














Let's face it, who actually has the time or energy to tackle the spring cleaning all in one go? Little and often is a much more manageable approach to having a happy, healthy home...

#### We test... potato mashers

We tested a selection of potato mashers, here's what we found...

#### STELLAR JAMES MARTIN POTATO MASHER, £8.75

This masher has a simple design with a soft-grip, anti-slip handle for ease of use. It does the job without any fuss, and with a bit of effort produced lump-free mashed potato. It came up sparkling in the dishwasher, but was also easy to clean by hand. It's a good buy, especially if you don't want to spend too much on a masher. Its design made it easy to use in the pan without causing extra mess.



#### JOSEPH JOSEPH SCOOP RICER, £25

We were impressed by the stylish design of this ricer, which was easy to clean and also dishwasher-safe. Simply scoop hot boiled potatoes from the pan, then add the top handle and press together, forcing the potato through the stainless steel plate for perfect, super-smooth mash. Although it has a very smart design, it is quite chunky, so takes up quite a large space in a drawer or cupboard. It is a little tricky to use until you get the hang of it - it's best to use a large pan to catch any mess.



#### **OXO GOOD GRIPS 3-IN-1** ADJUSTABLE POTATO RICER, £30

This 3-in-1 ricer has three different settings that you can quickly change between with a twist of the dial. We used the fine setting for mashed potato, which turned out velvety smooth with virtually no effort compared to using a traditional masher. There's also a medium setting for pressing water out of greens and a coarse setting for making chunky sauces. This was quite large but with no extra parts to worry about it's easy to store in a deep drawer or the cupboard. It was easy to clean and dishwasher-proof.

#### **RUSSELL HOBBS AURA MASH** & BLEND, £34.99

The mash head on this gadget was quick and easy to use – when clipped on it made light work of a pan of potatoes and blended smooth, creamy mash in seconds. The hand blender was equally successful, and would prove useful for a number of tasks. Cleaning the heads was fiddly by hand, but would be fine for those with a dishwasher. Overall this is a handy investment

for anyone who also needs a hand blender.



# My old junk room is now a calming office

Susan Rook's spare room was filled from top to bottom with junk and somewhere underneath there was a office waiting to be used!

Suzanne Rook, 45, and her two children moved in to their three-bedroom cottage 18 months ago. I decided to move out of the city to be nearer my job as a radio producer, and also to provide a safer environment for the children to grow up in'. The house Susan purchased was a converted barn, but had been a bit neglected over the years. It had a room I could use as an office for the days I had to work from home, and I was desperate to have my own space, especially with two young teenagers.

However, as she decorated each room in the rest of the house it seemed all the junk and left over furniture would end up being stored in the office. This meant the room wasn't fulfilling its proper use and Susan was working in the kitchen or living room and getting easily distracted. She decided that as soon as Christmas was over it would be her mission to reclaim the room and turn it into her dream office and a retreat from the coming and goings of her two children.

**STEP ONE** The first step was to remove all the rubbish and prep the room for painting. Susan had recently had a flood in the bathroom, which had affected all the walls and flooring in the office. 'It was functional, affordable and as the office is just off the kitchen area it would give a bit of a flow to the ground floor of the house - I also had loads left over from when we replaced the kitchen and I do like to re-use where I

can.' Susan decided she wanted a feature wall and had found a really pretty floral print wallpaper from Wallpaper Direct, which matched the colours of her favourite Orla Kiely radio. 'Lime, yellow and grey seem to be everywhere at the moment so I felt confident I would make it work in the room, and I carried a snippet of paper around with me for months ensuring I could match it up to all the bits and bobs I needed.'

STEP TWO With the walls and flooring ready the room was taking shape, her next job was to search for furniture, which was harder than she anticipated. 'I'd seen a lovely desk but at over £600 it was really pricey and out of my budget, so having looked around I decided to build my own desk area.' Susan picked up some old end-of-line kitchen units from a local DIY shop for under £60, she used these as floor cabinets and then fixed a length of her old kitchen worktop on top to create the desk area, which made the perfect customised work space. ## It's more than iust an office

Clever storage means Rachel's room is multi-functional

achel McWatt, husband Vincent, and children Gus, six; Seth, four; Elise, two, and Aoife, five months, have slowly made their house in Harrow, Middlesex, the perfect family home. Rooms have been designed and decorated to meet their needs, but the room at the front of the house was used for many things - none of them ordered! With no hallway storage and this room being next to the front door, all shoes, coats and bags were dumped on the floor in a pile resulting in daily chaos where no one could find anything. A child's desk gave a surface on which to do household paperwork, but it was generally lost in the disorder. Despite the compact proportions, Rachel was convinced she could make the room function better but was worried it would be asking too much from a small space. 'I wanted it to be an office with accessible storage for books and papers, but also a place to put shoes, coats and school bags. Although I would have loved to have it just as an office, I knew that would never work as we had no hall storage and the corridor was too narrow to add any. Instead, I decided to embrace the situation and treat the design as a challenge blending two rooms into one.' Rachel's confidence was high and she set to work in the autumn of 2014.

STEP ONE Rachel had seen a unit at a friend's house that had been made for them and she knew this was the way forward for her home. 'I needed to store such a wide mix of things and wanted to use the whole of one wall, there was no way I could buy the right thing on the high street. I drew a sketch of exactly what we needed with little cubbyholes for shoes, hanging space for

coats, and shelves designed to hold boxes, files and books. I found large some wooden boxes

that would be ideal for the children to keep their school shoes, bags and sports kit in and designed a low level space for these too.' Once her design was complete, Rachel input them all on the Jali website who made the piece to her exact design and the bespoke shelves delivered in two weeks. While she waited for the shelving be delivered.

Rachel chose the décor. 'I love pale grey as it's calm yet airy so painted the walls this shade, and laid a new floor in a pale washed wood plank to blend. **STEP TWO** To add a fun evecatching feature, Rachel decided to hang a wallpaper mural and searched the internet for the perfect design. 'I was aware that I needed to keep the detail quite small to not overwhelm the space but I also knew it would be really impactful and drive the feel of the room, so it was an important choice. I looked at hundreds and considered one with signposts on it and one with book spines but kept coming back to a blackboard print. I was a bit concerned it'd make the room dark but took the plunge anyway and I'm so glad I did because it looks fabulous and doesn't affect the light at all – I love it!' she smiles. After the paper was up, it was time to start thinking about furniture. Rachel wanted

a neat desk that didn't look too bulky and matching drawers for stationery, and spent hours looking at different websites. them in the end!' she laughs.


Good idea! Buy a range of boxes and files to keep all paperwork under control for a neat working space.



