



### HOW TO ... go paperless

If piles of paperwork are overwhelming your office space it might be time to go digital, and free-up your desk. You will, however, need to keep some stuff on good old-fashioned paper. Here's how to get started ...

There are some things that you will need to keep hard copies of. These include personal documents such as birth and marriage certificates; deeds; loan and mortgage documents; warranties; pay, P60 and P45 slips.

Request PDF versions of insurance certificates and ask for paperless billing on your household bills so you can view them online rather than having them posted. You can also request to view your bank statements online, unless you need to complete a tax return, for which you will need hard copies.

Set up a filing system on your computer for bills, statements and certificates, with different folders for each type of document, as you would have done with your paper versions. Then within each folder create another for the year, or even the month. It will make it much easier when it comes to locating them.

Unless you need to complete a tax return, keep a year's worth of bank statements, bills and payslips (until you receive your next P60). If you are self-employed then you should keep them for longer. Mortgage and any pension or investment documents should be kept indefinitely, as should P60 and P45 slips. Once you've sold a car and it's in the new owner's name, then you can destroy any servicing details and MOT certificates. Likewise, once an insurance policy has been terminated, or a switch is fully completed, then you can destroy the documents.

Always backup your computer files to an external hard drive in case anything should go wrong with your computer or laptop.




There are so many cleaning cloths available these days, all for different tasks, what do I actually need?

A pack of multi-purpose micro-fibre cloths should see vou through most household chores but there are a few specifics that will make



some tasks easier. A thick micro-fibre cloth is great for dusting and buffing surfaces; for kitchens choose something spongey for absorbing spills; a cloth with a non-scratch scouring side for scrubbing soapy grime is great for bathrooms, and a buffing window cloth is good for getting a high-shine on mirrors and shower-screens, as well as windows. Spontex has a collection of cloth kits that are great for tackling specific tasks, including bathroom, kitchen and window, priced at £4.99 for two cloths.







## Great buy

Clean windows and shower screens, remove condensation, and clear up spills, with one handy tool. The new Window and Glass Vacuum from Black & Decker is a really versatile multifunctional tool to keep around, perfect for taking care of chores around the house, as well as the car. The spray trigger allows you to spray water or detergent directly onto the area to be cleaned, while the washable micro-fibre pad will wipe it away. Twist

the head and the tool becomes a battery-powered wet vacuum cleaner with a squeegee for a streak-free finish on glass. The lithium-ion battery allows 23 minutes of run time, perfect for ensuring you can complete your task without running out of power.

### e test... cake tins

We tried out a selection of sandwich and muffin tins, here's what we found...

#### THINGS WE CONSIDERED

- How sturdy did the tin feel?
- Was it easy to pick up?
- Was it easy to release the cake from the tin?

#### PYREX ASIMETRIA METAL **EASY-GRIP 12-CUP MUFFIN** TRAY, FROM £13.99; 20CM CAKE PAN, FROM £9.99

These carbon steel tins were guite lightweight. The extra wide, slanted handles made them really easy to grip when coming out of the oven, making them feel comfortable to use. The safe non-stick coating was good in the round tin and it offered good heat distribution, however there was some sticking in the muffin tin.



#### SILVERSTONE 12-CUP MUFFIN TIN, £14; 9" ROUND CAKE TIN, £8.50

These ceramic tins were surprisingly lightweight, although sturdy, and the wide handles made moving them in and out of the oven really easy. We used the round cake tin to bake a cheesecake, which came out perfectly and left virtually no mess in the pan. The muffin tin was the perfect size for Yorkshire puddings too. They're not dishwasher-safe but they were so easy and quick to clean that this wasn't an issue.



#### KITCHENCRAFT MASTER CLASS **SMART SILICONE RIGID 6-HOLE** PAN, £14.95; 20CM ROUND CAKE PAN, £11.95

This clever cookware has silicone insides for easy turning out, while the non-stick, rigid frame makes it really secure to handle. The six-cup pan worked really well for muffins and Yorkshire puddings, which came out cleanly without any mess. We used the cake tin for a tried and tested carrot cake recipe with great results. Both pans are fridge, freezer and dishwashersafe, making them a practical choice for any busy kitchen.



#### MARY BERRY 12-HOLE PUSHPAN, £24.99; 20CM SHALLOW PUSHPAN, £12.99, **LAKELAND**

The tins were very strong and held their shape well, and had an outer lip to help grip the tin. The loose bottoms of the cake and muffin tin slid up easily once the cake was cooked. The silicone coating on the bottoms meant they didn't slide up too quickly, allowing full control when releasing the cakes.



