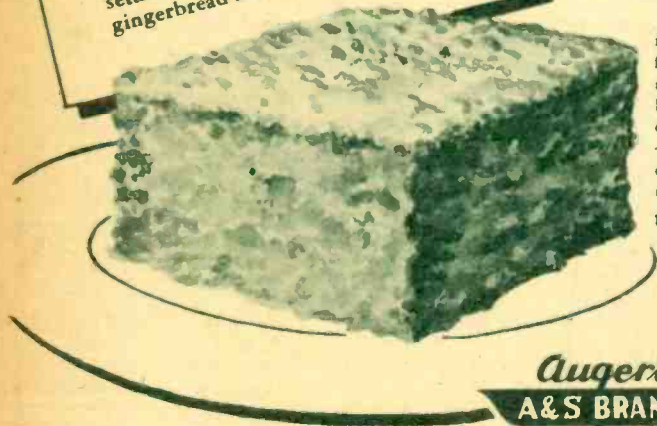

To "Archie," what goes in Brooklyn goes everywhere. To paraphrase Bob

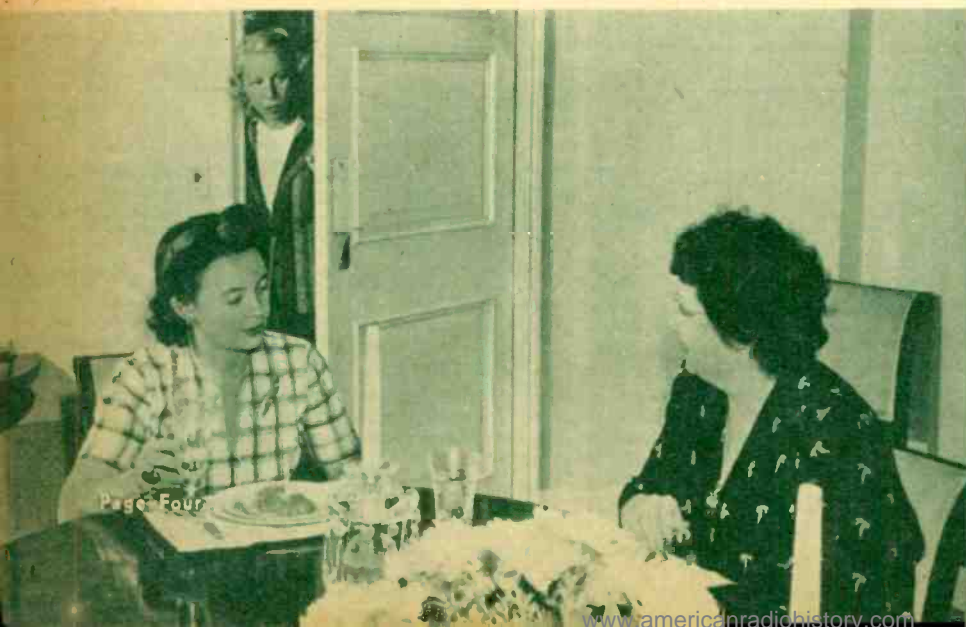
Hope, "Archie" never left Brooklyn.

