



Get ahead to ensure you enjoy every minute of the celebrations



A week or two before your guests arrive work out how many people you have coming and check that you have enough plates, bowls, glasses and cutlery, bearing in mind that you might not want to be washing up in between courses. Now is also a good time to check them over to make sure they are in good condition – nobody

wants to eat off a chipped plate – and if anything is dusty or grubby give it a good clean to save doing it as you are dishing up.

order well before the guests start to arrive...

If you are roasting a whole turkey, simmering a ham joint or making a large batch of soup, make sure your existing pots, pans, tins and trays are the right size. You don't want to be squeezing a turkey into a too-small tin on Christmas morning, or mopping up spilt soup that's bubbled over in a tiny pan.

The week before make sure your table linen is clean and ironed if needed. Check you have enough napkins, place mats and coasters while you are at it.

There will inevitably be leftovers on Christmas Day, or when entertaining in the lead-up to the big day, so it's important you are able to store them properly to avoid waste. Empty out that cupboard jammed with mismatched plastic boxes, locate the lids and make sure they still fit tightly. Think about what might be left over and decide on whether you have enough, or need to purchase a couple of new items. Check your rolls of tin foil, clingfilm and greaseproof paper and stock up if needed. And don't forget to add freezer bags to your shopping list as an added back up!

My set of stainless steel cutlery has become tarnished, is there any way of giving it back its sparkle?

Stainless steel cutlery can over time develop streaks on the surface which is actually a build up of detergent that hasn't been rinsed away sufficiently. If you wash them in the dishwasher make sure you remove them as soon as possible when the wash has finished, and always give them

a good rinse when washing by hand, ensuring you don't leave them to drain. To remove the stains try using a specific stainless steel cleaner, or use lemon juice to buff away the stain.

Making sure the turkey is cooked through is a difficult task, especially when it's large enough to feed a very hungry crowd. Leave no room for doubt by using OXO's digital instant read thermometer to measure the internal cooking temperature. Getting the turkey out of the roasting tin can also be an awkward moment - make it easier with this poultry lifter, which will allow you to drain juices from the turkey with ease and lift it swiftly onto the carving board.

Surprise cakes and hidden centres are the latest craze in the baking world, and thanks to Nordic Ware creating this trick has become a whole lot easier. The Piñata cake pan, available for £19.99 from Lakeland, allows you to bake a round cake with a hollow inside, to fill with sweets for a dramatic surprise when you cut a slice out of the finished cake. The round shape makes the perfect festive figgy pudding, but this pan is not just for Christmas. Use it all year round to create apples or footballs for birthdays, or pumpkins and eyeballs for Hallowe'en.



We test... cleaning pastes

We tested a selection of cleaning pastes, here's what we found...

ASTONISH PRO CLEANING PASTE, £3.99

With a pleasant smell and a good consistency, this paste worked well on a multitude of tasks around the home, including a greasy cooker hood and grime around taps. It contains essential oils of tea tree and eucalyptus, and left behind a slight coating which was effective in repelling water. The sponge included wasn't the best quality and didn't last very long, but could easily be replaced with another once it wears out



DR. BECKMANN POWER CLEANER, £4.09

This tough, multi-purpose paste had a scent reminiscent of fresh laundry, and came with its own sponge. The consistency was quite firm, so it was a little tricky to get a decent amount on the sponge, but it did work well for a variety of cleaning tasks, and was especially effective on grubby grout and limescale around taps. It left behind a water-repellent finish, which was really handy for use around sinks and taps, and it could also be useful for outside jobs such as alloy wheels and muddy trainers.



DOKTOR POWER MULTI-PURPOSE CLEANER, £4.99, JML

This all-purpose cleaner made light work of everything we tried it on from mucky oven doors to limescalecovered taps and a stained kitchen draining board. The product was solid in the container but once the wet sponge, which is included, was applied it soon softened up and created a good amount of cleaning foam. It had a fresh, pleasant citrus scent and didn't feel too harsh on our hands - and is environmentallyfriendly too, which is another bonus.



THINGS WE CONSIDERED

- Could it be used for a multitude of tasks?
- How well did it clean?
- Did it leave behind a residue?

BIO-MEX, £9.99, LAKELAND

A little goes a long way with this cleaner so is well worth the price. It comes as a hard block which you use with the included wet sponge. It took a while to get a good amount on the sponge at first but soon started to foam. It worked well on tasks around the kitchen such as cleaning a greasy hob, and left a uPVC door gleaming white although some elbow grease was needed for sticky marks. It had quiet a strong citrus smell which was fresh, and left behind a white residue which wiped away easily.

Make a budget

there are no payment problems.

Top tip

- Other accounts should be savings accounts, where you can earn good interest, or a cash ISA with tax-free interest.

Extra ways to save up

Try more long-term ways to make extra cash:

- Ask for overtime at work.
- Take on a second job, utilising a skill you can share with others, such as special occasion cakes.
- Make money from a spare room with a lodger.
- Rent out the garage if you never use it.
- Offer your babysitting, pet-sitting or dogwalking services to family and friends.

'VVe chose to revamp rather than replace'

Louise scoured the internet for her versatile and durable granite double sink, which she complemented with a stylish chrome mixer tap

The new replacement touch-top induction hob and integrated oven were simply slotted into place in around half an hour!

Louise Hanson transformed her tired, dated kitchendiner without any mess or fuss and for a fraction of the cost of buying new

Then Louise Hanson, first viewed the three-bedroom house in North Wales, she shares with husband Pete, and son Ben, she was instantly drawn to the large kitchen-diner. 'The previous owner had installed it 20 years ago, but despite its age, the oak units were in great condition, plus the traditional layout and generous storage were perfect for a busy family - so it seemed a shame to rip it out, especially as we couldn't afford to fit a kitchen of similar quality,' explains Louise. However, just three years on, and the inherited kitchen was beginning to show signs of wear and tear. 'The cooker, sink and laminate worktop had definitely seen better days, and although the units remained pristine, I must admit I found the dark and outdated timber finish quite oppressive,' says Louise. The challenge, for the couple, was how to create a modern airy space on a strict budget.

STEP ONE Keen to retain the units and avoid the expense and disruption a new kitchen brings, Louise initially suggested they simply paint them. However, worried that their painting skills were not up to the job, the couple began researching alternatives and were delighted to discover a local company specialising in re-spraying units. 'After a few home visits, plus a myriad of samples, we settled on a colour combination of soft grey and off-white,' recalls Louise. And with all doors off-site for re-painting, the couple set about dismantling some unwanted cupboards above the hob. 'I found being totally surrounded by wall units quite claustrophobic, and I'm pleased to say their removal instantly helped open up the room,' says Louise, 'however it did result in some problematic damaged tiling!'

