## Preface to the Tetrahedron Letters 50th Anniversary Special Issue

To Our Readers:

Beginning three years ago, as the fiftieth anniversary of our companion journal, *Tetrahedron*, was rapidly approaching, the Editors and Publisher of *Tetrahedron Publications* began meeting to discuss how best to recognize this important anniversary in the history of modern organic chemistry.

Tetrahedron Letters was launched in March, 1959 to facilitate the rapid publication of "preliminary communications" in cameraready format. Robert B.