#### Before you go ahead

#### You need to ensure both parties are happy and protected legally:

- Have a survey done on both properties, so any repairs or renovations are clearly stated.
- A formal house swap is a legal transaction, changing ownership on the title deeds.
- Both parties should take legal advice before going ahead and drawing up a transfer deed, when each party transfers their property.
- When children still have a mortgage in place, they will need the agreement of the mortgage company to transfer it to their new home.
- This could be the perfect time to look for a better mortgage rate but bear in mind any exit penalty costs.

#### Things to think about

#### There's a lot to consider before you take the plunge:

- ✓ Parents' circumstances may change and if their wealth is tied up in their house, they could find it difficult to manage.
- ✓ If a parent needs to live in a nursing home in later years, the local authority could take the view that a house swap has been done to deliberately deprive themselves of assets, which will affect contributions to care fees. ✓ To prevent this, don't wait until the
- possibility of a care home is imminent and ensure you have all legal agreements in place, clearly stating everybody's intentions. ✓ Both parties should re-do their wills to take the new arrangement into account.

#### Dos and don'ts

#### Bear in mind these rules of thumb: DO...

- ✓ Get professional legal advice.
- ✓ Involve other siblings to see how they feel
- ✓ Review all wills, especially parents'.
- ✓ Think about taking out a term assurance policy to protect a PET against Inheritance Tax. DON'T...
- ✓ Rush into anything.
- ✓ Do it unless it suits everyone's needs.
- ✓ Go ahead without the proper surveys and valuations in place.
- ✓ Get upset if the other party completely redecorates or changes the way they use the property. It's theirs now and it will be given a new lease of life, which you in turn can do with your new home.





# Loft living wallpaper

Give your walls a striking new look



It's gone from dark and dated, to bright and beautiful

Clever planning and design ideas allowed Sheena Watson to create a light, airy bathroom, that meets all her family's showering and bathing needs

Then Sheena Watson moved into her three-bedroom terrace, in Margate, with husband, Craig, and sons, Sam and Alex, she was well aware that it needed more than just a coat of paint to bring it up-to-date. 'It hadn't been decorated for decades, and the bathroom with its shabby turquoise suite, grubby walls and stained carpet was perhaps the worst room of all,' recalls Sheena. 'What's more, a huge cupboard, complete with antiquated boiler, meant there was no room to manoeuvre when it came to adding a much needed shower.' However, Sheena was sure she could rise to the challenge and create an inviting and practical family bathroom.

**STEP ONE** As a shower lover, Sheena was determined to fit a generous free-standing enclosure into her new bathroom, and having re-instated a new boiler elsewhere, the solution seemed obvious - remove the now redundant heater and cupboard, in order to free up space for a showering area. A brand new suite could then simply replace the old, thus negating the need to reconfigure expensive pipework. Unfortunately, before work could begin, Sheena discovered that the existing window desperately needed replacing. 'However, this gave me the opportunity to increase its width and let more light into what was a rather dark room, so I considered it a positive,' smiles Sheena. 'Which in turn, also proved a good excuse to invest in a lovely bespoke wooden blind, to ensure privacy.'

STEP TWO Removing the large cupboard also revealed an unexpected quirk to the room's layout. 'I had never really noticed before, but the room isn't actually square, and it was the newly revealed sloping wall that we were





Inoping to site the enclosure on,' explains Sheena. Undeterred by this Sheena came up with the inspired idea of straightening things up by building a false wall. The area behind was then shelved and pipes and electrics for the shower neatly housed in the new stud wall. 'We also removed the old pipework and boxingin by the bath, plus the hideous tiles,' continues Sheena. And rather than re-plaster, the couple opted to patch any damaged areas and cover the rest using tongue and groove panelling. 'I think it really helps add character to the room,' comments Sheena.

#### STEP THREE

When it came to choosing a new suite, Sheena decided to shop around. 'I found my lovely freestanding bath and enclosure online, while the basin and WC were chosen for their space-saving lines,' she says. 'I also opted for an electric shower so hot water is always guaranteed – an important consideration for our busy family.' The striking glass fascia was specifically chosen to complement the iridescent mosaics, which are Sheena's pride and joy. 'I spotted them while visiting friends, but as they were discontinued stock and we couldn't drive home and measure-up, I bought the lot for \$400 - it was a lucky gamble, as we tiled the entire shower area with just two sheets to spare!' she laughs.