STEP TWO To further conserve funds the couple had wanted to keep both flooring and tiles, and while a quick scour of the garage resulted in a few replacement tiles,

there were not enough to make good the damaged area. Unsure as to the solution the couple turned their attention to replacing the hob, oven and sink, and cleverly sourced models that would simply slot into the existing spaces. Louise also took the opportunity to refresh the walls with a spaceenhancing pale grey and begin sourcing worktops. 'I wanted to invest the money saved in a sleek granite surface, but Pete was concerned that any new worktop would mean more damage to the tiling, so when a friend suggested Granite Transformations it seemed the ideal compromise,' says Louise, 'as rather than remove the existing worktop they simply cover it, plus they also suggested a matching splashback for the hob area.' With the worktops on order, the remainder of the units were then sprayed in-situ and the doors re-hung. 'This took a few of days due to our choice of two colours, and the masking >






required, but the finish is excellent and has proved very hard-wearing,' smiles Louise. The new engineered worktops and splashback also proved equally successful, and took just a day to complete, without any mess or damage. 'Everyone comments on how fantastic they look, and I love the fact that they are made from recycled materials,' says Louise.

STEP THREE An avid recycler, Louise then replaced some of the motif tiles on the remaining walls with plain tiles salvaged from the garage, while the rest were covered with a smart MDF blackboard. 'I got the idea when reading a restaurant menu board, and although

Pete was sceptical, he now uses it more than me,' laughs Louise. She also dug out an old dining table stowed in a shed, and a set of kitchen chairs, donated by her mother, was given a quick facelift and teamed with a retro stool. Finally a trip to the high street resulted in some useful open storage and shelving, while a made-to-measure blind added a welcome splash of colour and pattern. And now that it's complete, Louise cannot believe the difference - 'the room not only feels, bright and spacious, but off-setting expensive items against some serious cost-cutting, meant I got the kitchen I wanted without breaking the bank!'



light as possible was number one on my list. I was sick of cooking without enough daylight.' 

We've tripled the size of our kitchen

Anna Wlodarczyk-Lebioda decided drastic action was necessary to create the kitchen of her dreams

Wlodarczyk-Lebioda, wanted to find a house in Kingston, with her husband Tomasz, 35, and their two sons, Fryderyk, three, and Ludwik, two. because we had a loft extension too and the dust and dirt everywhere was too much. The house was full of tradesmen and I was six months pregnant at the time so I was pleased to get out of the way.' Tomasz drew up some plans of the extension so they could start thinking about the kitchen's design. 'This was my opportunity to design a kitchen from scratch - I was so excited. We wanted a central island to extend our work surfaces and to increase the storage options.' Once they decided on a run of units on one side with a central island, they were able to think about colours and materials. Tomasz had built a kitchen or two before so he suggested he build the main kitchen from low-cost carcasses then choose the doors separately, giving it a designer look but for less. 'I wanted a practical door colour so I wouldn't be slaving away the whole time cleaning up after the two boys,' Anna explains. Anna and Tomasz wanted to have something in between modern and traditional, so in the end chose the Shakerstyle doors in grey and teamed them with a

Anna couldn't wait for the summer months so that she could fold back the doors onto the garden great for the boys in warmer weather. Anna positioned her old table and chairs in the kitchen. 'It's made a huge difference to the way we live. I can now cook in the kitchen and watch the boys play at the table. Our old kitchen didn't have

Just moving a door meant

Andrea Buckingham turned her cramped bathroom into one that feels quite spacious



Insider info

WHO LIVES HERE?

Andrea Buckingham, who works for an estate agent, lives in a 1900s end-ofterrace three-bedroom house in Stratford-upon-Avon with her sons, Rory, 24 and Jamie, 21.

WHAT DO YOU LIKE **MOST ABOUT THE ROOM?**

'I love the light in here – it's a really sunny room. And on winter evenings I love lighting the candles and relaxing in the bath with a glass of wine. I'd always wanted a bath underneath a window so when I lie in it I can see the sky. Because of the shutters I can see out but people can't see in.'

WHAT ARE YOUR TOP TIPS?

'It feels much cleaner and fresher in the bathroom when it's not full of clutter - so I keep the surfaces free for things I like looking at instead.

WHAT WAS WRONG WITH THE OLD ROOM?

The bathroom was very cramped and the badly designed layout meant that the bath took up too much space leaving no room for a much-desired shower



Before

ndrea Buckingham bought her end-ofterrace 1900s three-bedroom house in February 2012 for herself and sons Rory and Jamie, plus cats Atticus and Darcy. It was the spacious hallway and landing and large double bedrooms that sold the house to her -'It certainly wasn't the bathroom which was guite the opposite, being very cramped and badly designed,' she says. 'It measures only 1.8m by 2.3m and a full-size bath took up the right-hand wall facing the WC and basin. There was lino on the floor and the walls were tiled from floor-to-ceiling in stark white like a public convenience.'

However many other rooms needed attention too so Andrea employed a builder, Mark Webster, to work on the whole house. He gutted the bathroom and put double-glazing

into the existing window frame and added a couple of downlighters. Then he suggested moving the door as far to the left as possible as this created a far more useable space and meant the family could now have a shower installed as well as a bath. New tiled flooring was laid and the builder made a false wall on the left-hand side to hide the pipework. The walls were then partly tiled and partly painted.

Andrea redesigned the layout so that the new bath now runs below the window. The new shower enclosure is in the right-hand corner and the new WC and basin are in the same places as before. Andrea used the same wall tiles, but trimmed down to a more attractive size, to line the bath panel, and the soft honey-beige tones she chose for this room make it far more inviting than the previous chilly white.

BIJOU BATH

The bath measures 1.7m long and fits snugly along the end wall and under the window. Andrea had some of the wall tiles cut down to cover the bath panel.

HIDDEN HANDIWORK

Builder Mark made a false wall along the left-hand wall behind which is concealed all the pipework for the



DO SOME

Andrea transformed the very elaborate mirror, which was in an unattractive orange pine, from an antiques barn by sanding it down and painting it using a tester pot of **Dulux Ivory Lace** to tone in with the walls.

BATHROOM PROBLEM ROOM

I doubled the space





CURVED CORNERS

By choosing a quadrant enclosure which fits into the corner behind the door Andrea was able to get more space inside the shower without it impinging too much on the bathroom. The shower head too can be removed to be handheld for hair washing.

Insider info

WHO LIVES HERE?

Paula Melis, 42, who works for a charity, her husband Bill, 42, a teaching assistant, and their children Ruby, 10, Leo, seven and Anna, four. They bought this 1930s four-bedroom semi in Hove eight years ago.

WHAT WAS YOUR BEST BUY?

'It was cheaper to buy two pieces of oak and have them glued together than buy one piece in a thicker slab!'

WHAT'S WORKED REALLY WELL?

'I really like Farrow & Ball paint but my painter said as it's chalk-based it would be too absorbent in the kitchen and mark easily. Instead he had the colour I wanted mixed in Johnstone's kitchen paint.'

WHAT ARE YOUR TOP TIPS?

'Earthstone, like Corian, can be cut into any shape and sealed so the joins are invisible, but it's a fraction of the price. It meant I could still have the Belfast sink I wanted because you can't use laminate, and the acrylics and stone were both too expensive.'

