# Comedy with a Young Approach

*Still in Their Twenties, Sweeney and March Are Unafraid to Experiment in Radio Comedy, Come Up with Weekly Happy Half-Hour of Fun*

**T**HERE ARE two things that Bob Sweeney and Hal March like to talk about, even more than their CBS airshow—Sweeney, his wife, and March, his new car. We discovered this in the first five minutes of our recent interview chat with the two comedians.

Sweeney started talking about living in the Valley and March gave us a glance that indicated he knew what was coming. "Boy!" he enthused while Sweeney was stopping to take a breath. "Wait till you get a look at my new car!"

"Yes," his partner's train of thought was uninterrupted. "My wife and I love the Valley. We go bicycling almost every day, and my wife . . ."

"Personally, I prefer cars to bicycles," remarked March soberly. "Now, you take my new . . ."

"Hal hasn't talked about anything but his new car since he got it," commented Sweeney dryly, condescending finally to acknowledge his partner's presence.

"The same goes for Sweeney and his wife," grinned March. "But then, she's a swell girl. In fact, I went with her before she married Bob. That always happens to me. Every girl I go with gets married—to somebody else."

"Hal's got a keen new car, though—tell 'em about your new car, Hal," smiled Sweeney. "No kidding—it's a beauty."

You get the idea. Bob Sweeney and Hal March are a couple of compatible guys who share a firm friendship, a durable sense of humor, and an adventurous approach to radio comedy.

### Adventurous

"We're young enough—and okay, say maybe foolish enough—not to be afraid of trying something new,"

they declared earnestly. "Sometimes it turns out to be good, sometimes not. We like to give it a try."

Both Bob Sweeney and Hal March are young men in their late twenties, as are Frank Fox, Jack Crutcher, and William Davenport, the three writers who work with the boys on the preparation of their weekly broadcast scripts.

Sweeney and March's chief concern during our chat was that mention be made of all the people to whom they're grateful for being allowed to do what they want to do on the air each week. They expressed their gratitude for CBS' lenient attitude and for producer Manny Mannheim's guiding hand. "He gives us all the leeway we need to carry out our own ideas," they explained, "yet at the same time tempers them with his own invaluable experience and knowledge of radio. When Manny tells us 'That won't go,' we take it out of the script and have a better show."

The Sweeney-March show has undergone a number of format changes since its inception, but the boys feel that their present program form is working out the most satisfactorily. It presents them as a pair of radio comics who live in a trailer and work in the smallest office space existent at the Columbia Square broadcasting studios. "It doesn't even have any windows," elaborated Bob and Hal.

Hal is established in their scripts as "the big guy," slightly brainier than his chum, Bob, who is very childish in his approach to everything. Bob's favorite reading matter is "Outdoor Boy," which leads the twosome to many outlandish ether adventures from wild animal

hunts in the jungle to exploratory trips to the South Pole in search of ice cubes.

The patter which results is fast and funny, particularly as delivered in the manner of Sweeney and March, whose skillful sense of timing and character interpretation can make what might look like an unfunny line on paper absolutely hilarious on the air.

The boys are expertly aided each week by their broadcast crew that includes director Sterling Tracy, musician Lud Gluskin with orchestra and the "Sweeney and March Choral Society," soundmen Carl Schaele and Frank Rittenberg, engineer Pat Walsh, a handful of top-

flight Afra-ites, announcer Bob Le-  
mond, and the aforementioned pro-  
ducer Mannheim and trio of scrip-  
t-ers.

#### Right Way to Gripe

Extremely happy and enthusiastic about their present show spot on CBS, Sweeney and March look back with indulgent good humor on the lean years just past. They remember jubilantly the H-Hour, D-Day that their present successful invasion into radio comedy was initially launched.

It was one afternoon when they were both playing minor roles on Mutual's "Mainliner," and in between rehearsals, were sitting out in front of the studio lamenting to each

other about how they ought to be on the air with their own show. Suddenly, behind them, a voice called, "Okay, boys, if you want to be on the air and you're good—c'mon in."

Fortunately for them, they had been airing their troubles in front of the open window of Mutual's head of sales, Sid Gaynor, and the interview with him which resulted started them out on a Hollywood-to-New York-to-Hollywood cycle of activity that has culminated in their current CBS series.

"So if you have troubles," advise Hal and Bob, "sit on a curb and shout about them — but make sure that you're sitting in front of an executive's open window!"

# History is Entertainment

*"Cavalcade of America" Mixes Equal Parts of Entertainment, Education. Producer Jack Zoller Tells Us the Thought Behind the Show and Some of the Amazing Results It Has Attained*

**C**AVALCADE of America" has been on the air for twelve years dispensing its educational dramas and its philosophy of hope. In that time listeners have come to expect the best from the show. The demand for scripts to be

used by the Board of Education is greater than that requested from any other show. "People have come to expect authenticity from 'Cavalcade,'" producer Jack Zoller told us. "We can't get by with the slightest slip—and after all, we're only human", he added. Historians are retained to check the authenticity of each script and a huge reference library is em-

ployed. By the time a script reaches the air it is as authentic as time and thought can make it.

None but original scripts are used on the program and some of these are bought from unknown writers. In the search for good originals, a badly written script with a basically fine idea is not discarded. "Cavalcade's" rewrite man works on it until it is up to the standard of the show. Unlike most dramatic programs, "Cavalcade's" stories must be worked backwards. An idea or a personage is presented as a possibility for dramatization, and the search for the elements of a good story in the background is conducted. Finally a star must be fitted to the script. If, as often happens, there are relatives of the subject still alive, a copy of the script is sent to them for their approval.

It has been a policy of the program not to deal with personages who are still alive, though stories built around contemporary ideas and happenings may bring in the names of many living people.

## Medicine Intrigues

Most interest, according to Zoller, is generated by the medical subjects dramatized. The story of the man who invented the bronchoscope, in which the fact was stressed that a baby should never be allowed to play with anything smaller than its fist, resulted in many letters from mothers who wrote in appreciation of this warning. A little girl who had listened to a broadcast entitled "Race for Lennie", about the dangers of diabetes, recognized some of the symptoms given as her own. The child told her mother and was taken to a doctor who confirmed the child's judgment. The mother wrote to the program and said that the disease, because it had been recognized so soon, was checked.