'Initially I thought ceramic tiles would be good as they're hard-wearing and easy to clean but decided against it for fear that if I drop anything heavy like my hammer I could crack a tile.' Emily then discovered Castello Oak from QuickStep - a honeytoned oak engineered flooring. 'I loved it to her heart's content



- it was beautiful to look at, warmer to walk on and would just look like old floorboards if they got dents and marks over the years.' Once laid, the room felt fresh and clean and ready for the next stage. The room already had a sink on a white unit that was in good condition and Emily started looking for some additional storage to match.

'I went to Ikea and looked around and realised that kitchen units and worktop would be ideal, and I was thrilled when I found a range with a door almost identical

to the sink unit. I chose a tall cupboard for power tools and paint rollers as these are practical but not beautiful, and a smaller drawer unit with oak worktop in between. The oak gives a huge space to spread out and leave painted things to dry, and any damage it might get as I work won't matter because it's solid wood - I could even drill a hole in it and it wouldn't harm it in the way that it would laminate!' she laughs. She fitted the same handles on both old and new units to tie them together and the room was taking shape.

protection and a touch of pretty vintage style, Emily turned her hand to tiling and fitted a splashback. 'Although the room had to be practical I didn't want it to feel like I was working in a garage, so I chose gorgeous patterned tiles from Fired Earth to go behind the sink. The cobalt blue is stunning and the pattern disguises splashes so

they're perfect,' she explains. Next, Emily started to organise the things she uses often so they would be close at hand, and began with her tools. 'They've always been in a muddled box and I could never find anything,' she laughs, 'so I bought a metal peg board rack from eBay to hang everything up and sprayed it white. I also made my own

screwdriver rack by drilling holes through a piece of timber so all my screwdrivers are lined up and I can grab whatever I need. It's such a simple solution but I love it!'

**STEP THREE** The final touches were lots of fun for Emily. 'I wanted an eclectic vintage feel,' she explains. 'I collected vintage tins from car boot sales and used these teamed with old fashionedstyle Kilner jars to store furniture handles, threads and buttons. I keep craft paints in crates and I painted a charity shop stool



blue then distressed and waxed it, and made a red ticking curtain to dress the glass door. I loved doing it all myself, creating my perfect space.' With the room almost complete, Emily

treated herself to a statement bin to help her keep tidy. 'I wanted my room to have character and style and so I bought a gorgeous big red pedal bin that reminds me of a post box,' she laughs. Finally, Emily framed and hung pages from an old DIY annual she bought for 50p in a car boot sale to brighten the walls. 'To me, this room is heaven. I have everything right at hand, space to paint furniture that doesn't affect anyone else and I can leave things out mid-project which is such a treat. It really is wonderful.' The



'The kitchen was narrow and really cramped – there wasn't even enough room to have a worktop on both sides of the room,' Jane explains. 'We couldn't all be in there at the same time and the burgundy cabinets made it feel dark.'

In September 2013 work began to improve the space. The kitchen was extended by just 1.8m to allow for a new back door leading to the new utility in the garage, and the wall was taken out between the kitchen and dining room.

'A breakfast bar was top of my wish list and this was the ideal place to put one,' says Jane. 'It's fantastic – we congregate here all the time.'

The lack of light was resolved with a new skylight and a glazed back door – then Jane started thinking about a kitchen style.

'I like vintage pieces and the simplicity of Scandinavian design ideas,' she says. 'I'm drawn to wood but, as we already had an oak dining table and we wanted a wood floor, I didn't want to make the room feel overbearing.'

Jane struggled to find a contrasting cabinet colour that wasn't white or a gloss that would be difficult to keep clean. Then the answer popped up on a chance visit to a local independent kitchen shop. 'I stopped by to ask about quartz worktops and spotted this woodgrain style door in a white-grey, and it was just perfect,' Jane recalls.

The look was completed with a white quartz worktop teamed with bold vintage green walls and bespoke shelving. Jane's really pleased with how everything has come together.

'The kitchen is such a lovely bright space to be in now,' she smiles. 'The breakfast bar is brilliant because we can eat together, chat together and even cook together now.'

## We used wasted cupboard

Just a simple size-adjustment turned Heather Burton's cramped shower room into a



#### Insider info

#### WHO LIVES HERE?

Heather Burton, a journalist and her husband, Dave Burton, a photographer. They have lived in their four-bedroom detached house near York, since they built it 16 years ago.

#### WHAT DO YOU LIKE MOST ABOUT THE ROOM?

'We use the en suite first thing in the morning, usually when the sun is shining directly into the room, so it's a great way to wake up. I also like the painted boards on the wall – they were very inexpensive to do but totally changed the look of the room.'

#### WHAT ARE YOUR TOP TIPS?

'Create a weathered-effect on new wood by painting it with a coat of the darkest colour you want to use, then add two more layers of contrasting lighter shades. When dry, use a piece of sandpaper wrapped around a small block of wood and gently sand in the direction of the grain until you achieve the desired 'weathered' look.'

#### WHAT WAS WRONG WITH THE OLD ROOM?

The shape of the room was awkward, making it difficult to work around, and in hindsight the room was too small to be functional as a useable space.



Before

eather and Dave Burton had always struggled with the awkward shape and size of their en suite.

'We made a mistake when we designed our home by making it too small, but we never got round to changing it,' says Heather. 'In the end the room started to look so dated and unloved that we asked a friend of ours, a joiner, to help transform it by making it bigger and changing the layout.'

They wanted to make more space without knocking out structural walls which would have a major impact on the main bedroom.

'My built-in wardrobe was much deeper than it needed to be, so we decided to take some of the space from the back of the wardrobe and use it to make more room in the en suite,' says Heather. 'By switching the WC around, we also had room for two basins instead of one.'

Work began early in 2014 when the joiner/builder took out all the old fittings, wall tiles and floorboards then knocked out a section of the breeze block wall between the built-in wardrobe and the en suite. He built a stud wall in the gap to create the framework for the

hidden toilet cistern, with inset shelves above it.

He laid new pipework and relaid the floor with new boards, at a higher level than the original to cover the pipes, and built a shallow wooden frame on which to fix the tongue and groove boards to the wall and added new skirting boards.

The shower area was lined with waterproof Wedi board and the new shower tray fixed into position. Shortly after the joiner had found and fitted a worn, chunky railway sleeper as a counter top, and fixed two new basins into position, he was taken ill and had to take several months off to recuperate.

'Dave continued with the rest of the work at weekends,' says Heather. This included tiling, fitting the shower, fitting window shutters – chosen by Heather to make the dated window look more attractive – and decorating.

