TCA reduces publication time of contributions

Recent technological progress is enabling Springer-Verlag to meet with authors' requirements for shorter publication times. Thus we are pleased to announce that Springer-Verlag is introducing the **Online First** publication concept for TCA.

Online Publication

All articles will be available to subscribers on the WWW approximately 2 weeks after the authors' proofs have been received. It will no longer be necessary for all the manuscripts in a given issue to wait for that complete issue to be filled in order to be published. As each paper is ready for publication, it will be published on the WWW with its own unique publication date as follows: "Published Online: $\langle date when placed on Springer's LINK server \rangle$ ". This date will also appear in the printed issues.

Citing Online First Contributions

Each article published by TCA will receive a unique DOI (Digital Object Identifier), which is linked to the URL and the bibliography when the printed issue is released. The DOI is registered with the International DOI Foundation, it is unique like the ISBN for books or the ISSN for periodicals. Since articles will have no page numbers until the issue is printed, Online First published contributions are citated by journal title and DOI.

Consequences

An author returning proofs to Springer-Verlag cannot withdraw or correct his contribution, as it is immediately prepared for WWW publication and published online. Any corrections after the proofs are returned have to be made in an Erratum, which will be hyperlinked to the article.