"Cavalcade" calls Hollywood its home, though much of the time the "Cavalcade" show is broadcast from New York. This year the program will visit other U. S. towns. Its sponsor, Du Pont Company, has many plants all over the country and the idea of bringing stars to some of the towns which ordinarily never see them will be a summer project. In May the program returns to New York to take advantage of Broadway names available for broadcasts.

The bright talent of Broadway, though it's inspiring to the listener, can be a headache to a radio producer, according to Zoller. Don't get him wrong, Broadway luminaries are swell folks, but they're so darn busy. "The eastern broadcast goes on the air at eight o'clock and curtain time for most Broadway stars is eight-

thirty", explained Zoller. "We have to keep elevators waiting and taxicabs waiting so they can make it. Then on the repeat broadcast it's the same thing. We repeat to the west at 11:30 p. m., eastern time—just about the time the curtain is coming down on a Broadway hit. That means more elevators and taxicabs. And it's a little distracting to the actor, too. You know New York—so much can happen between Broadway and Rockefeller Center!"

Producer Zoller attempted to put into words what "Cavalcade of America" hopes to convey to his listeners. "It's a show full of hope for everyone," he said. "Its philosophy is one of positiveness. We want to show that America today is a country of opportunity no less than it was in the days of Edison and Ford."

# Men of Music

No. 29 of a Series

*Friends Call Him "The Late Dick Aurandt" Because He Can't Get to an Appointment on Time, but with Radio It's Different — He's on the Spot with Melody and Moods*

◀ **DICK AURANDT IS THE MAN** behind the music of many a dramatic series. His talents are not confined strictly to music—he's a capable engineer and writer, and originator of "Song Is Born" (not on the air at present).

**W**ELL," said the radio producer, "I want the theme music on this show to be romantic, exciting and mysterious—all at the same time!" Maestro Richard Aurandt was the hapless victim of these instructions. Did he point out that Beethoven himself would find it impossible? No—he simply wrote a theme which followed the spirit, if not the letter, of the request and the producer was satisfied.

Like many musicians, Dick has been bedeviled by odd instructions from producers who know radio, but don't know music. However, Bill Rousseau, producer of ABC's "Murder and Mr. Malone," isn't one of them, Dick adds. "I'm on the spot," Dick smiled. "he's a fine musician and a former concert pianist—I can't kid him when it comes to music!"

Dick is also heard as organist and pianist on "Meet the Missus," with Jack Meakin's orchestra on "Great Gildersleeve" in addition to leading his own orchestral combinations on "Man Named Jordan," "Ghost Walks" and "Murder and Mr. Malone." He refers to his musicians on the latter show as "My Symphony of Five." Actor Dick Ryan, after hearing a "Malone" broadcast, complimented musician Dick on making a ten-piece orchestra sound like twenty. "He was amazed when I told him there were only five pieces," laughed Aurandt. On "Ghost Walks," Dick uses only three pieces—he himself handles the piano and organ, chimes and cymbals! "I'm called the French horn player's nemesis," he admitted, referring to his unorthodox use of this difficult instrument to create unearthly music for his mystery shows.

### Busy-ness Personified

Dick is also heard Saturdays and Sundays on a program of organ solos called "Prelude to Midnight" on CBS—but not locally. He admits he's in doubt as to just who does listen, as up to now he has received one fan letter on the show! Dick has also just finished writing and producing spot announcements for Sears and Roebuck and 42 Hair Oil—yes, he's the guy!

We asked Dick if he thought that those folks who claim they don't like the mood music that accompanies mystery shows had an argument. "I'm afraid that if they heard a show without it, they'd think it was so flat they wouldn't listen," he assured us.

Dick attributes the fact that he is

Billie handled the "Mrs. Hush" call and those to the writers of the winning letters. As to the latter, she says that all of them were calm, desperately calm, when they received her call. Only one party did not answer—there was nobody home. Cooperation from the telephone company was extraordinary—there were no delays, according to Billie. "I thanked the operators when I called across the country," she said, "and they replied, 'Don't thank us—we're as excited as you are!'"

Edwards thanked Billie on each broadcast for her considerable part in helping the show run smoothly and Billie received calls and letters from people she hadn't heard from in years who heard the air mention.

As always, the lunatic fringe of contestants kept her line buzzing with inane queries—which, because Billie is the sort of person she is, received as courteous an answer as the intelligent questions. For instance, one woman called up and said, "Can you tell me something about the contest?" Billie said, "I imagine you mean the 'Mrs. Hush' contest." "No," replied the woman, "it's 'Mrs. Harsh.'" "Mrs. Hush", insisted Billie. "What did you want to know about it?" "I was wondering," asked the woman, "what's the matter with Mrs. Harsh that they have to take up a collection for her?" "Madam," said the busy Billie firmly, "listen to your radio!"

### Your Cue (Shows You May Like)

#### "The City"

An encompassing title like "The City" is a difficult one to live up to in a radio series, but the CBS show of that name heard on KNX Sundays at 5:00 p.m. does just that every minute it's on the air.

Each week a radio picture of the city is drawn with music, narration, plot and sound. The blend is perfect and though the show is termed impressionistic and even "arty", the fascinating plots woven into the portrait carry suspense, pathos and humor. Tracing the movements of many of the people whose actions cross and recross, affecting each other for perhaps a moment or a lifetime, sounds like a complicated idea to put into a half-hour radio drama. Tolstoy took thousands of pages to do the same thing in his novels. In their way, the artists responsible for "The City" succeed too.

People like most of us who live and work in a city we love will feel particularly close to this program. New Yorkers, Chicagoans and San Franciscans might even weep with nostalgia.

A recent drama told the story of an office building on a Saturday morning. The working people who come and go throughout the day are riding a faulty elevator, doomed to plunge to destruction. A janitor, the operator, the stenographers, a scientist, a detective, a blackmailer, the employers—who will be in it as it falls and what insignificant errand will send them on the ride to their death? Around this premise were woven the

music and sound effects that bring the city (and good radio) to life.

