


QuikPak, of Norristown, PA, emerges as the leading contender in the bid to purchase the Amiga. OuikPak has been manufacturing the A4000T since 1995, and all 4000T motherboards are made and distributed from the PA site. They made their intentions to buy the Amiga known in a public statement released December 24,1996. QuikPak submitted a final comprehensive bid for the assets and intellectual properties of the Amiga on January 31. All bids will be reviewed during February, and a winning bid will be selected by February 28, 1997 [ever hear this before?]. When the outcome of the bidding process is resolved, QuikPak will make a public announcement.

VIScorp, the prior leader in the effort to obtain the Amiga rights, failed to buy the Amiga in the agreed time frame and at the agreed price. VIScorp's renege on their earlier agreement again threw the Amiga liquidation proceedings wide open. Turmoil seemed to hit VIScorp as first Carl Sassenrath and then Jason Compton resigned. Soon after this, former CEO Bill Buck was relieved of his position as head honcho. VIScorp's web site no longer makes many references to the Amiga. However, they entered another bid and are still considered to be in the race

There were reportedly many bids for the Amiga, most of which remain undisclosed. There is some validity to reports that MicroSoft and Sony are interested, but to what extent is not known. There were also reports that Paxtron Corporation and former VIScorp CEO

Bill Buck teamed up to enter a bid, hoping to liquidate the Amiga assets if successful. However, Paxtron's President Joel Kornreich denies this report, saying Paxtron has been in contact with many of the parties interested in the Amiga, but are not involved with Bill Buck and certainly did not place a bid.

While the sale drags on, QuikPak continues to offer several computer models based around the A4000, as well as 060 accelerator cards. The 4000T is the standard 040/25Mhz tower system. The 4060T is the same as the 4000T but with a 060/50Mhz CPU. The 4040L is a "luggable" computer with a built-in high resolution LCD screen. It comes in several versions with either an

Carl Sassenrath, one of the original creators of the Amiga OS, announced he is developing a completely new computer language called LAVA. Unrelated to Java-an object-orientated programming language-LAVA is a solution-oriented language. It is designed not for engineers, but for the rest of us who require a smart, practical approach to solving a wide range of computing problems. It is an easy-to-use, powerful, efficient, and portable language for creating small graphical, audio, multimedia, network, and control applications. It is not restricted to a particular hardware platform, operating system, or processor.

According to Sassenrath, LAVA has gone through various stages of refinement for nearly ten years. The current prototype has been up and running for several months. There are still a few important modules to complete, but the expected release for the alpha-test version is March 1997. A beta release is scheduled for sometime in May 1997 with a final release later in the summer.

There are a few varieties of LAVA, depending on your needs and requirements.

LAVA- The basic LAVA language, including the translator (compiler) and execution environment. It is useful for scripts, configuration, shells, file manipulation, etc. Because of its small size, it is excellent for small control systems (e.g.

Probably the most destructive thing anyone can do is to pirate software. This will kill development quicker than a 100 megaton nuke. We must not give illegally copied software to our friends.

We Amigans have had to pull together for a long time now and frankly it isn't easy. But there is a reason we hang tough. We know what we have in the Amiga and we want to see it stick around. A lot is happening. There is a growing movement away single OS from dominance (Windows/Intel) and we want to see the Amiga lead that movement. Keep the faith and stay informed. There is light at the end of the tunnel.

040 or 060 CPU and is available complete with NewTek's Video Toaster and Flyer on board. Prices range from US \$4,495 to \$9,995. They also offer an 060 accelerator card for the A3000/A4000 desktop and various A4000T computers. These cards are reportedly the fastest 060 cards available and offer built-in Wide SCSI 2 support.