**STEP FOUR** Sheena always knew she wanted the room to have a fresh blue and white scheme. So having picked out a subtle blue tone in her tiling, for the walls,

she then painted the panelling a soft grey to complement the new vinyl flooring.

plenty of designs on offer.

A lover of all things vintage, the room was completed with an assortment of inherited, pre-loved and high street finds. 'The ladder was my best bargain as we found it in a cupboard when we moved in,' says Sheena. 'The mirror is from my previous home, and the cabinet, spotted at a local emporium, cost just £15.' While Sheena would never describe the room as spacious, she is pleased that, even with the new enclosure, the finished room looks and feels much bigger. 'I'm delighted with the result – it's a lovely bright and relaxing space to spend time in.'

A BEAUTIFUL USE OF SPACE

Then Helen Middleton, her husband, Phil, and two children, Jamie and Jodie, moved into their 1930s end of terrace in Beckenham, the cramped and tired bathroom was the first room on their list for a remodel. However, it wasn't just the suite and feature tiling that were the problem. 'Everything was falling apart, and while the suite and décor could easily be replaced, it didn't address the fact that the room was simply too small and impractical to cater for busy family life,' explains Helen. What they wanted was a modern functional space, complete with bath and separate shower.

STEP ONE Surprisingly, the solution lay outside the bathroom, as the couple discovered that by pushing out onto their spacious landing, they could gain a small but vital 70cm. 'It was just enough to help open up the room and, as it was a stud wall, it was done and dusted in a weekend,' says Helen. However, with only one bathroom in the house, Helen was now even more determined to add a free-standing enclosure in the still small room, despite



Phil's scepticism. And having considered various layouts, she decided to keep the bath under the window, remove the builtin cupboard from behind the door and squeeze in a shower enclosure instead, while the new WC and basin would then face one another. 'To be honest, I wasn't totally convinced it would actually work, despite having measured everything, and I was still quietly worried about available space when the work started!' she smiles.

#### BATHROOM MAKEOVER

**STEP TWO** When it came to sourcing the suite, size was inevitably everything, and an inspired choice of soft curved designs helped to visually open up the available floor space. 'The all-glass quadrant enclosure was also designed to allow the eye to travel around the room unhindered, again making it appear larger,' says Helen. However, before the carefully selected purchases could be fitted there was the small matter of preparing the room. 'Removing the old tiles caused >

so much damage that we ended up re-plastering, while the soil pipe also had to re-routed - although luckily this didn't prove quite as difficult as anticipated,' says

Helen. Of course, moving the bath and adding a shower also meant extending existing pipework, but this simply involved relaying it under the floorboards.

**STEP THREE** Having removed the original radiator, Helen replaced it with a space-saving wall-mounted heated towel rail, before turning her attention to the floor. 'I had originally considered painting the boards, but lifting the old lino had revealed quite a lot of damage, which was only made worse when the plumber laid the new pipework,' recalls Helen. Phil was also worried about fitting new timber flooring in a bathroom, so in the end the couple opted for smart, low maintenance oak-effect laminate. 'I think it adds a real warmth to the room, and it is also waterresistant,' she continues.

**STEP FOUR** It was always Helen's plan to opt for light-enhancing white and pale grey walls, however, a last-minute decision to introduce contrasting deep grey brick tiling really lifts the scheme. 'I spotted the tiles while researching floors, by restricting their application, she only required a few metres, thus saving money including a smart roller blind and quirky storage. Despite her initial misgivings regarding space, Helen was delighted to for stowing a towel when showering. In fact, Helen is happy to report: 'The finished room looks and feels much bigger

# It's both sophisticated and family-friendly

Kerry Quayle reconfigured an awkward layout in order to create a spacious bathroom, complete with feature bath and glamorous touches

7hen Kerry and Rob Quayle moved into their three-bedroom semi-detached period home in Cheshire, they knew it required serious updating. However, it was to be a further eight years before they turned their attention to the problematic bathroom. 'After a while it's far too easy to ignore problems, such as the lack of showering facilities, especially when there is an entire house renovation to keep you busy,' explains Kerry. And while the couple did carry out cosmetic improvements over the years, including painting over the lurid pink walls, and fitting shutters for privacy, it was the imminent arrival of their first child, Darcie, that finally spurred them into action.