This fine sustaining feature is a cooperative effort on the part of many talented artists. Producer Sterling Tracy welds the scripts of Beth Barnes, Jack Newman, Stu Novins; the music of conductor Wilbur Hatch and Lucien Moraweck; Harry Essman's sound effects; Frank Goss' narration, and the fine acting of the players into integrated whole which would not succeed if any one part were minimized. We only hope that whatever intelligent and fortunate sponsor takes this show will realize that and not succumb to star power.

Happily, credit is given to all participating artists. Soundman Essman told us it's the first time the sound has been credited on a sustaining show.

And who fell in the doomed elevator? Luckily, the blackmailer!

### "It's Smile Time"

On their fifteen minute spot on KHJ at 11:15 a.m., the "Smile Time" gang, Steve Allen, Wendell Noble and June Foray, dish out more gags than can be found in most half-hour radio shows—and they do it every day, too. Samples: "I went five miles on a half-gallon of gas." "How?" "I lit a match." or: "I will now sing a song entitled, 'His Girl Stood Him Up at the Party, but He Kept Falling Down All the Same'". Or: "I went to a party—we tried to play spin the bottle but nobody would let go of the bottle." See?

And it is fifteen solid minutes of fun, interrupted only by a song by Wendell. Steve and Wendell write the show and they set a terrific pace for themselves. Girl friend June Foray supplies enough voices to articulate anything the boys dream up—including a dog. Eddie Truman delivers appropriate organ accompaniments and keeps up with the rapid pace.

A small but enthusiastic audience enlivens proceedings by being properly appreciative, leading us to believe that the "Smile Time" boys must be as entertaining to watch as they are to hear.

### Hits and Headlines

Been tuning in your radio of a recent morning and catching such yesterday tunes as "Jeepers Creepers" or Bea Wain's wistful warbling of "Do I Worry?" We have—and we like it. A mixture of melodies and memories, we think, makes for mighty palatable ether entertainment, and this gimmick, with various variations, has supplied the format for a number of shows. "Hits and Headlines" (KMPC, Monday through Friday, 9:30 a.m.) has applied it with extremely listenable results.

This program's personnel is a pleasing-voiced twosome, Patricia Service

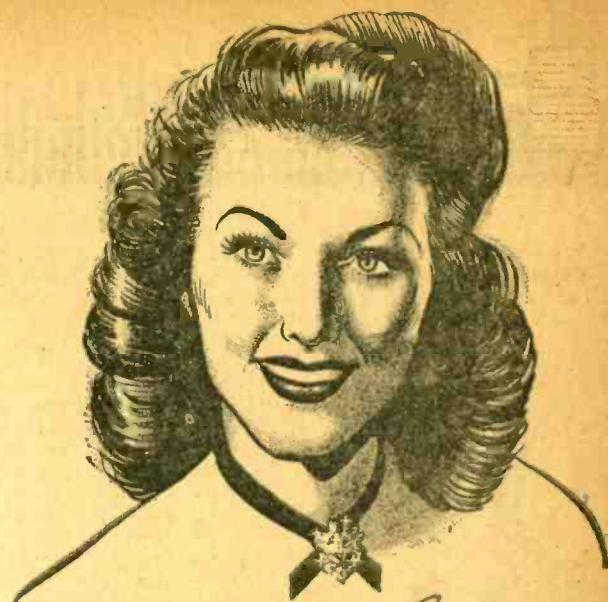

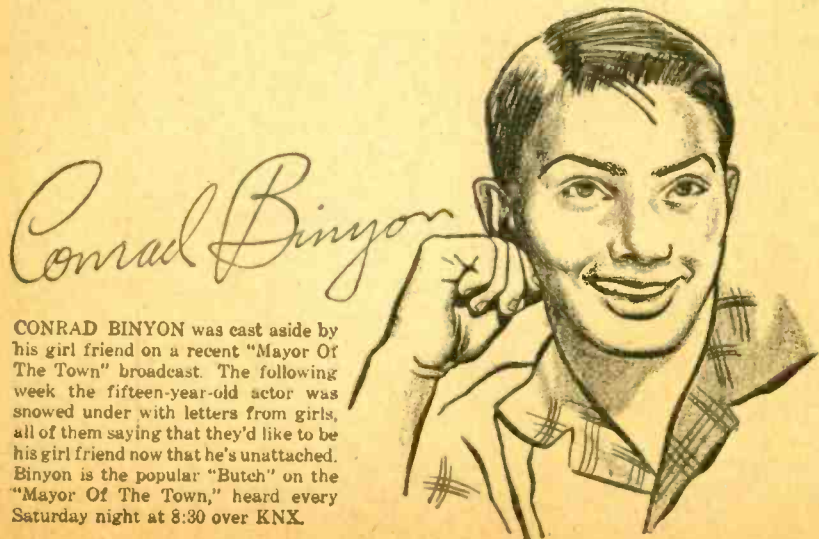

and Tom Latimer, who write, produce and emcee thirty minutes of happy early-morning microphone fare. Patricia also serves painless plugs for the program's sponsor, Nash's of Pasadena, in the form of fashion chit-chat for women.

The show's format is this. Taking the date of each day's broadcast—say, March 19th, for instance—the couple first reminisces about the March 19th of ten years ago. On March 19, 1937, they remind you, your morning paper contained an advertisement that announced delicious ice cream at eight cents a pint, and in the pictorial section, a photograph of a pretty Hollywood High School student who had just been signed to a Warner Brothers picture contract. The name under the photo was Lana Turner. Musically, they further illustrate via a ten-year-old waxing that Bing Crosby's romantic crooning of "South Sea Island Magic" was riding the popularity wave.

A few years later, March 19, 1939, Ann Sheridan was heralded as Hollywood's "Oomph Girl" and Judy Garland was buoyantly singing a novel tribute to our late president, "Mr. Franklin D. Roosevelt Jones"; March 19, 1941, the midwest farmers were praying for rain, and a new '41 Oldsmobile was selling for \$852, and Eddy Duchin's talented fingers tickled the keyboard in a rhythmic rendition of "Practice Makes Perfect"; March 19, 1943, the war was making its mark in many ways—housewives were reminded to buy only government-inspected meat to help curb black-marketeers, commuters were told to take their bicycles out of storage to diminish heavy bus and street-car travel, and Dinah Shore waxed a haunting ditty of the times, "You'd Be So Nice to Come Home To"—and so on, through the years until today, March 19, 1947, in commemoration of which, Patricia and Tom read a top news story of the day and play a current disc hit, Paula Kelly and the Modernaires giving a fast treatment to the novelty "Hoodle Addle", for instance.