QuikPak's new 5050T prototype uses a hybrid motherboard containing both a 68060 CPU and a Pentium 150. The 5050T uses the Siamese system from Hi-Q of England. It will run both the Amiga OS and Windows simultaneously and allows easy switching between both operating systems. The Retargetable Graphics (RTG) feature of the Siamese

QuikPak also mentions a model 1630LD on their web site. Due to the bidding process, QuikPak representatives can not publicly comment on the 1630LD's features. However, it is based on a fast 030 CPU and will contain many upgraded features and an excellent price. Both the 5050T and 1630LD are ready for market if and when QuikPak wins their bid for the Amiga. Hot New Emulators From Microcode

Jim Drew and Joe Fenton, formally of the defunct Utilities Unlimited, formed a new company called Microcode Solutions [briefly known as Persistence Software]. They released an exciting new 80x86 emulation program called PCx and will soon release a Mac emulation program called "Fusion." With emulation being on the minds of many amigans, The Informer talked to Jim Drew, the CEO of Microcode Solutions, to get some answers.

Amiga Informer (AI): You offer two Mac emulation products, Mac1200 and MacLite. How do they differ?

Jim Drew (JD): We don't offer Mac1200 and MacLite. These were products of the now defunct Utilities Unlimited.

AI: Do you own the rights to these products? JD: I own the rights to all of Utilities Unlimited's products. I am no longer producing anything that came from Utilities Unlimited.

AI: Does this mean that Mac1200 and MacLite are no longer in active development? JD: Correct. I don't have a problem fixing something if it is broken, but at this point there will be no more additional features added to anything that Utilities Unlimited sold.

We are releasing a completely new Macintosh emulation called Fusion. It offers all of the features of MacPro for the Emplant hardware without the need of any additional hardware. There are many new features that will make Fusion even better than the Emplant stuff we did.

AI: Does the Emplant board have any advantage over the software-only emulation? JD: Yes. Speed and compatibility. For this reason, Fusion will use the Emplant hardware if you have it. When Joe Fenton and I designed the Emplant board, we wanted to make the hardware handle most of the programming problems. So, the Emplant is actually a complete duplication of a Mac IIcx motherboard without the ADB port and floppy controller. By letting the hardware handle all of the Mac's interrupt and timing functions, valuable Amiga resources are freed up, thus making the Amiga run faster, which in turn makes the Mac emulation also faster.

AI: How has the response been to PCx, your new 80x86 emulation program?

JD: Staggering! Sales are good, and people are really surprised how much faster and more compatible PCx is compared to PCTask.

AI: How does PCx differ from your main competitor, PCTask?

JD: PCx is faster than PCTask, especially on faster (040/060) machines. The CPU Transcription makes slow machines no less than twice as fast as standard mode. The compability is near perfect because the emulation is a hardware-level emulation. This means that we emulate each piece of PC hardware at a low level...so if a program 'pokes' at the hardware, it is going to find it! We also have Sound Blaster support, the ability to 'mount' an Amiga partition as a PC drive, and native drivers such as ANSI, ASPI, and CD-ROM. We just have a lot of neat stuff that goes with this package.

AI: Are games that run on a 486 PC playable on an AGA Amiga with an average 030 processor?

JD: Any CGA/EGA game and simple VGA games run quite well.

AI: What is the suggested hardware requirements to run PCx effectively?

JD: We optimized PCx really for an 040/060 system. Although a stock A3000 (25Mhz) works very well for DOS based applications and CGA/EGA game playing. AI: If the same program were to run in Mac emulation and in PC emulation, which would give better performance? JD: Definately the Mac emulation. Not only is the CPU the same, but we rewrote portions of the Mac's OS to use the Amiga's hardware to make it faster.

AHI is a new audio system developed by Martin Blom of Sweden. It is a set of routines used to talk to audio cards-even Paula, the Amiga's custom audio chip. Once installed, it replaces the current sound subsystem and programs that support AHI will work in 16-Bit sound and in more than 4 channels. Music and audio programs written to take advantage of AHI will work on all supported audio cards. This saves a programmer the effort of writing separate drivers for each different audio card. A list of programs that work with sound cards can be found at Pauli Porkka's support page which can be linked from the AHI homepage. Hardware currently supported by AHI are: Aura (sampling only); Delfina. DSP; Paula; Prelude; Toccata; and Wavetools. There is planned support for DLT's Hypersound 32 and Plasma 32 audio cards. PCx is a new software-only 80x86 emulation program from Microcode Solutions. This emulation includes the Pentium and 686 instruction set and the Intel undocumented P5 instructions. PCx runs on any Amiga with a 68020 or later processor. It features a slick user interface, is self configuring, and allows a wide variety of display modes. Mono Sound Blaster emulation is built-in as is support for video cards including the Graffiti Graphics Box. The Graffiti Box is an affordable graphics device that outputs data in chunky format, so no chunky-to-planar graphics conversion is necessary, making a 320x200, 256 color PCx display really fly! PCx also offers the ability to mount Amiga partitions on the PC side and provides CD-ROM support. You can download a demo version of PCx from the Blittersoft web site (http://blitter soft.wildnet.co.uk/). PCx retails for US \$59.95. Owners of the Emplant e586DX emulation module can send in their original e586DX disk and get PCx for half the normal retail price. Look for a full review of PCx in our next issue.

