some unexplainable reason, always says "Stop" when she's called upon to rein in her horse. J. C., who always calls all of the cast by their script names, will patiently remind her, "Now, Mary Anne, I believe that a horse understands the whoa better than stop."

J. C. has other favorite expressions besides "I don't understand." "That mean anything?" is his way of asking if a certain sound effect is right. "What is that?" always refers to a line that adds nothing to the script. But the stock phrase — the phrase which pegs the program — is "I don't understand."

Larry Hays talked him out of one of those "I don't understands" once. The bandit was shooting at Cisco,

but Cisco had replaced bullets with blanks.

"I don't understand," said J. C. "When did he change those bullets?"

Larry argued that the "Cisco Kid" was fast as light, and that it was all right to leave a few things to the imagination. J. C. shook his head over it, but didn't change it. That night he asked his wife about the show.

"It was fine, dear," replied Peggie Hays, "but I don't understand—when did he change that bullet?"

From his baseball broadcasts, the six-foot-tall Texan branched out into radio writing, producing and acting, and appeared on the air from Waco, Dallas, Houston, Oklahoma City and on other southwestern stations. In 1940, he moved to New York to join a network production staff and handled such programs as the Bob Ripley broadcasts, "Gangbusters," and "Swap Nite."

### Poet, Bronco Rider

In the summer of 1943, Clark came to Hollywood to work out a radio show of his own called "The Law West of the Pecos," and since then his air activities have been many and varied. In addition, he engages in such widely different extracurricular pursuits as writing poetry and riding bucking broncos at rodeos.

Cottonseed is married to his childhood sweetheart and has one child, a twelve-year-old daughter.

Clark teamed with his program cohort, Foy Willing, to pen "Texas Blues," a hit Western tune, while Willing has authored the "Riders'" theme, "Drifting Along the Prairie" and the top-selling "Rose of Santa Fe."

Willing also does his own arranging for the trio (Al Sloey and Nick Rhineheart are the other two-thirds), and expertly fingers the electric guitar.

Foy is married to a Texas miss named Mickey Mitchell and they have six-year-old twins, Foy Glenn and Joyce Ann.

Says blond, six-footer Willing (these Westerners come tall!): "A good act, good business, and good will are the three rules for success." The success of his "Riders of the Purple Sage" seems to prove that he practices what he preaches!

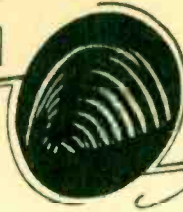