All of this, as you can see, results in an interesting and enjoyable half-hour. Our only suggestion is that, on some days at least, the twosome delve farther into their store of yesteryear's news and tunes, to tickle their listeners' memories even more with the noteworthy topical tidbits and increasingly nostalgic melodies of the late twenties and early thirties.

For our money, the popular songs of those days were a lot better than most of those produced in the past ten years.

## The Singing Truman

Page Norman Corwin—it's a real democracy when they let a girl sing on the radio without holding against her the fact that her father is President of these United States! Or didn't

you hear Miss Margaret Truman on the air, Sunday, March 16?

The Truman tones were a pleasant surprise to most listeners, including us. Not being a professional music critic, we'd call her voice warm, young and sweet—and especially liked her rendition of "Cielito Lindo". The real critics were complimentary in judging her by their stringent professional standards and we'd be happy if the young singer is encouraged to further strides in her career. What better symbol of a musical land and a musical people than a President's daughter who sings?

As usual, the last word on the subject came from a comedian. Said Bob Hope on his broadcast: "I hear that now Thomas E. Dewey is making arrangements to adopt Bobby Breen."

## "Falcon" No Worse

If run-of-the-mill mysteries still appeal to you as a pleasant evening's diversion via your radio, you'll find "The Falcon" (KHJ-Mutual, Tuesday, 8:30 p.m.) no better, no worse than all the others. The hero (portrayed by James Melghan) is the usual suave fellow who performs the usual custom of staying several steps ahead of the police on the sleuthing trail. He does this by such cute tricks as luring the officer of the law into an empty closet and locking the door on him.

Oh, well—during such "private detective" programs as this, if what happens to the police at the hands of the slick sleuth sounds more harrowing than what happens to the criminals as a result of their combined fumbling efforts, don't let it bother you.

It's a sure thing that "The Falcon" (or whatever apt tag the hero happens to wear) will cross the finish line first, with his pocket handkerchief still in place and, likely as not, a beautiful blonde under each arm.

## Se Habla Espanol?

Something new in radio is being tried by San Diego schools via KYOR. It's a course in Spanish (5 to 5:15 p.m. Monday through Friday) and it's intended to be painless. The woman who believes it is Mrs. Margit W. MacRae, who teaches Spanish to more than 3000 fourth, fifth and sixth graders in twenty-four city schools. Each broadcast originates from an imaginary supper table at the Marlow home (to carry out Mrs. MacRae's belief that learning of a foreign language is easy if an informal approach is used).

Actually, the Marlow family is the MacRae family. Participating with Mrs. MacRae are her husband, Roderrick; her son Erik, nineteen, a junior at State College; her daughter, Margit, nine, a fourth-grader at Brooklyn School, and Mrs. Viola May MacRae, Mr. MacRae's mother. KYOR is avoiding the possibility of listeners passing over the program with an irate "those Tijuana stations!" by insisting upon enough good American English mixed in to identify the program and help listeners begin their study from scratch.

Valentine, it was a tricky mathematical problem which, he says, fifty per cent of his adult audience would be unable to answer.

If you missed the live Benny show last Sunday (March 16) but heard the repeat, that wasn't your radio on the bum when a fade occurred during the singing of quartet Bing Crosby, Dennis Day, Andy Russell and Dick Haymes.

Apparently finding the song pitched too high for his comfort, Bing let slip an ad lib, "Who the h— set this key? Dennis Day?" When KFI repeated the program at 9:30 p.m. by transcription, the naughty line was ethered-out.

Hey, Bingo, you've gotta be more careful when you're broadcasting live rather than recording, or have you forgotten so soon?

### What a Boon!

No longer need distracted parents and wailing children become lost from each other in crowds. Television has come to the rescue.

The other night at KFI's television demonstrations, a little girl was wandering around crying for her daddy, from whom she'd become separated.

### EDDY HOWARD ORCH.

"Romance with Eddy Howard" is the title of his new six-sided album, featuring standards in love songs ("Paradise" especially) and aimed at the young man whose fancy lightly turns in spring . . . very lush Howard vocals and simple arrangements had a tough time keeping this one in the 2-note classification . . . it's good. ### PEGGY LEE

With Dave Barbour's small combo setting the pace, Peggy has quite a brisc-disc in the rhythmic spiritual "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot" and the slower ballad, "Speaking of Angels" . . . give it a spin and see if it isn't worth 3 notes. (Capitol.)

### BETTY RHODES

Here's a swell gal who improves with each new release, but she doesn't have a chance to do very much with "Maybe You'll Be There" and "You're Everywhere" . . . backed by the Charles Dant musicians, it's strictly the 2-note "maybe" class (RCA-Victor).

### HARRY JAMES ORCH.

In "Heartaches", the James band has nice arranging, Marion Morgan vocal, and nice trumpet work by the maestro—but the mediocre "I Tipped My Hat" on the reverse side pulls this platter down to no more than 2 notes. (Columbia.)

### DINAH SHORE

You'll like Dinah's "The Egg and I" and "Who Cares What People Say" with Sonny Burke's smooth background . . . it's just the sort of thing Shore knows how to sell . . . and Mansfield got a real bargain when he bought it for .3 notes. (Columbia.)

### MONICA LEWIS

In her serious moments, Monica can be quite torchy and that's just how it is with "A Thousand and One Nights" and "Midnight Masquerade" with Ray Bloch's orchestra backing . . . let's be conservative and say 2 notes for Monica. (Signature).

chronically late to all appointments (a friend revealed that he was even late to his own wedding!) to the fact that he is in radio where his livelihood demands he be on time. He claims he does his best work under pressure—and at night. "I just can't think in the morning," he insisted. Folks on the old "Dreft Star Playhouse" would agree with this last. It seems that the rehearsal for that now defunct show started at seven in the morning—an hour at which our Mr. Aurandt cannot think, to use his own words. He conducted a trio of strings and played the organ. Once he became dissatisfied with the musical effect his boys were giving. He stopped playing, struck a chord on the organ and said, "Now when we get on the air, do it like this," and he demonstrated on his instrument. The horrified look on the harpist's face made him glance at the signal lights in the studio. They were red—and a nation-wide audience had just been treated to musical instruction in the middle of the announcer's frantic commercial!