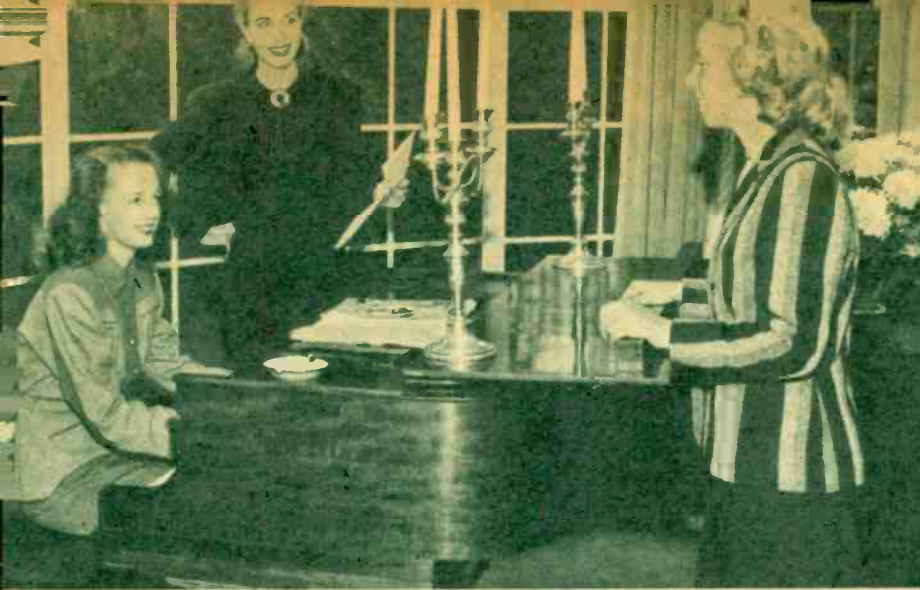

Phone Addict

Talk about people who live their roles in real life, consider the matter of the telephone, that all-important instrument in the "Duffy's Tavern" scripts. "Archie" is addicted to the telephone. He's a great one to buy a yacht, rent an office, or hire a Hallowe'en costume over the phone. He likes to begin calling people the minute he opens his eyes in the morning. Evvy, his secretary, sits perched on the edge of his bed, phone in hand, waiting for him to wake up and start dialing. And he encourages our son to do likewise. Instead of the usual toys, Ed Jr. has a specially-made pint-sized phone dangling from his playpen.

He talks into it constantly, convinced from watching his Dad that it's the smart thing to do.

Little Ed is a chip off the old block in every respect except his accent. Strictly a California product, he spurns Brooklynesse, preferring a brogue more like Hungarian for himself. A Hollywood affectation, no doubt.

I always thought a man's haircut was a simple thing, until "Archie" took Ed Jr. for his first trim. Then I learned that a man and his barber are thicker than thieves and almost as close as a gal and her hairdresser. The boys passed by a dozen good barbers in Bel-Air and Beverly Hills and made a bee-line for "Archie's" tonsorial parlor in Hollywood. A man's first haircut is a production and they weren't taking any chances of offending "Archie's"

She's a Radio Fan, Too!

"Lolly" Parsons' Love of Movies and the People in Them Is Well Known, But With Her Recent Hospitalization, She Found Herself a Real Radio Fan, With Daily Pet Programs

Sunday, 6:15 p.m.

WE WERE chatting with the famous Hollywood chatterer in the comfortable pastel-toned den of her beautiful Beverly Hills home, which, incidentally, was undergoing some strenuous renovation in some rooms at the rear that were out of our sight but not out of hearing.

It was a little unlike the mental picture we had conjured of the bustling ABC air commentator-columnist-writer. Somehow, we had always imagined that any meeting with Louella O. Parsons would find her at a desk surrounded by typewriters, telephones, secretaries and an interesting assortment of stars with lapsful of hot scoops to deliver to this gracious-mannered, sweet-voiced woman whose name is synonymous with the latest intimate Hollywood news items.

But our visit with this fabulous figure of filmland was conducted in a restful atmosphere of charm and leisure with not one jangle of a telephone bell to disturb us.

Nevertheless, seated opposite us in a warm velvet houserobe of the same jet black as her loose-waved, short-bobbed hair, Miss Parsons assured us that such an interlude of inactivity was rare for her. One look at her schedule, of course, certainly confirmed this, for in spite of her critical period of hospitalization

some weeks ago, she continues to turn out regularly an amazing volume of top Hollywood copy in her position as International News Service Motion Picture Editor, Cosmopolitan film reviewer, fan magazine interviewer and radio reporter.

"You know," she told us, "I actually never have a day off. My husband is furious with me!"

Throughout the week, with the aid of a woman stationed in New York, a local "leg man," Ruth Waterbury, who prepares her air interviews, and other assistants, Miss Parsons meets her newspaper and magazine deadlines and at the same time keeps an ear out for good air copy that can be safely kept until broadcast time without risking the loss of a "scoop." "Somehow, I manage at least one good scoop for every broadcast," she pointed out. "I got the Laraine Day divorce, which was a tremendous surprise, and the news of Jeanne Crain's baby even though Jeanne was still denying it—to name just a few."

Frank Session

Miss Parsons explained that at the end of the week, the day before her broadcast, a "round table" session is held at which she and her staff go over the copy assembled for the forthcoming fifteen-minute broadcast and choose what they consider is the cream of the material. "We often disagree as to what should stay and what should go," she af-

firmed, "but there is no 'Yes-man-ing' from anyone. Everybody speaks his piece."

On the subject of speaking her piece at the microphone, the film chatterer confessed to an extreme inferiority complex about her voice. "I have tried everything. I used to attempt to lower my voice way down here," she demonstrated, with a strained low register, "and I have studied with numerous coaches—but finally, I decided to use my own voice and be concerned only with what I am saying. If people don't like my delivery, well, I just figure that it is the voice God gave me and that's that. I'm much less nervous about my broadcasting now than I used to be."

A hard worker, "Lolly" is usually the first one in her office every morning, turning out copy even before her secretary gets on the job. Many of her best stories are born of phone calls and visits from the stars themselves, who regard Miss Parsons as an intimate friend.