**STEP ONE** Kerry's first challenge was how to fit a luxurious shower into the awkward 'L'-shaped layout. 'Although a good size, the room was dominated by a massive cupboard, that originally housed an equally large boiler,' explains Kerry. 'And this severely limited our options.' However, having swapped the boiler for an efficient, compact model, the couple realised it made sense to also reduce the size of the cupboard. 'I think we must have halved its size and the results were amazing - suddenly we had room to site a bath next to the cupboard, while moving the WC along the window wall and placing the sink opposite the newly narrowed cupboard freed up the entire recessed area, for my walk-in shower,' smiles Kerry.



**STEP TWO** When it came to putting her ideas into practice, Kerry always knew she wanted the room to remain in keeping with the age of her home. 'We live in a 19th-century house, and while I wanted a modern bathroom, I was also keen to inject a traditional touch - so getting the mix right was vital,' she comments. Luckily her supplier, Anfield & Co, was happy to help. 'They spent ages drawing my plans to scale and researching all the various styles available,' recalls Kerry. 'They even came up trumps, when I requested a bateaustyle bath they would guarantee I could fill, as our previous tub simply drained the water tank every time it was used,' she laughs. In the end Kerry settled on a traditional suite teamed with modern enclosure and classic fittings. 'The basin and WC are actually an Art Deco design, but I think their crisp geometric lines work really well in the space, while I

#### WHO LIVES HERE?

Victoria Gallimore, 32, runs a company sourcing and renovating old furniture, www.cherryvintage.co.uk. She lives with fiancé, Andy, 34, a health economist, and their dog, Spike. They moved into the twobedroom terraced cottage in June 2013.

#### WHAT DO YOU LIKE **MOST ABOUT THE ROOM?**

'The amount of light that's now coming in. Before it was dark and depressing, but the roof light makes such a difference.'

#### ANY TIPS TO PASS ON?

'In a cramped, dark room, think about all the ways in which you can lighten things up. We put in a roof light and changed the original wooden door to one with panels, so we could put in opaque glass.'

#### WHAT WAS WRONG WITH THE OLD ROOM?

The low ceiling and the room's dimensions meant this space felt very small and cramped. The floor-to-ceiling tiles were grubby and the grout was falling out. Also a leak behind the plasterboard left this room in a poor state.

uying a cottage that needed tons of work but had great potential wasn't too much of a problem for Victoria Gallimore and her fiancé Andy Garnham. 'We're both pretty handy. We can turn our hand to most things and since we took on the house we've completely renovated both bedrooms and the living room, doing everything from building wardrobes, rebuilding furniture and painting everywhere. But the bathroom and kitchen needed a bit more thinking about, as they are downstairs in a 1980s extension with a flat roof,' Victoria explains. And with both their dads also being knowledgeable about the building trade and property, they had plenty of expert advice.

'The agreement all round was that we needed to raise the ceiling of both the bathroom and the kitchen to make both rooms feel appreciably bigger,' says Victoria. 'We couldn't face doing both rooms at once, so we decided to concentrate on the bathroom first as it was driving us both mad. When we raised the roof we also added a roof light to help bring extra light into the space.'

The cramped bathroom meant that the shower on the wall wasn't really tall enough for Andy, plus the walls were tiled floor-to-ceiling in grubby white tiles with failing grout, and the pipework had been oddly boxed in, so a large piece stuck out.

'The whole process took from September to December last year, as when they took the tiles off, the plasterboard was soaking wet from leaks and had to be replaced, then allowed to dry in

between. The whole ceiling and building work took about six weeks, and they left us with a WC until the

last moment otherwise it would have been a nightmare,' Victoria exclaims.





Paint the MDF with two coats of white paint to make the back board. Cut all of the 15mm thick wooden planks to size, then sand the cut edges. Spray paint the 92cm and 60cm planks orange (these will form the outer frame), and the two 57cm lengths purple (these will be the inner shelves). Paint the three lengths of decorative moulding purple. Cut each of the spindles down to 57cm, making sure to cut equal amounts from both ends.

Construct the outer frame of the unit.

Position the two 90cm planks of wood on top of the MDF back board, aligning them along the two long edges for a flush finish.

Drill pilot holes, then screw into position. Repeat to screw the two 60cm planks at the top and bottom of the MDF to complete the frame.