'With so many delays it took about nine months from start to finish, but it's been worth the hassle,' says Heather. 'Although we haven't gained a lot of space, it's made a huge difference to the room, and it's the best it's ever been.'



#### CREATE IMPACT

Heather wanted to create a look which was partly Scandinavian, partly industrial, so she asked the joiner to fit tongue and groove boards from floor-to-ceiling on one wall, then painted them three colours before sanding them back to create a

#### **LOOK FOR INTERESTING ALTERNATIVES**

The counter top is a thick piece of railway sleeper, bought from a local wood yard and kept in its original state. It is fixed onto concealed heavy duty wall brackets.

#### **CONCEAL THE PIPEWORK**

The plumbing for the wall-mounted taps is concealed behind the tongue and groove boards which have been mounted on a shallow wooden frame.

#### PAINT THE FLOOR FOR A PRACTICAL FINISH

Painted floor boards can be matt varnished to prevent them becoming splash marked. Keep some spare paint to touch up any sections which get scratched or which fade with time. The floorboards were raised to create space for the new plumbing, then the joiner made a curved feature step from the en suite down into the bedroom.

#### **CREATE RECESSED**

Recessed shelves are neat, practical and stylish. The joiner created a box frame to fit into the section of wall that was removed for the concealed toilet cistern. He then rested bespoke shelves on simple wooden brackets, adding a small trim across the front to make them look as though they are cantilevered.



#### Heart in hands sequin cushion

This gorgeous cushion has just the right amount of sparkle and will add a touch of romance to your living room.

#### SHOPPING LIST

- square cushion pad1m red cotton fabric
- ruler pencil scissors one A4 sheet cream felt opins sewing machine
- red thread iron 1m red sequin trim
- hot glue gun

Measure your cushion pad and add 3cm to both the width and length (this will be your .1.5cm seam allowance). Cut a piece of red cotton to that size – this will be your cushion front. Download and print the Hands Cushion Template from www.yourhomemagazine.co.uk or send a stamped SAE to Your Home February Hands Cushion Template, HBM UK, The Tower, Phoenix Square, Colchester, CO4 9HU. Use the template to cut the hands shape from cream felt, then pin it to the middle of your cushion front. Stitch around the outer edge to secure.

Cut two rectangles from red cotton; each need to be the same width as your cushion front but only 3/4 the length – these will be your cushion backs. Press and stitch a 1.5cm double-fold hem along one long edge of each. Lay your cushion front right side up, then place the two back pieces on top, with right sides facing. The back pieces should overlap slightly.

Pin, then stitch all around the edges of the cushion, leaving a 1.5cm seam allowance.

Turn the cushion right **!**sides out and press. Fill the central heart shape with sequin trim, beginning at one side and curling the trim around to fill the shape, using a hot glue gun to stick it into place.

#### Palmistry hand

This gorgeous display harks back to traditional fortune-telling techniques to create a unique piece of art.

#### SHOPPING LIST

- artist's wooden hand model, from a selection at the National Gallery shop
- white spray paintpencilredren
- black fine line pen
   one A4 sheet red felt
- scissors red embroidery thread needle
- toy filling

Begin by giving your model hand two coats of white spray paint, working on one side at a time if possible to ensure an even finish. Leave to dry thoroughly.

Using a pencil, sketch the health, heart and head lines onto the palm of the hand, using our sample degree as a placement guide. We added the name of each line midway through it in script. Work over the pencil lines in red pen. To make the text really stand out, finish by going over the pencil lines in a black fine line pen.

Fold a piece of red felt in half, and draw a heart shape onto it. Cut it out to create two red hearts – hold these together and blanket stitch around the edge using red embroidery thread. Before you finish the seam, stuff it with a small amount of toy filling, then finish the stitching. Place the heart into the fingers of the hand, then mount in a glass dome and display.

#### Heart wall art

Create this wire art-piece and decorate your home for Valentine's Day and beyond.

Download and print the Wire Heart Template from www. yourhomemagazine.co.uk or send a stamped SAE to Your Home February Wire Heart Template, HBM UK, The Tower, Phoenix Square, Colchester, Essex, CO4 9HU. Following the template, cut and twist pieces of steel wire together using pliers, starting with the central heart and then moving on to the hands.

Cut and twist small sections of thin floristry wire between the thicker strengthen it. We added it in several places throughout the work – you can add as little or as much as you like, as long as the structure feels strong and secure. Use another piece of floristry wire to create a hanger.

Fold a piece of red felt in half and draw a heart onto it. Cut the heart out and work a blanket stitch around the edge in red thread, leaving a small gap in the seam. Stuff a little toy filling into the heart to pad it out, then stitch closed. Hang from the middle of the wire heart using another length of thread, then hang the work on the wall.

## urniture facelis

The month we revamped an old wooden chair with a innovative woven ribbon seat

Te found this chair in a house clearance shop: priced at just £5 it was a bargain, especially for a piece of furniture with such a solid wooden structure. A quick rub down and a coat of paint updated the chair almost immediately - we then renewed the foam pad and covered the seat with woven ribbons to give a unique and decorative finish.

#### You will need

✓ wooden seat with drop-in seat pad ✓dust sheet ✓glass paper and sanding block ✓damp cloth ✓ paint brush ✓Annie Sloan Chalk Paint in Old White, £18.95 per 11 ✓ soft cloth ✓Annie Sloan Soft Wax, £7.99 per 500ml ✓ 2.5cm thick foam ✓ marker pen ✓ scissors ✓ 10m each of cream and black grosgrain ribbons, 25mm wide, 89p per m, Hobbycraft √hammer ✓ upholstery tacks





Begin by removing the seat pad from the chair. Sometimes the pads are held in place with screws, but they may simply lift up and out. Place the chair frame on a dust sheet, then sand it with glass paper and a sanding block. Wipe clean with a damp cloth to remove any dust and dirt.

Paint the frame with a coat or two of chalk paint and leave to dry. Lightly distress the frame with a little glass paper for a shabby chic look. Finish with a coat of Annie Sloan wax, applied with a soft cloth.

Lay the foam down on a flat surface. Place the seat pad down directly on top of it. Use a marker pen to draw around the seat pad onto the foam beneath, then remove the seat pad. Use scissors to trim around the drawn lines, cutting approximately 5mm inside them so that the foam is slightly smaller than the original seat pad.

Turn the chair over so that you can work on the underside. Take a length of grosgrain ribbon and fold one end under by 1cm, then tack it to the underside of the back of the chair frame using four small upholstery tacks. Ensure all the ribbon ends are turned under before tacking for a neat finish. This first ribbon should run from the underside of the back of the frame, then up on to the seat top, towards the front of the seat. It should then run underneath the front of the frame.