WHAT WAS WRONG WITH THE OLD ROOM?

The layout was impractical and made the kitchen cramped with little space for all of the appliances the family needed.

Paula Melis couldn't wait to move into the spacious 1930s house she had bought with then boyfriend Bill in 2006, as it was their first home with one another, and she had been living in a two-bedroom flat with her daughter Ruby. Although the cramped galley kitchen was far from ideal the couple had a plan.

'We knew we could knock down the adjoining wall to the dining room and create a big open-plan space,' she explains. 'I just had to live with the kitchen as it was until we'd saved up to do the work!' It wasn't until the Melis' son Leo and daughter Anna came along a few years later that Paula knew enough was enough. 'My three kids wanted to be with me while I was cooking but with the hob and the oven on opposite sides of the kitchen, I was worried about tripping over them – there just wasn't enough space for us all.'

The small room also meant Paula didn't have

enough storage or full-sized appliances. 'We were bursting at the seams,' she continues. 'I had an under-counter fridge but the freezer was outside in our garden room, and the slimline dishwasher was really frustrating.'

Paula began planning the new kitchen just before the building work started to remove the wall, put in the new doors and the new skylights in February 2013. The open-plan space was designed by architects Cityzen. She looked for a cabinet colour that would make the space feel bright and airy. 'The Burford Grey kitchen from Howdens Joinery was exactly the neutral colour I wanted so I could add colour with accessories,' explains Paula. Top of her wish list was a breakfast bar to bring the family together. 'It's brilliant because I can cook on one side while the kids sit on the other,' she says. 'I love that we can be in the same room now without getting on top of one another!'



Christmas will soon be here, so now is the perfect time to sit down and get to work on some Christmas crafts – such as these bright and beautiful decorations

Sparkly wreath

Adorn your home with this glamorous wreath and add a little shine to Christmas time.

SHOPPING LIST

• 20cm polystyrene wreath, £2, Hobbycraft • 3m blue 5cm wide stretch sequin trim • sequin pins • silver and green sequin trim, 1m of each • purple individual sequins • 50cm blue silk • scissors • pins • sewing machine and thread

First, cover your wreath. Cut the stretch sequin trim into 15cm lengths, then wrap them over the front of the wreath blank, using sequin pins to secure them into position. We overlapped each of ours slightly to ensure a neat finish.

Add your embellishments. We wrapped lengths of silver and green around the wreath, then added individual purple sequins sporadically all over the wreath, using sequin pins to secure them all.

Stitch a bow. To do this, cut a 20cm square from blue silk fabric. Fold it in half, right sides facing, and stitch along both side edges and three quarters of the bottom edge, leaving 5cm open. Turn out through the gap, press, then hand stitch closed. Make two ribbon tails by cutting four 6cm x 15cm strips and stitching them right sides together in pairs, then turning out through the top – we also stitched diagonally across the bottom of ours. Finally, cut a 5cm x 10cm length of silk, and press the long edges over

to the wrong side by 1cm. Wrap this around the middle of the bow to gather it, and hand stitch into position. Use pins to fix the ribbon tails and bow onto the front of the wreath.

Toptip

As our wreath was going to be hung on a mirror, we added a piece of felt to the back of it to cover

Sequin baubles

This shiny decorations will add a touch of glamour to your tree.

SHOPPING LIST

Begin by prepping the polystyrene balls. Place them onto a sheet of newspaper or brown paper and spray with purple paint - you will need to do one side, let it dry, then turn over and repeat on the other side. Leave to dry thoroughly.

Add the sequin design, starting at the base of the bauble and working your with two tiny seed beads, then add a sequin, inserting the pin through the central hole. Push the pin firmly into the polystyrene ball. Repeat, covering the ball, until only the very top is left.

When there is only a small gap left at the top of the ball, cut a 20cm length of glitter ribbon, and fold it in half. Push a sequin pin through the middle of a mini bow embellishment, then push this through the ribbon ends, making sure to go through both. Push the pin into the top of the ball to finish - add another couple of pins to make sure it's really secure.



Striped stocking

Make this sophisticated stocking using scraps of fabric and sequin strands.

SHOPPING LIST

- a selection of fabric offcuts at least 30cm square of each scissors pins
- sewing machine thread pencil 1m blue cotton fabric sewing needle
- hot glue gun purple and stranded seguins, 60cm of each glitter ribbon



Start by cutting and stitching together strips of fabric to make one big patchwork sheet. We cut ours into 12cm wide strips and machine stitched together, then pressed flat. With the wrong side facing you, draw a stocking shape out onto your strips, making it slightly larger than you'd like your finished stocking to be on all sides. Cut it out.

Lay the striped stocking onto a piece of blue cotton and cut it out three d times – one of these will be the back of the outer stocking, and the other two will be the lining. Pin the two

lining pieces right sides together and stitch around the edge with a 1.5cm seam allowance, leaving the top edge open and a 10cm seam gap in the bottom of the foot. Place the third blue cotton piece right sides together with the striped stocking piece, and stitch together around the edge, leaving the top edge open.

none at all.

Slide the outer stocking inside the lining stocking, with right sides facing and the back and front seams aligned. Pin, then machine stitch all around the top edge of the stocking to join the two together. Pull the stocking right sides out through the hole in the bottom of the lining, and hand stitch it closed. Finally, use a hot glue gun to stick strips of sequin trim along each of the stripe seam lines. Fold the top of the stocking over to make a cuff, then hand stitch a loop of ribbon to the top edge to allow for hanging.



Furniture facelift...

This month we created a stylish storage unit using wooden Ikea boxes

any of us have these wooden Moppe storage boxes from Ikea at home; they're inexpensive and handy for keeping clutter tidied away. We decided to update ours by incorporating several of the boxes together. A pull-out tray is a useful addition, perfect to rest a cup of tea or to contain paper as you work. Smart chrome handles with library card windows look great and help organise the contents so everything is close to hand and quickly found.

You will need




Remove the drawers from the wooden box frames and place to one side. Sit two of the frames side-by-side, right way up. Place a second pair on their ends on top, one at each edge with a gap in the middle; this will create vertical storage. Add the remaining two box frames side by side on top, exactly as the first pair. This arrangement will form the base of the cabinet. The overall measurement of the boxes arranged like this is 567mm wide x 688mm tall.

Glue and nail the outer frame pieces together using PVA glue and panel pins. The MDF is fairly thin so take care not to split it. Drawing a pencil guide showing the depth of the wood beneath at each edge can help.

Glue and panel pin the back piece onto the rest of the frame, this will strengthen the structure and make it square. Leave the frame to dry.

Glue the bottom two wooden box frames inside the base of the frame – the fit should be quite tight. Next, glue the two vertical boxes inside, on top of the bottom two. Lay the two 20cm battens on top of them – these will act as temporary spacers and will be removed and



Add a few screws, worked through the wooden boxes and into the frame beyond, to secure the boxes into place. This is particularly important for the top two boxes – if they fall or move down, the pull-out tray will become too tight to pull open.