Names Fine Stars

Asked to name a handful of Hollywood's great whom she regards with particular personal admiration for their qualitative traits of character, Miss Parsons pursed her lips thoughtfully and answered:

"Gregory Peck, who has the great charm of making you feel that there is nothing else in the world that he

The Life of Bendix

*If You Think "Riley" Has Ups
And Downs You Should Hark to
Bill Bendix's Own Life Story*

BILL BENDIX is "Riley" to radio listeners nowadays, but back in the late twenties Bill was a radio performer of an entirely different ilk. He played a comedy German character on a fifteen-minute-a-week show on station WNEW, Newark, with a script which he and a friend wrote and acted.

"We lasted for thirteen weeks," said Bendix, "and we didn't get a dime out of it—just experience. It did make me want to follow radio someday, though."

Bill's first ambition, however, was in an entirely different line—he wanted to be a professional baseball player. It takes just one look at Bill to realize that he probably would have made a good one. Radio listeners are lucky that his parents changed his mind for him. His first job was as bat boy for the New York

Giants. Bill was overjoyed when the team asked him to go south with them for spring training, but his folks refused to let him go.

At sixteen, Bill entered amateur theatricals with the Henry Street Settlement House Players.

"My family was all in show business and they all knew that getting started wasn't easy. So they encouraged me to take something steady. I got a job with a wholesale grocery firm and worked up to managing a store," recalled Bendix.

Depressed, Too

Bill ceased being serious about the stage at this point. He married his childhood sweetheart and became the father of Lorraine, who is now a pretty teen-ager with acting ambitions of her own.

Here Bill pulled an amazing switch on the usual hard times story. The depression was rough on actors, but it was just as rough on grocers. Bill's store closed down and the little Bendix family knew what it was to be broke and hungry. Bill's courageous wife, Tess, got a job in a toothpaste company.

Bill landed on the W.P.A. Federal Theater Project. "I got ninety-four dollars a month and ironically enough, a part in a play, "It Can't Happen Here." Yes, in the black depths of the depression Bill was discovered!

The producer-star of Saroyan's "Time of Your Life" saw Bill in the W.P.A. project play and offered him the role of the tough cop in the Broadway production he was casting. "I guess he figured I looked big enough and 'copper' enough," Bill says now, with his modest opinion of himself. The play was a hit and so was Bill's acting. He toured from coast to coast and got himself discovered again—this time by the movies. Bill was back in New York when he received his Hollywood bid.

"Tess rushed around, got my one and only good suit of clothes all fixed up, ironed my two good shirts and gathered up all my relatives to see me off," smiled Bill. Bendix left New York by plane in a blaze of glory—and then was air-sick all the way across the country!

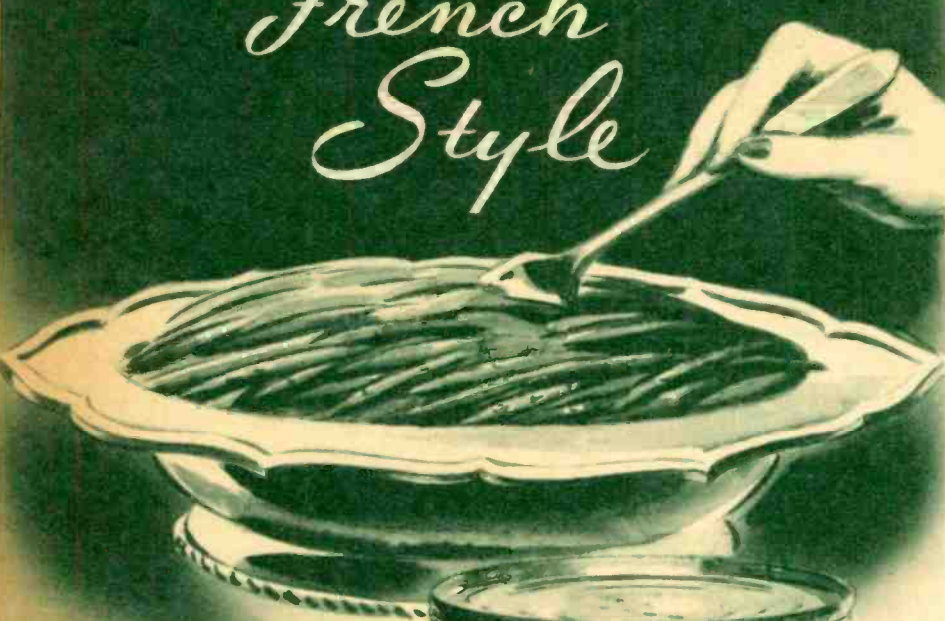
He clicked in his first screen role and since then has been a success in a variety of parts—out-and-out

We attempt to be of service, but often do not have the exact information desired on hand, and what with deadlines breathing menacingly down our necks, the time we can devote to your queries is limited.

A service custom-built for radio fans, however, has now been established. Originated by Ruth Arnold and called "Information, If You Please", it offers to service all callers with whatever information about radio, its personalities and programs that is desired. The number to call is HO 6196.