limited display quality. This is due to restrictions in color capabilities and processor performance. Support for third party graphics cards is being considered, but is second priority to native operation.

LAVA will also be released for the PC. It is critical that LAVA gain a large user base as rapidly as possible. The only way to do this is to support various PC configurations, including Windows (95, 3.1, and NT) and DOS. In time other platforms will be considered, possibly including phase5 A\Box, Be Box, PIOS, VillageTronics, Apple Macintosh (68k and PPC), Unix flavors including Lynx (useful as LAVA servers), Sun, SGI, Next, and other workstations and special custom or proprietary systems.

AI: Is Microcode working on the next version of PCx?

JD: We are always working on PCx's enhanced mode (Windows 95) support. Once this is complete, then we can release Fusion, and then we will also release our first non-Amiga program called, "PowerCLONE." This is a 80x86 emulation for PowerMac machines, based on the PCx technology.

AI: What other development products are in the works?

JD: We have a lot of neat products just sitting around from the days at Utilities Unlimited. We plan on doing a market survey to see what the public wants.

AI: How do you see the Amigas future as a desk top computer?

JD: I see the OS surviving, and the hardware changed to modern technology.

AI: Any comments?

JD: We still believe in the Amiga, and we hope that the public will believe in our abilities to keep the Amiga alive.

SofTalk, TransMaker and PhonMaker

SofTalk from Parth Galen is a software speech synthesizer for the Amiga. But it is definitely not a replacement for the voice synthesizer that used to ship with all Amigas.

SofTalk does try to read text aloud. It works with the old "say" command, and with the old "speak" device. It just doesn't produce output that's very understandable. The lack is in hard consonants, or "stops." B's, D's, P's and T's especially aren't pronounced. If you input a string of these letters each is pronounced "e." This will not do for intelligible speech.

What you can do is experiment with computerized speech, though the basic SofTalk package won't take you very far. It consists of a narrator device and a translator device, like the old Amiga OS. The difference is these allow much more user intervention. SofTalk comes with a demonstration program that allows you to enter text or phoneme codons (more about them later). The program will then pronounce the text you entered. You can vary a number of parameters to do some minimal experimentation. It's really only enough to get you started.

The real value of SofTalk is seen when you add one or more of its companion programs, "PhonMaker" or "TransMaker."

We need to understand the computerized speech process. First, text is translated through the translator.library into special symbols called codons. The codons are passed to the narrator.device, which uses them to select individual sounds to pronounce. These sounds are "phonemes." The old Commodore system provided no control over codons or phonemes. With SofTalk, TransMaker and PhonMaker you have complete control.

PhonMaker edits phonemes. You can replace any or all of the default phonemes with your own. The program arrives with a lot of information. You'll need it - not because the program is difficult, but because the task of designing phonemes properly is complex. It is also fascinating, and PhonMaker is a well thought out program for doing it. Given time and the will to create phonemes, most people can learn to do it.

A nice feature is the ability to input data from a sound sampler. Such phonemes sound much better than the defaults. However, the lack of consonants/stops persists.

The TransMaker program is also complex, and comes with three manuals and a reference card. It's used to create or modify translator library look-up tables. In theory, you should be able to create tables for any language or accent. In practice, this is going to be an absorbing, challenging job. Like PhonMaker, TransMaker is a well designed tool. Unlike PhonMaker, it is not properly font aware. When I ran it on a computer which doesn't use the default Topaz font, I came up with a window having oversized text in overlapping labels for the buttons and gadgets. Once I figured out what was what, the program worked flawlessly despite its strange appearance.

