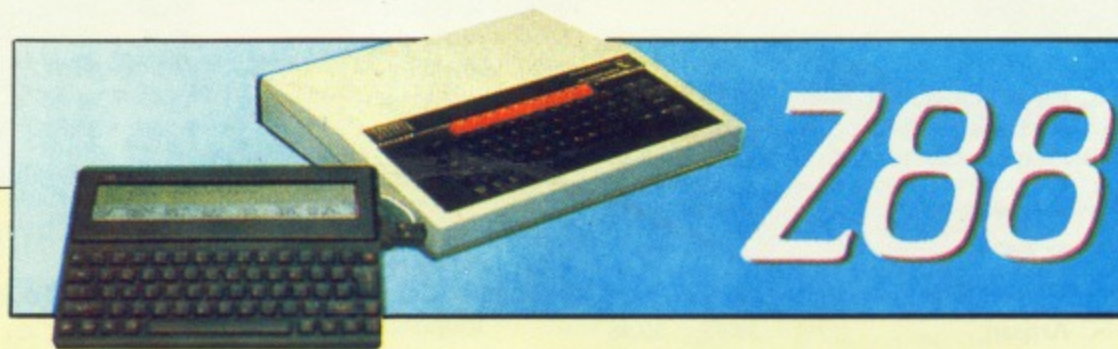

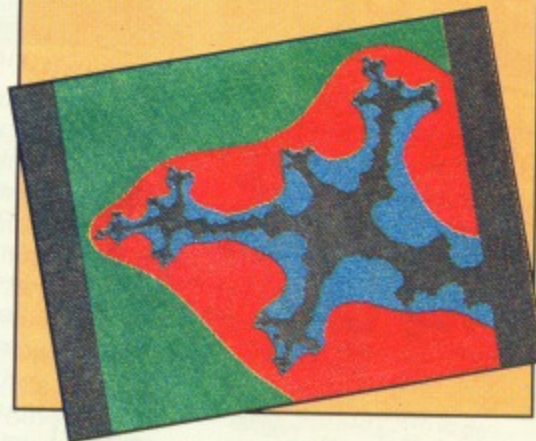

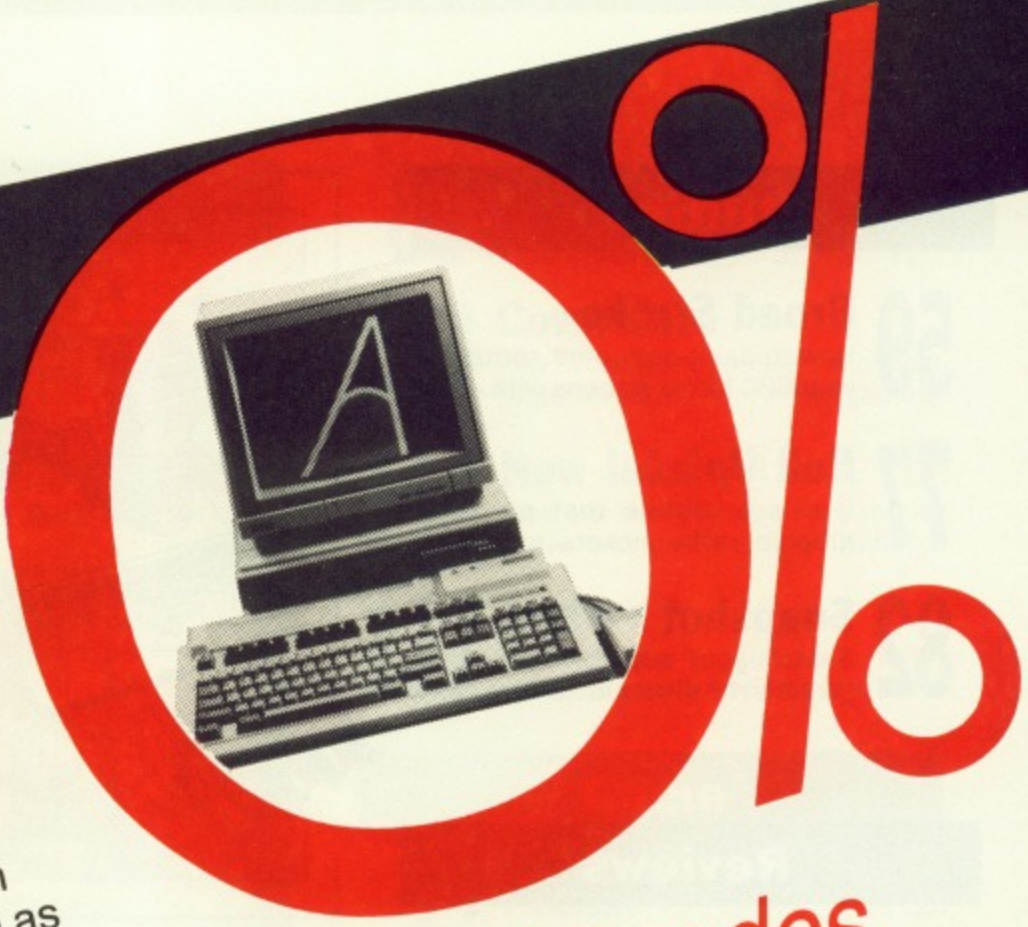

## Oliver's Arc beats a Cray

A MATHEMATICAL puzzle that took three weeks to crack on one of the world's most powerful mainframe computers was solved by a 16-year-old in only three hours using an Archimedes.

Encouraged by his father, Oliver Riorden from Ealing, London, decided to tackle the Sunday Times competition puzzle set by John Conway – former Cambridge don and currently professor of mathematics at Princeton University.

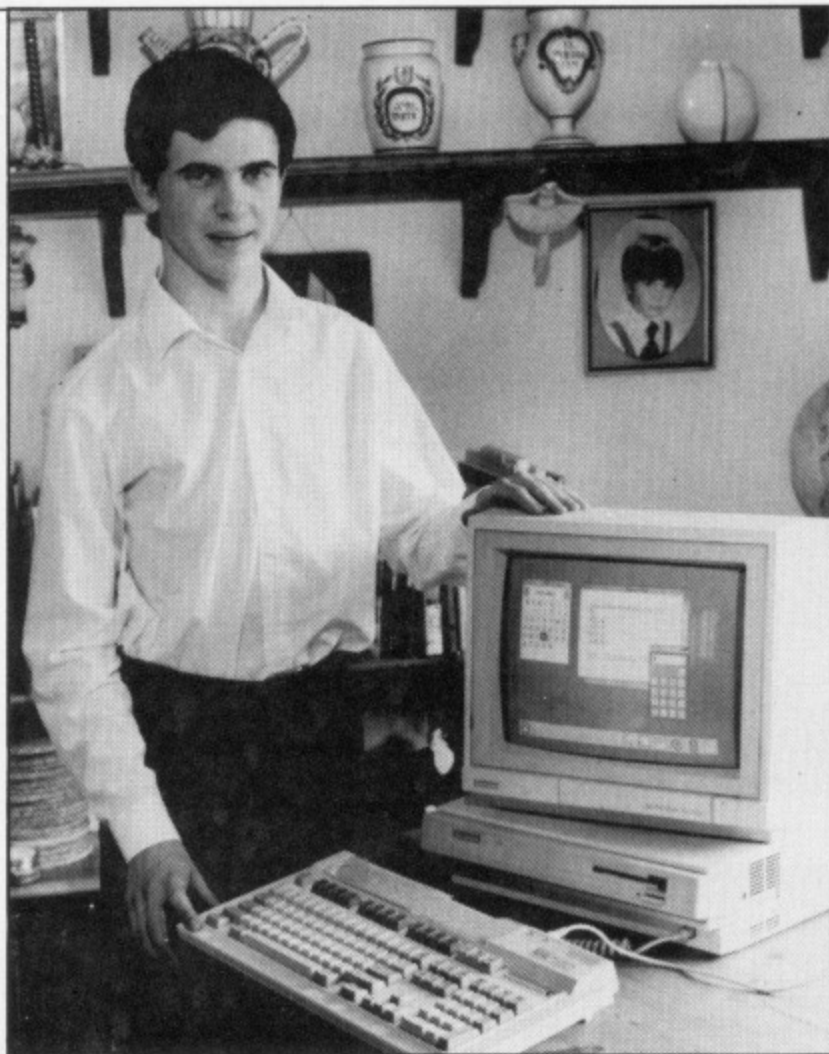
Originally, Conway offered \$10,000 to anyone who could find an answer to his challenge at a symposium in New Jersey this summer attended by more than 500 leading American mathematicians and scientists.

Only one – British mathematician Dr Colin Mallows – claimed the prize, and he took three weeks to come up with the answer using a Cray supercomputer.

A keen student of mathematics, Oliver came up with the answer to Dr Conway's challenge – which was to find the point in a number sequence beyond which all numbers when divided by their own place in the series fell within the range of 0.45 and 0.55.

He did it within minutes after writing his own program which divided each number in the sequence by its position, and printing the numbers outside the range. Oliver generated 200,000 terms in order to find the correct answer.

"I know and admire the work of John Conway, particularly his invention *The Life Game*", said Oliver. "Solving his riddle using the

fast processing power of my Archimedes was the easy part. Proving my theory was more complicated and took up most of the three hours".

A pupil at St Paul's School in Barnes, Oliver is studying mathematics, further mathematics, physics, chemistry and music at A Level. A keen

programmer, he used a BBC Micro at home before acquiring his Archimedes a year ago.

To mark Oliver's achievement, Acorn Computers has presented him with Archimedes software to go with his prize of a calculator from the Sunday Times.

## The Arc goes fax

A PRODUCT which turns an Archimedes into a fax machine is being prepared by Computer Concepts for release before the end of the year.

The Fax Pack modem card will plug into the Archimedes and telephone socket. It will have auto dial, auto answer, send or receive any group 2 or

3 fax, and save on the current filing system as a fax file.

The software will allow character-based output from a variety of word processors to be converted to a fax file format. This will also convert sprites and other graphic files to the same format.

Computer Concepts (0442 63933) is planning two modules – the basic Fax Pack at under £500 and a version with a hand-held scanner and Archimedes interface for around £800.

## PCB designer

THE complex and time-consuming process of designing printed circuit board layouts can now be fully automated with the new ARC-PCB design system from Silicon Vision (01-422 2274).

The PCB software – designed specifically for the Archimedes – provides a graphical interface that allows component placement and inter-component routing and editing to be performed interactively.

Fully automatic routing is provided for up to eight layer boards with a maximum design area of 32 square inches and up to 300,000 components.

Part libraries can be created, including surface mount devices, and lines and pad sizes are all fully variable.

Fast zoom, pan and redraw functions speed up design and on-screen help is available.

The ARC-PCB system will drive most leading printers and plotters, including the Plotmate A3, HP-GL, Graphtec and Epson. Prices start at £1,220.

## Prestel challenged

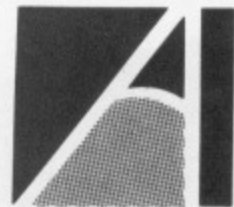
OFTEL, the telecommunications watchdog, has revealed it has received a number of complaints about new Prestel charges introduced in the summer.

"They came primarily from home computer users who tend to access the system in the evenings and at weekends", said a spokesman.

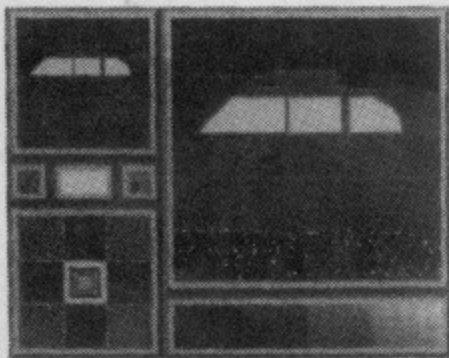
"We have asked British Telecom for an explanation of the basis for the new charges and have also raised the question of quality of service, which many complainants say has deteriorated significantly".

## Masterly challenge to Arc

THE BBC Master seems set to steal some limelight from the Archimedes, thanks to a new release from A B Designs (01-644 6643).

The Microbrush High Resolution System is a considerably enhanced version of the company's Microbrush series.

Used in conjunction with an Integrex colourjet printer it can produce images using any 2,400 colours from a palette of more than four million at approximately 16 times the standard resolution of the BBC Master.

This is made possible by the addition of a rom which contains the high resolution system, 10 rom-based typefaces, a 10 point perspective system and a second fill routine.

The rom costs £65 when bought separately, £50 with the other two roms in the Microbrush series.

### THE MICROBRUSH GRAPHICS SYSTEM

At last a high resolution graphics system for the Master contained in 2 - 16K roms, and a system for the BBC II comprised of 2 - 16K roms. Here are 40 good reasons why you should own a Microbrush graphics system.

# NEWS *beat*

## THE PERSONAL COMPUTER SHOW REPORT

ACORN boasted its largest ever presence at a PC Show, and although overshadowed by its bigger and flashier neighbours from Commodore and Atari, it wasn't dominated.

The reason was an impressive, though low key, demonstration of Archimedes technology, new and not-so-new.

Highlight was the new enhanced multi-tasking Archimedes operating system, Risc OS, shown in all its glory for the very first time.

Integrated word processors, spreadsheets and databases, 3D graphic modelling, desktop publishing, sound and vision, productivity tools, books and compilers were just some of the areas covered by Acorn and guest third party suppliers.

Visitors to the Acorn Theatre were treated to presentations of Acorn's Desktop Publisher, ProArtisan from Clares, EMR's Sound-Graphics-Music show, productivity tools from Minerva, Lingenuity's Presenter and 1st Word Plus, AIM's Eckhord image presentation system, Mitre's Flying Start II and Colton's PipeDream and SpellCheck.

Owners of BBC Micros and Masters had to search elsewhere at Earls Court for products to suit their machines. But they weren't disappointed.

## Superior budget games

Blue Ribbon sales director Martyn Wilson told *The Micro User*: "This brings together the two best known names in the Acorn games marketplace.

"BBC Micro owners are eager for quality product at a budget

price and these games are destined to return straight to the top of the charts".

Superior's managing director Richard Hanson said: "We've been watching the Acorn market for some time and are now convinced the time is right for our games to enter the budget arena.

# Press for action

**N**O writer of software reviews should be without one – this was my conclusion after only half an hour with this clever add-on. Morley Electronics has added software to a rom cartridge from Care Electronics and come up with a package with no clear rival. The cartridge contains a 16k eeprom for the software, and a small ram chip to store the user-defined instructions. There is a miniature push button on the top of the cartridge which activates a previously determined sequence of commands.

Installing and using the Master Smart Cartridge takes seconds and presents no problems. Simply plug it into one of the two slots on the Master, switch on and type \*GMENU. Now select a menu letter from A-W, press Escape and that instruction will be activated at each push of the cartridge button whatever the micro is doing at that moment – well almost. Since the Smart Cartridge works via an unrecognised interrupt request, it may not always perform the required task, but it worked every time for me.

I find the most useful utility is one which dumps the screen to a printer. Pressing the button freezes the current program and activates a faster than average screen dump routine which provides a good multitone dump on an Epson-compatible printer. There is also a \*GGDUMP command that can be used to call the routine from Basic programs. Graphics dumps work for Modes 0,1,2 and 4 – and corresponding shadow modes – irrespective of whether the Tube co-processor is active or not.

The other modes, including Mode 7 and 135, print out as text dumps. I managed to get screen dumps of frozen action from various games and graphics demonstrations from the Welcome disc first time. While I was impressed with the Morley screen dump, I would have liked some other types such as an inverse dump for a negative version of

the screen. And you should remember that only Epson-compatible printers are supported.

A similar utility saves the screen memory to disc or tape with a user-definable filename which is incremented by a suffix letter each time the button is pressed – for example, SCREENa, SCREENb and so on.

Option A saves the entire computer's memory from &0000 to &8000, as well as the shadow ram and some MOS private workspace, in seven files saved with a chosen filename, each suffixed with the letters a-g. Unfortunately, the instructions are too brief – two sides of typed A4 – to give enough details of these files, except that files d and e hold the real and shadow screens.

Option D pauses the micro which can be restarted by pressing any key. Three patch options allow you to enter your own machine code routine – up to 256 bytes long – when the cartridge button is pressed.

Star commands – selected by Morley – can be entered with options H-S. Some are useful, such as \*TIME, \*ROMS, \*CAT. However \*FX200, to set normal Break and Escape action, and \*FX247, for intercepting the Break vector, are unusual choices.

There is an option to poke a hex value to a chosen memory location which could be useful for game pokes, although if more than one location needs changing it is not much use. Option W will \*RUN a machine code program.

A user-defined option can contain up to 20 characters for your favourite star command sequence. This enables the Smart Cartridge to be tailored to your needs. The only minor frustration here is remembering to press a key to exit the Smart interrupt.

This powerful option is only limited by your own ideas, and I would have appreciated more than one page of hints and tips. Your star command could invoke another rom. For example, entering WORD or SHEET into option U will activate View or ViewSheet at the button press, but interestingly – due to interrupt problems, I imagine – I could not get this to work with the Tube co-processor on.

Having had the Smart cartridge and finding what a joy it is to use, my only wish is for one that works on the Archimedes.

## Dangling on a string

**L**ARSOFT adventures have never been featured in this column with their full solutions before. And a considerable number of you have experienced difficulties with Geoff's last adventure *Puppet Man*. Since it is now 18 months old I think the best thing to do is to serialise the full solution over the next few issues.

One problem, I feel, is that not all of you have taken the trouble to talk to the various characters encountered in the game. Apart from uttering some dreadful puns, the Butcher and the Candlestick Maker do offer some worthwhile assistance.

The background to this delightful adventure is a classical one: Three of the Nine Muses need your help. They are Terpsichore, Thalia and Erato – the Muses of dance, comedy and lyric poetry respectively.

There are three characters in the adventure who, if helped in various ways, enable each Muse to provide the necessary inspiration.

Ballerina cannot dance until her shoes have been found, Tomaszewski the clown cannot perform until the eggshell with his clown-face identity on it has been found and poor Pierrot, having written a love-poem to Columbine, has locked it away and lost the key. So off we go to

get Ballerina on the hop and thus satisfy Terpsichore.

First of all, wake up and move E to talk to the Muse, then go to the Manor House grounds and enter the house itself. Go Up and N to the Study and take the Ladder.

Next move S and E, open and examine the cabinet then take the Slippers and leave the Manor House. From there go to the Crossroads and then N, N and W. Drop the Ladder, climb it and examine the hollow to disclose the jacket. Examination of the jacket produces a silver key which you should take back to the Manor House.

Once inside, go N from the bottom of the stairs to the Lounge. Open the closet, examine it and then do the same with the skeleton. Take the skeleton key and return to the Crossroads.

From here go S to the Village Green and then W to the Village Hall. Open the Hall and go inside, examine the goods to reveal the shoes and take them.

Finally to complete this section of the adventure, return to the Muse and give her the slippers and then go back to the Manor House, go upstairs and W to Ballerina and give her the shoes.

## Disc problems

The lads at Heyley Software tell me that some folk have been experiencing difficulties with the SAVE/LOAD aspect of some of their disc-based adventures.

There are two solutions: If you have a twin disc drive, put the save position disc in drive 1 and leave the program disc in drive 0. Alternatively, return the disc to them and they will send you a bug free copy. Future adventures will not have this problem.

## Further into the Dungeon

Stuart Booth's approach to solving **Dungeon Adventure** differed radically from mine in the middle part of the game. After I had dealt with the carnivorous jelly – see last month's column – I carefully explored the ramp area. Stuart, on the other hand, moved out on to the Face and became upwardly mobile as you'll see.

Once on the Face, move to the nose and then climb the stairs to the Gatehouse. Ignore the disappearing Dwarf at this point and instead enter the nearest gully to avoid being killed by the rolling boulder.

Once you are at the Gatehouse, SAY PASSWORD is the *Open Sesame* while at the main door N of the bridge, you need to BLOW the Stick before it will open and admit you.

Once you are inside, locate the Throne Room and go S and down the ramp. Now you must move around until you are picked up by the Roc.

In the Roc's nest you should take the Rock Crystal and the Caterpillar. Hug or squeeze the Caterpillar so that it extrudes the rope, you need to take this and fasten it so that you can climb down from the nest. Abandon the Caterpillar now as it has no further use.

Below the nest you must get the Will o' the Wisp from the muddy puddle. It is a light source so you can drop the Driftwood here. If you enter LOOK anywhere near the ramp, you will discover the Face Mask.

Go West twice from the Powdery Peat to the Pit and there you'll find the Gem. Hitting it with the Hammer will destroy its baneful influence on you and the Ghostly Orcs.

Exercise monumental self-control and ignore the Silver Collar. Instead climb back up and return to the Throne Room past where the Ghostly Orcs

used to be. Once you are on the Throne press button four.

This deposits you in the Odd Little Room where you'll find the Collar (Mithril). Wear it and then get the Lapis Lazuli and Onyx Oryx, put them and the Crystal, Stick, Face and Figurine into the Packing Case – which you should always carry.

Finally, climb back up to the Throne, and press button five, but make sure you are carrying an *odd* number of objects – use the Violet Collar as a make-weight if needed. Button eight on the Throne provides information and nine teleports you back into the Pit.

Now that you have the Mithril Collar you can go almost anywhere you like: Simply climb on to a coloured Pedestal and enter a colour and you will be transported to the pedestal of the colour you chose.



entrance. The precise input he needs here is MEET CHUBBY.

Mark Thomas is a bit stuck in **The Price of Magik** – I think his main problem is that he rejuvenates too early. You can only renew your youth *twice* during the adventure and so you must plan carefully and do it at the last moment. Apart from that he is totally insane but stuck at the door in the Stone Room.

This door poses just about the trickiest puzzle in the whole adventure: Cast ESP beyond it, cast BOM at the Idol, cast ESP again and then HYP to control the Idol. Now cast ESP again and tell the Idol to open the door.