New Year's Eve

It was a happy New Year as far as the traditional traffic dangers of the holiday season were concerned. After the tragic Christmas Eve death toll in Los Angeles, it was heartening to see the quiet streets on New Year's Eve. Early in the evening, at every corner we turned, we saw traffic cops—and thanked our lucky stars they were there.

Special mention should be made, we think, of KFI's and KECA's timely service to celebrating citizens. KFI cancelled all commercial station breaks for the twenty-hour period from 6:00 a.m. on December 31st to the following 2:00 a.m. on January 1st, sounding traffic warnings to those in cars. (Know how much that costs in cancelled spot announcements? \$2,500.)

KECA carried traffic safety announcements and a box score on traffic accidents in addition to many longer appeals made on various programs. They covered a twenty-four hour period, starting at 5:45 p.m. on December 31st.

We hope this service will be resumed next year on December 24th, and we'll feel more like looking forward to Christmas Eve knowing our friends and families will be safe.

In fact, we'd like to see radio, through such spot announcements and shows like "Design for Death", keep up a year round campaign to cut Los Angeles traffic mortalities.

Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

We'd Hire Novak!

Honestly, we'd have sworn that the tough private eye, complete with wild

metaphors and wilder women, was finally becoming old hat on the air—yes, and in the magazines and movies, too. Then along came ABC's "Pat Novak for Hire" and we began to think we'd just never heard this type of show done really well before.

Jack Webb, who plays "Pat", has an intimate, cynical voice. A large part of the mood depends upon Webb's narration and he never lets it down.

It's in the script department that the show really shines, however. The dialogue is rich in original colloquialisms. They come so thick and fast that the listener is kept as much on his toes as "Novak", himself. Scripter Dick Breen is so adept at this bright writing that a good part of it is just tossed away in an off-hand manner.

A friend of ours, who happens to be a great "Novak" fan, told us the other day that he had no idea what the previous night's show was about. "All I know", he explained, "is that

the dialogue is so swell, I don't care what the plot is."

The only other character who figures in each episode is "Jocko", an amiable and philosophical drunk whose unorthodox views would be considered highly quotable by the columnists if the show were a widely known one.

So far, "Pat Novak for Hire" is a regional program. The locale and flavor is San Francisco water-front. We only hope that when the program goes national (as it undoubtedly should) the San Francisco mood remains undisturbed. We're not worried about them changing "Pat" — if they tried that he'd slap their ears down!

"Meet the Press"

If you think that radio still shies away from the outspoken statement, the pointed retort and the positive conviction, you haven't been listening to Mutual's hard-hitting show, "Meet the Press".

Each week, a different group of newsmen is invited to shoot questions at an individual who has been making front page news. Whether or not you sympathize with the political leanings of the subject will determine for whom you root—the reporters or the interviewee. You may be surprised that occasionally someone whom you formerly disliked heartily will put up such an honest account of himself in the face of rapid-fire questioning that you'll change your feeling—at least insofar as the personality of the subject is concerned. A spurious character shows itself up as readily.

To show you that "Meet the Press" sidesteps no issues, two of the subjects in the past year have been Gerhardt Eisler, German Communist accused of being one of the international leaders of the Communist Party, and Senator Bilbo, who is accused of just being Bilbo.

The program is produced by Martha Rountree, former columnist and press agent. Newsmen should be thankful for their chance to ask the questions that are really on their minds on Miss Rountree's program. And radio listeners should be grateful that there is a program that gives them credit for intelligence to draw their own conclusions minus the pro and anti ideas of a professional editorialist.

Radio In Review

In the spirit of the New Year was that broadcast on CBS' "Doctor Christian" program on New Year's Day. Written by Mrs. Douglas G. Stockwell, a Connecticut housewife, one of the winners in the show's annual script competition, it undoubtedly reflected the thoughts and concern of many serious-minded Americans who regard the precarious international situation with well-founded trepidation.

Titled "Diagnosis" and featuring Pedro de Cordoba as "Mr. World," it was based on a fanciful incident in which a man with a big round scarred face swathed in bandages came to "Dr. Christian" for a consultation about the pain and worry being caused him by his children.

Provocative passages from the script included the following dialogue:

DR. CHRISTIAN: Tell me, where did you get all those scars?

MR. WORLD: A few were the work of wind and weather when I was extremely young and tender. A few show where animals fought me and left their imprints.

DR. CHRISTIAN: And the rest?

MR. WORLD: (SADLY) The ones that went deep and hurt and mattered, my children gave me, when they've fought and killed one another. These are the scars their wounds have made.

DR. CHRISTIAN: I can see that your children make you sad. Have you fear of more wounds and scars?