Turn the unit upside down. Drill a pilot hole at each corner of the base and then screw the feet into place.

Make the pull-out tray. Lay the MDF base down onto a work surface, then glue and pin the front, back and two sides into place around the edges of it.

Lastly, remove the temporary spacer battens. Paint the entire unit – including the feet, tray and drawers – with red chalk paint, then leave to dry. Use a soft brush or cloth to add a coat of wax over the paint. Screw the label plates onto the back of each drawer; we recommend using the back because it does not have a cut-out finger hole. Place the tray and drawers into the cabinet at the top and bottom, then cut a card label for each drawer plate and slip into place.




Download and print the December Advent template from www.yourhomemagazine.co.uk or send a stamped SAE to Your Home December Advent Template, Hubert Burda Media UK, The Tower, Phoenix Square, Colchester, Essex, CO4 9HU. Cut the template out.

Use the template to cut 25 stocking shapes from your fabric offcuts - then flip it over so Pin these together in pairs (right sides facing) and machine stitch around the outside of the shape with a 5mm seam allowance, leaving the top edge open. Turn them right sides out and press.

Repeat step 2 using cotton fabric, to cut 50 lining pieces. Once again pin the shapes into pairs (right sides facing) and stitch around the outside of the shape, once again leaving the top edge open, and also leaving a 3cm gap in the seam at the bottom of the foot. Turn right sides out,

With right sides facing, slide the lining stocking over the outer stocking, aligning the seams $oldsymbol{\perp}$ and top edge. Hand stitch around the top edge, working through both layers, then turn right sides out through the gap in the bottom of the lining seam. Stitch the gap closed, then press.





Using a pencil, draw the outline of the numbers 1-25 out onto the right side of a sheet of self-adhesive felt. Use a pair of scissors or a craft knife to carefully cut them out. Stick each number onto one of the stockings, positioning them around 2cm down from the top edge.

Measure the area in which you'd like to hang your Advent calendar, and cut a length of jumbo pompom trim to fit. Securely hang the trim however you like – we chose to loop ours along a banister but you could also hang it from the ceiling, over a mantelpiece or around the edge of a room

Decorate 25 plain wooden clothes pegs with a selection of colourful washi tapes. Once your $\mathcal I$ trim is securely hung, use the pegs to clip your stockings into place - then fill with sweets or other mini gifts to finish.

Girls' Guide to

Give your kitchen a weekend facelift, just in time for any Christmas entertaining, with some fresh new tiles



before you actually get to placing the tiles on the walls.

you are tiling.

To establish the area you need to cover in square metres, simply measure the height and width of the area and multiply. Then add on around 5% to allow for any breakages and mistakes. Once you have your tiles, it's a good idea to make a measuring rod. They're very simple to make, just take a length of wooden batten and place on a flat surface, lay out a row of your chosen tiles directly above this, complete with tile spacers in between. Mark on the batten the position of each tile and the spacers.

As a rule it's best to begin tiling from the centre of the wall, so that any cut tiles appear at the edges in equal sizes. To do this measure the width of the wall, then mark the centre point. Take the measuring rod and place it so that one of the tile-edge marks lines up with this line. Then, still using the measuring rod, count how many full tiles will fit in. Once you get to the edge you can see whether you will need to cut any tiles to fit. If you can see that you're going to end up with tiles that are less than half a tile wide you may want to readjust, as narrow slivers of tiles are hard to cut, so go back and move the starting mark accordingly.

Also to ensure you have even-sized tiles at the top and bottom of your walls the same method as above applies. To work this out, draw a vertical line from the centre line up, using a spirit level to ensure it's straight. Then as before use the measuring rod to establish how many whole tiles you'll require, and whether the cut tiles will be sufficiently thick at the edges, and if not readjust the line for the starting tile. If you are part tiling your wall, rather than tiling right up to the ceiling, the top row of horizontal

is where your first tile is to sit. The frame will also help support the tiles while they're drying as it will stop them sliding down the wall.

5 Starting from the corner of your frame apply tile adhesive to the wall, then spread evenly with a notched spreader. Place the starting tile in position pressing the edges against the frame and against the wall.

6 Next add a tile above and one to the side, pressing into the wall to help them adhere. Insert a spacer between the tiles and push in, so they can be grouted over without being visible.







Continue in this way,
applying adhesive to small
sections of wall as you go to
avoid it drying out. Work your
way along until you get to
the edges. Wipe off any
adhesive before it dries.

When you get to the edges, it's likely you'll need to cut tiles to fit. As walls are rarely completely straight it's best to measure the space for each individual tile and cut accordingly. After no check the fit, if slightly too large you


cutting check the fit, if slightly too large you can make slight tweaks with a tile file.

Apply adhesive direct to the back of the tile, rather than to the wall, then press into place. If you're also tiling the adjacent wall take care when cutting the edge tiles to ensure the grout lines are level. Once all the tiles have been laid, allow the adhesive to dry, the amount of time this takes will vary dependent on the product you are using.

10 Finally take a small amount of grout and press into the gaps. With a grout spreader, use long upward strokes to work it into the joints. Wipe tiles with a damp sponge, taking care not to remove any from the joints. Once the grout has completely dried, polish off with a clean cloth.







Trick of the trade

The experts at Topps Tiles share their handy hints for using coloured grout:

- A darker grout is ideal for areas of the home that see food spills, such as kitchen splash backs. Darker colours offer lower maintenance compared to their white counterparts that can show stains more easily.
- Using lighter coloured grouts with white tiles gives the illusion of seamless tiling and can open up the space, while darker grout when matched with a lighter tile creates a bold, geometric look that highlights the finished edge.
- Coloured grout can be applied in exactly the same way as lighter grout, but take extra care to wipe off any excess as this can dry and stain the glaze on lighter tiles.
- When considering which grout to use for your bathroom, using a darker colour can be more forgiving by reducing the appearance of mould residue when compared to the traditional white finish.


I had a wood-burning stove installed in my house last winter - what maintenance checks do I need to carry out to keep it in good working order? Mrs F Cartright, Lancashire



Matt Kisler, product manager \bigcap for Dimplex, gives his expert advice... The rules on maintenance are less strict than those for gas appliances as there is no legal requirement for annual

maintenance. However, some maintenance is necessary and there are simple guidelines you can follow, which cover two main areas - sweeping the chimney, and visual checks on the condition of the stove.

A chimney should be swept by a qualified chimney sweep a minimum of once a year, even if the stove is used only occasionally. Sweeping is necessary to ensure free passage of the dangerous combustion gasses from the stove by removing blockages such as birds' nests and soot. Regular sweeping also removes creosote, which can cause



At the start of the season, it's also worth checking the consumable items on your stove - such as the rope seal around the door, and the bricks. The rope seal needs to maintain an airtight seal, however, this will compress through use. Your stove manufacturer will be able to advise what length and diameter of replacement rope you'll need and you can purchase rope, and a special fire-resistant adhesive, from most stove shops. Also check the brick lining. A hairline fracture, for example, is not a problem - but if you notice that a crack in a brick has started to widen, that's the time to replace it. Simply lift the baffle plate, remove and replace.