Though Aurandt may not be wide awake in the early morning, the rest of the time he's an extra sharp guy. His talent at engineering is so great it nearly superseded his musical ambitions at one time. 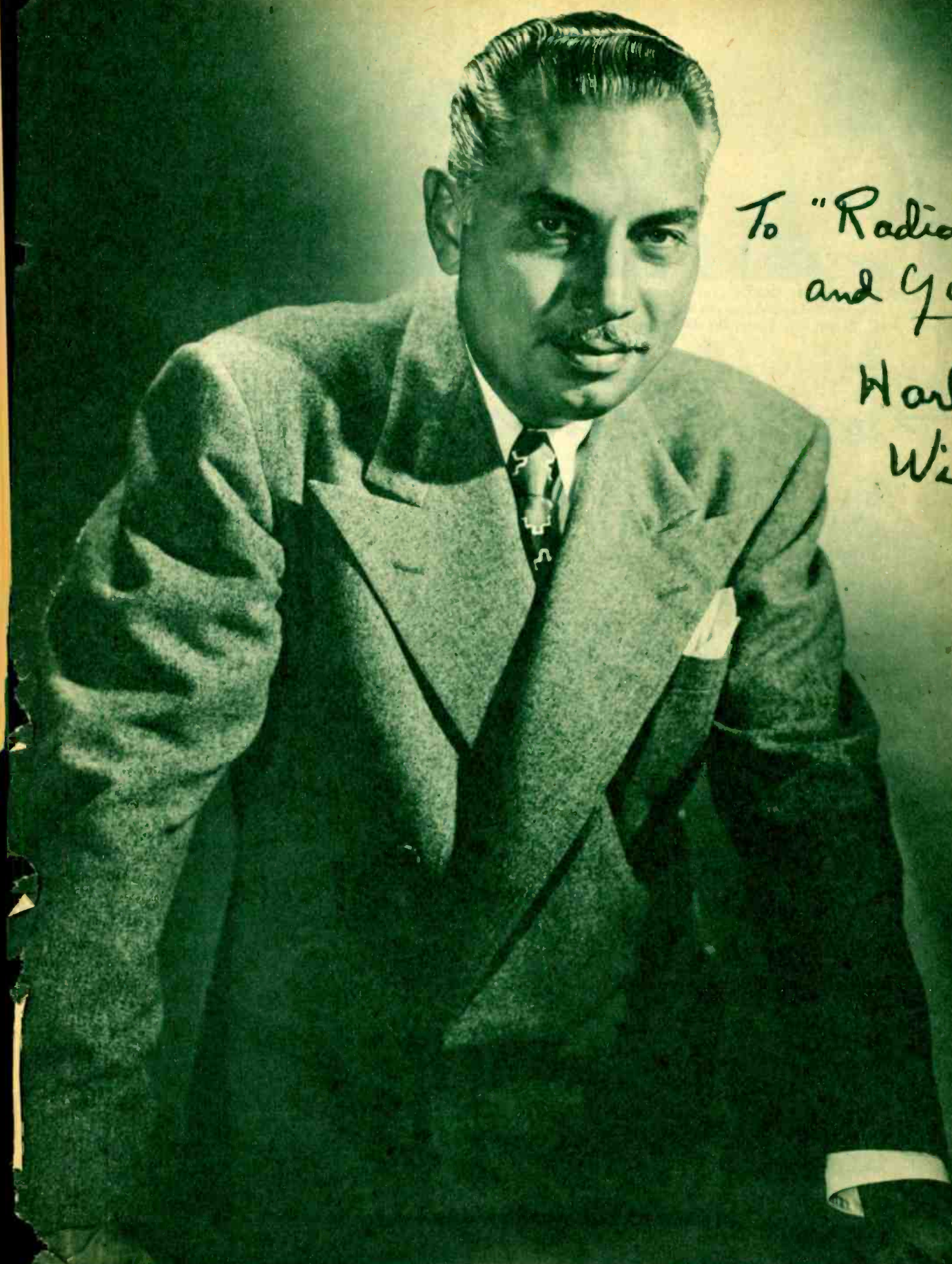

# Special Delivery

*Ken Barton's Mikeside Manner Is Outgrowth of Years' Experience as Sportscaster, Newsmen, Interviewer*

**I**T WAS a few minutes to airtime, and the French champion bicycle rider whom Ken Barton was to interview on his sportscast hadn't shown up. Ken was getting worried, but in sports broadcasting you get used to worrying. Finally the man rushed into the studio just as the producer threw the cue. Ken motioned him into his chair and started in—to discover that Frenchie couldn't speak a word of English!

How Ken got over that hurdle he doesn't quite remember, but it was probably much the same way he got over the hurdle of Alice Greenbough. Miss Greenbough, famed Texas cowgirl scheduled as an interviewee, at the last minute couldn't make it. Ken had to put somebody in her place, and the best he could do on short notice was the secretary of Producer Paul Hill. So on the air went the secretary as Miss Greenbough, and the interview sounded like this:

Barton: The only difference between a cowgirl and a cowboy in competition is that the cowgirl rides the same saddle with one rein and her stirrups hobbled under the horse's belly, isn't that right?

Secretary: Yes, that's right.

Barton: And it's true, isn't it, that in bulldogging, the bulldogger and the hazer back their horses into the chute gate and cannot leave until the steer breaks the barrier?

Secretary: Yes, that's quite true.

Experiences like that are what made Ken Barton decide always to prepare a complete 15-minute script without an interview for use when his prospect didn't show up, and they are also what made him the excellent sportscaster he is today. For Barton's "special delivery" is the result of years of hard work as sportscaster, newsmen, and interviewer, which have combined to give him a very special broadcasting delivery all his own.

## Unpredictable

Barton has interviewed most of the greats in sports, finds that you can't tell by the game a man plays how he's going to be on the mike. Wrestlers, for instance, whom the public doesn't think of in terms of brain waves, often give wonderful interviews. Barton believes in working without a script of any kind. He outlines the track the interview is to take, lists a few leading questions, and from there on it's strictly ad lib. "It makes for a more natural broadcast," he says. "If they get off the track, it's easy enough to pull them back on with another question."