Measure and divide the inside

of the frame into three 30cm sections – fit a 57cm shelf along each of these lines, inserting two screws into each side of each shelf.

Position the spindles 10cm up from each shelf, aligning the front edge of the spindle with the front edge of the unit. Screw these into position, once again working from each side. Finally, use hot glue to stick each of the 57cm mouldings along the front of each shelf, to serve as a lip to keep the plates in place.

Lay the glass or plastic bowl upside down, and spray with cooking oil. This will ensure the plaster doesn't stick too much. Cut the bandages into short strips and, one by one, dunk them into a bowl of water to wet them, wring them out a little, then place onto the bowl. Smooth them over every so often, building up the layers until you're happy with the result. Leave to dry thoroughly overnight.

Once it is completely dry, gently ease the plaster bowl away from the glass one. Sit it right side up. Cut the Decopatch paper into squares and, using a 50/50 mix of water and PVA glue, cover the inside of the bowl. Once covered, paint a layer of the glue mix over the paper. Once

of the glue mix over the paper. Once again, leave to dry thoroughly.

Turn the bowl upside down.
Dunk a brush into your chosen colour of paint, and drip it onto the centre of the up-turned bowl, allowing it to drip down the sides.

#### Glitter letter lights

Begin by positioning the holes for the lights to show through. Decide where you'd like each light to be and mark with a pencil. At each point, drill a hole, making sure that the drill bit you use is wide enough for your LED bulb to poke through. Once all the holes are drilled, sand to create a smooth finish.

Coat the inside of each letter with PVA glue, ensuring the side edges are covered as well as the back. Sprinkle silver glitter inside each letter, making sure to completely cover the glue layer – it's better to use too much glitter at this stage than not enough. Wait until the glue

has dried, then turn the letters over (preferably over a bowl or bin) and shake off the excess.

Turn the letters over, so that the glittered side is facing down.
Coat the back and sides of each letter with purple spray paint, and leave to dry thoroughly. Once dry, push each of your LED lights through the holes, and glue into position.

Top tip

Wall-mount these letters by attaching Command strips to the back and using a string of fairy lights instead of LED tea lights.









Create a quirky dressing table from an old wooden door

oors are often discarded during house renovations, and frequently seen lining skips, so can be easy to find. For this transformation, we used a bold wallpaper to highlight the door's panels, painted the wood with a pretty lilac shade and added a covered shelf to create a dressing table. Finally, we attached a large coat hook to hang a vintage mirror, plus decorative doorknobs to hang necklaces and scarves.

#### You will need

wooden door / filler / sand paper / sponge and soapy water / Annabelle wallpaper, £9.99 per roll, Homebase / scissors / pencil / tape measure / drill and drill bit / screw-in hook / pink ceramic Padstow flower knobs, £3.90 each, Trinca-Ferro / white shelf board, £6.49, Homebase / 15cm shelf brackets, £2.99 each, Homebase / screws / screwdriver / fabric / PVA glue / bowl of water / paint brush / Amethyst quick-dry satin paint, £11.99 per 750ml tin, Homebase / vintage mirror

Remove any door furniture such as handles, hooks and hinges from the door. Cover any holes with filler, leave to dry. Sand the filler and door all over with sand paper – this will remove any loose paint and provide a base or key for the paint and wallpaper. Wipe the door clean with a sponge and soapy water to remove any dust, then leave to dry.

Position the wallpaper roughly in place on the door panels, using your fingertips to pinch and mark the shape of each panel into the paper. Cut to size with scissors. It's a good idea to lightly mark each panel with a number on the reverse to identify them later. Place them to one side.

Position the knobs on the door then mark and drill a hole for each, we added three on each side of our door. Drill one extra hole for a central hook, to hang a mirror. Do not add any of the items yet as the door needs to be painted first.

Plot the position of the shelf. We turned our door upside down so the small top panels were at the bottom, this allowed the shelf to fit neatly across the door without crossing any vertical panels – we also wanted to keep our shelf quite high, to fit a tall stool

underneath. Mark and screw the brackets for your shelf in place.

Cut a piece of fabric to cover the shelf. The fabric should be the same width as your shelf (plus 20cm), and twice the depth (plus 20cm – this extra allowance will cover the sides). Place the shelf on a work surface, then mix equal parts PVA glue and water in a bowl and apply to the surface of the shelf. Position the fabric right-side-up on top of the glued surface, then smooth flat. Turn the shelf over, then apply glue onto one side edge and the bottom of the shelf, gently pull the fabric over and smooth in place. Leave to dry.