MR. WORLD: Would it were only that! From now on, Dr. Christian, their little wars will no longer just batter and scare me. They've a brand-new toy that can actually blow themselves—and me—up!

DR. CHRISTIAN: Fireworks aren't very safe in the hands of children. Why do you give them such dangerous play-things?

MR. WORLD: I didn't give them any such toy. . . Dr. Christian, a parent can never tell what a child is going to use for a toy!

Another excerpt . . .

DR. CHRISTIAN: Do you mean that each child has his own house, with his own roof over it?

MR. WORLD: And his own fence around it. Some of them higher than others. I suppose it's been the best solution, really. Each child in his own house. My children, you see, get along so poorly. They even think differently.

DR. CHRISTIAN: About what?

MR. WORLD: About everything. What they have. What to do with it. What their neighbors have that would be nice to take from them. How hard they should work. What they should work for. I often wonder how they can all be my children . . . the children of the world . . . with such differing points of view.

DR. CHRISTIAN: Don't they ever go through each other's gates?

MR. WORLD: Not often, unless it's to pilfer.

DR. CHRISTIAN: Never to play . . . or to talk things over?

MR. WORLD: Rarely. And when they do, they sometimes make matters worse.

DR. CHRISTIAN: Does none of them really like his brother?

MR. WORLD: Oh, yes; they have spells of liking. Just as they have spells of fighting. For instance, Sam, the one in that biggest house on the right-hand continent, lately waves often to Johnny, there on the left. In fact, he's usually tossing him something to eat . . . He'll give all his bread away, even if he goes hungry.

DR. CHRISTIAN: He looks fat enough to me. I wouldn't worry about him.

MR. WORLD: I don't for that reason. But

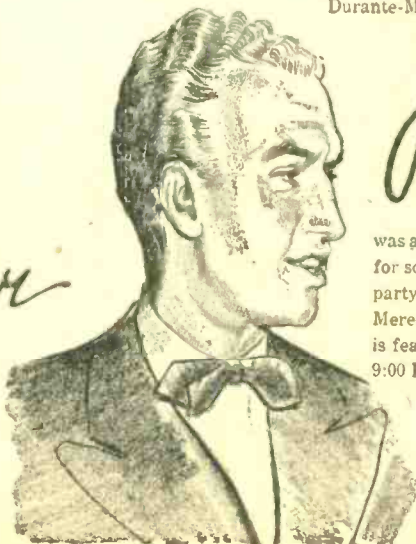

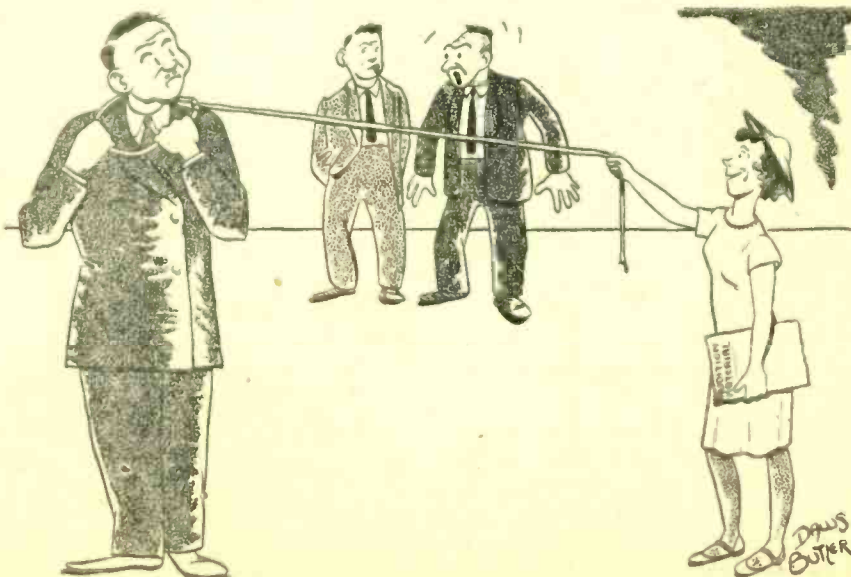
Try It

KMPC's Don York Owes the Start of His Air Career to His Ability at Rumba-ing

YOU wouldn't think that being an expert rumba dancer could pave the way to a career as a news commentator! But that's the amazing story behind Don York and his "Headline Celebrities" program on KMPC.

Don for many years spent his winters in Havana and Miami, and learned the rumba from his Cuban friends. Havana is a mecca for cosmopolites who gather there each winter to enjoy the balmy weather and dancing to the unexcelled native orchestras. Through his rumba dancing, Don found himself a member of this unique social circle.

One of these Havana vacationists was a French radio commentator. He noticed Don's voice and suggested that Don should start a radio program in the United States. The Frenchman also proffered the idea that he and other Havana vacationists whom Don knew could send him exclusive items about famous people in their home countries.