The worst fifteen minutes in his life are always those preceding a broadcast. Sports people have no conception of the inevitability of radio, occasionally call up to say they "can't make it" or don't bother to call at all. Which is why Barton always covers with a full-length script.

Of sports figures in the boxing world, Bob Pastor was one of the eas-

iest and most cooperative. Joe Louis is fairly mlike-shy, is stiffish until he forgets about half way through and then he's very good.

Tennis player Alice Marble interviews much the same as Louis. The best tennis player Ken ever interviewed was Fred Perry, and the worst was the Polish tennis star, Jadwiga Jedredjowska, whom Ted Husing had to nickname "YaYa" in order to be able to pronounce it when he was sportscasting her Forest Hills tennis match.

Wrestler Jim Londos was easy to interview although hard to understand. Two of the best sports figures were wrestlers Bill Long and Chief Little Wolf—both did very well.

Interviewing Gentleman George Zaharias and his wife, Babe Dirdikson, gave Barton one of the biggest kicks he's had. Other good interviewees were Rex Mays and the late Bob Swanson, and Dr. Mal Stevens, coach of the Brooklyn Dodgers football team.

Barton is particularly fond of Dud de Groot, coach of the Los Angeles Dons All-American conference, because he'll discuss anything and will stick his neck out on any question Barton cares to ask. Worst interviewee is Strangler Lewis, as unpredictable on the mike as he is in private life.

## Pros Fail Sometimes

But it isn't just the interviewees who are unpredictable on the air. Radio people make their fluffs too. During the 1936 air races, Barton introduced Major General Westover to the announcer doing a special sportscast; he came back with "Hello, major, how are you?" And on another occasion during the neck-and-neck air race between Roscoe Turner and Earl Ortman, when Barton was coordinator of all radio broadcasts, the announcer devoted the broadcast to describing the size of the crowd and the state of the weather while Turner and Ortman whipped around the py-

# Platter Impresario

*Gene Norman Blends Premieres of New Discs, New Waxings of Old Favorites, and Interviews With Famous Music Men into Pleasant Program*

**I**N HOLLYWOOD TOWN, famous for its klieg-lighted premieres and cinema stars, there's a young man who had an idea which he has proved; premiere important new music and new albums of old favorites, and you have a popular radio half hour.

That young man is Gene Norman. His "Eastside Serenade" presents not only the very best and latest releases from the wax works, but composers and conductors as guests on record premiere nights.

A list of the famous men-of-music who have appeared on Gene's unique show is a veritable who's who of musicians. Among the composers who have been on hand to be interviewed on a "first night" have been Gordon Jenkins for the premiere of his "Manhattan Towers," Dmitri Tiomkin, whose "Duel in the Sun" music was aired for the first time on "Serenade," and Ferde Grofe, who recently made his second appearance on the Sunday night airer.

Three-time Academy Award winner Alfred Newman is one of Gene's best known "repeaters." Incidentally, all five of Newman's new Majestic albums . . . a cycle of five which made a complete musical library . . . have been introduced to western au-

diences on "Serenade," with notes by Mr. Newman in person.

Duke Ellington was on the show recently when his "Perfume Suite" was introduced. "The Duke" made his only interview appearance in Los Angeles on "Serenade." Gene has played recordings of all of Ellington's major works during the past two years.

David Rose previewed his Cole Porter album on Norman's unique show six months before it was heard anywhere else. Gene has Dave's assurance that "Serenade" will have the opportunity to preview all of his new M. G. M. records, with personal notes by the maestro.

Young Norman was first to present Victor Young's score for "Love Letters," interviewing the composer on premiere night. Paul Weston was his guest for the first West Coast airing of his "Music of Memory" album, and Ferde Grofe first appeared on the show when his "Grand Canyon Suite" was aired. Al Sack came to the studio for an interview in connection with presentation of his "Velvet Moods."

## Unique Interview

One of the unique "firsts" which

Gene has chalked up in recent months was his exclusive interview with that famous conductor, Arthur Fiedler, of the Boston "Pops" Orchestra. Gene interviewed Mr. Fiedler by means of transcription. He sent his questions to the conductor in Boston, and Fiedler transcribed his answers to the young emcee's queries. Gene plans to arrange other exclusive interviews with famous musicians in this way.

Known about town as "The Voice of Eastside" because of his many disc-jockeying sessions each week for Eastside Brewing Company, Gene also is heard on stations KFWB, KMPC and KHJ, as well as his Sunday night special, "Serenade," on KECA.

Born a mid-westerner, Gene attended University of Wisconsin at Madison, and like many an ambitious young man, majored in "econ" (School of Economics, to you), planning to join his father in the family business enterprises. He might even now be the president of the junior chamber of commerce and a successful young business man in some mid-western city, except for

*Out of a Famous Comic Strip and onto the Airways Steps Christmas Early Each Night, in the Person of Cathryn Cragen, to Mark a Departure in Record Shows*

**L**AST SEPTEMBER, nocturnal listeners first heard the lilting theme, "Jingle Bells," introduce the coast's only girl disc jockey, whose prototype is the svelte charmer from the famous Dick Tracy comic strip.

The voice introducing the records behind this melodious soliciting of late listeners is Miss Cathryn Cragen. The in-the-flesh use of Chester Gould's sultry-voiced siren was the brainchild of Don Fedderson, manager of radio station KLAC. So KLAC immediately made exclusive ar-

rangements with the creator of Dick Tracy to borrow "Miss Early," and auditions were under way.

More than fifty different and likely candidates tried for the part, and applications for these auditions came from as far east as New York. But this soft-spoken twenty-one-year-old walked off with top priority for the hour sponsored by Universal International Studios.

Cathryn was born in Chicago, Illinois, daughter of the late E. L. Cragen, who added to American industrial history by laying the first oil pipeline reaching from Tulsa, Oklahoma, to Houston, Texas. Her family moved to California and Cathryn attended first the exclusive Marlborough School for Girls, and later Holmby College. Schooling was augmented by intensive dramatic instruction.