Fold and glue the remaining shelf edge and both sides. Fold the fabric neatly at each corner; any excess can be cut away for a neater finish. Paint the fabric shelf with a layer of the PVA mix and leave to dry.

Paint the door with a coat of lilac paint, leave to dry. Repeat if necessary.

Attach the shelf brackets and screw the shelf to them. Add the knobs at each side of the door. Finally, screw the central hook in place and hang the mirror.

## Jew simple Make a statement with this

azz up a plain white lampshade and add a touch of quirky style to your living room by covering it in patterned silk and creating a selection of fabric blooms to make vour own design.

Begin by cutting strips of fabric to form the fabric roses. For each rose, cut two strips - we cut ours across the full width of the fat quarter (46cm) x 5cm each. Pin the two strips together, with right sides facing, and along one of the long sides, cut a wavy edge.

luxurious floral lampshade

With the strips still pinned together, stitch along the curved edge of each, leaving out. Press, then begin to roll the strip up from one end, wrapping it around itself. Once all of the fabric has been rolled, hand stitch the end in place to hold the shape together.

Next, create roses from strips of jumbo ric rac. Cut two 50cm strips and weave them around each other – the curves of each should lock together to hold them well. Pin. then stitch a single line down the centre of the strips, to secure. As in step 2, roll the ric rac up around itself and secure with hand stitches.

Working on one rose at a time, begin to tease the rolled curved edges of the fabric outwards and fold them over, until they resemble rose petals. You may need to pull some out more than others to create a natural look. Repeat with the ric rac roses, folding the edge of each curve outwards to make petals.







#### You will need

From a scrap of green fabric, cut a series of leaf shapes in various sizes. For a neat, finished look you can cut these in pairs and stitch right sides together, then turn out, to seam the edges. We chose to leave our leaf edges raw for a natural, slightly frayed edge.

Cover the lampshade. Measure the circumference and height of your shade, and add 8cm to both amounts. Cut a piece of silk dupion to this size, and lay it flat, with right side facing downwards. Spray the lampshade with adhesive and place it down on top of the fabric, then gently ease the fabric around it and press into position, folding the raw edges over to the wrong side by 3cm each and overlapping slightly. Fold the top and bottom raw edges over to the inside of the lampshade and glue into place.

Decide the arrangement you'd like the flowers and leaves to take on the lampshade. Once happy with their positioning, attach them securely - for this we first glued them into place with a hot glue gun, then added a few hand stitches around the base of each to make sure they were held fast.

Finally, add the feathered trim around the base of the shade. We chose to glue this into position, then work a few hand stitches all the way around to hold securely.

# Girls' Guide to Div

Get your kitchen or bathroom looking as good as new with our guide to replacing damaged tiles

1 First, cover your worktop, sink or bath area using sheeting to protect it from any falling pieces of tile. You should also wear safety goggles. Next, use a grout scraper to remove as much grout as possible from around the damaged tile.



Using a suitable drill bit – a ceramic tile drill bit is best – drill random holes into the tile to help loosen it. You'll need to push quite hard against the tile but make sure the holes don't go through the wall behind.



3 Use a bolster or chisel to loosen and remove sections of the tile, being careful not to damage any surrounding tiles in the process. Make sure you're wearing gloves when removing the pieces of tile.



Once you've completely got rid of the cracked tile, use a scraper to remove as much of the old adhesive from the wall as possible. If you don't do this, the new tile will sit proud of the old tiles.



Now you're ready to fit the new tile. Apply adhesive to the back of the tile and use tile spacers to make sure it's perfectly aligned with the existing tiles. Once the adhesive is dry, remove the spacers, re-grout and clean around the tile.



#### Top tip

If the new grout around the replaced tile looks noticeably newer or whiter compared to the rest of the wall, use a grout pen to colour over the existing grout to make it match and refresh the look of your tiles.

#### Trick of the trade

You'll need to use a grout remover to make removing the cracked tile as easy as possible. When using it, lean the tool into the broken tile so that if you slip you'll only chip the tile you're going to remove.

A few slabs in my patio have worked loose over the summer – how can I fix them back in place?

A Claire Arnold, Product Manager at Tarmac Building Products, tells us how...