So Don flew back to nearby Miami, and convinced executives of the CBS station there that here was something new in radio. Under the sponsorship of an insurance company, "Headline Celebrities" for two years

was the most-talked-of program in the Florida-Cuba area.

Don's fan mail was especially fascinating because Miami's geographic position enabled the program to be heard in the picturesque Caribbean area. Letters came in bearing the postmarks of Jamaica, Haiti, the Dominican Republic, Martinique, and other far-off lands. Most of these came from British or American residents, but a few were from English-speaking natives who often asked why Don York didn't say something about the celebrities of their little countries.

In Different Languages

After the program had been on six months, several Cuban friends of Don's suggested that scripts of the program be read over a station in Havana, so that they wouldn't have to struggle to understand the English version. Arrangements were made with Havana's 25,000 watt station, CMQ, and Don's scripts were airmailed there and read by a Cuban newscaster. This made "Headline Celebrities" the only gossip program ever to be broadcast in two countries in different languages.

When the busy winter season subsided, Don went to New York and handled motion picture narrations for a leading commercial film com-

Teen-Age Problems Are Dramatized, Then Discussed by Teen-Agers On Programs Devoted to New Generation

FOR the "bobby-sox" generation who've been the butt of so much head-wagging over their so-called hysteria and swoon-fever, Mutual's new half-hour show "It's Up to Youth" offers some convincing proof that these same teen-agers have not only a more serious side, but a capable one at that!

Object of the show, sponsored by Seventeen Magazine, is to air young people's opinions on issues and problems of their own. To do this, "It's Up to Youth" presents a fifteen-minute drama on some topic timely for teeners, then follows with fifteen minutes of panel discussion of the problem presented in the drama. The panel of four high school students is moderated by Bill Slater, a really regular guy, and opinions and suggestions—though spontaneous—are plentiful.

Take the case of Anne Whitman, popular sixteen-year-old. There's "something different" about Anne that has her friends more and more confused as time passes. Anne has always been very mysterious about

Woman of Music---

Betty Rhodes



FEW OF US realize how important one song hit can be to a star. Not many years ago, songstress Betty Rhodes was going great guns. Then, somehow, she seemed to slip out of the limelight. Along came a song called "Rumors Are Flying" (Number One on the Hit Parade for many weeks). Betty recorded it for Victor. Within a few weeks, three motion picture studios and several top agencies were dickering for her talent.

Not only that, but in Hollywood, where Betty lives, the leading disc jockeys jumped on the bandwagon and voted her the most popular girl singer of the month. They certified this honor by asking her to appear for interviews on their programs.

Over the past few weeks, Betty has appeared as guest of honor on the programs of Bill Anson, KFWB; Alex Cooper, KXLA; Peter Potter, KFWB; Bill Leyden, KMPC; Gene Norman, KFWB; Ira Cook, KFAC, and Ted Lenz, KGFJ.

Betty is no novice in the song business. She is known as "The First Lady of Television."

"It all began a few years ago," she says, "when I became acquainted with Harry R. Lubcke, whose experimental television studios of W6XAO were located in the same building where I did my network broadcasts. One day Mr. Lubcke asked me to sing before the television camera as part of an experiment he was doing."

Little Bestowed

Owners of television sets bombarded the studio by phone and letter informing that they wanted to see and hear the telegenic Betty

again and again. And so it was that Lubcke, the pioneer telecaster of the Southland, gave Betty the title.

Many fans think that Betty was born in Hollywood. She comes from the city of Rockford, Ill. But her family moved to the coast when she was very young.

"You see, I wanted to be a singer, and mother thought that I should have all the trimmings that go with a singing career. So I attended film studio schools, learned to walk with a book balanced on my head, negotiate a circular staircase with ease and poise, balance a demi-tasse cup and the hundreds of other patience-trying lessons that teach coordination."

Of course she learned to sing, too! She developed a smooth, distinct style of ballad vocalizing so much her very own that millions of radio listeners from coast to coast know the soft, well-modulated timbre of the Rhodes voice.

Her first song hit, Betty says, was a tune called "I Said No," which also, incidentally, greatly aided the King Sisters in their career.

Betty made her first picture when she was fourteen, a Paramount film called "Forgotten Faces," starring Herbert Marshall. This led her to "Fleet's In," "Priorities on Parade," "Mountain Moonlight," "Stage Door,"

"Life of the Party," "Along the Rio Grande" and many others.

Air Credits

Meanwhile, she appeared on the air with Eddie Cantor, Bob Hope, Fred-Allen, Dick Haymes and many other headline programs and was signed for records by RCA-Victor. She recently was singing star on NBC's "Meet Me at Parky's."