Martin also has problems with the adventure **L** – in view of the fact that a great many readers are in difficulties with this game, I'm going to provide the full solution in this column soon.

# Library

**ALTHOUGH** we receive dozens of Library submissions every month we can only print a few. One of the main criteria of their selection, apart from their usefulness, is the quality of the documentation. So if you want to stand a better chance of getting your program published make sure you send details about what it does and how it works. This month we have an interesting selection of routines, including an easier way to access the front end memory from a second processor. There's also an Archimedes routine to help you debug programs or even write simple languages and, finally, there's a pretty print text display program.

**Title:** Read/Write I/O Processor  
**Language:** 6502  
**Author:** Pieter Allaart

When using 6502 second and co-processors, reading from and writing to the front end memory is far more complicated than simple LDA and STA commands.

The official way is to use the Osword at &FFF1, with the Accumulator set to either 5 for reading or 6 for writing, while X and Y point to a five-byte control block which contains the address and the byte to be read or written. As all this takes a lot of instructions, it would be useful if we had a special subroutine to perform this dreadful task for us.

The listing here does this: To incorporate it into your own programs just copy lines 240-440. You can then use the routine by setting !block to the address of the byte you want to access and set A to the value to be written. The routine automatically increments the address so repeated calls can be made without altering !block.

**Title:** Word wrap

Pretty printing from programs is always tricky to achieve so here's a routine that will print text in any mode without splitting words. It can also print in Mode 7 colours with any defined window width.

The program will work on any BBC Micro – but if you have Basic I then line 580 should be changed to:

after you've made sure you've typed it in correctly using Get it Right!

All the text to be printed should be in lower case unless you have text which needs to be in capitals. When a full stop, question or exclamation mark are encountered a space is inserted and the next character is made a capital – for a comma and semi-colon just a space is added. However if any of these characters would appear at the start of a new line they are not printed at all – but the next character is still capitalised.

Additionally there is not the 255 character limit as there is in Basic – if you load text direct from a word

processor whole text blocks will be printed regardless of length until a Return is encountered.

Capitals are generated by ANDing with 95, so if you follow a stop with other characters you can generate interesting control code actions. For example "(" generates a backspace and "-" is a Return. The program is

ideal for adventure games and educational programs where lots of text needs to be printed for easy reading.

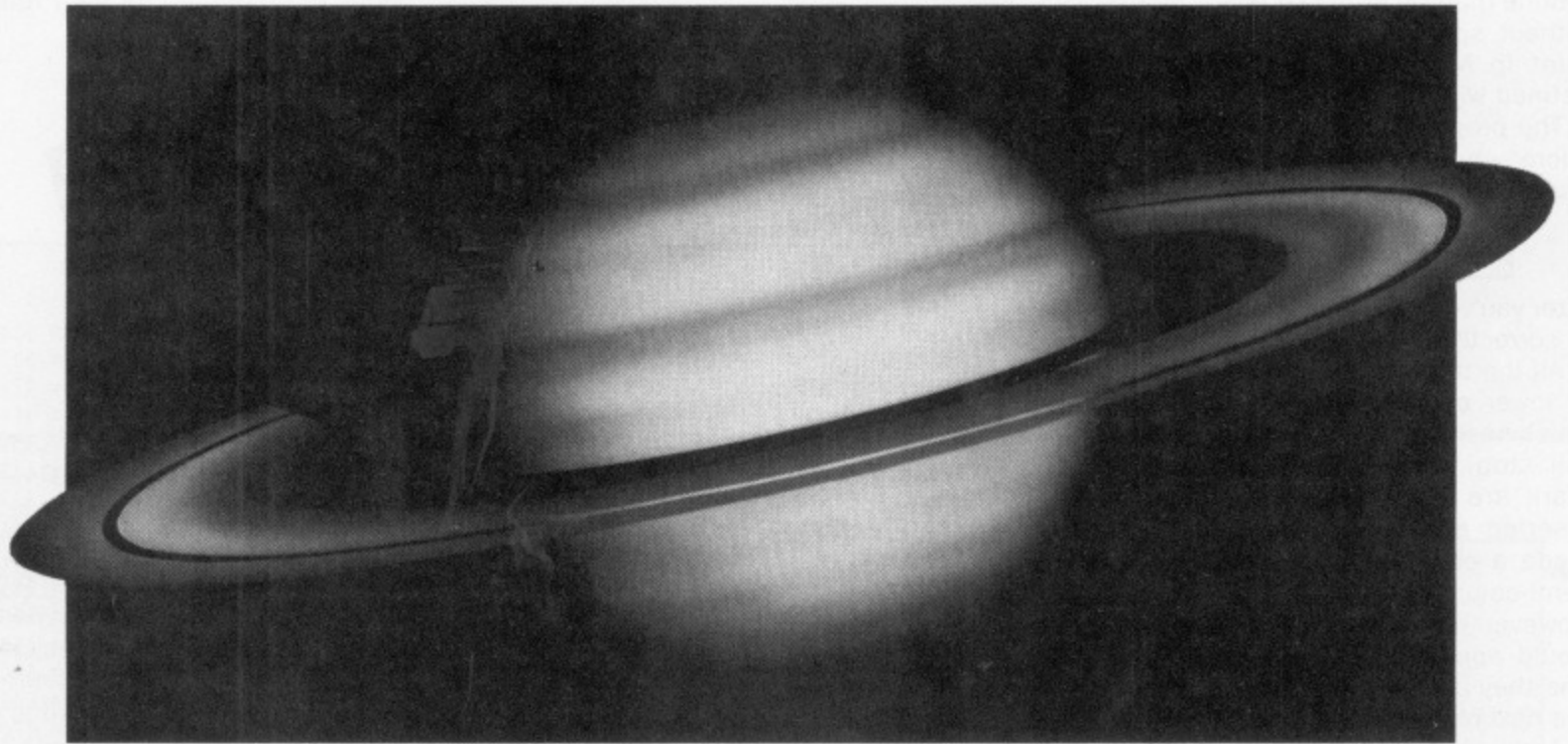

## The Empire Strikes Back ... the sequel

LAST March I reviewed the BBC Micro version of the Atari arcade hit Star Wars in which the Empire received a real pummelling from the rebel pilots. Now comes The Empire Strikes Back in which an extremely miffed Darth Vader launches a concerted attack against the rebel forces.

Before beginning the game you are given the opportunity to re-define the control keys – a useful and very welcome feature. Unfortunately, you are limited to using letters only – the ? \* and Return keys are not acceptable. Along with Z and X, these must be the most common preference for computer gamers.

The Empire Strikes Back uses the same multi-game format as its predecessor, with Probots, Walkers, Tie fighters and asteroids forming the four sections to be played. They all employ the same vector graphics used in the Star Wars program.

The Probots are tall mechanical devices that scour the rebel planet in search of your secret base. Sat astride your snowspeeder you dodge enemy laser bolts and return fire,



destroying as many Probots as possible.

No matter how well you perform in this first section the Imperial forces still manage to get a fix on your base and section two begins. Lord Vader dispatches a whole battalion of Imperial Walkers to destroy the rebel power generator – these are of two types, the small but nimble AT-STs, and the huge lumbering AT-ATs.

The two legged AT-STs fire at you, but can be destroyed with laser fire. The larger elephantine AT-ATs are practically invulnerable to your puny lasers, but will fall foul of a strategically fired tow cable. A direct hit causes the machine to sink to its knees before exploding – a very nice touch.

Section three is a repeat of the Tie-fighter attack that proved to be the high spot of the Star Wars game. Assuming the role of Han Solo, you pilot the Millennium Falcon in a fast and furious dog fight against a squadron of Imperial fighters. The auto-repeating fire button is very welcome as things begin to heat up.

Then comes the final section of the game: The asteroid field. No matter how many times I attempted to negotiate this one, I always fell foul of one asteroid too many. The huge angular shapes proved to be impervious to laser fire and practically impossible to dodge. Give us a chance, Domark.

You are given the option to start the game on any one of three difficulty levels, although they all seemed very similar to me.

The Empire Strikes Back is an all-action, zap and blast, arcade game and even better than Star Wars.

You have some defence though: You can shoot with a forward gun/laser, run away, jump into hyperspace or kill everything on screen using a smart bomb. Points are gained for destroying the enemy and for returning captured men to the ground. After 10,000 points you get an extra life and another smart bomb.

If you liked Defender or any of its clones this version will not disappoint you. It is fast – too fast for me – and smooth. It has a pause facility and redefinable keys so that when the Return key is ruined by the hammering it gets from your trigger finger you can still play the game. There is a high score table and the sound is optional.

There are 99 different levels and at higher levels the number of monsters increases – I have counted 50 objects moving on the screen at one time with no perceptible slowing down of the action. The sprites – created using Minerva's own soon-to-be-released Atelier – are clear and move smoothly with both colour and shade used to very good effect, although some are a little small.

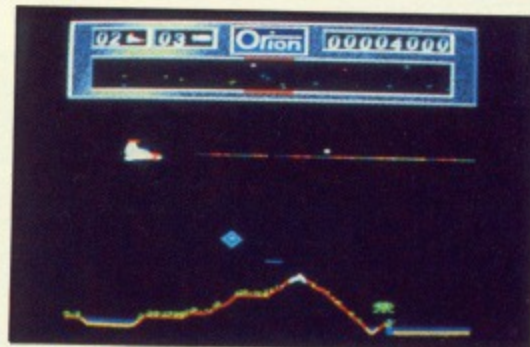
But what makes this game is the sound: Lucas Fowler, B.J. Stearne and Merlyn Kline have either a very good sense of humour or a very weird sense of relevant sounds. If you manage to shoot a lander which has captured a man you are greeted by the sound of a falling piano.

When the Nike trainer gets destroyed the resulting explosion has the same tonal quality of a banger going off inside an empty baked bean tin. While if you foolishly allow a lander to change into a mutant it rushes at your ship like a pair of fighting cats.

My 12-year-old daughter has fast reactions and nimble fingers, and her squeals of delight pay tribute to the enjoyment that this game's sound effects can give.

I only have one complaint, and that is not with any aspect of the software but with the time taken for it to load – it takes well over a minute before the spacebar can be pressed to start the action. When I first booted the disc I thought that there was something wrong.

The disc drive seemed to make several attempts to load



before finally presenting the opening titles. Minerva says that this is due to the large amount of code which has to be loaded – more than 500k of sprite and sound data – and not to the copy protection system.

This high quality product is an excellent example of a very well-known game that you either love or hate. I think that lots of you will part with £14.95 for a copy.

## Pipeline ... going down the tubes

IN an effort to supplement Earth's dwindling supplies of sulphur, a mining operation was established on Io, one of Jupiter's moons. However, recent volcanic activity has surrounded the robot-controlled mining platform with a sea of burning sulphur.

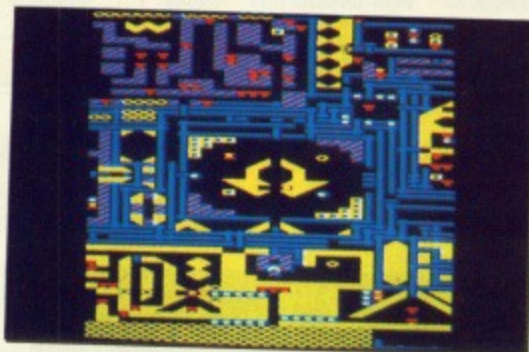
So desperate is Earth's need for the precious chemical that you have been sent to Io to collect every single drum and close down all four mining platforms.

Arcade/adventure games have become something of a trademark for Superior, with classics such as Ravenskull and the Repton series. The dimensions of Pipeline make the little green lizard look like a screen from Pacman.

If you were impressed when you first examined the map of Repton 3, prepare to be amazed by the Pipeline layout – each of the four levels is twice the size of a Repton scenario.

Ever conscious of the value for money offered by the budget software houses, Pipeline has been beefed up into a top notch package. Not only do you receive the best arcade/adventure game on the market, you also get a character designer, level designer and mission generator. Added to which Superior is offering to market the best original game created with these utilities.

At first glance Pipeline resembles Ravenskull – the action is viewed from above while a space-suited hero scuttles around a beautifully drawn, but deadly, maze.



As you appear at the start of level one it doesn't take long for you to realise that you have materialised inside a sealed compound. Ignoring this fact for the moment, you begin to collect sulphur drums.

By the time you have gathered all the available sulphur you will also have found a remote control unit and a set of blueprints. Though the remote control unit has little effect, the blueprints teleport you to the inner reaches of the mining platform.

The place where you appear just happens to be a room with two exits – the first guarded by a control robot, the second blocked by a locked manhole cover. It is at this point that you are expected to discover the significance of the remote control unit – it moves manhole covers.

Examination of your surroundings reveals a distinct lack of sulphur drums and it is now time to enter the Pipeline. This is a complex network of pipes through which the sulphur is normally pumped. Since the platform is no longer active it can be used as a means of getting from A to B – unfor-

tunately you have no idea where B is.

Summoning your courage you step into the Pipeline. Using multi-directional scrolling at breakneck speed the display traces your passage through the twisted network. If you are lucky the terminus will not consist of a bubbling sulphur pit or an oncoming fireball.

Flames can be of two types – stationary or mobile. The former are only a problem when you are racing to complete the level before the countdown expires. The latter follow pre-determined routes through their own sections of maze and are a major cause of premature death due to their high rate of travel. You can only see a small proportion of the maze, so are very vulnerable to charging fireballs.

There are 16 different objects to be found in the maze – including mallets, space burgers, spanners, magnets, lasers, explosives, detonators and one control robot.

One word of warning to those who have a comprehensive selection of roms fitted – I found it necessary to disable each one before the program would run.

Pipeline is a masterpiece of brain-twisting entertainment. If Rubik ever turned his hand to computer programming he would produce something like this.

## Plague Planet ... catching a cold

ARCHIMEDES adventures are at last coming on to the market steadily and Plague Planet is available for the Archimedes as well as the BBC Micro. Initially, I played both versions simultaneously in order to make comparisons, but abandoned this technique as soon as I had made sure that the essential plot of the adventure was the same for both machines.

The Archimedes version I have seen runs under the 6502 emulator, and thus is a trifle slow – nice loading screen, though – but versions for sale are now written in ARM code and players will have the option of using keyboard or mouse to select input.

Good documentation and packaging include the offer of a well thought out sheet providing a choice between sensible hints and outright answers to puzzles.

Far in the future, mankind has spread among the stars and subsequent strife meant that planets became isolated until political stability returned once more, centred on Rigel IV. Now agents from there wander far and wide in attempt to reconstruct the Empire.

One such agent crash-lands on your own planet not far

from where you, an enterprising rural type, just happen to be.

The opening sequence includes an interesting chaining puzzle and a maze. You won't be able to map this one by dropping objects, but the solution is clearly signposted for the discriminating adventurer.

After wandering to and fro, collecting essential equipment and data, you are free to examine the crashed spacecraft in its' crater – always provided you have put in the necessary spadework, that is.

The task modules involved are as follows: Visit the village area to collect equipment, visit the crater to discover the ship, visit the village to collect information and then return to the spaceship.

I'm giving this additional help so that even beginners will have a stab at this entertaining and humorous adventure and get well on the way before facing any serious tasks.

Once you explore the spaceship seriously you will soon find that you are the unwitting agent of disaster – opening the ship released a deadly virus that will destroy you, and your whole planet in 10 days – unless, you can locate the essential ingredients of the antidote from the planets Arboreta, Zenthar, Aquaria and Vulcania.

I had to go back to the beginning on more than one occasion as I worked out the correct sequence of events and once I was well into the adventure before I found that I lacked the necessary esprit-de-corps to put a stop to inimical

activity. I must be too tidy minded.

This adventure was written using ALPS – the Adventure Language Programming System Rom and the ALPS Extension disc. The parser is certainly workmanlike, allowing input such as EXAMINE THE DOOR AND THEN OPEN IT or DROP EVERYTHING AND GO NORTH THEN WEST.

However, I found one or two slight niggles – for instance, it is essential to throw a rope at a certain location if you are to rise above your problems. Having done so, I read *You can see a strong fence post with a rope tied to it and a coiled up rope*, where in fact there was only one rope. A status flag had not been properly reset, and I almost got into trouble.

Similarly, at one point when a piece of paper fluttered to the ground, I couldn't GET PAPER – but the item was there – and was described accurately (but differently) as I discovered on entering LOOK. Don't let these niggles put you off, though. A product well worth buying for either micro.

## Triple Decker volumes 7 & 8 ... games galore

DELVING once more into the seemingly bottomless pit of budget software, Alternative has put together volumes seven and eight of its rapidly expanding Triple Decker range.

Triple Decker volume seven opens with **Atom Smash** – a game which shuns conventional theories on sub-atomic physics in favour of the Alternative approach.

The nucleus of every element up to number 17 in the periodic table has become unstable. In an effort to rectify this situation you and your ship have been miniaturised and armed with a supply of gluons – sub-atomic particles of the boson variety that bind quarks in hadrons. They are represented as red blobs.

Starting with hydrogen, you must collect a gluon from the warehouse and fly it to the docking point on the nucleus. This process has to be repeated five times while avoiding the single electron that bounces around the screen. Logically enough, the number of electrons increases as you progress through the periodic table. This is a simple game that is well programmed and fun to play.

**Knockout** is a version of Breakout that has been turned on its head – presumably because it makes the programming easier. At the top of the screen a cannon ball floats horizontally right and left – below this a brick wall advances skywards. The aim is to smash every brick before the wall reaches the cannon ball.

Having eliminated the traditional bat from the game you are restricted to pressing the spacebar whenever you want to drop the ball vertically from its current position.

Even before the demolition of the first wall is complete, a second wall has appeared and is heading your way... will this torment ever end?

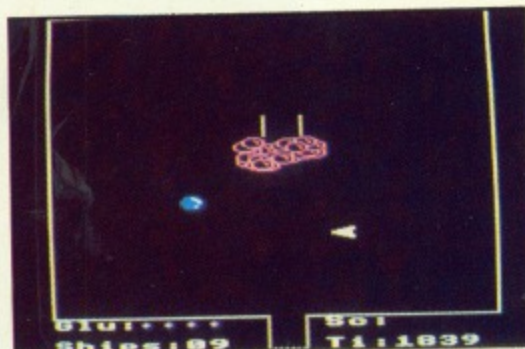
If you have failed miserably at either of the first two games it could just be that your faculties are waning and the old

reflexes just aren't what they used to be. Program number three – **Reaction Tester** – will let you know, to one hundredth of a second, just how fast you really are.

Using a traffic light system, the program flashes a red, yellow then green bar on the screen. As soon as the green bar appears you must press the spacebar. This action stops the clock and displays your time along with a rating from excellent to poor.

The first game of Triple Decker eight is **Grebit**, an excellent version of the arcade classic Frogger. Your task is to guide the ambling amphibian from his starting point on one side of the M25 to his lily pond on the far side of a raging torrent.

With a total of nine lives to play with, you may think that it's all going to be a piece of cake, but don't believe it.

My only grumbles are the lack of sound when the frog jumps and the poor choice of colours – the frog is practically invisible when sitting on one of the swimming turtles.

In **Mr. Freeze** you are the proprietor of a successful frozen food company, so successful in fact that an unscrupulous rival has sabotaged your warehouse – represented by a screenful of ice blocks, between which have been placed a number of electric fires. As each fire is switched on its countdown timer begins to tick – if this reaches zero before you reach it then you lose a life.

You can only run on the ice blocks – which promptly melt as you leave them. Movement is allowed in both the vertical



and horizontal planes, and you may also slide a row of ice blocks left or right. Unfortunately only half of the last sentence is true – my Mr. Freeze was limited to vertical movement only and the ice blocks refused to travel in any direction but left.

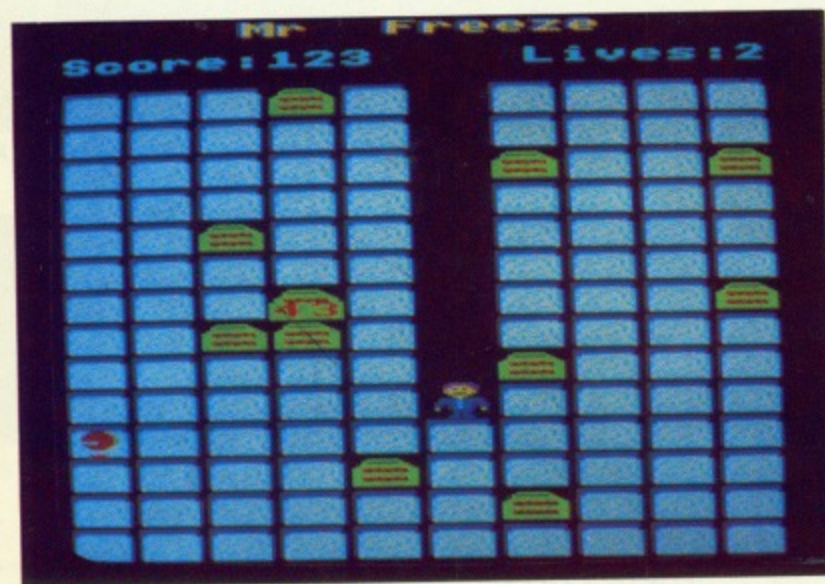
The final game, **Fruit Worm**, follows the adventures of a small worm with a voracious appetite for fruit. Moving at a steady pace, you must guide the worm between rocks in its search for nourishment. However, the more it eats, the longer it becomes, until finally it bites its own tail and the game ends.

Fruit Worm looked quite good, but was completely unplayable due to a nasty bug – as soon as I pressed any key to begin the game the worm shot off to the right and promptly died on the garden fence!