A wobbly slab is not only annoying but it can be a dangerous trip hazard. Grab a bag of U-CAN mix in the bag mortar, which will cover an area of 0.4m<sup>2</sup>, and follow these simple steps.

YOU WILL NEED: • trowel • chisel • hammer

spade brush rubber mallet

1. REMOVE OLD GROUTING – Prepare the area by using your hammer and chisel to chip away the existing grout. Then use your spade to lift the slab out of place.

2. CHIP AWAY OLD MORTAR – When you lift the slab, you may find that it has been laid on a sand/cement base or on a mortar bed. If it's the latter you might discover left over mortar on the slab or the ground. Use a hammer and chisel to remove this and even out the surface. Remove some sand to the depth of about 30mm (depending on the size of your slab) if there is an existing sand base.

3. MIX THE MORTAR – You'll need 2.5 litres of clean water to mix the U-CAN mortar in its bag. Just unscrew the spout

and pour the water into the bag. Squeeze out any excess air, screw the cap back on, and lie the bag down flat. Knead it to ensure the water is evenly distributed. Flip the bag over a couple of times to make sure the mortar is fully mixed. When that's done cut off the top of the bag.

4. LAY THE MORTAR – Now that all the preparation is done, it's time to re-lay the slab. Add five blobs of mortar onto the ground – one to cover each corner of the slab and one in the middle.

5. LAY THE SLAB – Carefully set your slab back in place and tap it with a rubber mallet. If the slab still sits higher than the surface around it, you might have a bit too much mortar. Just lift the slab and take some away before replacing it.

6. REPOINT THE GAPS – Finish off the job by using a pointing trowel (the back of a trowel handle will work well if you don't have one of these) to fill the gaps between the slabs with any excess mortar. The mortar will be fully dry within a few hours, leaving you with an attractive and safe path or patio.

KNOW YOUR HOME'S WATER PRESSURE This is paramount

before purchasing a shower. Choose a shower that is suitable for a low flow system if your home's pressure is under one bar to guarantee an invigorating shower. An electric shower is a great option for flexibility, as they are suitable for all installations, being mains-fed. Electric showers are also kind to the pocket as they work to a cold water system, only heating water when actually needed. We would recommend always checking with the manufacturer before making any purchase.

 CHOOSE BETWEEN EXPOSED OR **CONCEALED INSTALLATIONS** Exposed installations can easily be



upgraded and altered as trends change, and provide both showering and bathing opportunities. Concealed installations are useful if space in the bathroom is at a premium, and mean that you can have a fixed head and hand-held shower system. Concealed shower valve installations can

allow you to choose between three showering options, including wall/ceiling-mounted shower heads, hand-held showers, side sprays and bath filling options, creating a clean and minimalist look.

 LOOK OUT FOR THE SIZE OF THE SHOWER HEAD If you're looking for a more powerful spray pattern then consider the size of the shower head. Large shower heads tend to deliver a high flow rate but the pressure of the water is less than that of a smaller shower head.

I live in an area that is off the mains gas grid, and so rely on oil for fuelling my heating and hot water. ## Your September checklist Discover seasonal tasks for your home and garden

#### IF YOU DO ONE THING THIS MONTH...

September marks the end of summer and the annual back to school, and even back to work panic. Make sure you're fully prepared with our handy tips for getting your house and your family organised.

- No doubt you'll have a pile of shirts and school uniforms to wash over the next few weeks, so make sure your washing comes out smelling as fresh as possible by giving your machine a clean first. You can do this by running a service wash – that's a high temperature wash with detergent but without any clothes in the drum. Your machine might even have a special setting for this so it's worth checking your manual. If your drum really smells unpleasant, you can use white vinegar in the service cycle too – just make sure you leave the door open for the drum to dry fully once it's finished. Leaving the door open after every use will also help to stop bacteria growing and nasty smells developing.
- Packed lunches are a popular choice for busy families up and down the country, but leftovers can leave unsightly stains on plastic lunch boxes. To help clean off staining, make a paste with baking soda and warm water and lightly scrub the inside of the container, leaving the paste on overnight if possible and rinsing with warm soapy water. Swilling your boxes with vinegar before rinsing will also help remove any lingering odours. It's actually more hygienic to store your lunch in glass containers as they can be washed at higher temperatures, and although this isn't necessarily a practical option for kids, layering your salad in a glass jar is a fun, healthy way of taking your lunch to work.
- Throw out any uniforms that the kids have grown out of along with any of your work clothes that have seen better days. Take them to a charity shop or make the most of the last weekends of summer and spend the morning with the kids selling them at a car boot sale.
- Lastly, spend the night before you go back to work or school making sure everyone's bags are packed and lunches are made. It will make the following morning much less manic so you can make the first day back run as smoothly as possible.