A creamy complexion, blue eyes, blonde hair and trim figure match the wholesome, fresh charm of her personality. In a town overstocked with ambitious girls who depend on flip sophistication and winsome naivete, she is an outstanding example of a young American career girl who is as natural and genuine as the people of Rockford, where she was born.

When asked how she keeps that fresh beauty in Hollywood, where singing stars work so hard, Betty replied: "I have a very simple philosophy. It is this: Do one thing well and be well paid for it. Many girls grab every contract in sight, with the result that even youngsters get that tired look by forcing themselves at top speed from 6 a. m. to midnight."

With the success of Betty's "Rumors Are Flying," RCA-Victor plans to exploit many of her forthcoming records and it has been predicted

her parents—none of the kids have ever met them, and she always changes the subject when they ask why. At home, meanwhile, Anne is becoming more and more unhappy and her parents are pretty worried. It's soon clear that she's ashamed of her home and her family because their scale of living is a lot more modest than that of her more affluent classmates. Afraid to ask friends to her home, she has begun to feel guilty about continually accepting their invitations, and when her parents find out and suggest giving a party for her, Anne bursts into tears. What to do?

Understand Problem

Well, now it's the panel's turn. Moderator Bill Slater calls for suggestions and he doesn't have to wait long. In this case there's a sharp division between the male contingent—who say Anne's been building friendships on a false basis and ought to do something about it right away—and the girls, who think that such explanations have to be made more gradually. After further tossing of ideas, the score is three to one for the gradual approach but unanimous in sympathy with Anne's understanding parents and in agreement on the need for definite action of some kind to heal this unhealthy situation—one which may easily exist in thousands of listening communities.

Louise Gray has a different kind of problem. Pretty, as well as outstanding in her studies—a not-too-usual combination—she's faced with the choice of a full four-year university scholarship or a tempting immediate job that offers "super" opportunities for advancement. It's not an easy question, but it's probably the kind that bothers plenty of high school seniors every spring. And under Bill Slater's encouragement some helpful and surprising ideas are aired in high schoolers' own voices.

Then there's always the case of the "impossible hero," especially timely during football season. Jerry has gained the adoration of his whole community for a series of winning plays on the local eleven. But the situation has gotten out of hand and his girl friend is one of the few who realizes it. When Jerry begins to slide through classes on his athletic reputation, and his head accordingly swells hopelessly beyond hat-size, there's a situation that the panel agrees shouldn't be allowed to exist anywhere.

The sponsor of "It's Up to Youth" believes that the teen-age group can think for itself and can solve its own problems if given a fair chance. "It's Up to Youth" offers that chance and by all indications seems to be proving its point!

In a recent broadcast, the ever-persistent housing problem was the

basis for a teen-ager's unhappy situation. She, too, was beginning to feel ashamed of asking friends to her home, now filled with mother, father, brother, and newly-acquired sister-in-law, all living in each other's laps during the apartment shortage. But in this case the discussion showed that most of the trouble was in Lynn's own head, and a simple family meeting and airing of gripes proved to be all that was needed for bringing about mutual adjustment to an unavoidable situation.

Often the show—which is now traveling from city to city in order to give teen-agers all over the country a chance to voice their opinions—switches back to New York at the end of the discussion period to present, in dramatized form, Seventeen's own suggestion for solution of the evening's problem. So far, the ideas of panel and magazine have been pretty consistent.

Youth's serious and intelligent responses to the challenge presented each week suggest at least two things: (1) the program is talking their language, and also (2) "the chillun" have a few things to say that adults—especially the many who have reason to know they're living in a "teen age"—can profit by hearing.

pany, as well as doing free-lance radio work.

Don York was born in a city never associated with the rumba—Boston, Massachusetts. Tennis was his earliest enthusiasm and he chose the University of Miami as his college because of the excellent Florida tennis weather.

During summer vacations, Don toured the country competing in tennis tournaments, and played many of the country's stars, including Don Budge, Frank Kovacs, Bobby Riggs, and several of Cuba's Davis Cup players.

His radio career was interrupted when he joined the U. S. Navy during the war. York was given the assignment of narrating the Seabee radio show, which was heard not only in the U. S., but at all navy and army bases in Europe, Asia, and the Pacific.

Another interesting assignment was as narrator on a series of Red Cross nurse-recruiting shows on the ABC network.

Home Touch

Next came orders to go overseas for the Armed Forces Radio Service as chief newscaster for the AFRS station on Guam. One of Don's innovations on his 7:00 p.m. newscast at Guam was especially popular with his homesick audience. He would begin each broadcast by saying, "If you hail from *Detroit, Michigan*, this is the news your friends and family are hearing over *station*

WJR." Each night, he mentioned a different city and station, and the men got in the habit of hoping to hear their home town mentioned.