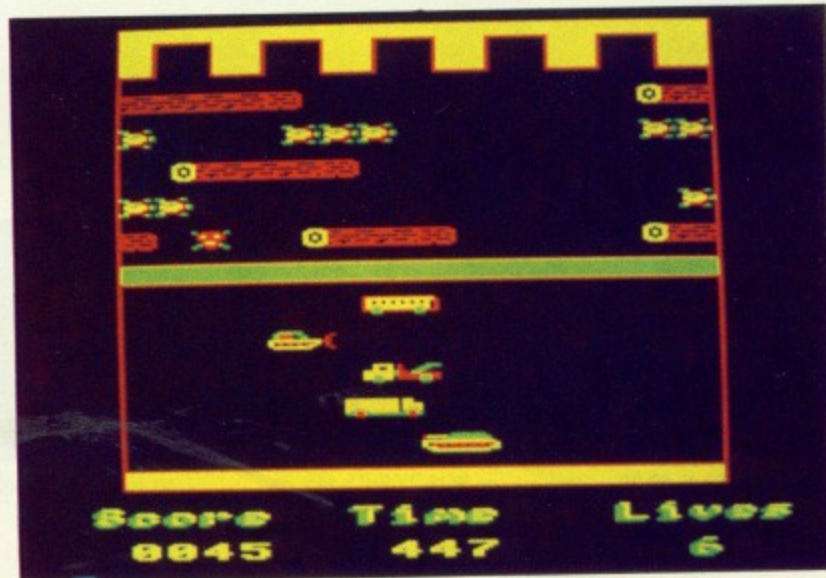
Triple Decker volume eight would have easily out-classed volume seven were it not for the bugs. My copy may have been unrepresentative, but hang on to your receipt just in case.

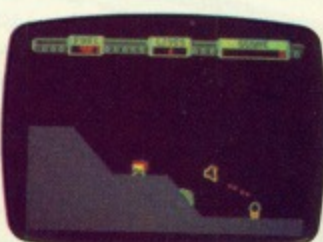

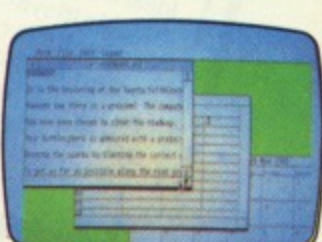

# A taste for adventure

*Howard Roberts looks at the Archimedes games scene*

**F**ANS of text-only adventure games will almost certainly have heard of Infocom – the most famous producer of micro adventure games in the world. The company has many excellent titles to its credit, including *Zork*, *Enchanter* and *Deadline*.

Until now Infocom products have not been available for Acorn machines, partly due to the memory required. However, with the appearance of the Archimedes PC Emulator, we can now play them. The titles looked at here are three of the most famous available from this prolific company and can all be played using the emulator.

Products: *The Hitch Hiker's Guide to the Galaxy*,  
*Leather Goddesses of Phobos* and *Bureacracy*

The Hitch Hiker's Guide to the Galaxy is a game based on Douglas Adams' hilarious storyline. Indeed, he's credited as co-author and the text certainly shows touches of his original sense of humour. You start as Arthur Dent, minutes before your house is to be demolished by several large yellow bulldozers. You face the problem of waking with a monumental hangover, trying to find an aspirin and having *no tea*.

The game follows the original storyline closely until you leave the planet with Ford Prefect, your pal from Betelgeuse. From there on the puzzles are new, although old favourites do make an appearance: The Infinite Improbability Drive, The Ravenous Bugblatter Beast of Traal and, of course, Marvin the Paranoid Android.

As an Infocom adventurer, you are nobody until you have solved the Babel Fish puzzle. The problem is that you need to get the fish in your ear. There is an all-but inexhaustible supply of them in a large tank in the wall and upon activating the dispenser, one flies out and disappears through a hole in the wall.

You can cover up the hole and release another fish, only for it to bounce off your cover and fall through a grate in the floor. The puzzle continues in this vein for another three or four obstacles until you finally manage to obtain the fish. This puzzle is one of the finest I have come across.

Despite all this praise, Hitch Hiker falls down mainly in not having any sort of coherent plot or finale. However, my main feeling when finishing this game was *Wow! When is the sequel coming out?* I would recommend it unreservedly to



moderately experienced adventurers – but it's not a game for beginners.

The provocatively titled **Leather Goddesses of Phobos** is actually a spoof on 1930's pulp sci-fi magazines where scantily dressed Amazons strode the Galaxy in thigh-length boots and bulging bikinis.

You're cast as an innocent citizen – gender determined very early on – kidnapped by tentacled aliens and transported to Phobos, one of the moons of Mars where the Leather Goddesses are plotting to enslave the people of Earth and make them their lifelong servants.

The title should give some suggestion as to what the main preoccupation of the game is. If you haven't guessed perhaps the message at the start of the game: *You feel an urge*, will give you a clue, along with the fact that there are two playing modes: *Lewd* and *Suggestive*. When you enter Lewd mode you are asked for your age any value lower than 18 results in the program playing Suggestive mode.

The text is not particularly ribald and instead takes the form of obvious innuendo. For example, if you get captured in the prison you are disposed

of by the prison doctor with objects as varied as a tub of yoghurt, some long rubber hosing and a yak. None of the puzzles are obscenely biological and, rather than being nastily presented, they're often quite humorous.

There is a warning at the beginning of this game that some of the material may be distasteful to some people, though the author makes his views clearly felt about the sort of people who treat it as pornography rather than as a bit of fun. Overall this is a good game that would be quite suitable for the beginner who enjoys a little harmless innuendo.

I have just one thing to say about Bureacracy: Aarrgghh! It's slowly driving me insane as, no doubt, Douglas Adams would be very pleased to hear. He has decided to share his problems bundled in red tape with us all and it is a complete change of scenario from Hitch Hiker.

You have just been employed by the Happitec Corporation and are due to attend an all-expenses-paid training seminar in Paris. However, you have just moved house and your payment cheque has, of course, been sent to your old address because the bank's computer wasn't too happy with your change-of-address form.

The new owner of your old house has left a message on your answering machine to the effect that he wasn't too pleased about the dry rot you

forgot to tell him about and refuses to forward your mail.

You are left completely penniless, in an empty house, trying desperately to find some money so that you can catch your flight to Paris. Your one hope is the bank but, unfortunately, it has a rule that you must have more than 10 dollars in your account at any given time. You happen to have exactly that amount so any request for withdrawal is refused.

This game is proof that an adventure doesn't need to have more than 100 locations to be good. In fact, I would be surprised if there are more than 50. Your basic surroundings are your street, the houses and shops on it including a bookshop, a fast-food restaurant and the bank.

Don't buy this game if you are a beginner or have no patience. I considered myself, as an adventure writer, experienced in this field, but I have now been put in my place – though it helps knowing that the highest score I have heard of so far is a mere 10. You have been warned.

For a little light relief, there are a few silly items included in the packaging of all the adventures. In Bureacracy you are presented with a copy of Popular Paranoia Magazine and in Hitch Hiker there's a pair of peril-sensitive sunglasses – totally black. I'll leave you to discover for yourself what comes with Leather Goddesses.

Finally, the recommended selling price of these games is quite high but they're worth it.

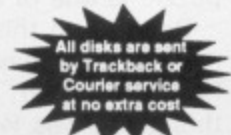

# PROBLEM SOLVED

## Backup puzzle

AT our school we have a number of Masters and a BBC B, OS1.2. There's also a double disc drive, a number of single drives and a Viglen duck to connect two single drives. We have some ADFS 80 track discs we want to backup and convert to DFS.

The BBC B uses the duck but has no ADFS and the Masters, OS 3.20, corrupt discs when using the duck. How do we backup the discs? — **Paul Watts, Guildford, Surrey.**

● *You could always remove one of the terminating resistors from a disc drive and use the duck with the Master. However, perhaps the simplest solution is to link the two machines via the serial port and use some communications software to transfer the files — you could even just type \*FX2,1 on the Master and \*FX3,1 on the BBC B then just LIST from one to the other.*

*Finally you could perform a tedious sequence of loading a file, changing the filing system and disc and saving it again on the Master alone.*

## Cure for old age?

CAN you offer a solution to the problem my issue 4 BBC Micro is giving me? It's just celebrated its fifth birthday, so I suppose I'm due for some technical hassle. The machine continually crashes and then won't accept any keyboard input except Break, and often this fails to improve anything.

Occasionally it outputs "OSCLIOSCLI" as it goes down. Does this mean anything to you? The crashes have become very frequent so effectively my faithful BBC Micro is out for the count. — **Sheldon Young, Westgate, Co. Durham.**

● *You'd probably shout "OSCLIOSCLI" if you were about to crash. All this tells me, however, is that you have Basic 2 in your machine.*

*Micros — like people — grow old, and common to both is that they can suffer from bad joints. This is especially true of any non-soldered ones such as the keyboard connector and the power feeds to the main board. While it could be a component that is getting fragile and doing a nose dive as soon as it gets the slightest bit warm, it is more likely that an overall re-crimp*

*might rejuvenate your machine.*

*Remove the power leads and give the connectors a squeeze with some pliers so they tighten their grip on the connecting spades. Try reversing the keyboard connecting ribbon and the old standby of pushing all the chips down firmly. If this does not do the trick you'll have to take it to your local service centre where they can put it on a life support system and find out what is failing.*

## Getting control

I WOULD like to build a small maze-solving buggy controlled and guided by an on-board micro.

The first problem to solve is what micro to use, and this is where your vast knowledge and experience come in. Obviously as a BBC Micro user, a 6502 based unit would be most appropriate. But the only small controller cards I have seen recently use Z80 and 8052 processors and I don't fancy the complexity and expense of a cross-assembler.

So, what I need is a board the size of a Euro-card — or smaller — with a CMOS 6502, one or two 6522s, 4k ram, 4k rom and so on. Do you know if anyone sells one at the moment or can you direct me to a suitable circuit diagram? — **Andy McClements, London SE16.**

● *Several people make 6502 controller boards and I have reviewed several in the past. Two that spring to mind are CMS (0223 324141) and Lancaster Consultants (0524 65179). As you say it's not a particularly difficult thing to make.*

*As to cross assemblers, they are not very difficult to write in Basic although slow and without the fancy facilities of commercial systems.*

## Pie in the sky

RECENTLY my friend and I bought Double Phantom by Doctor Software: An excellent flight simulator that requires two BBC Micros and a supplied link which uses the user port. We wondered — as we live nearly two miles away from each other — if it is possible to create a radio link between the two user ports.

The only physical obstruction between our houses are other houses. Another idea we had

was to link through the mains wiring itself.

We hope that you will be able to find the solution to our problem as we don't think that rucksacks are very healthy for BBC Micros! — **Neil Burgess and Gregroy Emms (aged 15), East Barnet, Herts.**

● Unfortunately there is no simple solution to this problem. Radio link requires that you are both licensed radio amateurs and then you would need to transmit and receive at the same time. This is known as duplex communications and the problem with this is that the transmitter de-sensitises the receiver so nothing can be received. This can be overcome, but it is technically difficult.

Communications through the mains supply is possible but mains is generated in three phases with only one phase being fed to any house. If you and your friends' houses are on different phases there is no way you can get through. In addition long distance mains communications are often difficult due to fall off in power with distance and the filtering that is periodically distributed around.

Infra-red or ultrasonic links are possible but you may have trouble generating the necessary power to cover the distance. One solution might be to try earth communications.

*This is a little known technique that I first tried*

*when I was your age — a little over 20 years ago. Basically what you do is to bury two biscuit tins as far apart as possible and wire them up to an audio amplifier.*

*You then pump a signal into the ground and pick it up on a similar arrangement fed to the input of an amplifier. Maximum range is about one mile with 50 watts of audio. Depending upon the impedance of your earth you might have to use a matching transformer to achieve optimum coupling between the amplifier and earth. You could then use a modem to send audio signals. I rang the DTI — Department of Trade and Industry — who licence communications and they were not aware of any restrictions on this.*

*Summing up, it's probably easier to move the micros.*

## More lines for the micro

I AM building a project for my GCSE technology which requires 12 output lines from the micro. A friend told me that one of your Body Building projects was to use the 1MHz bus as a user port.

Please could you tell me which issue this was in and whether the kit is available from Musbury Consultants? Also, I own an Electron with ACP's

AP5 interface: The triple interface with user port, 1 MHz bus and Tube. The Electron's memory map is different from the BBC Micro's and therefore the above are accessed at different locations. Could you please tell me where? — **Paul Green, Lower Feltham, Middx.**

● The user port expansion board was published in the August 1985 issue of The Micro User and unfortunately the printed circuit board is no longer available. If you want to make it yourself send a SAE to Musbury Consultants who will send a photocopy of the artwork. However it's a double sided design with plated-through holes so it's a bit tricky to make.

A better solution — as you only need a few extra output lines — would be to use the printer port. However if you don't want to tie that up you can use the Multiplexer board — Pack 29 — that will give you 32 inputs and 32 outputs from the user port. This was described in the December 1985 issue of The Micro User and a few boards are left priced at £25.00 for the kit and £29.00 assembled.

The user port on the BBC Micro is at address &FE60 to &FE6F, the AP5 however has it at &FCB0 to &FCBF. Changing the software to reflect the new position of the port is an almost trivial task and should not prevent operation of any of the Body Building projects.

## Phantom keypress

I OWN a Master 128 and together with your excellent magazine I am happy. But recently I have come across a very annoying problem: When I turn my micro on everything seems fine then all of a sudden the number one comes up and automatically repeats itself and I have not even touched the keyboard.

The machine isn't overheating because it happens as soon as I turn it on. I'm not an expert but I have dusted and cleaned the inside of my computer to no avail. I would be very grateful if you could advise and possibly tell me the cause of my problem — **C. R. Broughton, Erdington. Birmingham.**

● The contacts of number one key switch must be resting together separated only by a thin oxide layer and occasionally this breaks down and you get the effect of the key being held down. The auto repeat facility then fires characters into the input buffer.

The most effective solution would be to replace the key with a new one, or failing that with one that is little used. As a temporary measure you could try inputting \*FX11,0 to turn off the auto repeat and so when your key sticks it only produces a single digit.

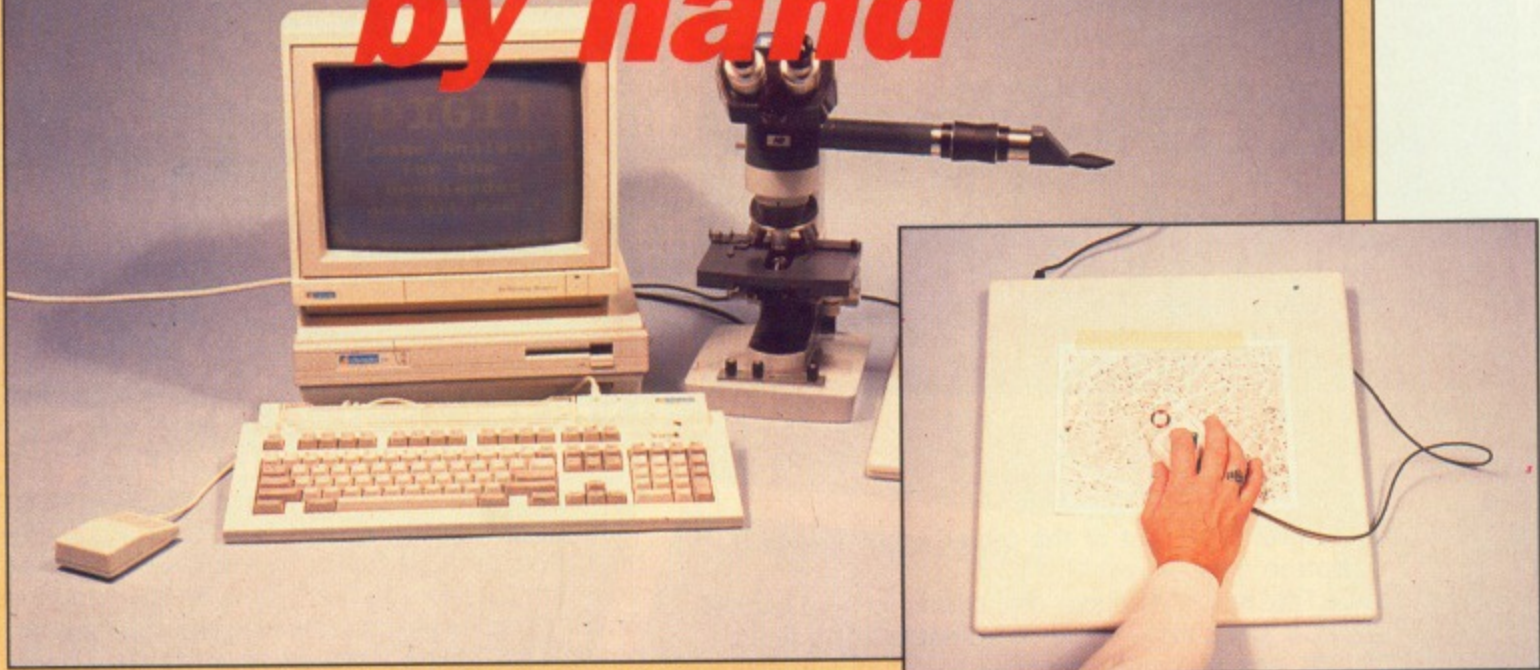


Figure II: Microscope, digitiser and Archimedes computer

**M**ANY fields of science require input and analysis of data concerning the spatial arrangement of structures. My own field of interest concerns the two and three dimensional arrangement of various components in body tissues and thus such data is frequently needed. In the past this has meant either spending long periods of time with inaccurate manual methods of measuring and hand-held calculators, or spending thousands of pounds on complex equipment. Now, for the first time, it's possible to use an accurate measuring system of reasonable price with BBC Micros.

Although the package we're looking at is for the Archimedes, there are versions for previous Acorn machines. For the review we used a Summagraphics Bit-pad 2 digitising tablet with cross-hair four button cursor, a 440 Archimedes – a 305 will suffice – and the Digit software.

Data is input by placing the crosshairs of the cursor on the subject on the digitising tablet and pressing a cursor button – Figure I. The image can be a photograph, a projected one or one viewed down a microscope using a drawing tube which enables you to see the digitising tablet and

the microscope slide at the same time – Figure II.

When the button is pressed the tablet sends the coordinates of the crosshair position to the computer via an RS232 link at 9600 baud – with the 1.24 RS232 fix from Acorn there were no problems with data flow.

The accuracy of the cursor in relation to the origin – bottom left of the active area of the tablet – is remarkable at 0.3mm, its resolution being 0.1mm and the active area of the tablet is 26.5x26.5cm. The Digit manual gives clear instructions for setting the three banks of DIP switches inside the Bit-pad to adjust baud rate, data format and so on. The Archimedes must also be configured with the correct baud rate and data format.

Booting the disc brings up the title screen – Figure III – followed by the menu, shown in Figure IV, which allows you to select from 10 options. The first three support data input from the digitiser in different modes: As individual points, distances between two points and as a stream of coordinates comprising a shape.

Digitising points is of particular value if you want to analyse the number of occurrences of groups of different structures in an area. Each instance of the first type of object is marked by pressing the cursor button once with the crosshairs over the object.

When all occurrences of the first type of object have been input, the same is done for any subsequent groups. The data can be displayed using the histogram option, and densities calculated using area data gathered using option three.

Using the shape option is easy: After selecting a filename for the data all you do is trace round the edges using the cursor with the button held down. The end of each shape is indicated by releasing the button and moving the cursor to the

strip on the right of the tablet and pressing the button once.

The micro displays the outline of the active area, the position and coordinates of the cursor and any digitised points — see Figure V. After 6,000 coordinates the machine interrupts data acquisition to store data on disc.

Option four provides the opportunity to display and print shape files. You can select a specific

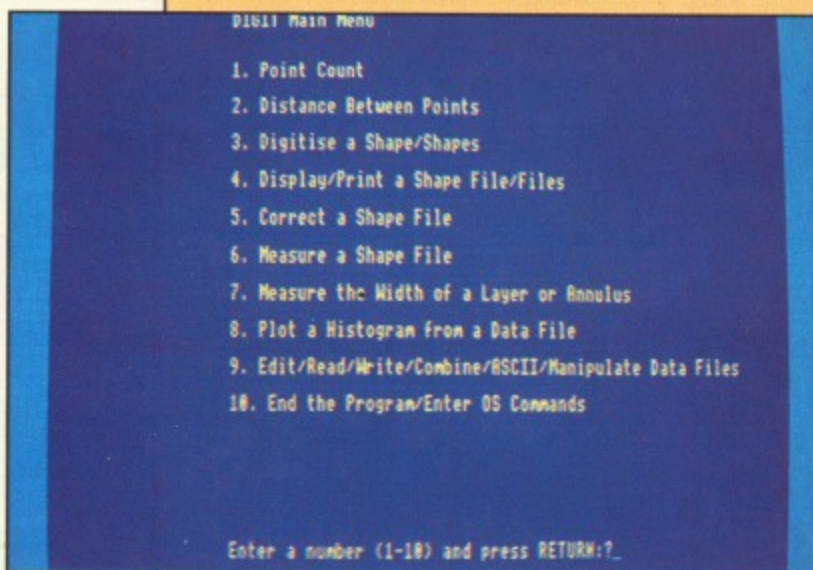


Figure IV: Main menu

area and enlarge or reduce it before printing.

As the input of data is so easy, a utility to correct a displayed shape is provided as option five. The file is entered, an output filename given and a comb size chosen. This selects the distance in 0.1mm increments required between two successive points before offering the second one for deletion. If you have a large number of points in the shape then editing them all — comb=1 — can take many hours.

The two most significant items available from the menu after the data input options — six and seven — allow measurements to be made on the digitised shapes. Selecting *Measure a shape*, prompts you for the filename containing the shape coordinates, for any reduction or enlargement factors and the appropriate units of length. There is an option to save one of the 20 measurements made to another file on the disc.