Stand the chair upright, facing towards you. Bring the ribbon up onto the chair seat (over the seat top) then wind it underneath the front of the chair to the back and then up alongside the first ribbon. The ribbons should always sit neatly side by side and sit flat. Secure underneath the frame with an upholstery tack, then slide the foam pad into place.

Continue to weave the ribbon from the back to the front until the seat pad is covered. Trim the ribbon, leaving 2cm extra. Fold the end of the ribbon under and then secure it out of sight using four tacks on the underside of the chair frame.

Next, start to weave the second ribbon across the chair seat from one side to the other. Begin by tacking the end of each ribbon underneath the frame as before, turning the ribbon end underneath for a neat finish. Cut each ribbon so that it's long enough to weave across the seat pad and back, going underneath the chair frame, with a little extra to turn underneath before securing with upholstery tacks.

Continue weaving individual ribbons across the chair alternating the over/under pattern as you weave towards the front of the seat. Gently ease the ribbons closely together as you work to ensure a tight weave with no gaps.



# Seus Simp

Give your home a touch of tribal style with this DIY zebra rug

rom stag heads to animal print, home décor is definitely taking a walk on the wild side at the moment. Create your own show-stopper with this faux zebra rug, made from striking upholstery fabric and suedette.

Work out roughly how big you would like your rug to be, and cut off a length of zebra fabric to slightly larger than that size in both width and length. Fold the zebra fabric in half widthways with right sides facing, and pin.

Download and print the Zebra Rug Guide from www.yourhomemagazine.co.uk or send a Rug Guide, HBM UK, The Tower, Phoenix Square, Colchester, Essex, CO4 9HU. Using the guide as a reference, sketch the shape of one half of the rug out onto the fabric, working out from the fold line.

Once you're happy with the shape you've drawn, cut it out, keeping it pinned together. Once cut, unfold and press flat. You can now make any alterations to the shape of the rug – remember to fold it in half again before making any further cuts to ensure it stays symmetrical.

Fold the faux suede fabric in half widthways, with right sides together. Fold your zebra rug in half once again (with right sides together) and place it on top, aligning the two folded edges. Draw and cut the faux suede around the zebra rug, leaving a border of about 1.5" all around. Unfold both fabrics, and press.





#### You will need

- 1.5m Limpopo bronze fabric, £21.99 per m, Terry's Fabrics @ 1.5m suede curtain fabric, £6.99 per m, Terry's Fabrics
- ⊕ dressmaker's chalk ⊕ scissors⊕ pins
- esewing machine orange thread
- orange embroidery thread
- embroidery needle 🙃 cardboard
- e orange and cream yarn scraps



Place the zebra rug on top of the faux suede rug with wrong sides facing, making sure it sits centrally. Pin together, then use a decorative machine stitch and a brightly coloured thread (we used orange) to sew a single strip down the middle of the work. Keep the layers pinned together.

Work a decorative machine stitch all around the edge of the zebra rug, to secure it into place on the faux suede and finish the edges of the fabric. Again, use a bright contrasting colour of thread to make this line stand out.

Once the layers are sewn, add decorative hand stitching. Thread an embroidery needle with a length of brightly-coloured embroidery thread (using all six strands) and work a straight stitch around the edge of the zebra fabric, around 2cm in from the machine stitching.

Finally, make a tassel tail. Cut a 10cm x 15cm rectangle of cardboard, and wrap lengths of cream and orange yarn around it several times - the more you wrap it, the bushier your tassel will be. Thread a strand of thread underneath the wrapped yarn and pull it tight into a knot, to hold the yarn together. Trim the wrapped yarn from the cardboard, cutting along the bottom edge. Wrap a final length of yarn around the strands and tie in a knot to gather it together once more. Stitch this tassel to the edge of the rug's tail to finish.



# Girls' Guide to



Hide unsightly radiators by fitting a stylish cover – follow these steps to learn how to install one





1 Before you begin, read through the instructions carefully. Lay everything out on the floor to check and identify all the parts and fixings. As many cabinets are made-to-measure, the instructions may vary from one to the other, however the basic principles of assembly should be the same for all styles. Join the side panels to the panel supports using the cam and bolt fixings.



2 Fit the magnetic catches to the underside of the top using the screws provided. You may find pre-drilled holes to show you where to fix them. Attach the back strut between the side panels, turn the top board upside-down (holes upwards) and fit the sides and upright to it. You may need an extra pair of hands to keep the unit steady while you do this.



3 Fit the front and side plinths to the uprights using the plastic dowels. This can be done either with the cabinet upside-down or upright. Take care when turning the cabinet over. Be aware that the dowels may fit fairly loosely – this is to allow some adjustment if you have an uneven floor surface. After you've assembled the whole cabinet, glue the plinths in place to secure them.



A Insert the front panel and grille. The metal plates on the top of the panel should line up to the magnetic catches on the top board. Once you're happy with the assembly, you can go through the process again, glueing the components in position as you go, Once the glue has dried, you can paint the cabinet and fix it to the wall through the back strut.

The instructions which came with your cabinet should provide more detailed information on using cam and bolt fixings.

My home suffers from condensation, especially during the winter months. I'm worried about this and the quality of the air are there any solutions? Mrs A Childs, Bristol



**EnviroVent's Marketing** ADirector, Rebecca McLean, gives her top tips for improving the air quality in your home...

58% of homeowners said that they had experienced condensation in their home. This is a particular problem in the winter months when there is a higher level of humidity. The result is that warm air, which carries more moisture than cooler air, remains trapped inside.

Resulting from a lack of ventilation, condensation means that your home has issues with internal air quality. Ensuring

regular air changes inside the property not only reduces relative humidity and tackles condensation, it also creates a healthier indoor environment.

#### TAKE A WHOLE HOUSE APPROACH TO VENTILATION

So what can you do about condensation? If it's a problem in just one or two rooms, particularly the kitchen or bathroom, you could consider a low energy usage extractor fan, such as Cylone7. This is designed to control humidity levels in kitchens, bathrooms and utility rooms using low energy consumption.

If you find that you're experiencing mould and condensation across a number of rooms in the house, then Positive Input Ventilation (PIV) may be a good option to consider. PIV units can be installed into any home. They work by drawing in fresh, filtered clean air from

the loft space in a house or from outside in a flat or apartment.

This fresh air is gently supplied into the home from a central position on a landing or the central hallway in a flat or bungalow. HOW CAN I CHECK THE **ENERGY-EFFICIENCY?** 

By checking the 'Window Energy Rating' (WER). The rating system is based on a scale of 'A+' to 'G', with 'A+' rated windows being the most energyefficient. Current Building Regulations for replacement windows fitted into existing dwellings recommend windows that achieve ratings 'A+' to 'C' to be installed. Installing 'A'-rated windows will help to conserve energy and ultimately contribute to the reduction of heating costs minimising heat loss that is caused by inefficient windows and doors, which can be up to 20% per household.