Though dark-eyed Cathryn still looks as though she had just stepped off the campus, she is no novice to radio. She has appeared as both featured player and in supporting roles in such top-notchers as the Burns and Allen show, "Mystery Is My Hobby," Arch Oboler's plays, and on "Dr. Christian." But there is no make-believe in her attitude toward radio. "I love radio, and I worked hard at my dramatics so I could be on the air. Of course I was lucky, too. I got to do some bits on 'Cavalcade' shows while I was still studying, and learned a lot that way." In all of her five years on the air, her fondest memory is of the second lead she played in one of the "Cavalcade of America" shows, "A Gentleman from Paris," starring Charles Boyer. She still augments

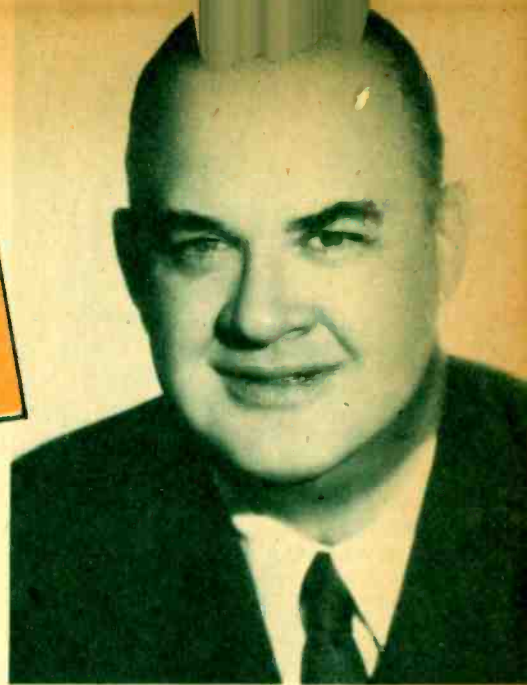

# MIKEMEN: No. 1 in a Series Don Wilson

They Call Him "Jovial, Genial, Chubby,"  
but We Call Him a Distinguished Veteran  
Who's Seen Radio Change for the Better.

**TWO HUNDRED AND THIRTY POUNDS** of swell personality is Don Wilson, heard weekly on the Ginny Simms show and also on other leading airers. He's still going strong after twenty-four years in radio.

**D**ON WILSON, rotund winner of Radio Life's 1946-47 Distinguished Achievement Award for the Most Enjoyable Commercial, has been "at it" for twenty-four years now, and that's a long time.

Don has seen radio change from a fad to a giant industry. When he started dabbling in radio back in 1924 they weren't as fussy about production, sound and timing as they are now.

"Before commercial radio, it didn't make much difference if we ran over a minute or two," Don recalls.

"As a matter of fact, if we didn't have anything to put on the air—or if someone failed to show up for a broadcast—the station just signed off for a while."

A bit more informal than things are today!

Don confesses there wasn't much money then in radio, "but it was a lot of fun and we learned as we went along".

Most people got into early radio because they were musically inclined, either instrumentally or vocally, since most radio programs consisted solely of music. Don started out as a singer over a Denver transmitter. It was several years before he took up sportscasting and then announcing.

Our chubby voice of experience says that announcers, along with technique, have changed for the better since those early days.

"Announcers today have finer diction and a much greater command of the language.

"They must have more than a good voice and a knowledge of pronuncia-

tion, however. They have to be able to project a 'selling' voice over the microphone and to have an acceptable radio personality at the same time", he points out.

According to Don, the radio microphone is the daddy of the lie detector.

"The mike is the greatest detector of insincerity, and by the same token it reflects honesty and sincerity in an announcer's voice", he claims.

#### His Advice

Every week Don receives countless letters from would-be announcers seeking advice on how to succeed in radio. He answers them all:

"Be yourself. Don't try to mimic someone else. Your own personality is your greatest asset.

"Have an honest enthusiasm about the product you're selling and your voice will register successfully."

He certainly knows whereof he speaks. The Radio Life citation is latest in a ten-year-long string of firsts in popularity polls which have picked him as favorite announcer.

Don has been with Jack Benny for thirteen years. Besides his Sunday stints for Benny, the Wilson verve also adds lift to Ginny Simms' Friday night alders, the Victor Borge-Benny Goodman show, and Kenny Baker's five-times-weekly early morning broadcasts.

Most of his fans write about his infectious laugh. Those background chuckles are not prop laughs. Don doesn't laugh at a joke because there's a paycheck in the shadows. He really enjoys a funny line and it's second nature for him to boom out with the hearty ho-hos.

After all those references to Don as a "Hemo Boy," comparisons to Mt. Wilson, and what not, the popular conception is a Don Wilson weighing in the neighborhood of 400 pounds, more or less.

Actually, Don weighs a trim 230—not bad for his six feet, two.

Ginny's warm-up shows make a lot over Don's avoidupois. A make-believe storm at sea calls for a line like "Make Wilson stay in the middle of the ship—it's listing!"

Pounds don't worry Don, and he claims he diets only when he's asleep. His favorite midnight snack is a bowl of graham crackers and milk.

Wilson is married to Marusia Rudenska, a refugee Polish countess and a very talented dress designer. A couple of weeks ago Marusia had her new spring opening in Beverly Hills. Hollywood stars and Beverly Hills society were well represented.

Ginny was one of the hostesses at the opening, which was emceed, as you might guess, by Don Wilson. Marusia modeled her creations herself and caused quite a flurry.

Don is very proud of Marusia's success. He likes to talk about her workshop in downtown Los Angeles, about the clever things she does with fabrics, and about the gowns she whips up for Esther Williams and other stars.

"They call her the Valentina of Beverly Hills", he says gleefully.

The Wilsons have just moved into a new apartment in Beverly Hills and are now in the happy throes of decorating. They used to live on a ranch in the Valley, but their busy careers made town living more to be desired.

Besides his multitudinous radio assignments, Don finds time to be President of Acro-Speed, Incorporated, an automotive tune-up equipment plant located in Pasadena—and to be radio's number one gin-rummy addict.

