International Congress of Pathology

The XIth International Congress of International Academy of Pathology and the IInd World Congress of Environmental and Academic Pathology will be held in Washington, D. C., October 17–23, 1976.

Being organized by U.S. - Canadian Division of the International Academy of Pathology, the Congress is co-sponsored by the American Society of Clinical Pathologists, the College of American Pathologists, the American Association of Pathologists and Bacteriologists, the American Society of Experimental Pathology, the Intersociety Pathology Council, Association of Pathology Chairmen, American Association of Neuropathologists, Academy of Clinical Laboratory Physicians and Scientists, Society of Pharmacological and Environmental Pathologists, Pediatric Pathology Club, and American Association of Dermatopathology.

There will be half-day symposia on Environmental Pathology, Education in Pathology, Bladder Carcinogenesis, Tissue Reaction to Drugs, Pathology of Aging, Nomenclature Coding and Data Processing, Population Control, Pediatric Pathology, Neuropathology, Comparative Pathology, Bone and Joint Pathology, Skin Pathology, and Analgesic Abuse Nephropathology. There will be two all-day sessions, one on Geographic Pathology and the other on Diseases of the Kidney. Fifteen slide seminars have been arranged and a two-day course on Diagnostic Electron Microscopy. A world renowned scientist has been scheduled as a guest lecturer for each day.

A number of social functions have been organized. Included in these are the opening ceremony, a concert at the National Gallery of Art, followed by a dinner at Hogate and Flagship Restaurants, boat ride on the Potomac, and the Gala Banquet. The registration fee will subsidize some of these functions.

Attendance at the Congress will give an opportunity to visit Washington during one of the most beautiful months of the year and participate in some of the Bicentennial activities scheduled throughout the year.