DO MY WINDOWS HAVE TO HAVE A WER? No, but a WER helps you to demonstrate compliance with Building Regulations for replacement windows. Windows offered solely on a low window U-value (the traditional approach) may not be as energy-efficient as WER-rated products. And even if the supplier is a Competent

**Persons Scheme Installer** member the product manufacturer may not be fully audited.

Grouting is notoriously hard to keep looking clean, particularly in damp areas, so it's a good idea to keep any grouting lines in tiles to a minimum. Large format tiles in the shower area and around the bath and basin are a good way of doing this.

And with splashes and spillages being part and parcel of a family bathroom, think carefully about the surfaces you choose to ensure they're easy to wipe clean without having to break out the rubber gloves and scrubbing brush. It's also a good idea to keep

the floor clear of obstacles wherever possible, with wall-hung sanitaryware and furniture being easy to clean around and underneath.

# Your February checklist

Discover seasonal tasks for your home and garden

#### IF YOU DO ONE THING THIS MONTH...

When it comes to cleaning, there are some jobs you do every day and others that you put off until the big spring clean each year. But don't let these awkward, fiddly jobs make the big clean a daunting prospect. Follow our handy hints and you'll be left wondering what all the fuss was about.

- Venetian blinds are the trickiest window dressings to clean. To keep on top of dust and prevent a build-up of moisture, Hillarys Blinds suggests donning a pair of cotton gloves and wiping your fingers between each slat to clear any dust and dirt. If you don't have any gloves you could use a feather duster or close the blinds and use the upholstery attachment on your vacuum cleaner instead. If your Venetian blinds are made from aluminium, give them a thorough clean by washing them in the bath or shower with mild household detergent and carefully hanging over the washing line to dry. This method isn't suitable for wooden blinds as any moisture could cause them to warp or stain.
- Lighting fixtures often show up any dust or cobwebs first, but it's not practical to take them apart each week to properly clean them. Throughout the year a regular wipe with a feather duster should be enough to keep them looking clean - you should always make sure your lights are turned off before doing this. For a deeper clean, turn off your lights and leave the bulbs to cool before removing them and wiping with a duster, not a damp cloth. To clean fabric shades, The Lighting Store recommends you don't get them wet as this could cause the metal frame underneath to rust and show through the fabric. The best way to clean them is to use the lowest setting on your vacuum cleaner on the shade and clean the base with regular furniture polish.
- Regularly washing your bedding will go a long way towards making sure your bed is hygienically clean all year round, but it's still important to freshen up your mattress. Bathroom and bedroom online store, Soak & Sleep, recommends vacuuming both sides of your mattress using the upholstery attachment, making sure you press deep into the fabric and any joins or seams to help remove dirt that might be lurking there. To kill any nasty odours, sprinkle baking soda onto the mattress first, leave for 15 minutes and then vacuum up.



So when she bought a modern townhouse painted from top to bottom in one neutral shade she saw an opportunity to bring lots of colour back into her life. Judy was keen to have more light and space and having lived in America, Canada, Asia and Europe, she was also keen to find a home which reflected these multi-cultural experiences. 'I wasn't looking for a modern place,' says Judy. 'I prefer older houses with character, but I was curious to see this





house. As soon as I walked in and saw the sun pouring through the windows I thought 'wow', this would be heaven after the dark old cottage. I was really surprised by how light and spacious it was. It had been for sale for a while so I put in a silly offer and nearly fell through the floor when it was accepted.'

She sold most of her furniture with the cottage and moved into her new home with just a large leather-effect corner sofa left by the previous owners, her bed and her collection of paintings. It was literally a blank canvas. 'The first thing I did was

choose bright, bold colours for all of the main living areas,' says Judy. 'The decorator thought I was mad, but it's a big space and I wanted it to be warm and welcoming.'

Judy knew which of her large-scale abstracts would hang on each wall, so she took inspiration from their colours to create the backdrop to her modern new home, using Farrow & Ball Charlotte's Locks in the main living area at the top of the house, then a specially mixed vibrant green for her own room and Farrow & Ball Babouche for the guest bedroom. 'Some people are frightened to use colour,

but providing the tones work together and the house works as a whole, there is no reason why you shouldn't use lots of them,' says Judy.

The ground floor bedrooms are used as a studio and a storeroom for Judy's paintings, which she exhibits throughout the UK and abroad. 'You don't have to understand abstract art to appreciate it,' says Judy. 'My view is that if you buy a painting that you really like, for whatever reason, you have something that is not only original,

but also says something about you as an individual. It's much more personal than a piece of furniture which can be replicated or replaced.'

Judy has renovated many properties over the years, so moving into a home which required no structural improvements was quite a novelty. It also meant that she could focus entirely on the décor, lighting and furnishings. 'Good artificial lighting is as important to me as natural light,' says Judy. 'I met a specialist light designer in the village who fitted mood lighting to the spiral staircase – it's such a simple idea and the effect is amazing.'

The staircase looks striking, but it posed a logistical problem for Judy who had to carry her furniture up three flights of spiral steps. A friend helped her to carry the largest paintings and big furniture, carefully manoeuvring the bulky pieces round and round, with rest stops at each level. 'It would have been a lot easier if I could have brought furniture through the balcony doors, but they are on the top floor. The bottom line was that if I couldn't take something apart to get it up the stairs, I couldn't keep it.'

Judy thought the open-plan layout



of the top floor could have been a challenge to furnish, but it was clearly dictated by the kitchen and the exposed brick fireplace. Judy tends to buy furniture when she sees something she really likes, rather than visit stores on a regular basis. The table and chairs were found in a small shop in Scotland and were delivered to Yorkshire in a small trailer. Some of her smaller, antique tables were bought in the UK and abroad, while the Ikea sofa was chosen for its design and proportions. 'I would rather have a big piece of original art on the wall and an inexpensive sofa than a mass produced print and a very expensive sofa,' says Judy, who holds abstract art classes from home. 'I also think good lighting is really important in a home because it can alter the mood of a room as well as change the emphasis and focal points. It would have been useful to have sockets in the middle of the floor because the sofa faces the fireplace and I wanted lighting at either end. All the sockets are along the wall which means cables to any free-standing lighting have to be hidden under the rugs.'