At the end of the season, the stove should be shut down, ensuring that all the ash is removed from the stove, and the chimney flue ways and baffle plate are brushed clean. Close the door and put the air control in the open position. This allows air to circulate around the stove and prevents corrosion and condensation so it's in top condition when you next come to light a fire.





There have been a number of burglaries in my neighbourhood recently, and I'm concerned that this could happen to me. What can I do to help make my

home more secure? Mrs E Robson, Sunderland

- Keep valuables and all house and car keys out of sight.
- Fit outside security lighting.

- Take care what personal information you share on social media, such as telling everyone when you are going on holiday.
- Make your home look occupied while you are out or away on holiday by using lights on timers and asking a trusted neighbour or family member to pop in and check everything is okay.



Colour is king in our cosy home

Andrea and Duncan have lovingly transformed a neglected cottage into a vibrant family home

ome, family and work have changed hugely since 2001 when Andrea was racing about London as a marketing manager and dividing her working week between London and Bristol. 'Both my family and my husband, Duncan, lived locally to Neston and I was commuting along the M4 way too often. We love the area and are family folk at heart, so it felt natural to move back here,' she explains.

Duncan's work as a civil engineer took him out and about across the region so he

'This is very much a winter room, Christmas morning is so cosy with the log burner going and Frank tearing through his gifts. It's a far cry from the day when we could see the sky from the living room when we were installing the attic bathroom,' says Andrea



was on the look out for the perfect property. 'We registered with a few agents and Duncan focused our search on Neston because it is such a pretty village. And luck was on our side as we were able to buy this cottage before it came on the open market. We were first time buyers so the seller saw us as a good bet,' explains Andrea.

When the couple first saw the cottage they were immediately struck by its potential. 'It was in a sorry state. The gardens were unkempt and the inside was a hotchpotch of terrible DIY and orange pine from the 70s, but we knew we could make it our home,' says Andrea.

The original cottage was built around 150 years ago and was considerably smaller than it is today - with just two rooms downstairs and one bathroom. To make the property work for them, the couple decided to apply for planning permission to extend the rear of the house and create a dining room onto the garden and also extend upwards into the loft space. This would create a large family bathroom and leave them with two bedrooms and a walk-in-wardrobe space on the first floor. 'Obtaining planning permission was our only hiccup. One of our neighbours objected to our plans, but we got there eventually and we are all friends now!' says Andrea. While the planning matter wrangled on Andrea, Duncan and Andrea's dad, David, pressed on with internal works. 'We used tradesmen for electrics and plumbing, but if we could do it ourselves, we did,' explains Andrea.

evenings spent working at the cottage the couple were ready to move in. 'We agreed that as long as it was liveable we would move in on the day of the Diamond Jubilee,' says Andrea. So with a working kitchen, and bathroom, but concrete floors and bare plaster walls the couple unpacked their limited belongings. 'It was our first home so we had a sofa, a bed, a table, four chairs and a wardrobe and we were thrilled to bits,' recalls Andrea.

And, as if moving to a tumbling down cottage was not challenging enough, Andrea decided to give up her job as well. 'People thought I was mad to give up a

The press lives in the dining room so that I'm near Frank when I work from home.'

13 years on, Andrea, Duncan and Frank are very settled in their cottage and have no plans to move. 'I don't want more and I certainly don't want different and our cottage was crafted with my father's love. It is our forever home.' YH



Then Victoria and Nigel Cook were courting as teenagers they often walked hand-in-hand past a ramshackle old farm steading near Shotley Bridge in Country Durham. And now, having recently celebrated their 23rd wedding anniversary, they're living in that very same spot. 'We always thought it would make a lovely home,' says Victoria. 'And here we are 30 years later!'

The farmsteading was converted into four properties 13 years ago, and the Cooks bought one of the houses directly from friends a few years later in 2005. 'It wasn't officially up for sale, but our friends knew we were looking to move,' says Victoria. 'We wanted to be in the catchment area for schools in Northumberland. However, we couldn't find anything we liked in Hexham or Corbridge, and had missed out on a barn we hoped to convert when it sold for a high price after sealed bids.' Having resigned themselves to staying put, their friends suggested they come and take a look at their 150-year-old converted pig shed. 'We saw it on the Tuesday, absolutely loved it and had offer accepted on the Friday,' recalls Victoria.

With its lofty proportions, cosy wood burner and antique furniture, Victoria and Nigel's dining room lends itself perfectly to Christmas dinner. They've recently re-painted the walls in Dove Tale by Farrow & Ball and chose the decadent Orchid wallpaper print from Cole & Son for the alcoves

It was the dining room that swung the sale for the couple. 'We thought we'd seen the whole house then they showed us the dining room and our jaws dropped - we just had to have it,' says Victoria. Although they





wallpaper sample of a big print, it's difficult to visualise how it will look on the walls. In addition to this, as the ceiling is so high we needed a scaffolding tower for the decorating work. However, it was definitely worth it. Being such a unique room, you need to do it justice so I'm really pleased with how it's turned out.' It's now a much better setting for the couple's treasured dining table and sideboard which were inherited from Nigel's grandfather. He bought them from a local furniture store after they had been crafted specially for the boardroom of a Newcastle shipbuilder, who cancelled the order. The look has been continued through to the mezzanine floor, which is perfect for guests staying over after dinner parties.

Another room which comes into its own at Christmas is the red living room. In here the couple painted over the terracotta and cream walls, opting for a red chimney breast and floral wallpaper in the alcoves. They also ripped up the carpet and replaced it with reclaimed parquet flooring, as carpet wasn't practical with a dog. 'Nigel had stored some furniture for a friend and they gave us the flooring for free in return,' explains Victoria. 'It was black and filthy, but looks amazing now we've cleaned it up, especially with the wooden beams and log burner that were

Our home is a real family affair

Helen and Mark Nicholson have created a compact country home from a former cow shelter

hristmas dinner is literally a homegrown affair for Helen and Mark Nicholson, who both come from farming backgrounds. 'Our parents arrive bearing gifts of meat, fresh fruit, vegetables and home baking,' says Helen. 'Mark's family are dairy farmers and my family runs an arable farm, tea room and farm shop, so the table groans with fresh produce.'

But with Christmas being one of the busiest times of the year for both families, Helen likes to get organised well in advance so that the festivities run like clockwork. 'The house really comes into its own at Christmas,' says Helen. 'It's one of the few times of the year when we use every bit of the house. We start off in the kitchen where we all gather round the big table for dinner, and then we light the fire and head for the living room. It can be blowing a gale outside, but we are always warm and cosy in here.'

