igh School Chemistry Day will be held on April 14, 1996, at the Moscone Convention Center in San Francisco, California. This event is held biannually as part of the Division of Chemical Education's activities at national American Chemical Society Meetings. The organizer of the San Francisco program, Robert Zafran, briefly describes its purpose and organization and invites all interested parties to attend.

For several years High School Chemistry Day has been a formal part of the American Chemical Society's (ACS's) Chemical Education Division program at National ACS Meetings. This event, dedicated to teaching at the secondaryschool level, consists of discussion panels, presentations, laboratory activities, and workshops devoted to both professional and educational topics of concern to high school chemistry teachers.

The event is usually sponsored by chemistry-related industries and organizations and coordinated by a local chemistry educator, who is responsible for the organization, program content, and facilities. Often, an area college or high school provides facilities, such as laboratories, computers, and Internet access. Presenters include professional chemists, educators, and the providers of chemistry education materials. Some of the topics presented during the last two High School Chemistry Days, which were held in concert with the 210<sup>th</sup> (Chicago) and 211<sup>th</sup> (New Orleans) ACS National Meetings, are listed below.

- Forensic Chemistry: Applications for High School Classes
- Internet-Based Resources for High School Chemistry
- Classroom Demonstrations (Talesnick, et al.)