But the benefits of having so much natural light and space in the modern townhouse far outweigh any disadvantages. 'I always said I would never live in a modern house but I love being here,' says Judy. 'It's a very easy house to live in – and while big paintings look great in any sized house, it's a bonus to have plenty of wall space for some of my favourites. I've lived all over the world in all kinds of places, but for me home is always where the art is.'

## My home's eclectic style has evolved over time

Jane Day's home is the ideal testing ground for her interiors blog

s an interiors blogger and stylist Jane Day is constantly re-arranging her accessories, making cushions and thinking up new ideas for displays at her home in Billingham. 'I'm always reading interiors magazines, blogs and making moodboards on Pinterest,' she says. 'Things like cushions and stools get changed around every week, and I like cosying things up with blankets and throws in winter.'

Jane's eclectic style has evolved organically since she met husband Robert and they bought their first home together in 2002. 'We chose the area as it was close to work and handy for the A19,' says Jane.

'But the house itself was a horrible 80s throwback that needed lots of work. It had a dated yellow and blue colour scheme with wallpaper borders in the lounge, mock-wood internal doors, curtain swags and lots of artex, rag rolling and stipple-effect paintwork. It was like someone had been watching Changing Rooms and tried all the paint effects at once!'

The pair set about making it liveable during their first year before gradually updating each room as money allowed. One of the first things to be ripped out were the old carpets. In the hallway, the dark terracotta carpet was swapped for hard-wearing sisal, with softer jute in the

living room. 'I wanted the flooring to have a natural element to it,' explains Jane. 'And the underlay is made from recycled old jumpers so it's eco-friendly.'

They've also had a new handmade pine kitchen installed, to which they've added lots of accessories and artwork including a vintage advertising sign found in Robert's grandad's garage. 'The old kitchen was dated with dark oak doors that were hanging off their hinges,' explains Jane. 'We stuck to the same layout as there wasn't much scope for changing it dramatically, but we wanted something built with integrity that would last. Even the carcasses are wood.'

The living room has double doors overlooking the rear cottage garden where the couple keep three chickens. Jane has added some quirky touches to the room such as the Fortnum & Mason hampers from eBay, which double up as storage, and the stained glass window on the wall. 'Robert's grandparents were going to throw them away when they got new double glazing, but his parents salvaged them and we discovered them years later in their loft,' she says

A few years after moving in, Jane had daughter Ruby, now nine, and decided to leave her IT job to become a full-time mum and focus more on her passion for interiors. 'I started doing china hire, then took an interior design course and started my blog teawithruby.co.uk, which just took over,' she explains. Through online interiors community Jane met fellow interiors enthusiast, maker, and owner of The Linen Garden, Vicky Trainor. The pair became best friends with a mutual love of 'treasure hunting' at vintage fairs and car boot sales, which led them to set up owenandhunter.co.uk. 'We sell homewares at fairs and pop-up shops, and we're in the process of developing an online shop,' says Jane. 'We have slightly different tastes, but when you put them together they just work. We just bounce off each other really well.'

'When styling, I try to not to make things too symmetrical. Group odd numbers and use different heights, group things that go together such as natural materials or vintage pieces.'

These days Jane's a big fan of French linen, vintage signs and upcycling, finding many pieces at car boot sales, reclamation yards and on eBay. For instance the lounge features a vintage 'No Parking' sign, old tennis rackets mounted on the wall, blinds made from French bed sheets and a stained glass panel from Robert's grandma's house. Her style is epitomised in the guest bedroom which features crates customised with vintage maps and a painted chest of drawers from her sisterin-law that Jane has re-painted white. In the master bedroom she's gone for a more dramatic look having painted the walls a rich red to show off the ornate gilt picture frames and beautiful antique French bed.

Although Ruby's bedroom is compact to say the least, she loves the cosy space which has furniture from The White Company, bunting and a crate customised with pretty bird wallpaper. 'Like many people we've gone for a make-do-andmend approach, doing bits and pieces to the house as and when we could afford it,' says Jane. 'Although ideally I'd like to

## How to upcycle an old crate

• Crates can be mounted on the wall alone or stacked in groups for displaying your favourite things, so decide where they'll be placed and make sure the size looks right for the space. You can choose to paint some sections and wallpaper others, both inside and out. Start by sanding the areas that will be painted or wallpapered. Use a primer then eggshell emulsion for the painted sections. Buy vintage wallpaper online or send off for samples so you don't have to buy a whole roll. You could also use pages from magazines. Cut the wallpaper up into pieces to make a collage on the floor, moving things around until you're happy with the arrangement. Use PVA glue to attach the wallpaper to the crate and finish with a matt varnish to seal.

• Crates are so versatile. If you want moveable storage, perhaps for kids' toys, add castors to the bottom instead of having wall-mounted shelving.

change certain things it would be quite an expense so we've worked around what's already here.'

The bathroom is a prime example of this approach. They've kept the simple white suite, but updated it by ripping up the laminate flooring, painting the walls and floor white and adding French-style accessories such as a grain sack bathmat. 'I love grain sacks as they are so versatile,' says Jane. 'As well as a bathmat, they can be used for bench cushions in the kitchen or re-upholstering chairs.'

As for the future, Jane and Robert would love a bigger place, but with Ruby settled at school they'll undoubtedly stay put for now. 'We often talk about building our own modern open-plan house,' says Jane. 'So maybe if we find the right plot of land we'll end up in the countryside.'

My little home is perfect for me



Student doctor Hayley has turned an investment into a home she doesn't want to leave

oving from Vancouver to Dublin was always going to be an adventure, and the process of finding accommodation would be difficult, but when Hayley Spurr gained a place to study in The College of Surgeons, she couldn't wait. However, the rental prices for accommodation gave her pause for thought. 'I quickly realised that over the years I would be spending a lot of money renting in Dublin. As I was lucky enough to have the support of my family, it seemed a more sensible option to look for somewhere that I could buy as an investment opportunity.'

After moving over in September 2013, at the top of Hayley's property hunting → To make the small living room feel as big and light as possible Hayley opted for a limed oak laminate from Mulvey's of Dundrum and Perspex tables from Harvey Norman. However, it proved a tall order to source and organise a home to buy while taking on her studies too. Fortunately Hayley was lucky enough to have a helper on hand. I spend a lot of time in the kitchen, and the existing one was only two metres square, so it wasn't going to work for me.' To give Hayley the space she wanted they planned a bright kitchen extension to the rear, while retaining the 25m<sup>2</sup> garden required by planning permission. tiny kitchen was redeployed as a utility corridor as well as a viewing link, one side is lined with units containing the washing machine, dryer and storage, the other side with coat hooks.