The square stone-built house features just two main rooms downstairs - a spacious kitchen with high open beams, and the living room with its traditional stone-built fireplace. It was built eight years ago from a former field shelter belonging to Mark's parents, who live in the main farmhouse two fields away. They

had always planned to convert the simple stone building into a two-bedroom home for their retirement. But when Mark left college and moved back to the family farm to work, it was agreed that Mark and Helen should convert it and live in it themselves with the aim of doing a house-swap when Mark's parents retire and he takes over the farm. 'It was a joint venture because we wanted to create a home which would suit everyone's needs over time. Fortunately we all share similar tastes, so it was very easy to work out the design and style of the house,' says Helen. 'We all wanted to create a straightforward, practical country home with a traditional farmhouse kitchen.'

Mark did a lot of the work himself and the

Draw a triangle on a piece of cardboard to create a template. Using a selection of your favourite fabric remnants, pin the template to the fabric and cut around it with fabric scissors. Thick fabric is best to prevent it curling at the edges. Alternatively, cut slightly wider than the template to create sufficient overlap for a hem. Repeat until you have a sufficient number of triangles.

2 Space the triangles evenly along a strip of binding tape, fold the shortest edge over the tape and pin in place. Sew the flags with a straight stitch.

conversion took just seven months. The barn had already been re-roofed so the earth floor was laid with under-floor heating and concrete to create the main living room, and a new floor was built above for two bedrooms and a family bathroom. The building was then extended in reclaimed stone and slate to include a dining kitchen, utility and cloakroom. 'The original building only had one large arched opening so we had to create all the doors and windows,' says Helen. 'Fortunately we had no issues with planning because we were converting the barn for our own use and we were keeping its

original style.'

Good idea! Take cuttings of holly, fir and laurel and mix with large pine cones to decorate oak beams and the tops of cupboards to create

Helen and Mark lived with his parents until their new home was ready to move into. Then they added their own stamp to the spacious rooms, choosing furniture which was neutral and rustic in style.

The fireplace in the living room is built from stone reclaimed from a demolished farm wall and was fitted with an open multi-fuel grate. Helen and Mark chose a large corner sofa which brings the seating closer to the fire and separates it from the rest of the room, which also serves as Mark's office. We considered building a wall in here to make two smaller rooms, but left it open with a view to changing it further down the line,' explains Helen. 'With a house this size you try to make use of every inch of space.'

Living in the country means Helen and Mark spend a lot of time outdoors, often walking their rough haired Jack Russell, Ruby, across the fields, so the house had to be practical and walker-friendly. Many of the fixtures and fittings are oak and the kitchen floor is tiled for easy cleaning. 'We kept the décor cream throughout to offset all the

natural wood and stone,' says Helen. 'These old barns can be quite dark and oppressive if you're not careful, so we have kept the walls light and the rooms open to avoid this.'

The house is full of natural character, including the big 'A-frame beams in the kitchen open to the apex of the extension, and the different levels between the two main rooms, which reflects the property's hillside location. And there is a country theme to the furniture and accessories - Helen likes fabrics which reflect Mark's love of outdoor pursuits, and natural textures such as tweed and wool. 'I often find things I like at country shows, but I also bring home things from my shop,' says Helen. 'It's in a converted barn on my parents' farm near Helmsley and is heavily influenced by the countryside, so there is quite a big overlap between things I buy for the shop and things I choose for our own home.'

Helen decorates in a traditional red theme at Christmas, hanging bunting and stockings across the fireplace, covering the beams and cupboard tops with natural foliage and making

every room look cosy with layers of throws and cushions. 'I start planning Christmas a long time before the day,' says Helen. 'I like to be organised. Luckily all the fresh food comes from the two farms so I know I'm not going to run out of essentials, but I don't start to relax until the last plate of turkey is served up and we can all sit down and enjoy the start of a big family Christmas at home.'

Yvonne Cook has created a small haven of vintage style in Weston Super Mare



Vonne Cook's home looks well established and authentically Victorian, but the truth is that the interior is much younger than its appearance would suggest. 'We wanted a Victorian property, but everything was out of our price range, so compromises had to be made. The house is Victorian, but the interior had been modernized, with all traces of its heritage removed in the process,' explains Yvonne. 'However, I fell for it straight away because I knew that with some effort we could have the period home that we so desperately wanted.'

The appeal of the house was definitely apparent from the beginning, as Yvonne could barely contain her excitement when she was looking around the property for the first time. 'I was practically putting in an offer on the spot, but thankfully Mark, my

husband, was more pragmatic and kept me quiet,' she recalls. Once home Mark put in a considered offer that was accepted and in October 2006 the family moved in.

As the house had been modernized in the 1980s, it was very much in keeping with the fashion of the time, with an avocado bathroom suite, brown carpets, period fireplaces that had been replaced with brick surrounds with spaces for ornaments and bedrooms that were chock-full of useful, but overbearing fitted wardrobes. Yvonne's instinct was to rush in and get rid of it all as soon as possible, but this wasn't practical as the family had budget constraints. and reclamation yards for bargains,' Yvonne explains.

As Jack and Billy were toddlers when the family moved in, and the potty training years were starting, a modern and convenient bathroom was the first priority for the home. 'Mark ripped out the avocado suite replacing it with simple white sanitaryware that I found online, we recycled the floorboards to make the bath panel, and then we installed a downstairs toilet, to save carting the boys upstairs,' says Yvonne.

Next to go were the chocolate brown carpets. 'They were old and made the living room dark, so they had to go. Once lifted we found that the original boards were handsome, but terribly draughty, so I made a huge and quite costly mistake,' admits Yvonne. 'I put down pale carpets, and had a log burner put in. It was a disaster with two toddlers, the carpets were filthy all the time and they only lasted 18 months!'

By 2010 the family had saved up enough money to start renovating again and the extra time had afforded them the chance to think carefully about what would be the best use of their space and money. After some careful consideration the first project was to extend the back of the house to create a large kitchen dining room. 'We wanted to create as useful a space as possible, but didn't want to lose too much of the garden as the boys needed space to play outside,' explains Yvonne. 'Our extension was just big enough to need planning permission which slowed things down a bit,' says Yvonne.

haberdashery store that was closing down and made an offer to buy it. Mark cut it out of the store and re-fitted it in their home. It looks like it has always been there, especially now that it is



However, Mark and his father, Alan, were able to get building work underway, just as the winter took hold. 'Mark was driving the JCB to dig out the foundations of the extension, and then they would both cart tonnes of soil and bricks out to the front, which they painstakingly sorted through to see if they could re-use later. Then to make it harder, it started snowing. They worked so hard in such terrible weather. I am so grateful to them,' she says.

The extension took seven months in total with Mark working on the project at weekends and in the evenings, while Yvonne sourced the fittings for the interior. 'The oak flooring was a reclamation yard bargain, and the base units are from Ikea and I added vintage handles to them. >

The open wall space between the office and the kitchen extension marks what was the back door of the house. The walls have since been painted in the elegant shade of French Grey from Little Greene

cabinets on the walls to give the room an authentic and interesting feel and I like to have things I need to hand,' says Yvonne.