The shape is redrawn on the screen and the

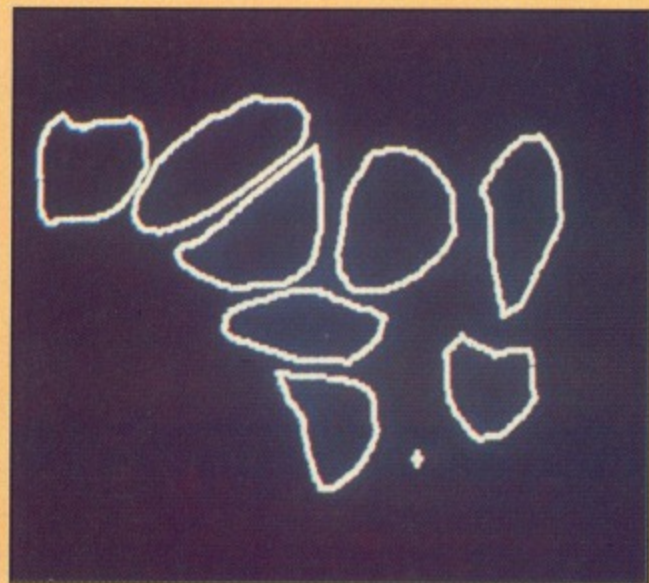


Figure V: Screen during shape data entry

first set of 10 measurements displayed almost immediately. Although it took less than one second on an Archimedes, it needed 14 seconds on a Compact for the first shape in the demo file Britain to be displayed. After the choice of a print-out you can select a further set of ten additional measurements which take a little longer to compute.

During this calculation a countdown is shown at the top of the screen, starting from 16 — it took seven seconds on the Archimedes and two minutes on the Compact, again using the Britain file. A sample printout from both sets of measurements is shown in Figure VI. The analysis then continues to the next shape in the file. Measurements are always displayed to 10 significant digits, regardless of the decimal point position.

The second measurement routine determines the minimum thickness or distance between two shapes. It accepts input from a file of two shapes which are displayed after the selection of any magnification factors and the appropriate units. The routine then takes each point on the first shape and finds the nearest point of the second shape and draws a line between the two, noting the distance.

As you might expect this takes a little time — 26 seconds for Archimedes and 4.45 minutes for Compact, using the Channel demo file. After testing every point in the first shape it displays the mean value for the measurements, the number made and the standard deviation. You can now save all the individual readings to disc.

There is also a superb histogram plotting

routine which will take a stream of data from any disc file. You can choose the increments on the X and Y axes and the labels for axes or leave the Archimedes to do it for you – a printout is shown in Figure VII.

The penultimate option from the base menu permits data file editing. You can create, read and write a data file, edit it, combine it with others and convert it to true Ascii format.

Perhaps the most powerful aspect of this collection of routines is the one that allows you to do calculations on data files from within the Digit

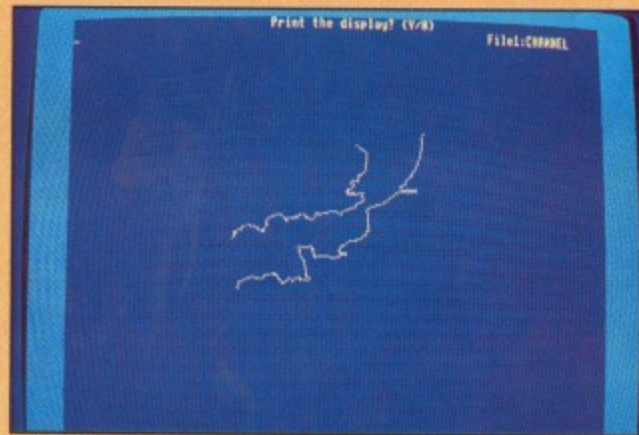


Figure VII: Printout of histogram from file Channel

program – without much effort it is possible to do simple stats by inputting formulae. You can leave the package using option 10.

The software comes on one disc and as it is all in Basic – except a data file for reprogramming the mouse pointer symbol – it's easy to modify to suit personal requirements and the author, Brian Hayes, is willing to discuss customised versions. The manual is in A4 format, 14 pages long and gives clear instructions about use of the bit-pad and the software.

I found the system particularly easy to use, fast and accurate. It compares favourably with much more expensive systems using the same industry standard Bit-pad – which is well made and also good value for money, even at the full price of just over £500. The software is very cheap and buying the two together saves a further £100.

There are three other support packages available: Distit, 3Digit and Dismap, each selling at £50. Distit provides nearest neighbour analysis, indicating whether the two-dimensional arrangement of structures is random or grouped. 3Digit constructs three-dimensional images from digitised 2D images, and Dismap displays contour maps of particle distributions. Brian Hayes also sells a simple hardware mod – £40 – which places a yellow light emitting diode over the cursor crosshairs, making them much easier to see down the microscope with the drawing tube.

### Teachers would welcome portables

MOVES to bring portable micros into the range of equipment available to schools could result from a survey showing the machines would be welcomed by teachers. The survey, of more than 300 teachers involved with information technology, revealed a strong demand for portables – though few can buy them because they are not yet approved or considered by most LEAs.

Organised by Cambridge Computer – manufacturer of the Z88 portable – the survey revealed that only 10 per cent of respondents already had portables – and many of these were micros on trolleys. However, 90 per cent of the teachers said there was a definite need for portable micros in schools and more than 60 per cent said they were essential.

Main benefits of portables were identified as their adaptability across the curriculum and convenience for field trips and home use.

Paul Streeter, sales manager of Cambridge Computer (0223 312216), said: "This report confirms there is a strong demand from teachers for portable micros, and it is very much in the hands of the LEAs to meet this requirement.

"Cost is no longer a barrier as prices have come down with the introduction of portable machines like the Z88 and Amstrad PPC. We are already working with two LEAs – Hertfordshire and Shropshire – which are taking portables as seriously as this survey suggests they should.

"They will be evaluating Z88s in classrooms during the current school year, and we expect more to follow their example during the next few months".

### Grant boosts micro music

SIGNS are that the government's IT Education Support Grant is giving a big boost to the use of micros in the music classroom. This is thanks to the ESG allowing local education authorities to buy computer systems for music teaching and to appoint specialist IT music advisory teachers who can introduce the technology into schools.

In the first nine months of this year 23 music IT advisory teachers were appointed by LEAs around the country. One of the largest LEAs, Cheshire County, has used the ESG to appoint two music IT advisory teachers and purchase 48 music systems from Hybrid Technology (0223 316910) for selected primary and secondary schools.

The BBC Micro-based Hybrid Music System is currently the sole computer music system approved for purchase under the ESG.

It includes a music synthesiser, keyboard, Midi and integrated music software. Its unique music

programming language Ample allows a wide range of additional educational materials and applications to be created by teachers and software developers.

### Education information

ANOTHER milestone has been achieved by the Microelectronics Information Service for Education, MISE, which is part of the Neris database.

More than 2,000 software items and publications on Neris are provided by MISE, which is operated by former MEP information officer Lynn Craig.

Her company, Creative Data (091-488 7249), has also placed bibliographical details of 75 publishers' products on Neris this year. "This is now the largest online source of software information available nationally to all those involved in education and IT", she said.

Creative Data also supplies hard copy versions of its full database – which covers reviews and information about the products of 1,000 publishers of software and books – at a cost of between £5 and £20. Negotiations are underway which may lead to the hard copy MISE data being made available through Neris.

### Science aid

A PACK of four BBC Micro and Master programs has been released by BBC Enterprises to accompany the Radio 4 educational series Inside Science.

The software is designed to provide further insight into four topics covered by the radio programmes – pollution, artificial intelligence, nuclear power and plastics.

The package costs £19.95 and can be used independently of the broadcasts.



## Prints of whales

*Shelley Gibson dives into a pack on seagoing mammals*

**H**AVING always had an interest in these large inoffensive mammals, it was with some pleasure that I turned to this package. Fitting nicely into the school theme of *The Living World*, this is a complete topic package which is becoming increasingly popular with the busy teacher. The pack consists of two different software discs, a set of slides with accompanying soundtrack, a teachers' handbook full of lesson plans and photo-copyable worksheets with a cassette of whale noises and songs. Further worksheets and posters will be available with the finished version.

The theme is presented from the ecological viewpoint, emphasising how whales and their relatives are becoming increasingly endangered. There is a great deal of scientific information but this is presented in a way that children of all abilities found it easy to relate to and understand. The approach avoids shock and horror tactics - something which often prevents subjects of this type being used with younger or sensitive children. Yet the message that man is driving these creatures to extinction is conveyed clearly.

The teachers' handbook provides a firm base around which to build the scheme of work. It caters for all ages from reception through to first or second year secondary, although with some adaptation this would be suitable for older children.

From a simple introduction explaining the nature and size of whales, the information

explores swimming, breathing and migration, ending with pictures and descriptions of all the various species. The book is American in origin and so there are the expected problems with spelling, the description of ages ranges by grade and the units of measure are not metric. Yet on the whole the worksheets are well set out, clear and interesting. Not too much information is put on each sheet and the activities vary.

Topologika does make teachers aware of the problems of the American origin with an insertion in the front of the resource book. The company feels that the cost of producing an English version is prohibitive and unnecessary and I must agree. There is nothing in the content which cannot be cured by selective usage and a spot of typists' correction fluid, and it would be a great shame if the American text discouraged the use of this otherwise excellent production:

The excellent slide package comes from the World Wildlife Fund and the soundtrack is distinct and easily understood - it kept my class rivetted for half an hour. You have the opportunity to pause the commentary, and there is plenty of time to swop slides for those of us without an automatic projector.

The least used part of the pack was the tape of whale noises and music, but even this was used to good effect in an assembly on the subject and as a general introduction. The software kept my class occupied and entertained, despite some problems with running of it. Though most of the problems were minor they seemed daunting.

Whale Facts is the database disc and consists of indexed, easily selectable pages of information concerning the whale with pictures and descriptions of the different species - linking

well with the quiz sheets elsewhere in the package. All pages can be easily dumped to a printer by pressing P. Every page is printed in clear type and uses simple language.

The children found it easy to find the information they needed – always opting to use the micro rather than the textbook. The most enjoyable part was being able to take away their personal copy of the information. They were also fascinated by the pictures, and made endless copies of these which they displayed in various ways. What was most impressive was the lack of a single spelling mistake – very rare for classroom databases.

The second piece of software is Whale Games which didn't go at all well with our school Econet. The simple solution is to type ?&224=&A6 before running the program which disables Econet.

The first offering is The Migration Game and is suitable for a single child or a group and tests their knowledge on whales to date. You are shown a map of the world and the various migration routes then you're asked a question and the correct answer has your whale progressing on its migration.

These are multiple choice questions and when you have spent as much time on reading the question as you want, pressing the spacebar will give you three possible correct answers and a time limit of 10 seconds. The quicker the response time the more points you will score. With the lower ability groups, interest was kept by speeding up the question reading time by appointing a group reader.

A nice touch is that wrongly answered questions will reappear later in the game. The first whale to reach warm water is the winner, and the results are stored for the teacher's information. The questions vary in difficulty and aspect and the provision of multiple choice answers made the less able in the class more confident to try.

The second game – Save the Whale – has you, a group of whales, a whaler, a helicopter and a conservation ship called Rainbow being the cast. The micro-controlled whaler and the helicopter are hunting the whales. The whales and Rainbow are controlled by an individual or group with the aim of getting your herd safely across the ocean. It is a simple way to improve directional skills and forward route planning while involving a lot of enjoyment by avoiding the whalers.

As with all the games the third – Ears that See



*The migration game*

– initially asks you what noise level you require – from loud to silent – which is a nice, and very necessary touch if the micro is in the classroom proper.

The game is based on echo location and teaches the identification of line orientation, visible or invisible mathematical shapes and finally you must identify the invisible shape before being eaten by a shark. The manual stresses that these are played in order. The concept and instruction are not simple, and would probably be best left to higher ability children.

The pack is well thought out and attractively presented as a whole. The programs use pleasant and clear graphics, bold text and interesting sound effects – there is not one single annoying jingle. A wide range of ages and abilities are catered for both on and off the micro. As all the components can be bought separately this is one of the best topic packages available.

**I**NSIDE Information is the title of a pack of learning materials containing software and text introducing you to information technology. It is aimed at the City and Guild Certificate course No 444, Inside Information, which is itself also aimed at those wanting a general introduction to IT, so the software could be used as part of any course on this subject.

The pack includes two audio cassettes containing four 35 minute programmes from the 1985 Radio 4 series, Inside Information. It is here that the basic problem lies – in the date. This package, though new, contains information current three years ago. The spoken commentary refers to acoustic couplers which are seldom used nowadays and the book claims that "MSX is too recent for anyone to be sure whether it will become the world standard for 8 bit micros..." Well, it didn't.

It is presented by Paul Heiney and many of the important aspects of IT are raised and covered, such as how micros work, the applications to which they are put and the impact of the electronic office. This is accompanied by an easy to read software manual, a student guide and a softback book by computer journalist Jacquetta Megarry. Having no particular flag to wave, she has written an eminently readable book covering in broader terms the same areas as the other material.

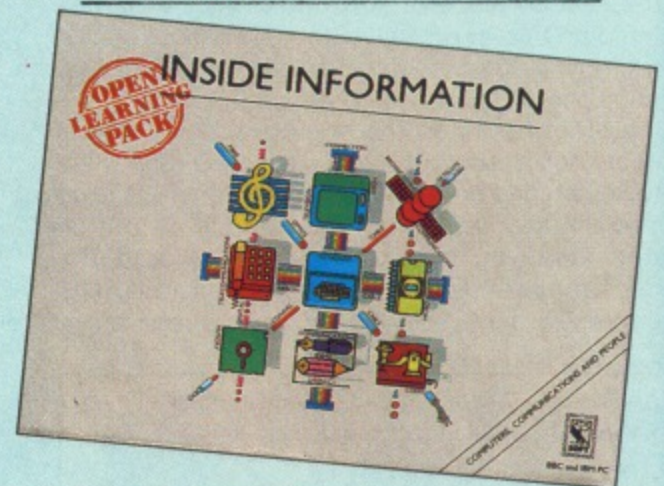
Software is provided in both BBC Micro DFS and MSdos formats with fairly minor differences between the two.

The description of applications of IT are interesting and vary from archaeological records to radio programmes. Paul Heiney enlists the help of a wide range of IT users and creates an easy to listen to commentary. My favourite quote is: "If you can kick it, it's hardware".

When you come to the software it is important to remember that the intention is not to present state of the art examples, but to demonstrate how the micro handles text. The word processing section is cumbersome and I found it confusing. However the TextDem program is more worthwhile as it shows how a typist would correct an error-

ridden piece of writing.

I also found other sections to be flawed: LidOff for example is written to show how a micro copes with keyboard input as direct commands or as a line of programming. Unfortunately abbreviations of keywords are not recognised and several structures such as FOR...NEXT loops are not implemented. The manual only lists a meagre 11 commands with which it can deal, but this hardly underlines the power of modern micros.

LidCalc and LidData are simple examples of a spreadsheet and database respectively and are more useful than the word processor. The programs are supplied with sample data files so that you can experiment. Though these programs are not fast or powerful they do show on screen what is happening inside your machines.

The spreadsheet option has been set up to show the effects of double glazing and carpets on heat loss from a living room. Though interesting, a more flexible context-free spreadsheet would have permitted more investigation.

The database does include this flexibility and a sample file concerning employees is included should you need it. The process of sorting data is deliberately slowed to demonstrate the algorithm used or conditional searches can be made. I was pleased that AND, OR and NOT are all implemented in the search conditions, thus the program is genuinely interesting to work with. Your results can be printed out in a variety of formats and this program is far superior to any of the others on the disc.

The last sample program is LidTurn, which includes a simple implementation of a lathe as an example of the way in which micros can control machines.

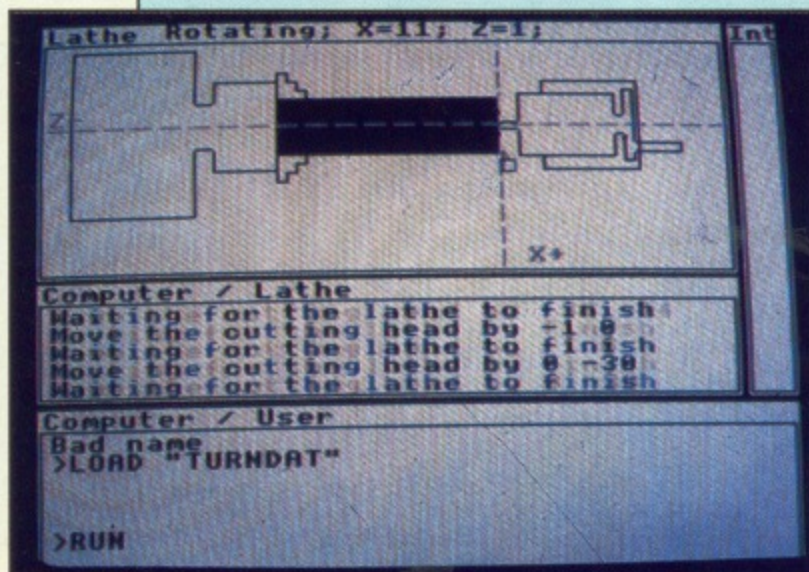
This is not a package for the casual buyer, though the book is well worth reading and will surely have a wide audience. However, I could only recommend the entire package to students considering the City and Guilds course.

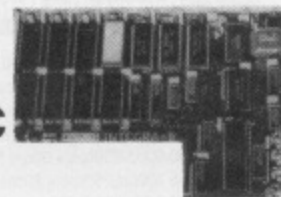

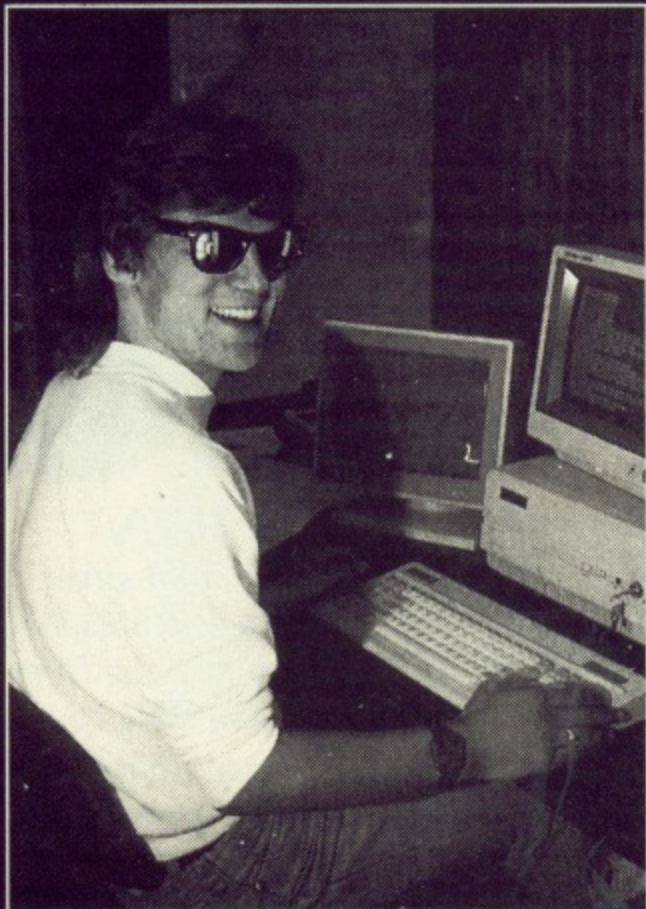

Neil Newell: Arch wizard at work

**D**EEP in the wooded wilds of Southern England, far beyond the Stockbroker Belt where no Yuppie has ever ventured, lives a mysterious being who has created a strange and mystical land. He is the Arch Wizard Hazeii – adopting the name of Neil Newell for everyday use – and the land is Shades.

No longer a figment of his imagination, Shades has been made accessible to any mere mortal who has the use of a telling bone, a modem and who is enrolled in the fabled society of MicroLink, Micronet and Telecom Gold.