Once the structural work had been completed Hayley and Wesley could turn their thoughts to the décor. 'The other thing I really wanted to do was to strip back that beautiful brick fireplace,' says Hayley. 'My first time living away from home was in Montreal, where I lived in a really wonderful old house with lots of period features and exposed brick, and that loft-style stayed with me as something I really loved.' Stripped, cleaned and repaired, the fireplace openings have been cleverly used as spaces for lighting and for a television. Long term, the living room opening is designed to take a woodburning stove, but as a student doctor with a hectic schedule, Hayley doesn't have much time to build fires or clean out a stove, so for now it's a great place to put the television, leaving the floor space clear and uncluttered.

The colour scheme in the kitchen grew from the triptych Hayley bought on her



second day in Ireland. 'I went with my parents on a mad hike across Howth Head, and we bought these prints in the West Pier Art Studio, so they're pretty special. The other thing that is important in the kitchen is the clock; I've had it in every home I ever lived in, always in the kitchen. 

#### Egg fried quinoa

PREPARATION TIME 10 MINUTES COOKING TIME 20 MINUTES SERVES 2-4

#### YOU WILL NEED

- ✓75g quinoa ✓1 tbsp sesame oil
- ✓2cm piece ginger, peeled and grated
- ✓1 cooked chicken breast, skin removed and shredded ✓100g prawns ✓3 spring onions, sliced ✓50g frozen peas ✓50g sugar snap peas, sliced ✓3 small pak choi, shredded ✓3 the happy egg co. eggs, whisked ✓1 tbsp soy sauce

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- Place the quinoa in a medium-sized saucepan and half fill the saucepan with water.




#### **DIRECTIONS**

- Heat the oil in a large non-stick frying pan and cook the onion and garlic over a low heat for 10 minutes or until soft and lightly golden.
- Add the ginger, chillies, cumin and garam masala or curry powder. Cook over a moderate heat for 1-2 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- Add the lamb and stir-fry for 2-3 minutes, then add the tomatoes, sugar and tomato purée and bring to the boil. Season with salt and pepper, reduce the heat and gently simmer uncovered for 20-25 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add a little water, if needed. Add the peas 10 minutes before the end of the cooking time.



- At this point you could garnish with the coriander and serve with flat or naan bread, plain basmati rice or poppadums and a selection of relishes, or continue to turn into a bake with a rustic topping. Keema can be frozen successfully and used at a later date. Simply cool, transfer to a rigid container, label and freeze for up to 2 months. Remember to defrost overnight in the fridge and reheat until piping hot.
- To make the bake, put the keema in a large non-stick pan with the stock and heat for 3-4 minutes until piping hot, breaking up the mixture
- with a wooden spoon. Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4.
- Spoon the lamb into a large ovenproof baking dish or 4 small ovenproof dishes. Heat the mash and spoon over the keema. Sprinkle over the breadcrumbs.
- Cook in the oven for 20 minutes until the mash is golden. Garnish with the herbs and serve with a selection of seasonal vegetables.

### Leek, white bean and smoked haddock stew

#### YOU WILL NEED

√30g butter ✓2 leeks, trimmed and sliced thinly into rings ✓200g potatoes, peeled and cut into 1cm dice ✓400ml milk ✓ 600ml fish, chicken or vegetable stock √1 bay leaf 
√400g smoked undyed haddock fillet ✓30g plain flour <a>195</a>g tin of sweetcorn ✓2 x 400g tins white beans; drained and washed (cannellini. butter or haricot) √1 tbsp chopped parsley ✓1 tsp smoked paprika

#### DIRECTIONS

- Place a medium-sized saucepan or sauté pan on the stove and add the butter. Allow it to melt before adding the leeks and potatoes with a pinch of salt and a generous twist of pepper. Cook for 10 minutes until the leeks are soft.
- Meanwhile, pour the milk and the stock into another pan with the bay leaf and add the fish. Bring to the boil before removing the fish from the poaching liquor. When cool enough to handle, flake the fish into chunks and remove and discard any skin. Set the cooking liquor aside.
- Add the flour and the sweetcorn to the leeks and potatoes and stir well. Cook the flour and sweetcorn for a few minutes before adding the hot poaching liquor. Mix well and bring to the boil. Add the drained beans and simmer until the potatoes are tender.
- Add the flaked fish to the stew and heat through. Taste for seasoning. Stir in the chopped parsley and sprinkle with a little smoked paprika.



#### Egg stuffed peppers and tomatoes

PREPARATION TIME 10 MINUTES
COOKING TIME 25-30 MINUTES SERVES 3-4

#### YOU WILL NEED


- ✓1 tsp olive oil ✓1 onion, finely chopped
- ✓1 garlic clove, crushed ✓50g chorizo, sliced
- ✓1 tbsp smoked paprika ✓400g tin chopped tomatoes ✓1 tbsp tomato purée ✓2 large handfuls of kale or spinach ✓1 beef-steak tomato, cut in half, seeds removed ✓1 orange pepper, cut in half, seeds removed ✓1 red pepper, cut in half, seeds removed ✓6 the happy egg co. eggs

#### DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 190°C/375°F/Gas Mark 6.
- In a large pan heat the oil and add the onion and garlic. Cook for 2-3 minutes until the onion starts to soften. Add the chorizo, paprika, canned tomatoes and tomato purée and bring to the boil and simmer for 5-10 minutes. Add the kale in the last 5 minutes, if using spinach just stir through at the end of the cooking time.
- Place the vegetable halves in a deep baking tray. Spoon the mixture into the vegetable halves but leave space at the top for the egg any remaining mixture can be served with the vegetables.
- Make a slight indent in the mixture; carefully crack the eggs and place in the centre of each vegetable. Place in the oven and bake for about 25-30 minutes until the eggs have set.
- Serve with any remaining tomato sauce and an extra pile of your favourite seasonal vegetables.



Paint effects are back in fashion, so get creative to transform tired walls and furniture - try applying uniform blocks of colour to make a striking kitchen splashback.

## ONLY BUY WHAT YOU NEED

Work out the exact quantities of materials needed for the job so you don't overspend. Measure rooms and use online calculators that let you know the required amount of paint, wallpaper or tiles. When refurbishing a kitchen or bedroom, don't rip out cupboards or wardrobes without examining the carcasses first, as if they're in good condition, replace the doors rather than the entire units, keeping expenses down. Investing in multi-purpose tools is more cost-effective than buying ones with a single function, or, if you're unlikely to use a particular piece of kit again, hire it instead. Sell any left over materials on eBay, Gumtree or a specialist website.