It's difficult to rate these products. If you wish a text to speech reader, then the grade is a D at best. Matters improve greatly when you use SofTalk with its companions, and I strongly recommend this is the only way you use it at present. For exploring computer phonetics the programs are in a world by themselves. They're fascinating, fun and informative. They deserve an A for effort, but the end results you hear will likely never exceed a C. Even with all three programs, truly intelligible speech is probably unattainable. This is not a set of software for everyone.

ing knowledge of everything required to run the game. It is written at an intermediate level. Power Football is easily installed by the Commodore Installer and is not copy-protected. No bugs were found during the evaluation.

The game is a good simulation. There are quite a few formations and pass patterns to choose from. The player first acts as coach, setting up the offense or defense, and then, once all the decisions are made, the action goes to the arcade mode. The player controls either the free safety, if on defense, or the quarterback on offense. As quarterback, you can pass or hand off the ball. All the arcade action is controlled by the "Virtual Joystick" of the mouse.

The arcade section of the game suffers because the program tries to cover the whole range of Amigas - being able run on a 512K Amiga OS 1.3 machine through today's machines. The graphics in the arcade section seem quite blocky, which I suspect is due to the game being programmed to run on an Amiga OS 1.3 / 512K machine. Along the same lines, the text in the coaching portion of the game is quite small and difficult to read. The playability of the game would improve a good deal if the text was more easily readable, and the graphics in the arcade mode were smoother. The graphics seem

to suffer by comparison to the simulation portion of the game.

Admittedly, I have no real experience with other products of this type. I have been able to find reviews of "Amiga CD Football" by Commodore, "Profes-

 sional Football Simulator" by MicroSearch, and "Tom Landry
 Strategy Football" by Merit Software.
 Each of the reviews seem to imply that the games are much more extensive than the game under review. Then again, I am not sure if these products can be found, and they were priced quite a lot higher then "Power Football."

Power Football is a good simulation, but suffers because the text in the "coach" setup section is small and hard to read. The graphics in the arcade portion of the game are passable, but could use improvement. Overall, the game rates a C, with good simulation but only fair graphics.

CD Summary

Utilities Experience (UE) is, as you would expect, full of useful utilities. What makes this CD so attractive is it's organization. Everything is laid out in an orderly fashion. All drawers are cleaned up and snapshoted, as are the drawer's contents. When you open the UE icon you have a CD-prefs drawer that will give you several options for configuring the display. The "useful" drawer contains a "clickme" icon that, once clicked, will temporarily set up your system to interface smoothly with the CD. This allows most programs to work directly from the CD.

UE contains 15 separate drawers that represent the subjects of Business, Emulation, Graphics, DataTypes, Video, Icons+Tools, Demos, Comms, Music, Disk Tools, Misc, Workbench+Shell, Text Files, Rendering and Programmers. Nearly all these drawers contain a "contents" file that lists the programs within the drawer and gives a brief description of what these programs do.

There is a large selection of commercial demo programs including DPaint 5, Twist, SBasePro, Digital Universe, AdPro and many more. Some drawers, like Graphics, contain scores of programs, and the DataTypes drawer has dozens of datatypes at your disposal. All the other subject drawers are likewise filled with hundreds of files.

Any CD compilation containing public domain software will become dated. Certainly, some of the programs contained within Utilities Experience have since been upgraded. However, many remain the latest version and will undoubtedly give you a wealth of utilities to improve your computing experience.

Workbench Extras

The Amiga's user interface is still one of the most friendly and usable available on any computer of any size. Like any complex creation though, some portions are better designed than others. One of the strangest design decisions involves the graphical deletion of files.

There are two ways you can remove a file, or an entire directory of files, from the Amiga's disks. First, you can always use the "Icons/Delete" item from the Workbench pulldown menu. A more graphical method involves dragging the file or directory to be deleted into the Amiga trashcan. You might use this method when you want to get something out of the way for now and plan to really remove it later, since items remain in the trashcan until you deliberately select Empty Trash. This gives you a chance to change your mind.