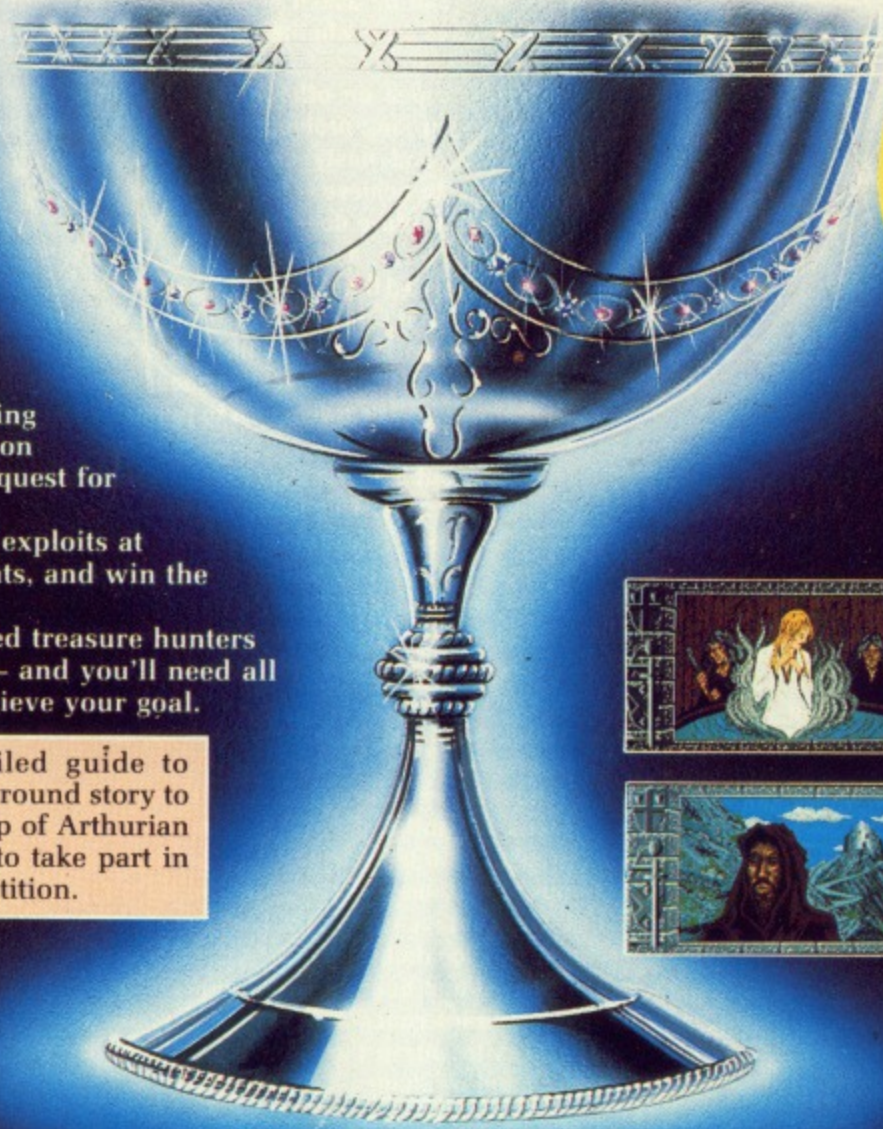

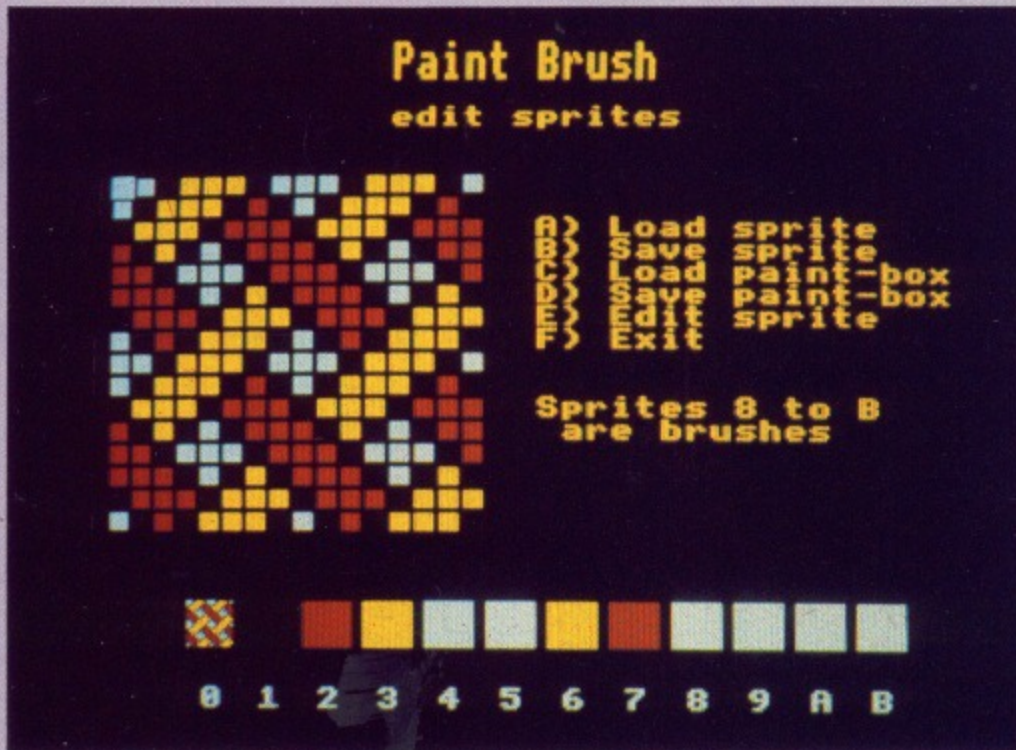

## Brush up on your colour

*Rob Anderson gives your micro a can of patterned paint*

**O**NE of the most practical features of CAD systems is the paint brush which enables pixels – points of colour – to be plotted on to a graphics screen with as little fuss as possible. Brush is a program that allows any user-defined pattern to be painted across a Mode 1 screen using a specified brush shape.

However, the pattern is not simply thrown on to the screen wherever the brush happens to be, but it is scrolled with the brush, giving a consistent pattern which always joins up no matter where the brush goes. In fact it acts as if you've got a can of patterned paint.

There is also a special feature to randomise the pixels of paint enabling shading and speckling effects to be created. And an editor is also included so that you can design your own patterns and brushes.

There are two programs to type in: Source – which creates the machine code screen handling routines – and Brush itself. Type in each separately and ensure you've made no typing errors

with Get it Right! Run Source to generate a file called PatObj, then you can run Brush.

The main menu gives you three options: Screen editing, pattern/brush editing or ending the program. Selecting option 1 prompts you for the Mode 1 screen filename to be edited. If you have no screens available you can create a blank one easily from Basic by typing:

```
MODE1:*SAVE screen1 3000 8000
```

before using Brush. And incidentally, whenever a filename is asked for you can issue a star command instead by prefixing the string with an asterisk – this is useful for checking disc catalogues.

You must also enter the filename under which the edited screen will be saved. The source screen is loaded and a destination file saved immediately to make sure there is room on the disc to hold the altered version. A square brush appears and the controls in this mode are shown in the panel on the left – notice that holding down the control key will speed up the brush movement.

There is a pull-down menu – selected with M – which allows you to select different patterns by pressing key 0 to 7 or a new brush with 8 to B. After choosing a brush it is possible to randomise its pixels by pressing R immediately after selection.

While in the menu a continuous sound – with pitch directly related to the brush speed – is produced and you can alter it using the up and

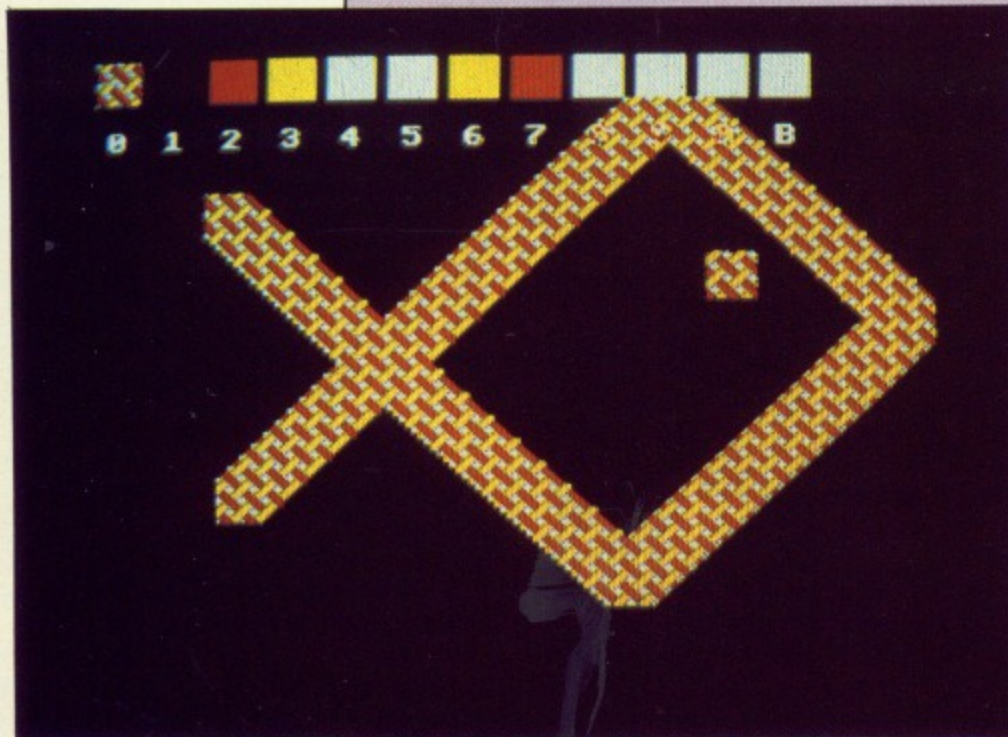

altered using the editor from option 2 of the main menu. Once in this a blown-up version of the currently selected brush or pattern is shown. The controls for this option are given in the panel above.

It's a good idea to save single brushes or patterns under one directory and complete sets – paint boxes – under another to avoid confusion when reloading the files.

Sprites 8 to B are the brushes and should only contain white pixels. But no checks are made to ensure this and some unusual and unpredictable spray effects can be created by using non-white colours in them. Pattern sprites saved using option B should not be re-loaded at a brush position and vice versa – although it does no harm.

So there you have it, an expert paint system on your BBC Micro. If you produce any interesting pictures using it we'd love to see them.

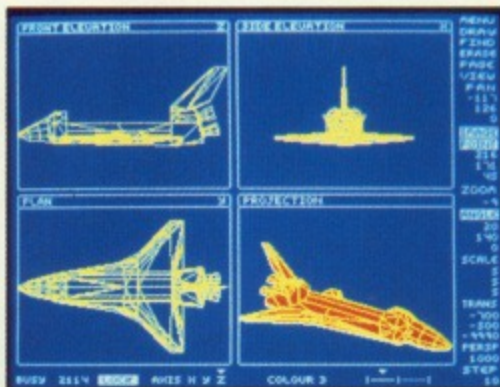
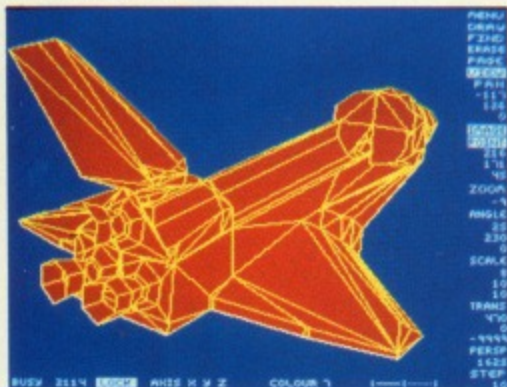

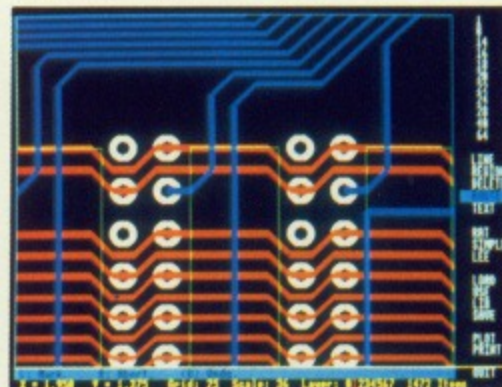

# A *shifty* character

*Mike Cook registers more facts about his Experimenter's Board*

**T**HE Body Build Experimenter's Board was first described in the August 88 issue of *The Micro User* and enables you to learn about interfacing in a relatively painless way. Last month we looked at how to handle inputs: This time we'll take a look at some of the hidden goodies in the VIA – the shift register.

Normally the BBC Micro's VIA is used simply as an input or output port, but there are hidden extras as well. The shift register is perhaps the most neglected part, but it can be most useful.

Basically a shift register is rather like a conveyor belt, the bits – zeros and ones – are loaded on to it at one end and fall off at the other, one at a time, in the same order. The conveyor belt is a register within the VIA – at address &FEOA – and the *end* is control line two on the VIA's B side – CB2.

The shift register can be made to work in the other direction as well so that whatever logic level is near the end of the belt is sucked back on to it. It is called a shift register because each time a bit is moved in or out all the other bits *shift over*. In deepest Lancashire this is known as an *utch up* register. To be technical for a moment, this

movement of bit patterns when you are outputting bits one at a time is known as a parallel to serial conversion.

Conversely, when you are collecting or inputting data, it is known as serial to parallel conversion. The only snag is that the shift register can be used for only one type of conversion at any one time: You can't perform a serial to parallel conversion while simultaneously converting parallel to serial.

As well as deciding which way you want the data to flow you also have to select what will control the time when it will be moved. Here you are faced with a choice of three different controlling signals or clocks.

### Time for a byte

You can shift the data when you feed a signal into control line 1 – CB1 – and this happens on the falling edge of the clock signal. In this way you can control the flow of your bit pattern or data from outside the micro.

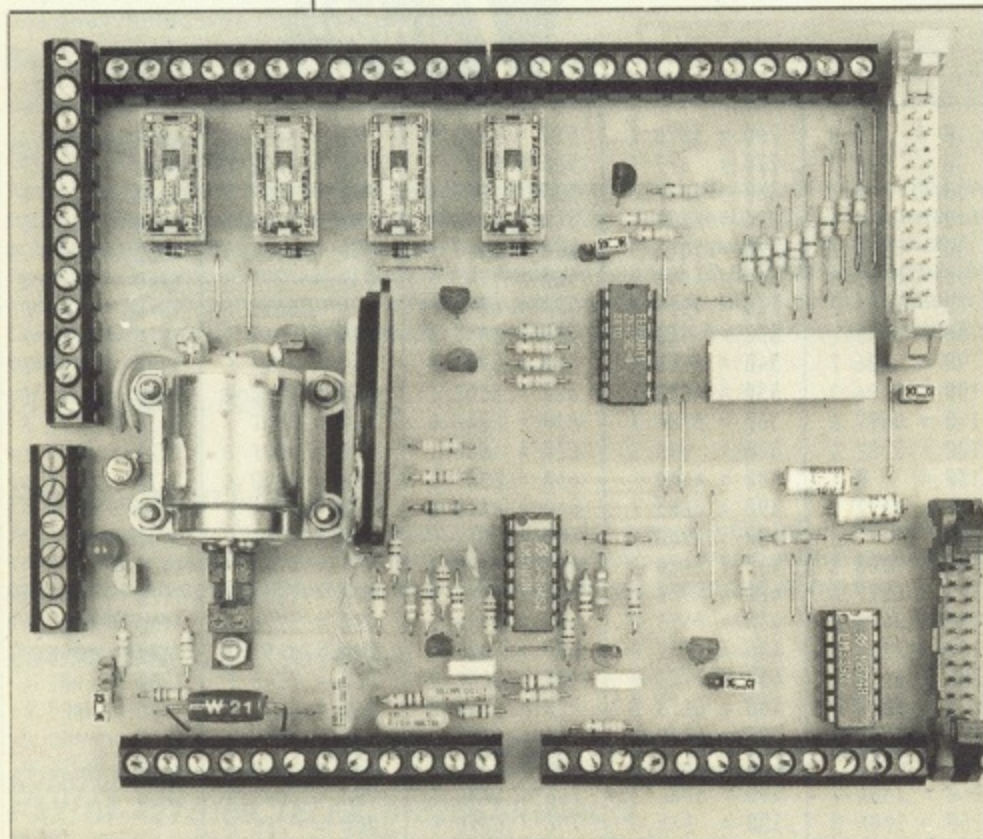
The two other sources of clock signals are derived from within the micro: You can use the system's clock – 1MHz – to get the fastest possible output, or you can use a counter to move data after a preset number of 1MHz system clock pulses.

Normally, when you shift all the data out of the shift register it is empty and will stop shifting until you load in some more data by storing it in address &FEOA. But there is another option: You can have all the data repeatedly appear on the output – when eight shifts have been performed, the whole operation is automatically repeated. This is known as a recirculating or free running mode.

Those of you who are good at working out combinations will have spotted seven different ways the shift register can work. In fact there are eight different modes – the eighth being disabled or not working. If you look at the table you will see all the different modes.

You can instruct the VIA which mode to use by putting the mode number in the Auxiliary Control register at address &FE6B. To make matters a little more complicated the mode number has to be placed in bits 2, 3 and 4 which means you have to shift the mode number two places to the right – multiply by 4 – before storing it in the register.

Also, other bits in this register affect other aspects of the VIA so we should make sure we

only change the bits we want to. This is done with logic operators in the same way as we did when we looked at outputs in the October issue.

Well enough of the theory: Let's carry out an experiment to reinforce the idea of shift registers. So that we can see what is happening we'll use the shift register modes that work on an external input and to provide the input we will use the slotted opto switch. This has built-in hysteresis circuitry so that we will not suffer with contact bounce producing multiple pulses which might be the case if we used a conventional switch or wire shorting loop.

To set up our board we need to move Link 2 to position B. This connects the output of the opto switch to the PB6 screw connector. Now wire a link between PB6 and CB1 and finally move Link 3 to position A so the LED shows the output of the shift register.

We'll start by looking at outputting a bit pattern: To do this we need to set the shift register into mode 7. There is no need to run a program — type in the commands directly from the keyboard:

Note that in the Basic version I have got the language to work out the bit pattern. This just makes things a little easier to follow — I could have simply used the bit pattern I wanted as I have in the Forth version. Also, there is nothing stopping you from working it out in Forth using a similar calculation.

Now we need to put some bit pattern into the shift register: The number &CC is useful because in binary it is 11001100. This means that our LED will change state every two clock pulses. Load up the shift register by typing:

IN BASIC
    ?&FE6A=&CC

IN FORTH
    FE6A CC C!
    
```

Now, shift out the bit pattern by moving a piece of paper in and out of the opto slot. You should see the LED changing every two times and after eight clock pulses the shift register will stop and the LED will remain off.

Try putting different numbers in the shift register. Can you predict the sequence? Also see which direction the register travels — which is the first bit out? You might notice a click associated with each change in the LED: This is because the LED drive is also connected to the audio amplifier.

We can monitor the contents of the shift register if we display its contents on the LED bar display. To do this we need a simple loop that continually reads the shift register and transfers

it to the LEDs at address &FE61:

```

IN BASIC
    10 REPEAT: ?&FE61=?&FE6A: UNTIL FALSE

IN FORTH
    : MON BEGIN FE6A C@ FE61 C! ; MON
    
```

Note that in fact the value in the shift register recirculates and does not stop after eight shifts. Try loading the number 1 into it and watch it run round. It recirculates because each time we read the shift register we reset the number of shifts needed to complete the transfer.

Now, let's have a look at using the shift register to gather inputs. First we need to set it in to mode 3 by typing:

Then, so that we can see what is going into the register, we need the same program we just had to continuously monitor the contents of the shift register. Then take a wire and connect one end to CB2 to make the data input: Touch it on the E connector for a logic zero or leave it unconnected and it will float high giving a logic one.

You should note that the LED will indicate the logic state you are about to put into the shift register. Now trip the opto switch and watch the shift register fill up. Try to input a specific bit pattern such as alternating zeros and ones.

While we have a program running it only gives us a window on the shift register: The accumulation or outputting of the bit pattern happens without any intervention from the micro. This is important because we need not take up micro time performing a serial to parallel conversion — it can be left free to do other tasks.

There are many practical applications of shift registers such as serial communications between micros, data gathering and generating special pulse trains. Next month we will see how the shift register ties in with the other hidden part of the VIA — the timers.

In the meantime, here's a little test: Write a program to simulate the shift register in the input mode. Use PBO as the data input and PB1 as the clock, displaying the register on the bar display. I'll give answers in Forth and Basic next month. See you then, and have a merry Christmas.

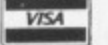

# Play it again ... and again

*Hac Man checks out what's on offer for yuletide*

**C**HRISTMAS is here again with a flood of great games coming out for the BBC Micro in time for the festive season. Superior has gone for a blitz approach. Starting late in September, its release schedule does not let up until the year is out. Many of the offerings are compilations which, rather surprisingly, feature some titles that did not originate from the Superior stable.

Play It Again Sam 3 – to be reviewed in next month's Software Scene – features **Commando** and **Killer Gorilla**, originally from Elite and Micro Power respectively, as well as Superior's own **Palace of Magic** and **Killer Gorilla II**. Killer Gorilla II will be known to many seasoned games players as Zany Kong Junior. Play It Again Sam 4 features **Spellbinder**, **Grand Prix Construction Set**, **Frak!** and a previously unreleased title – **Cosmic Camouflage**.

The next two releases are titles that I first heard about many moons ago, **By Fair Means or Foul** and **Exile**. The former is a boxing game in which you can perform a number of fair moves such as a body blow, upper cut or duck punch, and also four foul moves – groin punch, head butt, knee and

kick. Master 128 and Compact owners will be pleased to know that the package also contains a specially extended version of the game for their machines.

Exile is another game that falls into the ever popular arcade-adventure category. Written by Jeremy Smith, author of Thrust, and Peter Irvin, of Starship Command fame, it certainly has an excellent pedigree and features some of the best animation ever seen on the BBC Micro. Master owners especially, should sit up and take notice, because the Exile package also features an extended version for the Master series. Almost uniquely for this type of game, Exile also features a save game option – take that as a clue that Exile isn't going to be easy to complete.

**A Question of Sport** is the officially licensed micro version of the BBC Television programme. News of this came as rather a surprise to me, because Superior is not normally noted as champion of the licensing concept, but I'm sure it will sell well in the Christmas market.

No Christmas would be complete without a Repton game. **Repton Infinity** is the name of this latest offering, so called because it almost everything can be redefined – including the actions of the creatures and objects – allowing almost infinite scope for designing screens and puzzles that are even nastier than is currently possible. No doubt we will see some examples in due course.

### Playing some more

On Play It Again Sam 5, the lone Superior title is outnumbered by games that really stand out: Micro Power's **Imogen** and **Fortress**, the Zaxxon-clone written by Mat Newman. Superior's **Elixir** and Alligata's **Bugblaster** play the supporting cast.

Tynesoft has gone for the old maxim of quality rather than quantity. **Superman**, the company's big

title of the year that I first mentioned in the September issue, should be out early in December. At the time of writing, I have still not seen the game, but by all accounts it will be worth waiting for.

Also from Tynesoft is **Summer Olympiad**, a collection of sports events released to coincide with the Olympic Games last September. As with Superman, I did not get to see the game before this column went to press, but I expect that it will still be selling well.

## Games galore

Two titles that we can expect from the Tynesoft stable in the first quarter of next year are **Circus Games** – very much what the title implies – and **MayDay Squad** – an icon-driven 3D maze game in which you are one of the three members of the MayDay Squad that has been called in to rescue hostages from an embassy siege.

Go-Dax is a relatively new name to the BBC Micro market and is famous for its excellent game Skirmish. Although its founder, Darryl "Dax" Still has since left the company, Go-Dax is still very much alive. One title that will be of interest to Archimedes owners is **Fireball**, an Arkanoid/Impact-style game which should provide some less strenuous relief for anyone struggling to get to grips with Zarch and Conqueror.

Finally, just out from Impact is its first own-label Archimedes release **Quazer** which we first saw at *The Micro User* office in its pre-release form many months ago. It's a fairly standard vertical scrolling shoot-em-up with very clean graphics and catchy music.

## Getting on top

Last month I mentioned that I was not a great believer in high score tables. However, since starting this column I've received a number of letters from readers who have asked if their top score for a particular game is the highest in the land. Regular readers may recall that I included high scores for Zarch and Uridium in last month's column. So – in for a penny, in for a pound – here is a selection of high scores for many of the most popular games for the BBC Micro.

However, in the Hac-Man tradition, it is a high score table with a difference: Each has been achieved by the author of the game. Any additions or amendments are welcome – from authors as well as players – but please submit only genuine scores achieved without using any cheat modes or other modifications.

I have excluded arcade-adventures, such as the Repton and Thunderstruck series, because each one has an ending and therefore a maximum score, so that potentially everyone who completes a game of this type can achieve that maximum score. I have also excluded Elite and

other games in which it is possible to save your position. Once the player has become proficient at these games, high scores are achieved more by persistence than by outright skill.

## Chop suey

Whenever I review karate games I'm left with the thought: "Well, it's pretty good, but not quite as good as *Fist*". Many such games have been released on to the BBC Micro games market in recent years, but for my money **Way of the Exploding Fist** is still the best of the bunch. Although many of its competitors such as *Yie-Ar Kung Fu I* and *II*, offer more variety or more complex gameplay, in my mind none of them quite matches the technical excellence of *Exploding Fist*.

When I bought a Master 128 to replace my trusty Model B I discovered that *Fist* – in every one of its different incarnations – was one of the many games that suddenly refused to work with my new toy. There are three different versions of the game – the original cassette, one for disc and the mark 2 cassette version – also re-released on the Mastertronic Ricochet budget label. No prizes for identifying the disc version, but the two cassette ones are slightly more tricky to tell apart.

If the game loads a Mode 1 title page of the front cover of the game packaging using a Spectrum-style loader – building up the picture in white, line-by-line then filling in the colour afterwards – you have the first issue of the game. This version also features only one backdrop – a

courtyard with a giant Buddha statue behind the contestants. The second issue features two backdrops – a training room scene with training mats on the floor, as well as the courtyard scene – and switches between the two after every two rounds.

When I discovered that *Fist* was not directly compatible with the Master, I started digging and discovered that all three versions featured direct calls to routines resident at particular addresses in the Model B's OS1.2 rom. Regular readers may recall that this was the reason why *Jet-Pac* would only work on the Model B. Naturally, any MOS-specific call would not work on a different MOS, but it wasn't too much work to redirect the calls to the equivalent addresses in the Master's operating system.

## Fist full of games

That dealt with the game's compatibility problems for me and I forgot about them. Only when a reader by the name of Kenny from Smethwick, West Midlands wrote to me to make this very point was I reminded that other B+ and Master owners have always been deprived of this excellent game. So, here, is a conversion routine

suitable for the disc version of the game. As usual, enter the listing as shown, save it on one of your own blank discs, type:

# Just the ticket!

*Peter Harris shows how to get a new style of output from your micro*

**H**AVE you ever wanted to produce tickets for a local event using your BBC Micro? Creating simple text ones is no problem, but here's a utility that lets you print well designed tickets which can be numbered if you so desire. All you need is a Mode 0 screen designer and an Epson-compatible printer.

Screen dumps are at first glance a simple way of doing this, and it's certainly cheaper than organising artwork and sending it off to a printer. However, the process is slow if a conventional dump program is used – it could take nearly two hours to print 100 tickets.

One way round this is to open a \*SPOOL file before using the dump program and then print the SPOOLED file 100 times instead. This is certainly quicker but involves your disc drive running continuously for over an hour and it's impossible using a cassette.

The answer is to store the output of the screen dump routine in ram before sending it to your printer. Although it is impossible to store two Mode 0 screens in ram simultaneously, we actually don't need to – an area of the screen itself can be used for storage once that part has been processed.

The ticket printing program is not long, so HIMEM can be brought down a long way from its usual position – the start of screen memory. If the beginning of the dump buffer is placed just above the program and variable space there is sufficient memory to store at least a third of the picture before encroaching on the screen memory. The screen picture is corrupted as the buffer fills, but the affected area has already been safely processed.

Listing I is a Basic program, DUMPGEN, and you should type it in and use Get it Right! to make sure you have entered it exactly as it is printed. When you run it the screen dump routine will be generated and automatically saved as SDUMP9. The routine rearranges the screen image as if to send to the printer, but sends it to the buffer area instead.

The ticket printer is another Basic program – Listing II. In it lines 150 to 210 strip the icons and borders generated if you're using AMX Pagemaker. They are not otherwise necessary, but as they are very short, should be entered so your listing can be checked with Get it Right! They

can then be deleted if you are using another package.

When you run this program you are prompted for the name of a file, which should be a previously saved Mode 0 screen. The next prompts are for the number of copies required and whether you want the tickets numbering. If you request this facility you must enter the start value and the position where the number should be printed on the ticket. It helps to reckon that a hi-res screen is dumped in 32 lines with a width of around 55 pica characters.

The screen is then loaded and displayed, after which nothing seems to happen for a few minutes. In fact the buffer is being loaded and after a few minutes the screen image will start to be corrupted. Printing will start as soon as the whole file has been processed.

Although this utility was written for Mode 0 screens, it will work in any graphics mode. The only alteration you need to make is to adjust the MODE command in line 50 of Listing II. And so that's all there is to producing tickets cheaply using your BBC Micro.

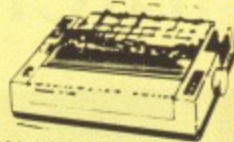

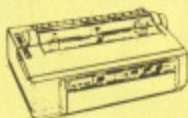

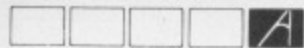

# Archimedes SOFTWARE

## Try taking a snapshot

*Gareth Long  
makes a grab  
for Archimedes  
graphics screens*

**I**n the June issue of *The Micro User* there was an interrupt-driven utility to save screens in any mode complete with colour information while another program is running. This month we present a simple Archimedes module that does the same job. The screen grabber is an ARM code program written for either the 300 or 400 micros enabling you to save entire screens at any point with a single key press.

It is loaded as a software module before running the program that you want to take

snapshots of and uses interrupts to test for Control+C being pressed. Then it issues:

```
*SCREENSAVE Screen00
```

to the command line interpreter. Each time you use it the two digit number at the end of the filename is incremented. Because it is used under interrupt and takes quite a while to execute you will occasionally get some corruption, but it's not serious.

If you use a fast screen save routine either change the command in the program – after ensuring it is correct with the checksum – or use the Alias:

```
*SET Alias$Screensave FastSave %0
```

so that every time the instruction is sent it is converted to the new one.

Type in the listing carefully, ensure it is correct, and save it. When run it generates the module which is saved automatically as *Screengrab*. You can load this with:

```
*RMLoad ScreenGrab
```

or:

```
*ScreenGrab
```

or even just double click it from the Desktop. Check that it has loaded properly by typing *\*MODULES*. Details of how a software module is put together were given in the August issue and the screen grabber will respond to:

```
*HELP scr.
```

correctly. If you want to disable it use the *\*RMKill* command.

The possibilities of this module are endless. You could, for instance, save a screen from *Zarch* for dumping to a printer so you can show your amazing hi-score. Or quickly grab a picture you are designing with *Artisan*. It's handy for saving the instructions page of a utility, or any screen you want to capture. The only limit is your imagination.

## The big unwrap

*Andrew Moore gets into the festive spirit*

**W**HAT is the true meaning of Christmas? A mad dash to unwrap as many presents as you can in the shortest amount of time possible is certainly not the answer, but in this materialistic world it does seem as if this aspect is growing in importance. Here's a little game to give you practice in this new yuletide tradition and with luck, get it out of your system.

Mr. Guzzle has woken up on Christmas morning with a big smile on his face and a desire to open as many presents as possible. As usual, by Christmas morning the floor is almost completely covered by pine needles, and to unwrap each tempting box he must walk right around it clearing them away.

However, Mr. Guzzle remembers from previous bitter experience that the thing that slowed him up on previous festive occasions was terrible indigestion. This always occurred after consuming the inevitable tempting chocolates which are lurking around every corner on Christmas Day.

So attracted is Mr. Guzzle to these sweets that they seem to follow him down the tunnels cleared of needles, almost as if they had minds of their own. Being tempted more than five or so times will be too much for Mr. Guzzle, and his unwrapping will be over for another Christmas.

The program can run on both the Z88 and the BBC Micro. First type in Listing I, the main part of the program. Then if you are using a Z88 type in Listing II otherwise if you're using a BBC Micro enter Listing III.

You control Mr. Guzzle using A for up, Z down, comma left and dot right. If you don't like these settings you can change lines 1100 and 1110. On the Z88 these keys give you momentum in the direction you press, so that you don't have to keep hammering them for fast movement.

The game consists of an unlimited sequence of progressively harder pine cone-strewn levels. Don't hang around too long because the chocolates will become more intelligent after about a minute. Note also that you move more slowly while you are clearing the pine cones.

The implementation is fairly straightforward and, regarding efficient machine independence, the crucial feature was not referring to the screen

size directly. It is kept in the variables *MAXX* and *MAXY* – these can be altered in line 1050 but should be at least eight and divisible by four.

Also the power of both machines' VDU drivers is used to encapsulate the information for defining the sprites – including colour – in a single string. For example Mr. Guzzle's face is stored in the string *US\$*. This is ideal for providing efficient machine independence as once *US\$* is defined, it can be used in exactly the same way on either machine in the main body of the program.

If you get tired of the levels as they are you can change the value of *G%* in line 1050. This seeds the random number generator for each level and should have a value of at least 100.

That's just about it. Remember that to succeed, you will need to do some strategic thinking as well as use dexterous finger play. Try to trap the chocolates before exposing Mr. Guzzle to them. Also, perhaps it might be worth unwrapping the furthest parcels first.

Have fun, and Merry Christmas!

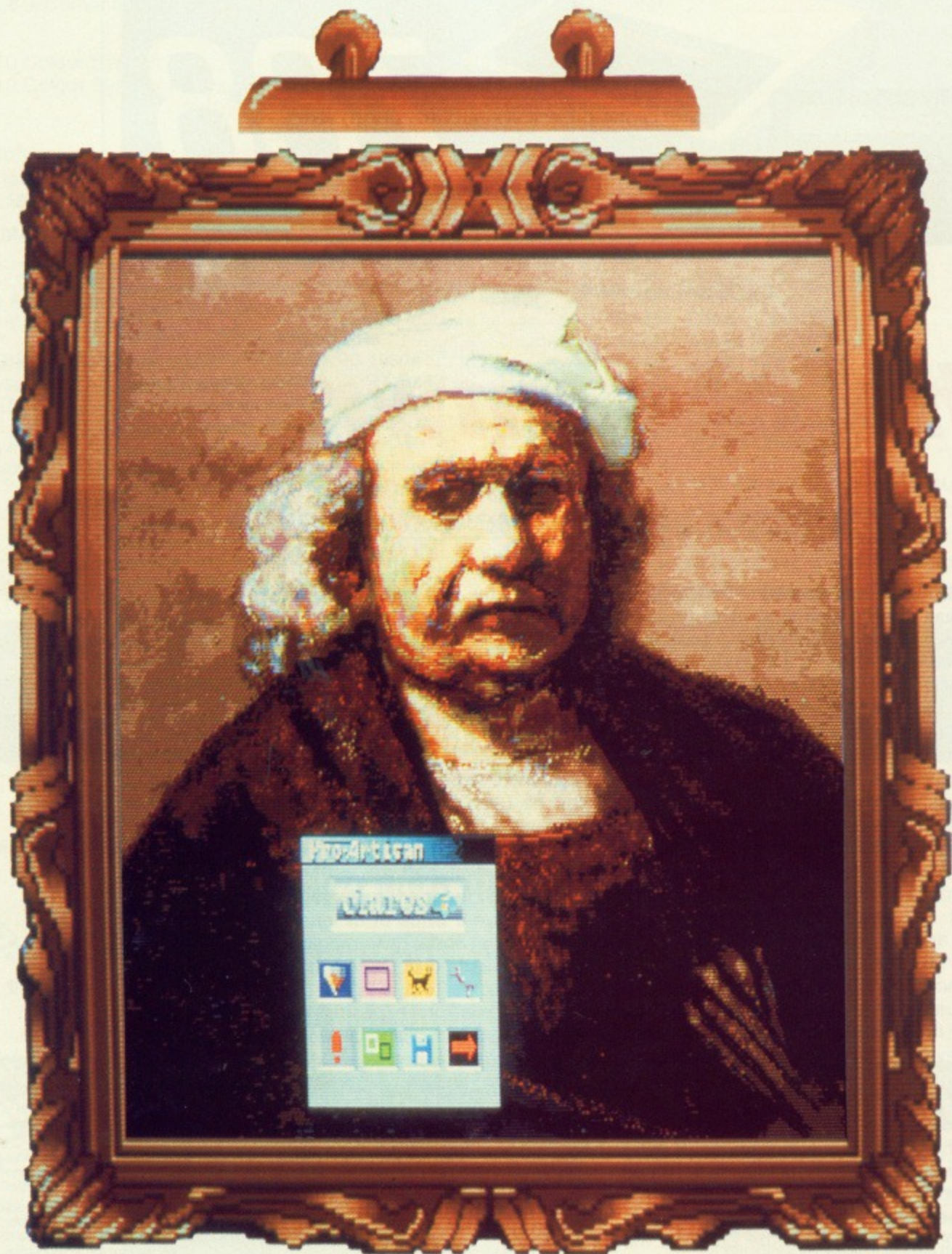
### Sweet strategy

The chocolates' movement strategy is a useful algorithm for many maze-style games:

- Of the four possible directions to move – up, right, down and left – look at the two which would result in moving towards the target. Choose the one in which there is currently the greatest distance between yourself and the target.
- If it is possible to move in this direction do so.
- Otherwise is it possible to move in the other direction that is towards the target? If yes, do so else don't move.
- When the chocolates become intelligent the third step is modified so that they don't just give up trying, but move temporarily away from Mr. Guzzle in the hope that they will discover another route towards him.

But if they will not, you had better know how to get around and get treasure. You can move in many ways by typing GO NORTH, GO UP, GO SOUTHWEST and all other directions. But you can also enter N, U and SW, which is quicker. OUT works from nearly everywhere and is good for retracing your steps if you get lost.

At first you will wish to stop and gawp at the wondrous things, and truly the descriptions of locations in Shades are lengthy and full of interesting information and clues.

But if you type BRIEF you will see only the name of your current location - you can see a full description by typing LOOK instead. This is useful, for you will move around quicker, and not have to cope with lots of words on your screen when you have to run fast from evil fighters such as Minotaur, whose name is a byword for cutting people into small bits.

When you find an object you must pick it up: So type GET (object). Not all objects are valuable: If you type GET T (for treasure) that is a quick way to tell if the object is worth anything. Then when you have it, type VALUE (object) to find its worth. Take it to the Mad King's Room, where if you drop it you will be given points for your deed, and may presently advance in rank and power.

The Mad King's Room is to the east of the courtyard in the castle, so you will not miss it. But if the drawbridge is raised you may not enter. Therefore go south from the drawbridge and you will find a way of lowering it.

That is all I can tell you for now, but I will return in the cycle of a moon and speak on matters of glory and honour: How to make a name for yourself in battle, unlike the fool Murrough, who sitteth in a safe place always and never dares risk his unlovely skin.

# A pocket full of data

**S**PECIALISED software is starting to become available to plug the cracks in the applications supplied as standard on the Z88. I suppose the most significant so far are Wordmongers' Z-term for communications, Computer Concepts' Spell-Master for serious word-processor users and now, also from Wordmongers, a database – zBase.

Of course PipeDream can be considered to be a simple database, but really the facilities are not particularly comprehensive, and someone used to a dedicated package such as ViewStore will find it poor so zBase is intended to fill that gap. Like System Delta and Inter-Base on the BBC Micro, zBase has its own programming language to give maximum flexibility in adding records and using data. It is unashamedly based on the PC's dBase II.

In order to use zBase you will need at least 128k of ram. The software comes on a 32k eprom and installs itself as an activity in the Z88 Index, just like PipeDream and Basic, so it can be used either by entering individual commands to be executed immediately, or by running a program – called a command file – which has been saved as plain text from PipeDream.

The commands are not unlike many of those in Basic and so quite easy to learn. The big but, however, is that although all the tools for comprehensive handling of databases are provided there's no Card Index program or other easy mechanism to interactively create, or add to, a database.

Databases in general have items of data – maybe a name – each of which constitutes a field. A collection of related fields – say someone's name, address and phone number – is a record and it is these records which are stored in the database file.

When creating a database the first thing you

need to do is to define a standard record. In zBase this is done by preparing a file in PipeDream which has one line per field and that contains the name of the field – either a string or number. Strings end in \$ and are followed by the maximum length.

To initialise the database zBase's CREATE command is used and the next stage is to put records into it. For example the series of commands:

```
APPEND BLANK LET 1:NAMES="John Allen" LET 1:ADDRESS="c/o The Micro User" LET 1:PHONE="0625-878888"
```

Here APPEND adds a blank record, 1 is the file – zBase allows 2 databases to be open at any time – and NAME\$, ADDRESS\$ and PHONE\$ are the names of the fields. Adding records in this way is really rather tedious so in practice it would be better to write a program which requests these items of information, and constructs a record from them.

As in most databases, zBase records can be sorted into order by using an index file, one which holds the information for just one of the fields of each record sorted into order, for example names arranged alphabetically – together with a pointer to show where to find the rest of the record in the main file. This provides a mechanism to retrieve things from the database and display them on the screen.

It's most likely that a database on the Z88 will be used in conjunction with one on another machine, so how easy is it to get information in and out of zBase? To and from PipeDream – or View Professional – it's very easy. The COPY TO and APPEND FROM commands can create and use files that are in PipeDream plain text format. That is, each field is separated by a tab character and each record by a carriage return.

One useful consequence of this is that zBase data can be entered into a PipeDream file and then appended to a database rather than via a

specially written program. In the other direction you need to remember to set the PipeDream column widths to match the length of the zBase fields in order for records to be displayed correctly.

COPY TO and APPEND FROM will also work with the information in delimited form, where each field is separated by a comma. This is useful, for example, to provide addresses for a mail-merge in View, or for transferring to or from Viewstore where files are stored in a similar format but, unless you're lucky, conversion can be messy.

Either of the formats can be used with Inter-Base but a simple Inter-Base program is required to take a zBase record and write it to an Inter-Base one and vice versa.

In fact, if you're prepared to write the programs, Inter-Base and zBase are extremely well suited to each other. Files can be produced by a program in one and picked up by a program in the other, so if you've a database on one machine which you want to use on the other, your own customised programs can make the conversion very easy.

The quality of the manual can make or break a database. Whatever anyone says they are never easy to use, so you need clear, easy to read documentation both to teach you how it works and as a constant reference when things begin to

go wrong. The review version of zBase only had a provisional manual with it, but I did find it lead me gently through the learning process.

It contained lots of useful example programs and although I expected it to assume knowledge of dBase II – making it harder to understand for BBC Micro users – it seems to have avoided that pitfall.

So is zBase worth getting? Yes, if you're a serious database user and want to carry part of a large database around with you. The facilities are good and comprehensive. If you're just a dabbler you might well be best to stick with PipeDream: In order to get the best out of zBase you really will have to write some programs yourself.

### SYSTEM LIMITATIONS

The size of a **zBase** database is limited to 65535 records per file and the maximum number of fields per record is 32 with a largest string variable length of 255.

**ViewStore** allows files up to 4096 Mb – if you have such a large drive – with 254 fields and 239 as the maximum record size.

Records in **Inter-Base** are constrained only by the memory size of your machine. Similarly the file size – and therefore the number of records per file – depends on the disc storage available.

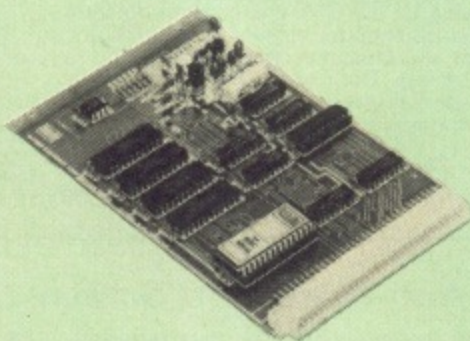

- Capture and replay of animated sequences.
- Several example programs illustrating the use of digitiser software.

#### RESOLUTION

Images are digitised to 512 (h) x 256 (v) pixels, and then scaled to fit the Archimedes' screen. It is possible to digitise to 512 x 512 pixels if the picture is stationary for about 0.1 second. 512 x 512 images can either be displayed on a MultiSync monitor, or on a normal monitor using interlacing.

Pictures are digitised to 64 levels of grey (6 bits). Note, however, that it is only possible to display all 64 levels on a monochrome monitor, or a colour monitor which has a composite (CVBS) input. For this reason, the Philips CM8533 monitor is recommended instead of the standard Archimedes monitor. It is also possible to connect both a colour and a monochrome monitor at the same time.

Any 2, 16 or 256 colour graphics mode can be used to display digitised pictures. In two colour modes, grey levels are represented using dot patterns, which may be redefined if required (a pattern editor is supplied).

#### SPEED

Video fields are captured in real time (1/50th sec.), and then transferred to Archimedes' memory or the screen. The grab/display rate is dependant on the screen mode and picture size, up to 25 fields per second for quarter screen images, or 12.5 per second for fullscreen (Mode 9).

#### HARDWARE

The digitiser is a single width podule, with a BNC socket on the rear panel for the video input, which may optionally be terminated via a link. There is 128K of on-board memory to store the digitised image, and a 32K ROM on the podule contains all the driver software.

Automatic video level control and black level clamping circuitry is used to ensure that the optimum contrast is obtained from a variety of video sources. A filter is included to avoid patterning effects when using colour sources.

**S**PENDING a whole day working with a new piece of software and at the end feeling bewildered, bothered and bewildered is very unusual, but such was my experience with Matrix-3. Apart from the cover page of the 192 page manual declaring it to be a scientific spreadsheet and adverts in the micro press announcing a "three dimensional spreadsheet package for the Archimedes", I remain unsure exactly what is on offer and at whom it is aimed.

This may seem an unreasonably harsh opinion but I feel that even specialised software should make some declarations of friendliness.

The professionally produced manual does tell you how to install it on a hard disc and how to run it. Whereupon you are presented with the usual window on to a standard spreadsheet with its columns, rows and cells. Matrix-3 allows up to 10,000 rows and 10,000 columns, and this sheet can be subdivided into 100 numbered pages for easier reference. It does not use Wimps or pop-up menus and is keyboard driven.

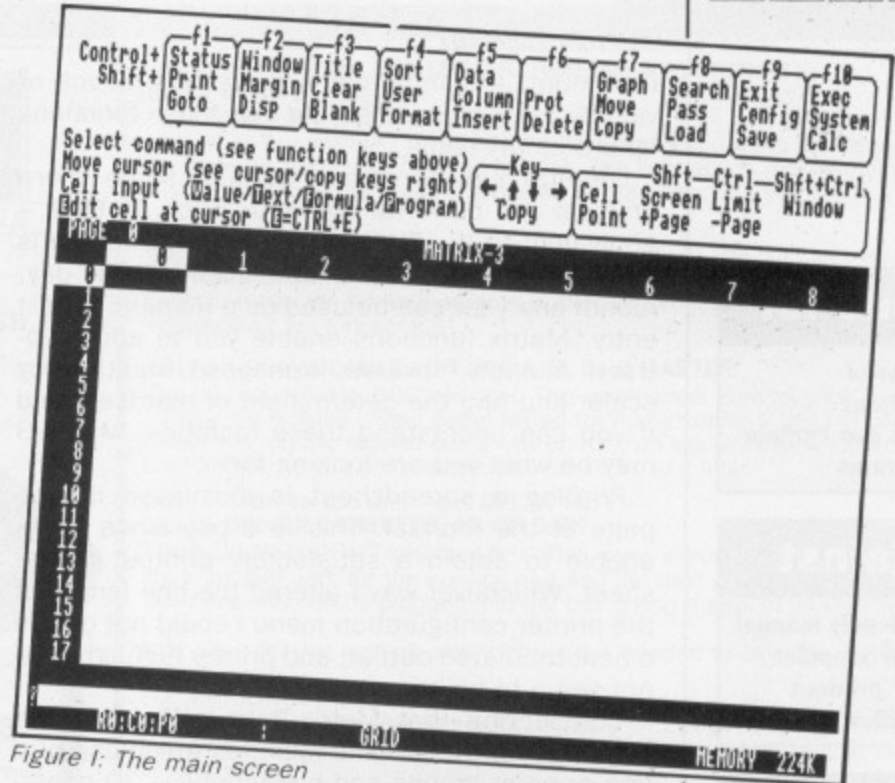


Figure 1: The main screen

I didn't like the layout of the screen but the amount of Help instructions available can be TABbed from novice - as in Figure 1 - to intermediate and expert levels with progressively more of the screen available for the sheet.

Fortunately, the default screen colours of yellow text on a blue background can be reconfigured to another combination of screen colours - but only eight.

A variable number of cells can be frozen as a margin to the scrolling part of the sheet, which aids comparison between different parts of the sheet. Alternatively, the screen can be split horizontally or vertically into separate windows on the same sheet and you can work on either.

Matrix-3 has all the features you would expect from any spreadsheet with the ability to enter text, values or formulae. However, each cell in a sheet may also contain a multi-line formula or program. This adds a tremendous potentiality to the calculating power of the spreadsheet and numeric constants, string constants, cell references, cell pointers and variables can all be used as data in these cell programs.

Although examples are provided in the manual, they are not accompanied by sufficient explanatory text. The manual devotes the same space explaining how to move the cursor round the sheet with the cursor keys as it does to some complex program explanation.

A cell could contain a program to calculate factorials and place the answer in other cells or calculate the repayment necessary to redeem a mortgage over a fixed period. A PROMPT command, which asks for an entry from the keyboard, can allow cells or cell programs to create live interaction with the spreadsheet, such as "enter surname" or "enter loan term in years".

There are cell functions for all the usual arithmetic, trigonometric and logic operations. The statistical functions include average, sum, mean deviation, standard deviation, variance,

maximum and minimum values and count of values. I was pleased to find that these functions ignore empty cells.

General cell functions include some more unusual and powerful operators such as TEST – equivalent to IF...THEN...ELSE – CYCLE which is an iteration count and a table LOOKUP. The day, month and year can be used as a numeric or text entry. Matrix functions enable you to add, subtract, multiply, inverse, transpose, multiply by scalar and find the determinant of matrices. And if you can understand these facilities, Matrix-3 may be what you are looking for!

Printing a spreadsheet is dismissed in one page of the manual. This is a pity since I was unable to obtain a satisfactory printout of the sheet. Whichever way I altered the line length in the printer configuration menu I could not obtain a neat tabulated output, and printer highlights do not seem to be supported.

Considering that Matrix-3 is tailored to the Archimedes, the graphic facilities which can plot line or point graphs and histograms – 2D only – are pathetic. The labelling of the axes is crude and the numbers for the scales virtually touch the axis lines. There is little control over the final appearance of the graphs, and the techniques for determining scaling are rudimentary.

More than one graph can be plotted on the

same axis, but the plots have default patterns of stripes for the histograms and shapes of points on the scattergrams which cannot be altered. The scattergram points, consisting of squares, crosses and triangles on multiple plots, all come out different shapes and sizes when they appear as pixel patterns on the screen and look dreadful.

## The plot thickens

Things get even worse when you try to perform a screen dump – Plotmate A3M/A4SM and Epson MX/RX/FX drivers are provided – either online or offline from a saved screen file. Although I have my fix module installed for the bug in the serial port for some reason these dump routines bypass this and I still end up with corrupted pictures.

A degree of graphic representation can be incorporated into the spreadsheet display. Figure 11 illustrates one of the example files provided on the disc, the screen display being in the expert mode. However, after two more days trying to master Matrix-3 I still have no idea how to achieve this.

All in all Matrix-3 is not the standard of software I would expect for the Archimedes apart from the undoubted power of its mathematical capabilities, which could appeal to specialist users providing they do not want the spreadsheet printed out or represented graphically.

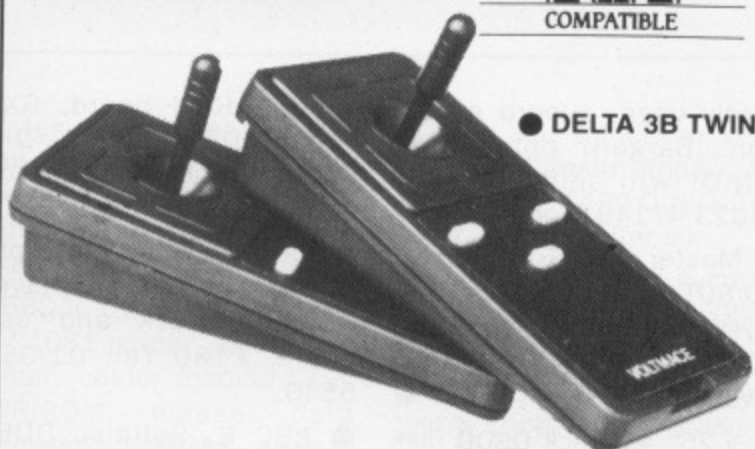

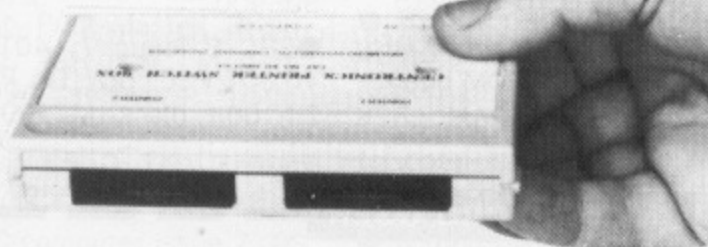

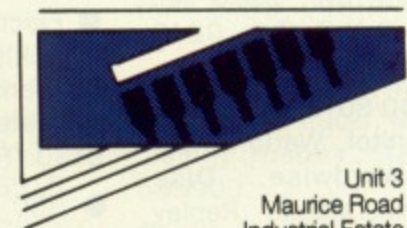

## Smiling through your beard

Petra Galloway looks at art on a shoestring from Leonardo

NOT counting the one on the Welcome disc, up to now there were only two art packages for the Archimedes. The first to appear, Artisan from Clares, was the most professional, but only used the 16-colour Mode 12. Arctist from Fairhurst Instruments was next, using Mode 15 with its 256 colours, but it lacked polish and had few advanced facilities.

Now there's Leonardo: It uses Mode 12 like Artisan, but rather than being a painting package it's more of an advanced pixel editor. All the shape drawing options are the standard ones supplied by the operating system, but there is also an airbrush with random dots – the one feature really missing from Artisan.

Colours are selected via the palette and there is a dither option that invokes the more advanced multi-colour fills available – giving more colours. Although Artisan is more

comprehensive Leonardo scores on ease of use.

However, where Leonardo beats both Artisan and Arctist completely is in its zoom capabilities. Arctist does have the facility but it's a beast to use: Artisan has three levels of zoom but you can only edit individual pixels. But Leonardo – oh joy – allows you to use all the graphics facilities in each of

its four levels, which means you can place objects with absolute accuracy.

Other goodies include the ability to issue star commands directly to do such things as print the screen, QSAVE and QLOAD for fast and compressed screen saving and easy scrolling of the picture when it is zoomed. Finally, it's possible to interface Leonardo directly with the Watford Video Digitiser, so you can load and edit grabbed pictures.

All in all this is a nice package, easy to use and friendly. The only thing I really missed was the ability to load and save individual sprites.

## Mightier than the sword

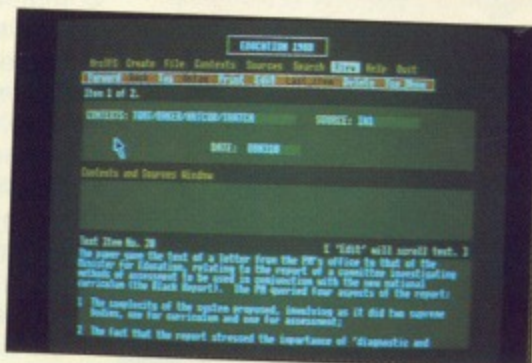
Teri Paul researches a new database tool for academics

DATABASES are a very useful way of storing data, but the most common ones have serious limitations when it comes to storing large amounts of textual information: You need to specify exactly the size shape and attributes of every field within a record.

ArctFS – Archimedes Text Filing System – is a free-form database so it doesn't have this drawback as each record can contain a lump of text of undefined length with various subject tags attached to it.

However, each tag has its own definition record stating what it stands for: And there's a Source record to describe where the text item has come from. This is kept separate because you may get more than one text item from the same source reference work.

At some future date you can choose one or more tags and



get a list of all the text data that your free-form database contains. ArctFS has the added advantage of letting you create output files containing the selected data in a word processor-readable form. This capability makes it ideal for academics, journalists or students who need to hold lots of text data for research.

The program itself is fairly straightforward to use and booting it up presents you with a screen divided into four main areas. At the top – apart from the title – there is a menu bar where only the functions available are highlighted and may be selected and just below this appear secondary menus.

Next come three windows: The linker shows what contexts and sources refer to the current text, which below this is the dialogue window for data entry for the context and source files. At the bottom is the largest area for editing the actual text data.

This is a well-written program and very powerful in its own field.

## A word in your micro

Fred Ingles questions whether this new game is worth the fee

BLOCKBUSTERS is a very popular childrens TV quiz that has spawned a lot of micro imitations. Not to be outdone Software Services has produced one for the Archimedes.

The game is played using a board composed of hexagonal areas with a letter of the alphabet at the centre of each. The two players – or teams – take turns to choose a letter and answer a question to which the correct response begins with the chosen letter.

Success results in that hexagon being filled in with that players colour and the same person choosing another letter. Failure means that the other player has a turn.

The aim is for one player to connect the top and bottom of



the board with hexagons of his colour and for the other to join the left and right sides – a stalemate is impossible.

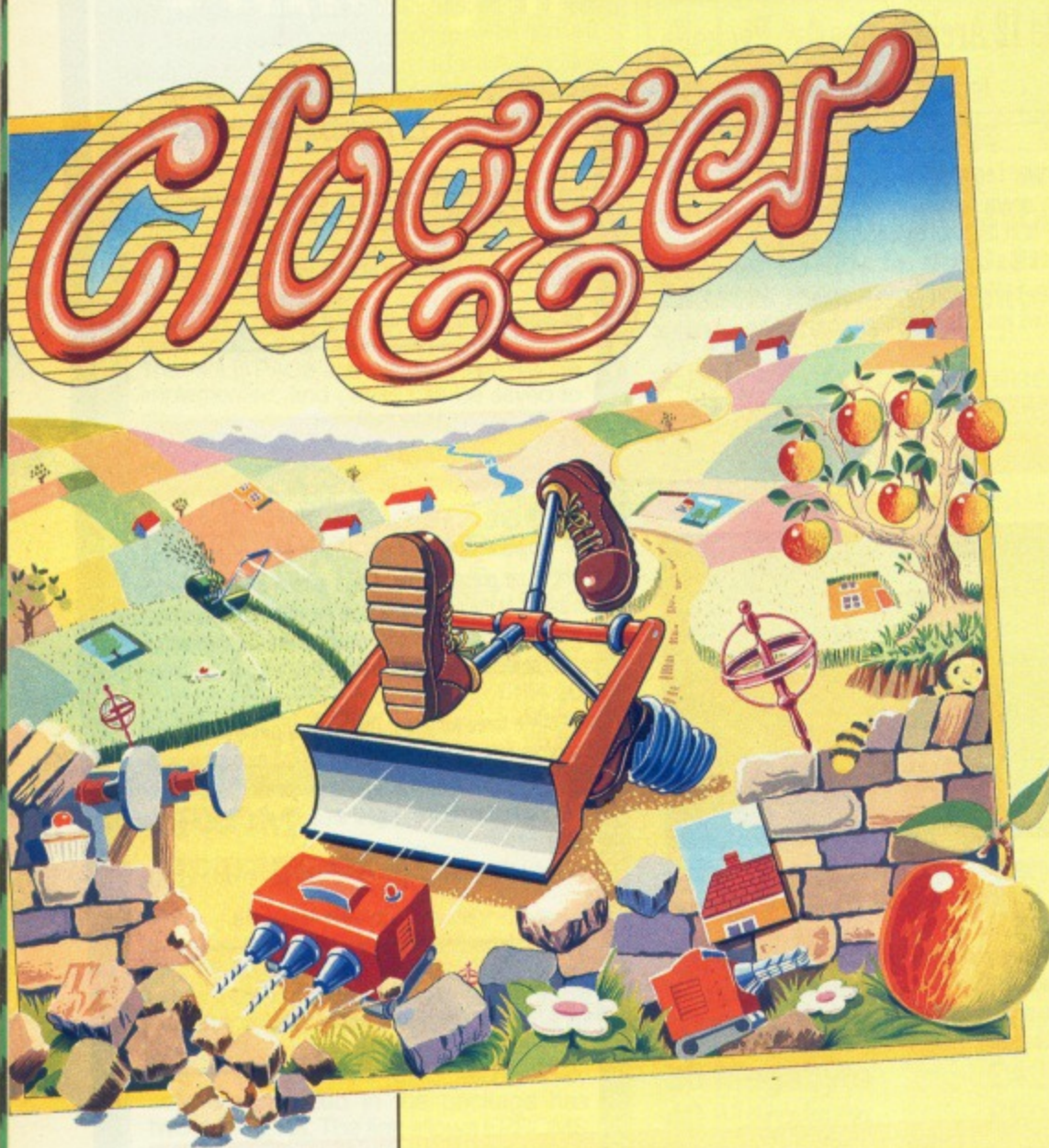
This version produces a very creditable board using nice, muted colours. The micro chooses a hexagon at random and

the fastest person to the key and a correct answer goes first. When an answer does not exactly match the micro's version, the opponent is asked whether the answer given is acceptable. This is a reasonably fair method and is common to all micro games of this type.

There are 2,700 questions included on the disc so repetition is unlikely, but all in all I found it a bit dull. Perhaps it would do well as a gift this time of the year – but the price seems a bit high.

## Gentle art of clogging



**I**n a strange and mystical land lives a peaceful race of beings known as the Cloggers – unusual creatures with three feet and no head. They have strange powers that let them perceive their environment in a way that is incomprehensible to man. They also have a great love of art, and the aim of all Cloggers is to reach the exalted status of Master by proving their artistic appreciation in a series of cunningly conceived tests.

In these they must reassemble various pieces of artwork which are scattered around dangerous landscapes in the hidden valleys of Clogland. Now you have the chance to reach this status.

To become a Master Clogger you must complete the 18 landscapes without using passwords – you have five lives with which to do this. Each landscape is progressively more complex with increasing numbers of individual tests of initiative.

On each you have to gather 21 pieces of a picture and push them to the finish area where they must be placed correctly to build up the complete masterpiece. You must also eat all the cakes and when both objectives have been achieved the level will end and you can move on to the next. You will be given the password for that level so you can practice without repeating lower ones.

The finish area is always seven objects wide by three high but can be anywhere on a particular level and you'll find it full of earth which you'll need to remove before the pieces can be inserted.

On the cover disc you'll find a demonstration version of Clogger with three full screens. You'll have hours of fun with these – but remember one ill-considered action can imperil your whole future.

Once you've mastered the art of Clogging, the full version – with all 18 screens – is available either from *The Micro User* or Impact Software – details are given on the disc.

So, can you become a Master Clogger?

### INSTRUCTIONS

Certain pieces of artwork may seem inaccessible. You will have to find the route to them by moving or using lawnmowers, buffers, gyroscopes and drills on the way. This must be done in a limited time.

A map of each level can be obtained by pressing M. Time will continue to tick away, so plan your strategy quickly. If you want to practise different levels press E on the title screen and Enter the password – provided you have discovered it.

To see the finished picture which you are assembling press P. You can also see the clock ticking away – appreciating the finer

points of the artwork is not recommended at this stage. Time is limited for each level and if it runs out you will run out of energy and lose a life.

However your energy – and therefore your time – can be increased by eating cakes. These will each give you an extra 30 seconds worth of energy but don't eat too much at once – the maximum time you can have at any stage is 10 minutes. So don't hang about.

You can see how well you're doing at any time by looking at the status screen – press S while you're playing. This is the only stage that time stands still.

## CLOGGER'S ALMANAC

While the ability to complete the tests that will make you a Master Clogger depends on your skill and initiative, the Clogland Council does supply a brief advisory almanac describing the hazards that await you and tools at your disposal. Read carefully:

**Cakes** increase your energy – and thereby increase your time – by 30 seconds. Don't forget that all the cakes must be eaten before a level can be completed.

**Apples** increases your score and removes a possible barrier.

**Earth** gets in the way: If in doubt remove it, but don't waste time.

**Cloggrass** is fatal on contact – it can be removed with a lawnmower.

**Springs** form a barrier unless approached from one particular side when it will be removed.

**Gyroscopes** fly off when pushed until stopped by another object or deflected to their original position by a spring.

**Buffers** are used to solve problems caused by gyroscopes.

**Drills** will cut through any three objects and then disappear. There are two drills on each level. One drills to the left and the other to the right. It is advisable to only use drills to cut through objects that cannot be removed in any other way.

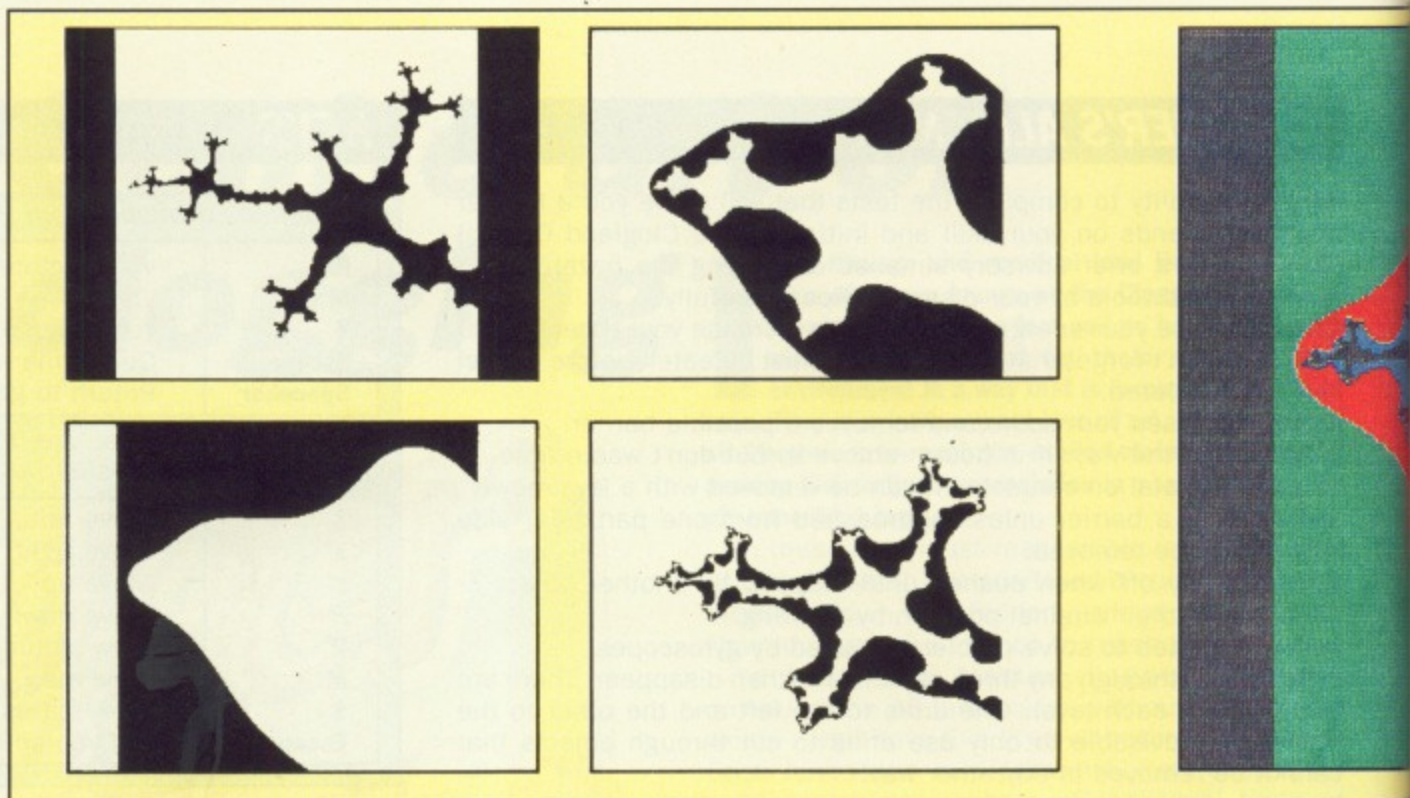

**It will save money and you'll have the chance to print your graphic screens in colour**

**D**ON'T throw that used ribbon away. If your printer uses an *endless* fabric one and if, like me, you resent having to buy new ribbons here is an easy way to economise: Re-ink them yourself. Not only will it save money, but also you will have the chance to print your favourite graphics screens in colour.

All you need are a bottle of stamp-pad – not Indian – ink, some paper handkerchieves, a sheet of plastic or a newspaper to protect your work surface, some rubber gloves if you prefer to keep your hands clean and about half an hour.

As you'll also need three hands – one to wind on the ribbon, one to hold the ink bottle and one to grip the ribbon cassette – you should either get a friend to help, or use a vice or your knees to grip the cassette. Wearing old clothing is recommended.

So, having arranged yourself and the ribbon, apply an excess of ink by putting the nozzle of the bottle to the ribbon surface without squeezing the bottle and turn the take-up knob to advance the ribbon. Surface tension should make the ink flow on to the ribbon, although the bottle may occasionally need squeezing gently.

Make sure that the whole ribbon width is being made shiny with ink, using the nozzle as a spreader if necessary, and keep up the tension with the take-up knob. Continue until the whole

ribbon has been treated then cap the ink bottle and put it aside.

The second stage is to remove the surplus ink. Fold a paper handkerchief into a pad and hold it – on open fingers – in contact with the underside of the ribbon. You'll see the shiny areas go dull as the ink is absorbed into the paper.

Wind the inky ribbon over the pad, watching the absorption of the ink, moving frequently to fresh areas of the pad and changing it as necessary, until the pad has almost stopped taking up ink. The re-inked ribbon should now be ready for use, if perhaps a little over-inked at first.

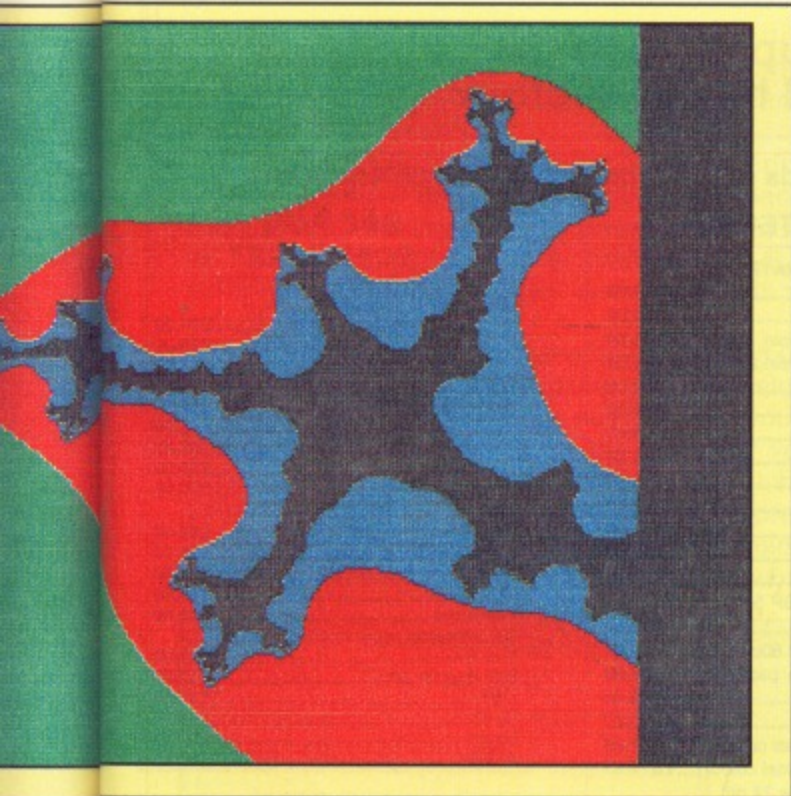
If you want to make coloured ribbons you can start with well-used black ones – the new colour should swamp the old. Then you can start printing multicoloured pictures.

Printing in more than one colour calls for the use of *separations*, which are simply the separate images for each colour: A multicolour graphics screen has to be split up into its component colours so that each can be printed with a different ink.

There are several ways of doing this so let's look at two: Using the utility given here and any dump routine, or using a dump program that allows masking. Either way you need a disc or cassette containing a saved screen that was drawn in one of the multicoloured graphics

modes 1, 2 or 5.

In the panel we look at how to use Watford Electronics DumpOut 3 for colour printouts, but if you haven't got a dump rom or utility that allows masking ensure your screen file's title is no longer than six characters. Listing 1 creates the separations so type it in, check it with Get it Right! and save it.

Because the program addresses screen memory directly for the sake of speed, it will not work with shadow ram turned on, so if you have it turn it off with \*SHADOW 0.

If you are using cassette rather than disc you should turn off all screen messages with:

```
*OPT 1,0
*OPT 2,0
```

to avoid corrupting the screen display. Using cassette takes ages but the principle is the same, so in what follows I shall refer only to disc.

Before you run the program make sure the disc has enough room on it for the separated screens: Mode 1 requires up to 100k, Mode 2 up to 340k and Mode 5 up to 50k.

These figures can be reduced by decreasing the number of separations to be made, set by *colours%* in line 140 – Mode 2 only has eight useful colours – or by adjusting the program to make it wait to let you change discs. The line where this would be necessary is indicated by a REM. Each of the separation discs must have the original graphics screen on, as it has to be reloaded after every separation process.

When you run the program you are first asked whether you want white to print out as white: This lets you reduce the number of separations by one – assuming you are printing on white paper. In other words, if you choose this option the separation for the white image will not be made or printed out.

Next specify which screen mode the saved picture is in. The program ensures that the physical

## USING DUMPOUT 3

If you have Watford's Dumpout 3 rom you can save yourself the trouble of typing in the listed programs because it has a mask parameter – M – that lets you select one or more colours for printing separately.

As we said in the article about this rom in the August issue of *The Micro User*, describing how masking works would be a whole article in itself – but you don't need to understand it to use it.

Table I lists the mask numbers that should follow the M parameter for each colour in Modes 1 and 5, and Table II lists the mask numbers for Mode 2. Each corresponds to one or two colours that will be *let through* the mask and allowed to print, so to print several colours in the same ink simply add the mask numbers together.

If you leave the P option alone – and I suggest you do for this exercise – the colour numbers are the logical colours for the screen mode, as mentioned for the separation program.

For multicolour work you will probably want each colour to be printed solid rather than as a grey tone, so use the T option to choose two-tone printing. To lighten the print density of a dark ink you can use the F option, which will let a little of the white of the paper show through.

colours are also the logical ones – the palette is not changed by a VDU19 command – so white is colour 3 or 7 according to the mode. Finally, enter the picture's filename.

Then sit back and enjoy the show as the various colours are read and saved to disc as separate files. These are automatically given names based on the original screen name, prefixed with S. to show they are screen images, and ending with the colour number.

To print out the separated colours you can use a short program such as Listing II after making necessary alterations to the number of colours, the mode, the filename and the name of your printer dump routine. After each screenful has been printed out the program waits for a keypress to give you time to realign the paper and change the ribbon: You will need to keep track of which

order the colours come in and whether the disc needs changing.

Accurate realignment of the paper after each colour is crucial for successful multicolour printing. The best way to do this is to line the perforations between the sheets up to a fixed point – say, the tear-bar.

The listing on the previous page gives you a routine that prints out the four separations of the screen-file *MANDEL* using DumpOut 3 and illustrated are the four images produced if you don't change the ribbon or rewind the paper. You can see how they can be pieced together in different colours to give the coloured illustration.

So now you can retrieve those old ribbons, save money and get colourful. Even if you don't want to make coloured screen dumps, it's surprising how much more interesting a letter looks in bright colours than in black.

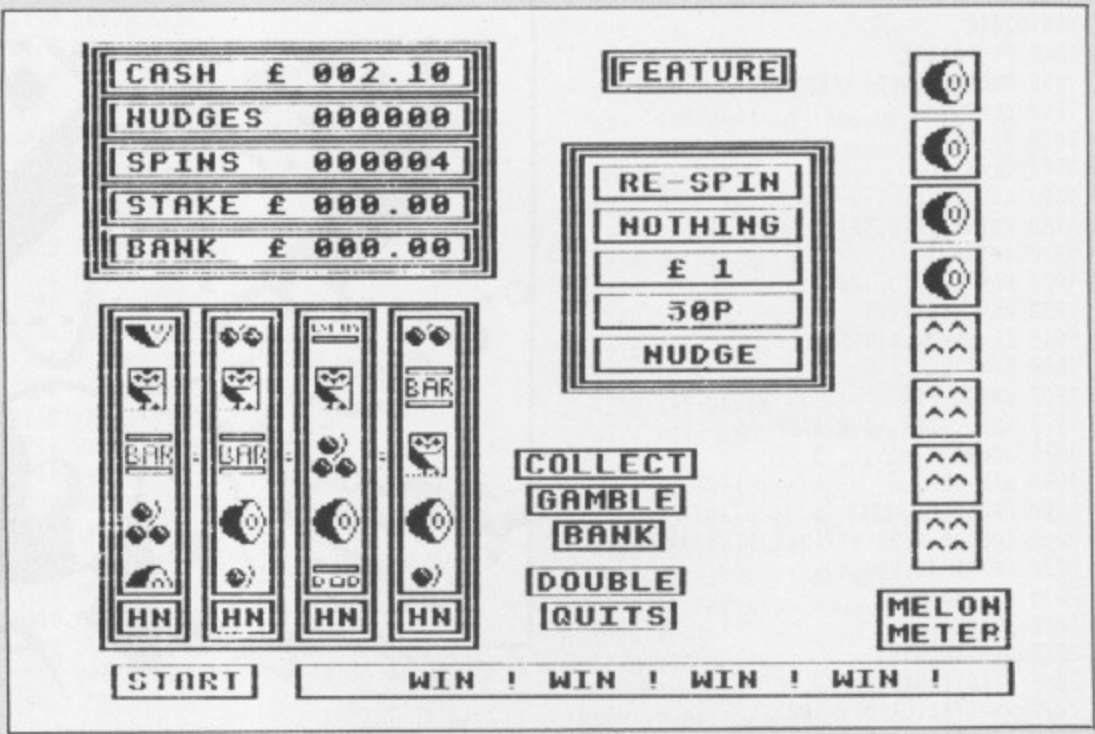

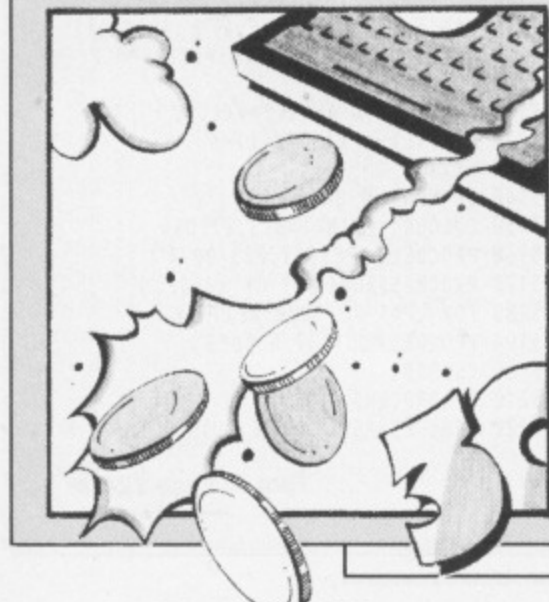

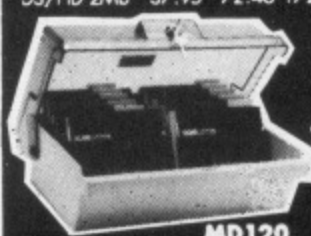

**£10 Prize letter**

IN the September issue of The Micro User there was a letter from Mr. A.E. Gillam who was having trouble typing in one of your programs, *Beastiroids*, published in June. He had obviously made some error in the extremely complicated Data statements of that program, but the checksums were correct.

You pointed out to him a place where this might have happened – in line 1320 – where typing a zero instead of a lower case o would get the same checksum value. What, you asked, were the odds against this happening?

I am afraid I have to inform you that this problem does not arise because of some strange fluke upsetting the checksum system. It is the result of a bug in the Get it Right! program itself.

In the *Beastiroids* program, it is not only typing a zero at the offending position which will leave the checksum unaltered – it will be unchanged whatever character is put there.

In fact you can replace the whole of that line after the \ character by something completely different, and the checksum will still be the same provided only that there is no : character

The source of the problem is a feature of the original checksum program – the way

that it ignores comments in assembly language sections.

In line 1290 of *Beastiroids* there is a [ as part of a data statement. This makes the checksum program assume that everything between this and the next ] – which as far as I can see is everything in line 1430 – is in assembly language.

The result is that it ignores everything that comes after a \ on any of the lines in between because it assumes that these are assembly language comments.

Unfortunately this means that quite a lot of the data in *Beastiroids* is not included in the published checksums.

It would be easy enough to get round this bug. All you would need to do would be to have another flag in the checksum program which is set when a data keyword – byte value &DC – is found, and which is cleared at the start of each line. The program could then check this whenever it encountered a [ and not treat it as the start of an assembly language section if that flag were set.

Mercifully, you seem to have published very few pro-

grams like *Beastiroids*, which include both [ and \ characters in data statements.

For these, altering any single character will always give a different checksum value for the appropriate line, though this could theoretically be left the same if more than one character was changed. – D. L. Harper, Brinsley, Nottingham.

● Thanks for your observations. As you say, it's very rare that [ and \ occur in data statements, so we feel it's better not to confuse people by changing Get it Right! at the moment.

## Integrated Fontstyle

I FIND Fontstyle an ideal way of printing my documents, but swapping between it and any word processor inconvenient. I have therefore devised the following method to integrate the two.

Add a single line to the FONTPRT program to get a function key to quit the program, enter the word processor and load the file.

The best place for a key to be programmed is during the printing procedure, just after the check that textfile\$ is on the text disc. This is around line 1525 – depending on the version:

```
1525 PROCoscli("KEY0"*W.

```

To use it just press f0 at the 'Please enter choice' prompt, and you will end up in Wordwise, with the last printed file loaded. Similar sequences could be used to enter other word processors. The line won't work if you haven't printed a document first.

I'm also worried about giving it to a company as they might copy it and claim it was theirs. Should I copyright it first? – P. Tatham, Kirk Ireton, Derbyshire.

● All well-known companies

are quite reputable but to be sure you can always seal a copy of your game in an envelope and lodge it with a bank or solicitor.

Nowadays adventure games companies are very picky about the quality of games they release, but even if yours is not up to their standard they will advise you on how to improve it. Some companies will even pay for an idea rather than a whole game.

disc. What happens is that the load and execution addresses are omitted from the disc catalogue although this can easily be added with a disc editor or by loading the file or program and resaving it to disc.

However when used with a Master every file is saved with the addresses 0000 FFFF 4000, giving each the same length. On the BBC Micro the correct file length was saved but not on the Master.

Is there any way to rectify these errors by amendment of the program? — J.M. Leggat, Wolverhampton.

● Unfortunately there were two errors in the published program:

The second fault is the one that stops the correct load and execution addresses being written to the disc.

However the problem with the file length is a bug in early versions of the Master DFS which fails to write the correct size to the disc when a file is closed and nothing — short of chip replacement — will cure it.

## Programming your Z88

IN the September issue of The Micro User Andrew Moore gives a PROC using the command line interpreter to turn the Z88's keyclick on. A neater way of doing this is to poke the memory directly, especially as this enables you to control not only the keyclick but also the repeat rate and the timeout.

## Room for adventure

RECENTLY I decided to have a go at writing a text adventure in Basic for my Compact. I was aiming high and my dreams were shattered when — having changed from Mode 7 to Mode 1 because I re-defined the comma character — I got the dreaded No room error.

I then had an idea: I deleted the line which set Mode 1 and created two different programs, the first was an introduction which set Mode 1 and then loaded

the main program. This worked, but when I attempted to list the main program I got No Room again. Please can you help. — Mathew Nash, Fulford, York.

● There are several points here: Unless you particularly need colour you might as well use Mode 6 which gives you 25 lines of 40 character wide text — and allows you to use defined characters.

At a guess you are not using shadow screen

anyway, which would put HIMEM at &8000 regardless of which screen mode is used — but then your program would only work on machines that have the extra screen memory.

In order to store text you ought to compress it to reduce the space needed, and more professional adventures don't hold the text in DATA statement at all but it is created separately and loaded when needed from disc.

timeout in minutes is a one byte unsigned binary number at &201 and location &202 contains the auto-repeat rate in centiseconds as a one-byte unsigned binary number — zero turns it off altogether. Location &203 contains &59 — Ascii of Y — or &4E — N — according to whether the keyclick is on or off.

Location &200 always contains &FF, and doesn't do anything important, so you can set up all three locations controlling the keyboard with one Basic statement if you use the ! operator like this:

```
KB%=!&200 : !&200=&kkrrmmFF
```

where kk is either &59 or &4E, rr is repeat rate which is normally &06 and mm is timeout normally &05.

The &FF is just there to make sure location &200 stays as it is — note that the ! operator pokes locations in reverse order. At the end of your program, put this line:

```
!&200=KB%
```

This restores the keyboard options to what they were

before so as not to interfere with your other programs.

One use that I've found for these pokes is to turn off the auto-repeat during games. This can be important as the Z88's INKEY function reads the next character in the input buffer. If the repeat isn't turned off during a game, this can fill up making you lose control of your spaceship or whatever as the micro is running several seconds behind you. — T.D. Lascelles, Portsmouth.

● Care must be taken if you poke the Z88's memory as, unlike the BBC Micro, you never switch it off to reset your errors and, also, these locations may change in future versions — it's always better to use legal methods.

It is compatible with all BBC Micros including the Master and is available for £14.99 using the order form on Page 135.

## Gem on the Master 512

I HAVE a Solidisk-modified Master 512 which gives me 897k ram with the latest BBC Micro MsDos 2.1 and Gem 2.0. I recently bought Gem 3.0 and other related software. Unfortunately it doesn't work properly.

Although I can load Gem 3.0 there's no mouse driver so I can only use it with the arrow keys. Software such as 1st Word Plus and Superbase which work under Gem 2.0 — though not properly — give no problems under Gem 3.0. I was hoping to buy a copy of Timeworks DTP but as it only works on Gem 3.0 I don't see much point as I won't be able to use the mouse.

I have contacted Digital

Research and Acorn but neither were able to help me. I can appreciate the cost involved in supplying a special version of Gem 3.0 to run on the Master 512, but unless I can obtain a modified working version of Gem 3.0 I'll be forced to buy a PC and I feel this would be such a shame as the BBC Micro seems to be a much superior machine.

Is it possible to buy a suitably adapted version of Gem 3.0 to run on the Master 512? — Rev. G.P. Bridle, Craigavon, Co. Armagh, N.Ireland.

● Perhaps one of our readers can help — however since 1st Word Plus and other original

PC software are now available as native Archimedes programs and you can run other PC packages on the emulator perhaps you should consider upgrading your hardware in this direction.

## VUPPY again

HAVING struggled with View's highlights for some time, I was interested to read Peter Harris's article — Join the View Club — in the September issue.

I typed in the listing and was most satisfied with the results. The only problem I found was remembering the printer control codes for features like enlarged or underlined.

I got around this problem by putting the various codes on the shift+control level of the function keys which are not used by View using the following command file:

The value of highlight 1 is changed at the start of the document, using the stored command HT, to 27 — the ESC code. Printer commands can then be utilised by typing a highlight 1 code followed by the appropriate function key.

Obviously there are not enough function keys for all the printer commands available and it is simple to change the definitions for your preferred ones.

The codes used here are for a Canon PW1080A printer which is allegedly Epson-compatible but it is advisable to check the codes for your own printer — I.D. Lindsay, Newton Abbott, Devon.
