In connection with the *5th International Congress in Quantum Chemistry* arranged by Camille Sandorfy in Montreal, Canada, under the auspices of the International Academy of Quantum Molecular Sciences, the Academy had its 22nd meeting on August 18, 1985. The Academy has maximum 30 regular members under 65 years of age, and a not limited number of members above 65.