Vintage accessories are a recurring theme in the Cook home. 'My childhood was very modest and my mum would recycle and make do, only buying things that she needed or loved and the habit has stayed with me,' explains Yvonne. 'I spent many hours of my childhood rummaging in jumble sales and flea markets and the joy of seeking out great finds is still a joy.' As a result every piece and

accessory has a story in the Cooks' home. 'At the heart of our home is my love of all things vintage and antique. I love the quality of older furniture and I am fascinated by the stories behind older pieces, and I love the thrill of finding unusual things.'

And Yvonne's home not only reflects her passions, but also opened up a new way of life for her. When people visited they would ask where I found this or that and would buy bits from me so my passion for vintage homewares became a way of making money,' she explains. By autumn 2012 the house was



3 ways with... oranges

- For a topping for buttered toast, take the **zest from 3 oranges**, then remove the pith and slice the oranges thinly. Place in a pan with 180g clear honey and a pinch of cinnamon, to taste. Over a medium heat, bring to the boil then simmer for 10-12 minutes, stirring regularly. Use straight away or keep in a sealed jar in the fridge for a couple of weeks.
- Make a sticky glaze for your Boxing Day ham 30 minutes before the end of cooking paint on a glaze made from **orange juice**, **mustard** and **dark soft brown sugar**.

Drain and dry out in a very low oven on greaseproof paper for an hour, turn off the heat and leave in the oven overnight. Scatter with caster sugar and the candied peel is ready to eat. Dip in dark chocolate for an extra treat.



Parma ham, sausage, almond and fig loaf

PREPARATION TIME 25 MINI ITES COOKING TIME 40-45 MINUTES SERVES 10

YOU WILL NEED

✓12 slices Parma ham ✓50g butter ✓1 onion, finely chopped ✓500g sausage meat <a>100g unsalted almonds, roughly chopped ✓75g dried figs, chopped ✓12 sage leaves, chopped handful.parsleyleaves, chopped ✓75g cooked chestnuts, roughly chopped ✓1 large egg, beaten

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark
- 4. Grease a loaf tin, approximately 22cm x 11cm, with olive oil. Line the tin with the Parma ham, making sure the slices hang over the edge.
- Melt the butter in a frying pan over a medium heat and fry the onion until soft, but not brown. Remove from the heat and cool slightly.
- Place the sausage meat in a large bowl and season with salt and pepper. Add the cooked onion, almonds, figs, sage, parsley and chestnuts. Add the egg and mix everything together thoroughly.
- Press the mixture into the tin and cover the top with the overhanging Parma ham. Roast in the oven for 40-45 minutes or until cooked through.
- Remove from the oven and allow to rest for 15 minutes before turning the loaf out.



Roasted turkey crown

PREPARATION TIME 10 MINUTES COOKING TIME 35 MINUTES PER 1KG, PLUS 25 MINUTES SERVES 10

YOU WILL NEED

- ✓ 5kg Golden Turkey breast crown ✓ 50g butter
- ✓ 10 rashers streaky bacon
 ✓ bunch of thyme

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 200°C/400°F/Gas Mark 6. Rub the butter all over the turkey crown and season well with salt and pepper. Lay the bacon over the crown, covering it completely. Place the crown in a roasting tin with the thyme and place in the centre of the oven.
- Cook for 25 minutes, until the bacon is well cooked. Remove the bacon and set aside. Baste the crown with the juices, cover with buttered foil and return to the oven.

Turn the oven down to 180°C/350°F/ Gas Mark 4 and cook for 35 minutes per 1kg, until the juices run clear. Remove the foil 30 minutes before the end of cooking.

■ Replace the bacon rashers back on the turkey 5 minutes before the end of the cooking time and serve with the slices of turkey, alternatively keep the bacon warm and serve with the turkey. Let the crown rest in a warm place for 30 minutes before carving.

California prune and goat's cheese tarts

PREPARATION TIME 20 MINUTES COOKING TIME 30 MINUTES SERVES 6

YOU WILL NEED

✓500g pack short crust pastry ✓75g walnuts, roughly chopped ✓125g California prunes, roughly chopped ✓3 tsp freshly chopped thyme leaves, plus 6 stalks for garnish ✓200g semi-soft goat's cheese, crumbled ✓150ml double cream ✓2 eggs

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 200°C/400°F/Gas Mark 6.
- Divide the pastry into 6 portions then roll out each one and use to line 6 x 10cm round loose bottom flan tins. Trim, then line with parchment paper and baking beans and bake in the oven for about 15 minutes until the pastry edges are pale golden. Remove the beans and paper and put the tart cases to one side.
- Mix together the walnuts, California prunes, thyme leaves and goat's cheese and season well with sea salt and freshly ground black pepper. Divide the mixture between the tart cases.
- Lightly whisk the cream and eggs together then pour carefully over the tarts. Add a pinch of freshly ground black pepper to each one and put in the oven to bake for about 15 minutes or until golden and set.
- Remove and leave for 5 minutes before serving. Serve topped with a thyme leaf, a lightly dressed salad and a generous spoonful of tangy chutney.

Butternut bells

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4.
- Individually wrap the butternut squash in foil and bake them in the oven for around 50 minutes, or until soft. Set aside and allow to cool down.
- While the butternut squash are cooling, start to make the filling. Gently fry the onion in the oil for 5 minutes, then add all the other ingredients for the filling and simmer for 15 minutes. Season to taste



with salt and pepper. Once finished, set aside.

- Once the squash are cool, cut them in half and scoop out the seeds along with a little of the flesh.
- Add the filling mixture to the squash and bake for

a further 10 minutes. To serve, garnish with beetroot, herbs and paprika.





Make the most of original features Add character to your home with our guide to

omeowners tend to fall into two camps: those who prefer the convenience of a newbuild, and those who love the character, quirks and features of a period property. Older houses are costlier to run and require more maintenance, but for many people, such drawbacks are a small price to pay for the opportunity to live in a home with a history. If you're

period details

lucky, all the features will be intact, but damaged or missing ones can usually be restored or reinstated. For the best results, don't rush the work, be prepared to employ skilled craftsmen for specialist jobs, use reclaimed materials or authentic reproductions, and do your research so you know which features are appropriate for your home's age and style.

16TH AND 17TH CENTURY

This period encompasses the Tudor, Elizabethan and Jacobean eras. Tudor houses were timberframed, and many were constructed with jetties overhanging the ground floor, creating extra space. Ceilings were beamed, fireplaces big and rooms often panelled in wood, making them cosy rather than lightfilled. Towards the end of the 16th Century, glass windows were introduced, and staircases started to take the place of ladders. Elizabethan and Jacobean houses are characterised by tall chimneys and ornate exterior detailing. The smartest houses had patterned glass windows, while diamond-shaped, leaded panes and exposed beams were commonplace.







GEORGIAN Classic, symmetrical facades, high ceilings, large sash windows with shutters and elegantly proportioned rooms mean that Georgian houses, built between 1700 and 1837, are highly sought after and never go out of fashion. Other characteristics include fanlights above panelled front doors, columns, decorative cornices and other mouldings, and fire surrounds ranging from elaborate marble in the drawing room to more simple designs in the bedrooms. Various companies specialise in sash window restoration, and if they are beyond repair, they can be replaced with new, energyefficient timber replicas. It's possible to find original Georgian fireplaces, though high quality reproductions cost around one third of the price of a period piece.

