# 7th BNASS University of Hull 20–22 July 1994

The Biennial National Atomic Spectroscopy Symposium has an international reputation as the United Kingdom's premier meeting in the field of analytical atomic spectroscopy. It is a three-day meeting where plenary lectures, given by world-renowned spectroscopists, provide overviews of important areas of atomic spectroscopy. Invited and submitted lectures, as well as posters, cover the most recent developments in both pure and applied atomic spectroscopy. Although the majority of papers tend to focus on analytical applications, presentations on theoretical studies or fundamental advances in AA, AE, AF and XRF are also important components of each BNASS.

At the 7th BNASS there will be an exhibition comprising the main suppliers of commercial atomic spectroscopic instrumentation and accessories, suppliers of ancillary equipment, and scientific publishers.

Younger scientists are particularly welcome at BNASS meetings, and a number of bursaries will be offered to research students. There will be prizes for the best student poster and lecture.

Immediately prior to the 7th BNASS there will be a Workshop covering the topics of sample pretreatment and sample introduction for atomic spectroscopy.

The balance between scientific and social activities has given BNASS the enviable reputation of being a friendly, dynamic meeting. A number of social events, including a Symposium Dinner, will form an integral part of the programme for the 7th BNASS. Delegates will be assured of a warm welcome from the University of Hull, and in particular the School of Chemistry which is home to one of the UK's major centres for analytical chemistry.