Actually, it's more correct to describe this second method of removing files as dragging them to 'A' trashcan rather than 'THE' trashcan. Unlike any other operating system I know of which uses the trashcan motif, the Amiga gives you not one but many. And that's a problem. Every Amiga filesystem has its own trashcan. That means every floppy, every hard drive partition, even the RAM disk has its own trashcan. You must drag a file into the appropriate trashcan or you'll just make a copy of it and leave the original file right where it was. Furthermore, you have to find the trashcan to use it. You have to ensure you can see the appropriate trashcan, often forcing you to open additional windows. It would be much nicer if the Amiga had just one trashcan sitting on the Workbench, like other systems have.

In fact there have been many programs over the years written to resolve this dilemma. The one we'll discuss is called X-Trash written by Rudi Chiarito. X-Trash is Freeware and can be found at http://www.cli.di.unipi.it/~chiarito/ under projects. It should be available on Aminet under util/app, but the current version (1.3) seems to be missing. The archive is about 33K bytes long. You'll also need to obtain and install the reqtools.library by Nico Franois found on Aminet in /util/libs/ReqToolsUsr.lha.

X-Trash will run on any Amiga with OS 2.0 or higher. Installation is simple. Copy the reqtools.library into your libs: device. Then, drag the X-Trash icon into the WBStartup drawer if you want it always active, or just place it anywhere else you wish if you want to start it manually.

X-Trash doesn't replace the individual trashcans, it provides one central point from which you can manage them. Best of all, it does this by placing an icon on the Workbench, where it's always visible. The icon placed there is a special sort called an "appicon." Here's how it works. When you want to "trash" a file (or entire directory), drag the file's icon over the X-Trash appicon and drop it. X-Trash will immediately move the file into the appropriate trashcan. If no trashcan exists for the file system containing the item to be deleted, one will be created. When it comes time to delete items, double click on the X-Trash appicon. X-Trash will open a window with four options to choose from; Empty, About, Quit and Cancel. Cancel, Quit and About do as you'd expect. Empty gets the work done. Clicking on this button brings up another window with four additional choices: All. Select, Icons and Cancel. As before, Cancel allows you to back out of the deletion. All

you lets empty all trashcans currently available that is, all trashcans on disks currently mounted by the Amiga. A requester will pop up each for trashcan, stating the



(disk) icon, then use this button, the trashcan for that filesystem will be emptied. It doesn't work for me, but I don't miss it. A11 and Select should cover just about any needs you have.

file system the trashcan belongs to and asking for a mouse click as confirmation. Requesters will only be displayed for trashcans which have contents. It's all very much quicker and easier to do than to describe. The Select option will open a simple concept but simple often leads to the best ideas. X-Trash, or some program like it, could easily become one of your favorite Amiga OS enhancements.

FTP - Internet Express

What's an FTP? FTP is another in the seemingly endless string of protocols used to transfer information over the internet. Whereas SMTP is for sending Email, and NNTP is for posting to Usenet, FTP, which stands for File Transfer Protocol, is specifically used to

transfer any type of file between machines on the internet. If you get shareware from Aminet, you are usually using FTP.

FTP was originally designed to act like a directory tool, so if there weren't graphic interfaces, it would still be easy to use. However, like everything on the internet these days, there are several graphic interfaces to play with.


First, it would help to understand the power of the native FTP interface. FTP was designed for a maximum speed of transfer, and so it has separate modes for text and binary

data. The binary protocol allows for transfer of essentially random 8-Bit messages, whereas the text protocol is optimized for 7-Bit blocks of ASCII information. This is important because though the binary protocol can transfer text, albeit slowly, the text protocol cannot transfer binary data. If you try to get a binary file via text protocol you'II end up with a corrupt file.

FTP allows you to move through a directory tree on the machine you are requesting the file from, and provides formatting commands, and commands to "put" or "get" a file.

As with all access over the internet, you need permission to do anything with a file. This permission is gained by logging on to the file serving machine. FTP allows two kinds of log-on's. The first is the standard log-on with your user name and a password. The second and more common is "anonymous" log-on. This has been dubbed "anonymous FTP" for short, and it means that when you log-on to the file server, for user name you use "anonymous," and for the password you use your Email address. This gives you access to special files designed for public access via FTP.