York was transferred to the states because of illness and after a session at the Long Beach Naval Hospital he became a producer for AFRS in Hollywood. Here he handled the "Words with Music" program, on which famous movie stars read their favorite poetry. The transcriptions were played for our occupation forces in Germany and Japan.

Among the stars who read their poetry were Donald Crisp, Jimmy Dunn, Signe Hasso, Ellen Drew, and many others.

Don was discharged from the service this summer. Besides his "Headline Celebrities" program for Maurice Bah Furs, he is preparing another show which will reach the air soon.

Besides appearing on the air, Don York is assistant manager of the west coast office of Peerless Film and Radio Productions, a commercial film and radio program company.

"Do you still keep up the rumba?" we asked him.

"Whenever I'm tired, I find it's the most relaxing hobby in the world," he said. "You can worry while dancing a fox trot or a waltz. But I defy anyone to worry while dancing a fast rumba!"

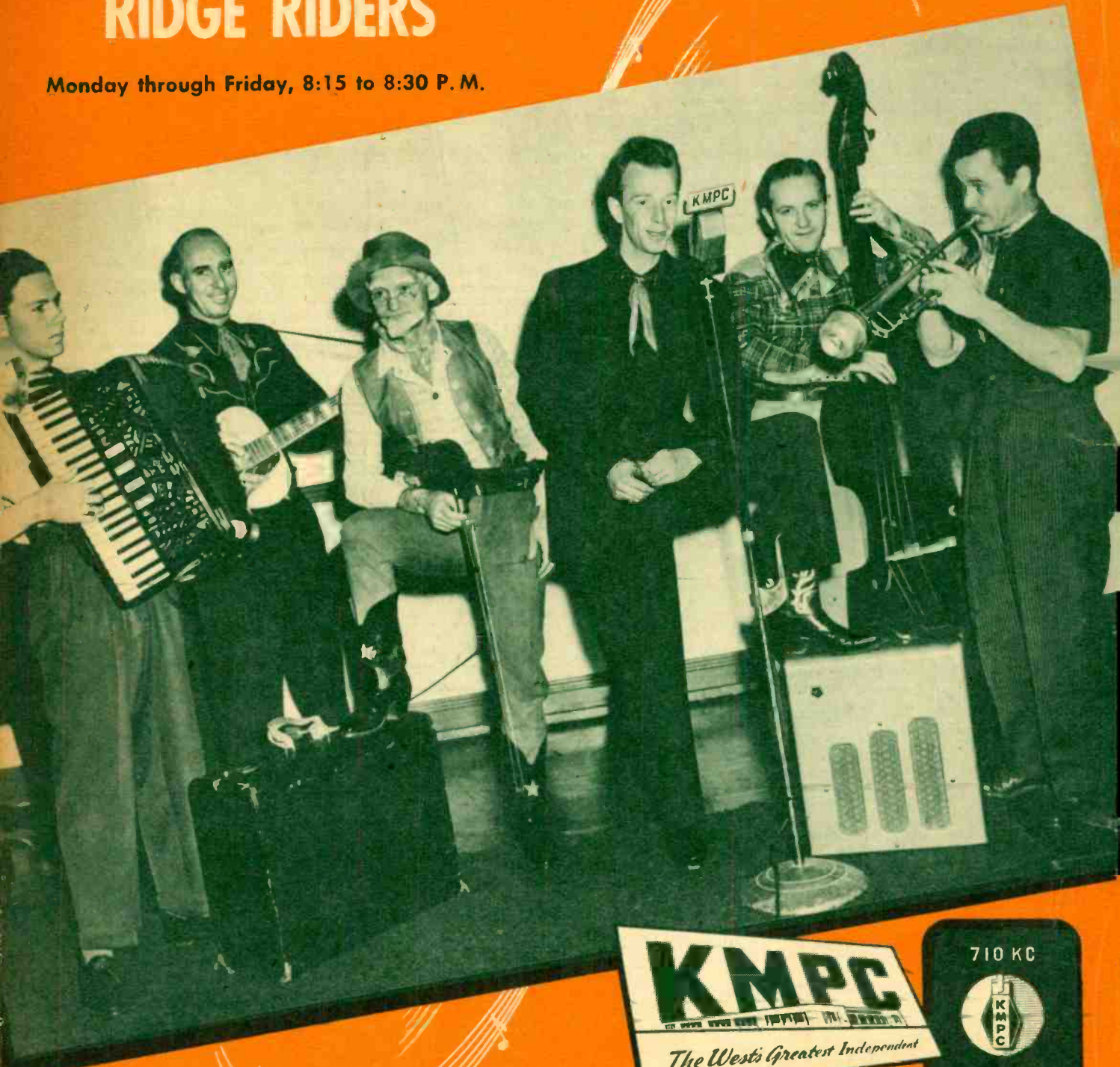