VICTORIAN

Much of the UK's housing stock was built while Queen Victoria was on the throne, from 1837 to 1901. Styles include Gothic and Italianate, but the most common type is the Victorian terrace, found in varying sizes in towns and villages throughout the country. Rooms were originally small, leading off a narrow passageway, and often cluttered and decorated in dark paints or wallpapers. Features included sash bay windows, tiled hallways, timber floors, dado and picture rails. As mains water pressure improved, bathrooms came in in the 1870s, and roll-top baths – both antique and reproduction – remain popular. Nowadays, many owners remove internal walls to create an open-plan living/dining rooms, and choose pale rather than traditional colours to maximise light.

EDWARDIAN

The Edwardian era only lasted until World War One, yet was a time of great change. Houses were typically red brick, and mock timber gables, pebbledash and hanging tiles were among the external touches inspired by the Arts and Crafts movement. Internally, homes now included an upstairs bathroom and separate WC as standard. Rooms were larger and more ornate in design than in Victorian houses, with features such as casement windows, stained glass panels, parquet flooring and fireplaces that were tiled or incorporated shelving or mirrors. There was also less clutter and a tendency towards lighter shades.

1920S AND 1930S

The interwar years saw the rise of the suburb and the emergence of large-scale house builders who built new estates of affordable, mainly semi-detached houses in areas where land was cheaper. These were far plainer in design than their Victorian counterparts, but relatively spacious, with wide halls and front and back gardens. Houses in the more affluent avenues and crescents had garages – ripe for conversion by future owners into extra rooms – plus bay windows and mock Tudor detailing. The Arts and Crafts movement was still influential but the most striking Expert architecture was Modernist or Art Deco. The stark white rendered homes - reminiscent of ocean Owen Pacev, founder of Renaissance liners - had curved metal-London, offers his tips on how to make sure you get period features right... framed windows, stepped

LISTED BUILDINGS Most homes built before 1840 are listed,

meaning that they are of exceptional architectural or historic special interest. A listing protects a building from detrimental alterations, and listed buildings consent – obtained from the local planning department – will be needed before any internal or external changes can be made. If granted, it's likely to be subject to certain stringent conditions - for example owners may be required to use particular materials or colours, or to fit

CASE STUDY

'We added period features to give our extension more character'



Having completed the hall, Kate is now keen to introduce more traditional character elsewhere in her home

Thomas first started to look for a character property their move to from Devon London five years ago, they ended up with more than they

bargained for. 'We fell for a place which was almost two houses in one,' Kate recalls. 'The original was a tiny two-up, two-down Victorian cottage, which had later been enlarged with a two-storey extension'. The problem for the couple was that the two parts didn't match up well, so they set about introducing some period features to merge the rooms in the

extension with the 150-yearold original in a much more sympathetic way.

'They say first impressions count so we started with the hall, which was a lovely size but totally lacking in character,' says Kate. Plaster coving helped to solve part of the problem. Fixed prior to decorating, it was painted in brilliant white to make it stand out against two steel grey feature walls. Next they fitted an ornate ceiling rose to show off a pretty glass

chandelier, one of a pair they found in a local reclamation yard - the second hangs on the upstairs landing. Another bargain from the same source was the stripped pine panelled door bought to replace a contemporary flush door that leads into the cloakroom. Kate didn't much care for the modern radiator



Added to the original red brick Victorian cottage was a substantial extension, rendered white in contrast, but lacking the period features of the original

either, so she swapped it with a traditional-style version from the kitchen: 'It was taking up too much

> room in there and makes such a great feature in the hall, it was worth the extra expense to move it', she says.

Kate and Graham also splashed out on engineered oak flooring which is virtually identical to the original stripped wood floorboards. decided to unfinished boards so that we could stain them ourselves to get a perfect match with the original and, after some trial and error, we got it right,' remembers Kate. She cut costs by recycling some old curtains, adding a fabric edging in the same shade of grey as the walls. Final finishing touches were the vintage window-style mirror bought locally for £60 and an antique table which is a treasured family heirloom.

Traditional coving and Farrow and Ball paint colours create a classic backdrop for period pieces in the hallway

Property know-how with George

This month property developer, architect and presenter of Channel 4's Amazing Spaces, **George Clarke**, discusses the challenges faced when living in a smaller home

here has been a lot of debate in the British housing industry over the last few years about the size of the new homes we are building and the concern that the rooms within those new homes are becoming unbearably small. It is a fascinating debate as there is no question that to build larger homes costs more money and with house prices becoming increasingly unaffordable there is an argument to say that if we build smaller homes then we would be building more affordable ones. The counter argument could be that with there being such a demand for homes, the house builders will achieve a good sale price irrespective of how small the house feels.

Obviously if a new home is built and it is ridiculously small and claustrophobic then it can have a detrimental effect on the family that lives there, so there needs to be a sensible balance struck between comfort, functionality and affordability.

In the 1960s we had minimum space standards as developed by Parker Morris report for the construction of new publicly funded homes, but unfortunately these standards were gradually phased out between 1981 and 1993. The only remaining Authority in England to have minimum space standards is The Greater London Authority. The rest have gone, which is a national scandal.

The RIBA (Royal Institute of British Architects) recently released a report called 'The Case for Space', which did show that our homes are certainly getting smaller and it does annoy me when I visit so many newbuild homes that have woeful lack of storage and spaces planned in a poor way. I recently saw a bedroom where, once you installed a standard sized double bed there was no room whatsoever for a wardrobe!

I have to point out that there is also a major problem with how UK estate agents communicate information about a property. If I asked you how many square feet

or square metres of usable space you had in your home I bet you wouldn't be able to tell me. You'd be able to tell me the number of rooms you have but you would have no idea about the gross floor area. Throughout Europe and in the United States people know the area of floor areas of their homes off by heart. And so they should because the construction cost of a home is based on the amount of floor area, the sales cost is broadly based on the usable floor area and it also defines how much space you have available to live in. The usable floor area of every home should be made clear on all sales particulars and more importantly there should be comprehensive floor plans of the home showing all furniture. Have you ever noticed how estate agents' floor plans never have furniture on them? It drives me mad! If there were furniture on the plans even the untrained eye would soon be able to see if a space works or not.

But size isn't everything. My biggest criticism of the house building industry is that the way rooms are planned and designed just isn't creative enough. Most spec-built properties are dumb boxes linked together with a few corridors. As you might have seen on 'George Clarke's Amazing Spaces' we work really hard to make even the smallest spaces do so many different things. It is about innovative and creative design that doesn't have to cost much money. Small really can be very beautiful.



Creative and innovative design is everything when it comes to new and affordable homes, but the industry just isn't doing it. As the old saying goes, 'it's not the size that matters, it's what you do with it that counts.'