There are three shareware packages available on Aminet to access files by FTP. The first is FTPmount (comm/tcp/FTPMount-1.0). This bit of software takes advantage of the similarity of FTP with the directory-based AmigaDOS file system. It mounts a device called FTP, and with some configuration, can make FTP sites appear as

directories. For example, you can use FTPmount to transparently mount your favorite Aminet site as a directory in your file system. This would allow you to type "dir FTP:aminet/recent" in the CLI and get a list of the recent files on Aminet. This is even more convenient if you use a directory tool like Directory Opus or DirWork, because you can use these as graphic interfaces. You just go into the FTP device and copy the file you want to your hard drive. It's that simple.

The other two packages are full FTP GUI's, and go by the confusingly similar names of AmFTP (comm/tcp/ AmFTP1. 65.lha) and AmiFTP (comm/tcp/ AmiFTP-1.607.lha). Of these, the first is a time limited demo, so you'll only have a short while to evaluate it until you have to pay the shareware fee. Both programs offer intuitive graphic interfaces that resemble directory utility interfaces.

AmFTP offers two directory windows, one for the server, and one for your computer, so you can redirect where you are sending from or receiving to on your machine. AmiFTP on the other hand offers a larger window size for server file information, but you have to choose the receiving directory via a requestor, and change it from the menu.


Both packages sport a special Aminet recent file interface, featuring an ADT (Aminet Download Tool) interface. This allows you to get a list of new files on Aminet since the last time you signed on.

AmFTP has one impressive function not found in the competition, and that is a direct Archie interface. Archie is a database program that contains a listing of files available throughout the internet. There are several

Archie sites across the net and they are updated regularly. In the early days of the internet this was a quick way to search the entire internet for a file by using the files name. With the boom on the internet, this searching has slowed to a snail's pace, but if you can't find a file you know the name of, Archie is still an excellent place to look. AmFTP's Archie interface allows you to send an Archie request. Once found, you can click on the filename and AmFTP will FTP to the site and get the file.

Well that's FTP in a nutshell. Now it's back to the net to FTP

Web Page Editors

When I started writing HTML, I did it the way I learned Basic and APL. I got a manual and poked around the net grabbing other peoples pages and downloading them. From there, I messed with the code and repeatedly reloaded things into the browser until I knew what the hypertext tags did. Once you get to this point you can easily advance to power web publishing with a dedicated web publisher program.


Currently available are several dedicated HTML editors, all found on Aminet. The first program is Magic WWW page Maker (comm/www/mwm212.lha) and it is non-MUI. It handles all the sophisticated HTML continued on page 15

tags including FORM tags, and will dump the created file to your web browser for viewing at the click of an icon. It has a main window where a text document can be loaded, and a "What is" window to indicate how the hypertext tags are effecting the text on that line. It seems to be based around converting existing text files and is very configured within the limits of the GUI. Personally, I find the display confusing, but this is individual preference. It also has a helpful log window that gives you information like the default format for a line of text. The shareware version doesn't allow me to save out the files, but I believe the registered version will.

By contrast, I've test constructed several pages with the MUI interfaced WebMaker. (text/hyper/WebMaker1 1.lha). This is a fully functional "donationware" HTML editor, and for someone who reads HTML it is a lot more intuitive. MUI allows you to configure windows and screens with the standard MUI preferences program. Basically, WebMaker is a text editor with built in HTML tagging. It covers most of the same tags as MWM and includes some Netscape HTML 3+ extensions that aren't standard, but are in general use. It has only one window which shows the HTML code as it stands during the editing process, which I find less confusing. It doesn't have a one button web browser interface, but this is easy to get around. I run IBrowse and Web-Maker on the same screen. By hitting the WebMaker save button followed by the IBrowse refresh button (opened to the local file), I view the page as I work.

Another new contender is WebDesign (comm/ www/WebDesign13.lha). WebDesign works by a series of buttons that cover the top half t h screen. The bottom half is the usual c o d e editing window. This editor adds s o m e more HTML3+ codes. but still falls short on



things like frames. WebDesign's layout is very clear and intuitive.