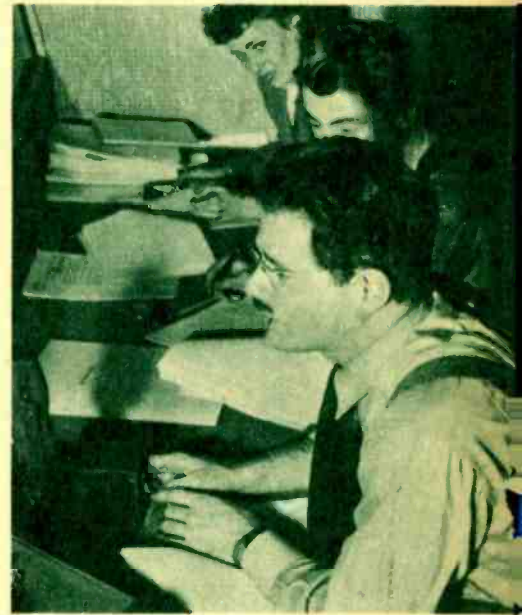

her nightly radio appearance schedule as "la Early" with parts on the "Red Ryder" show and "Cisco Kid."

After seeing Cathryn in front of her microphone working at catching the hearts of her audience with her intimate portrayal of "Christmas Early," we weren't surprised at her choice for the role.

### Loves Dreamy Music

"Well, I was surprised when I found I had won that audition. The thought of a record show was a new thing, too. You see, I guess I'm about the biggest square in radio. I love dreamy music, and lots and lots of tangos and rumbas. Especially Desi Arnaz. I guess he's my favorite." Apparently many of her listeners like the dreamy music, and lots and lots of tangos and rumbas, too, for her presentation has resulted in an avalanche of mail to radio station KLAC and in the bestowing upon Cathryn of the title, "The Sweetheart of Zeta Psi," by the chapter at UCLA, and the further title of "Queen of the Loyola Senior Class." Her program has its largest following among college and high school students who late at night relax in time with her tunes.

The enthusiastic and almost overnight response to her program she modestly attributes to the public's desire to hear or see a favorite fictional character in real life. Cathryn won't let herself be carried away too greatly by this fiction, however. She makes no secret of the "prop" she uses in portraying "Christmas Early."

"You see, I'm really a blonde, and 'Christmas' has dark hair." She grinned and patted the long black hair that is a trademark of cartoonist Gould's record spinner. "I suppose being of Irish-Italian descent, I should have had dark hair anyway, so this wig isn't so bad. It's kind of fun. Recently I even wore it to the Bachelors' Ball, when I went as 'Christmas Early.' But you should hear what my brother says about it!"

Cathryn is prouder of her brother than she is of any of her own plaudits. They live together in Hollywood, taking turns at "keeping the apartment up" until the return of their mother from Honolulu, where she is visiting. In addition to keeping house and doing radio work, Cathryn is kept busy by the several local charitable organizations to which she belongs. The brother studies law at the University of California at Los Angeles.

"But he's no help in picking records the students would like to hear. He's so interested in his law studies he thinks any kind of acting is the craziest thing. So I just play what my listeners request . . . and what I want to."

So when you hear "Christmas Ear-

ly" playing an excellent rendition of "Song of Scheherezade," the record currently holding favor with her, you'll know it's one of the records she plays "just because she wants to."

The yawning public which relaxes during her melodious hour might wonder how Cathryn herself, an early riser, manages to stay so alert. Her one vice is the answer. Coffee. "May the old days of its rationing never return!" she sighs.

one of those quirks of fate which so often influence lives.

When he entered the university, he chose as his roommate a man who was chief announcer on WHA, University of Wisconsin radio station. Now the radio bug is an infectious little creature, as many will testify, and somewhere along the road during those four years at college, the radio bug bit Gene. So after graduation he forsook a more prosaic business career, headed for New York, and was soon working on WBNX.

After that KGO, the American Broadcasting Company station in San Francisco, lured the Norman talents, and from there it was just one jump to the mecca of all aspiring young announcer-emcees . . . Hollywood!

Besides his busy radio schedule, Norman finds time to do narration at Columbia Pictures for many "trailers," and to be an account man for a local advertising agency. Throughout the war, and for many months thereafter, he conducted a two-a-week show, "Down Beat," for Armed Forces Radio Service.

This latter activity is one in which he is particularly interested. He was known as "The Voice of American Jazz" to troops on far-flung outposts during the war, and he still arranges two-hour-long "Down Beat" shows which he presents frequently at the Army's Birmingham Hospital in Van Nuys. He brings the best musical talent in Hollywood to the hospital for the entertainment of the six or seven hundred wounded and sick patients.



### PARADOXICALLY

lions literally unheeded and Barton grew quietly gray.

Barton, whose voice at the mike has covered practically every type of sporting event there is, lists in order the four most difficult sports to broadcast as horse racing, ice hockey, boxing, and basketball; and the three easiest as baseball, golf, and tennis.

"That, of course, is provided you are well acquainted with the background of the players and the rules and history of the sport. A baseball broadcast where the announcer has never heard of the players until he goes on the air can be the dulllest and therefore the most difficult in the world."

Horse racing, he thinks, is the hardest because all you can see as they turn for the home stretch is the horse's head and the rider's cap. It's extremely difficult, too, to get enough depth perception so that you know who's ahead even if you can identify the horses.

"Ice hockey is the fastest game broadcast. The players move so fast it's almost impossible to follow them. When a score is made, you must tell who scored, where the pass started from and where it originated, so you not only have to describe what's going on at the moment but remember back. And when four or five players get piled up at the goal, it doesn't straighten out the confusion any."

### Bad Moments

"I've picked boxing as the third most difficult sport to broadcast, but actually it contains a sportscaster's worst mike moment. That's when you take the mike away from the winner, who has just finished saying "Hello Mom—I won—I'll be home pretty soon" and hand it to the loser. He's punchy, he's been beat up pretty badly, and neither he nor you knows what's going to come out when he opens his mouth. When it starts out to be "That—hit me low and the—referee didn't call it" you've got to jerk the mike away fast."

But difficult though some of his sports figures have been before the mike, Barton gives the palm for being hard to interview to Bob Hope and Bing Crosby. "They're so darned quick with their ad libs that they leave you hanging on the ropes about four gags behind with no comeback."

Yes, movie stars can be sports figures too — and one of them Barton will never forget is Spencer Tracy, whom he interviewed at the polo matches recently. Tracy started to talk and then broke it off with,

"Oh, Ken — why kid the people? Who wants to talk about ham with all these beautiful horses here?"