GRAB A DISCOUNT From cashback sites and loyalty cards to money-off vouchers, there's no reason why you should ever have to pay full price again. Online shopping is usually cheaper than buying in-store, and you always have the right to return goods for a full refund. Megadiscount sites Amazon and eBay have huge home improvement sections, and some big supermarkets have branched into DIY – for example Asda has introduced George Home paints and wallpapers. Join Topcashback and Quidco for money back every time you make a purchase from a participating retailer, and sign up to Myvouchercodes for daily coupons and codes. B&Q's Diamond Card gives a discount to over 60s every Wednesday, and buy from your local builder's merchant to get trade prices.

▼ Build a handy workbench for less using a Simply Build It kit which includes screws and heavy duty connectors – the only extra is the timber, which costs around £45 for a 1.2m bench. The kit is also £45, from www.simplybuildit.co.uk

- In the kitchen, use standard Ikea carcasses and design your own door fronts, which can be made up by a joiner. This gives the impression of bespoke cupboards.
- Engineered floors are just as good as solid floors. Don't be afraid of using them as an alternative.
  - Create canvas-covered wall panels: tightly glue canvas onto MDF, lip the edges on the back and secure with staples. This is inexpensive but brings incredible texture and interest

a e l l e Collins keen to secure new home she made an offer on the property before her husband, Will, had even seen it! 'Fortunately, he trusts my iudgement we couldn't hang

around as places were being snapped up as soon as they hit the market,' she explains. The pretty Victorian terraced cottage was a big step up from the one-bedroom flat they'd already sold, but they stretched themselves to buy it and had little left over for home improvements.

As the couple had been living with Gaelle's parents while house-hunting, they were under no pressure to move in straight away. 'We were lucky to have the whole place empty while we re-decorated from top to bottom, and roped in the whole family to help with the work so that we didn't have to pay for a decorator,' says Gaelle.

The existing kitchen units were in reasonable condition but the old slate floor was in a sorry state. However, with the help of some restorer and lots of elbow grease, it came up like new for just £12. Needing new appliances, Gaelle and Will negotiated a substantial discount, including free installation, in a local electrical store, where they also picked up

their best bargain – an ex-display fridge for half of its \$400 price tag.

A big selling point of the house was the living/dining room with enough space for two sofas, bought in a sale, a large dining table and chairs and an old pine dresser rescued from Gaelle's parents' garage. After painstakingly restoring it with a \$25 pot of Annie Sloan chalk paint, she added some \$1 ceramic knobs from Amazon to give it a modern twist. A junk shop coffee table was given a similar treatment.

Having lavished lots of TLC on the house, Gaelle and Will are now saving up to tackle the next big project which is the scruffy garden. In the meantime, it's had a budget facelift. 'My only expense was a can of Cuprinol paint which totally transformed the old garden gate and fence, which will eventually be replaced,' says Gaelle.

Inexpensively decorated in pale, neutral shades, the cosy living room includes a pair of sofas and a secondhand coffee table, which Gaelle lovingly revamped. The newly-renovated handme-down dresser takes pride of place at the far end

f you're thinking about selling your home you want to do the best you can for it to stand out amongst the property crowd.

Even though the market is much improved than it was during the recession and house prices have bounced back in most areas to pre-2007 levels, you still want to get the best price you can if you want to sell up and move.

There are a number things you can do to make your home more appealing to a potential purchaser, most of these are really easy and affordable, others might take a bit more time, effort and money, but they are all well worth doing because a small amount of investment can either make your home sell quickly or for a better price or even both!

Here are my 10 top tips for making worthwhile improvements to your home:

A tired and drab kitchen is one major thing to put off a potential buyer. Especially if you're trying to sell a family home an ugly and unhygienic kitchen will put off any family with style and taste. These days there really is no excuse for a grim kitchen when a new kitchen can be bought and installed in the most affordable way imaginable. I'm still amazed at how affordable some new kitchens can be today.

Investing in a new bathroom suite would definitely be my number two home improvement. Anyone looking to buy a home will find a new bathroom suite that has been nicely tiled and decorated really appealing. Give your home a coat of paint both inside and outside. This is one of the easiest jobs to do and you can even do it yourself. 5 If there are any rooms that have tired-looking carpets in them then have them changed. With a bit of research and shopping around you can find the most affordable carpets that look great. You can hire a sander for very little money and giving your timber floors a light sanding is something you can easily do yourself, but do make sure you do this before decorating any rooms because the dust gets everywhere. Reseal the floors with oil that gives the timber a natural look. Avoid varnish as it can make your beautifully sanded floor look like it has a plastic finish.

Lighting is such an important part of a good 21st-century home so make sure


you make an effort to change all of your LED bulbs and replace any tired looking lamp shades or light fittings. This is more important than you could possibly imagine especially if you are trying to sell your home during the autumn or winter seasons when it will be dark in the evenings when people finish work and want to make an evening viewing. They will obviously want to make a second viewing during the day, but first impressions do last.

## 10 CLEAN CARPETS INSTEAD OF REPLACING

Replacing carpets throughout your home can be expensive, but the difference a good clean can make is fantastic. Vacuuming will remove the surface dirt, while a wet extraction deep clean will remove airborne contaminants that have penetrated it like road dust, pollen, fungus and bacteria.

#### WET CLEANING MAY SHRINK MY CARPET

It won't if done properly. Carpets that have been fitted properly will not be affected by wet extraction cleaning. Some types of carpets such as wool, that have not been secured with carpet grippers, can shrink when over wetted or exposed to extreme heat. When cleaning wool carpets only lukewarm water should be used with a dedicated carpet detergent. This will do a thorough and effective job and will not damage your carpet in any way. The Independent Carpet and Rug Institute recommends wet extraction as the most effective way to keep carpets in their cleanest, freshest and best condition.

#### • I DON'T HAVE TO CLEAN MY CARPET **BECAUSE IT HAS BUILT-IN STAIN RESISTANCE**

Although carpet shield-type coatings work in preventing some stains from penetrating the carpet fibres, dirt still gets trapped deep down in the carpet pile. Stain resistance also isn't permanent, while heavy foot traffic around kitchen entrances and hallways can actually drive greasy dirt deeper into the pile. In this instance, a product such as a High Foot Traffic Cleaner as a pre-treatment to machine deep cleaning, is needed to lift soil out of your carpet by breaking the bonds of embedded dirt and grease.

#### • I ONLY NEED TO DEEP CLEAN MY CARPET IF THERE IS A SPOT OR STAIN

Dirt will build up over time even if there are no spills or stains. A regular once over with a vacuum is necessary and will mean less dirt builds up on the surface but it doesn't remove the deep down dirt. If you have pets, it's still advisable to wet clean the carpet at least two or three times a year, as it will help to eliminate odours and remove fur, oil and protein stains.