The latest full function editor is WebPlug (comm/www/WebPlug v121. lha). WebPlug has a configured screen, and covers most HTML tags. It functions well in competition with the other editors, but I suffered several system crashes with the shareware version I tested.

Another program to consider is WebFactory (comm/www/WebFactory. lha). It doesn't do quite what the others are capable of, but it fully supports header META tags, which are how you place authoring information and keywords for web search utilities. These are important because they allow you to define how you want your page to appear when Lycos or AltaVista refer a browser to your site.

Finally, there is a full featured editor in

This extremely rich language used initially on IBM's educational networks allowed massive programs to be reduced often to a single cryptic line of code.



The non-MUI Magic Web page Maker offers a log window and a view button that dumps a file to your browser for viewing.


sight which may well out do all the competition. This is Arachne. and it is being developed by NightSpeed Software of Rhode Island. We will definitely have more on this developing program when available.

Another interesting item is a graphics map editor called Ptolemy (www.ids.net/~nightspd). This program allows the easy construction of clickable imagemaps, and requires no knowledge of HTML imagemap code. If nothing else, this is a great stand alone utility.

In addition to the above dedicated programs, there are many HTML add-on's for all the usual text editors as well. The HTML-heaven suite, for example, adds menus, cycle gadgets, or button bars to almost every available text editor via ARexx. Likewise, GoldEd has a public domain plug-in to do WWW editing.

DataFlyer CD-XDS vI.I

More and more Amigans want to access CD-ROM's. SCSI modules are one way to attach a CD-ROM drive to your system, but IDE devices are still cheaper than their SCSI counterparts, making them appealing. The A1200 and A600 come with a built-in IDE controller that will control up to two devices. Since most users are running only one IDE device (a hard drive), it make sense to utilize the unused IDE address. Recognizing this, Expansion Systems offers the DataFlyer CD-XDS as a way to add an IDE CD-ROM to a system.

The CD-XDS package includes a two piece aluminium chassis, a IDE power/data cable and a small but detailed manual. Optionally, you can order a 5-pin DIN power cable for connecting to an external power supply. You may also wish to purchase the CD-XDS bundled with Asimware's APATI compatible file system. This is only the APATI file system found on Asimware's CDFS software. No other part of the CDFS software is included. In all cases, an APATI file system is necessary to read the information on a CD-ROM.

We tested the CD-XDS on an A1200 that included an Apollo 1240 40 Mhz accelerator, 32 Mb fast RAM, and a Squirrel SCSI controller with 2 devices attached. This system also had an external hard drive housed in a DataFlyer XDS chassis.

A separately purchased Mitsui FX400 Quad speed CD-ROM Drive was mounted into the CD-XDS chassis. This standard 5 1/4 drive screwed easily onto the CD-XDS chassis. Connecting the power supply plug, the IDE cable, and setting the power jumpers was straight forward and easy. After sliding on the chassis housing, it was ready to connect to the A1200.

It is necessary to open your computer to connect the power/data cable to the IDE header. By following the well diagramed



manual, making the connections inside the computer was a snap, and within 10 minutes, we had the CD-XDS running.

We also connected the CD-XDS to our external DataFlyer hard drive. This required a bit more thinking, because the manual failed to detail this procedure. After a brief call to tech support, we were on track and installation proceeded without a hitch. It is worth noting however, that if you are attaching your CD-XDS chassis to a DataFlyer external hard drive, it may be necessary to power the CD-XDS with a separate power supply. We where not able to power the CD-XDS through the computer.

Once installed, the CD-XDS worked flawlessly. I have only two minor complaints. I found the chassis cover was difficult to slide over the CD-ROM drive. This was caused by a mounting screw not setting fully. However, after a little lubrication it slid on securely. The other minor complaint was the lack of documentation on installing the CD-XDS to an external DataFlyer hard drive. I was assured that this documentation would be posted to their web site to remedy the oversight.

This is an excellent and well made product that installs easily, and does what it says. The CD-XDS rates an A.



Everyone knows they should back-up their hard drive but many don't. If nothing else, you should at least back-up your most important Workbench Directories. Top priority is your S, (User-startup and startup-Sequence especially), Libs, Devs, Prefs and C directories. Put them in a safe place for when (not if) you need them.