There wasn't a door on our living room and we have decided to keep it that way as it frees up the wall space. If privacy is needed we can close the dining room door.'

## WHAT'S YOUR **TOP TIP?**

'Check that new furniture will fit in doorways and up stairs. Our sofa had to go in through the window and the original double bed I bought had to be returned as we couldn't get it up the stairs.'

✓ As the two spaces were back-to-back a lot of the plumbing work was already in place and was a relatively straightforward job for Jamie Goodman, a local interior designer and fitter. The old bath was replaced with a modern walk-in shower and a wet room-style floor. 'I was limited to a degree on what I could do with the rest of the house as I brought a lot of my furniture with me but felt I could really go to town with the shower room,' explains Jayne. 'I spotted the gold mosaics in a local shop and these dictated the rest of the scheme. I wanted something really contemporary, like a boutique hotel and am so pleased with the results. Plus, there is never a queue for the bathroom in the mornings.'


Before moving in, Jayne took stock of the furniture she had and looked at where she could reuse it in the new house. Unfortunately some of it, like her old bed, was just too big for the period cottage

Jayne complemented her traditional dining furniture with clusters of big silver candles, vases and twinkling glass. The stunning ceiling light creates sparkling reflections on to the walls at night with a dazzling effect

but she wanted to keep the pieces she could and give them a new contemporary setting. 'We were lucky that the floors on the ground floor and in the loft bedroom were already stripped and stained, saving us a messy job,' she says. 'I decided to use a palette of pale, muted shades on all of the walls for a fresh, modern look that would create a neutral backdrop for my eclectic collection of period-style furniture.'

The kitchen had been fitted by the previous owners and was in such good condition that Jayne didn't feel that she had to change it. The pale cabinetry made the room feel light and bright and the galley layout was the best solution for the long room. The only change she made was to repaint the walls that had been a dark shade of green; a colour that, while popular in period houses, made the room feel a little gloomy. 'I chose a lighter shade to match the units and it made a real difference,' she says.

## A tight budget did not stop us from updating our home

Bea Roach's bright ideas and husband Phil's DIY expertise are a perfect combination



Bea and Phil Roach like a challenge. So when they moved into their new home and were confronted by a sink full of dirty crockery left behind by the previous owner, they took it calmly in their stride.

'The house was in such a terrible condition, it didn't seem to matter,' explains Bea. 'All of the walls were yellow with cigarette smoke, it was dirty and dated. We had asked the owner to remove all of the carpets before we moved in because they

stank so badly, so we had bare chipboard on the floors. We stayed up all night that first night, scrubbing the kitchen and bathroom to make them useable, especially as Holly and Lewis were only small. In fact, we scrubbed the house from top to bottom for days.'

The couple had seen that the house needed updating when they first viewed it, but were confident that they could transform it into their first, proper family home. We liked the location because it's

yet surrounded by fields and woods for walks,' says Bea. 'It was just run-down, structurally it was sound. We didn't mind that it needed a lot of work because it meant we could put our own stamp on it and we could afford to buy it.' When they moved in, in November 2007, the second, urgent task after cleaning the house was to paint the children's bedrooms. 'We made Holly and Lewis' rooms presentable for them, so with their toys all in place they felt happy.'

Next on the list was the kitchen. 'It had dark wood units, beige wall tiles, and a patterned, vinyl floor,' recalls Bea. 'Dark and dated and really not very nice at all.' On a limited budget, at that stage the couple could not afford to completely replace the kitchen. They reused the unit carcasses and fitted new, white Shaker-

Three tiny rooms were knocked into one big kitchen-diner that is now the focal point of the house. Bea and Phil made the dining table by painting MDF in red for the top and placing it on a wooden frame. The bench was salvaged from a pub. 'We just put it in the back of the car and brought it home,' says Bea. The chairs are from second-hand shops. Bea made the coasters from old vinvl records. 'Phil and I love our music and didn't want to throw away all of our old vinyl records, so we found a new use for them.'

The white, high-gloss kitchen units teamed up with a black worktop are all from Ikea. The grey wall tiles are textured to create extra interest

style doors to them, teaming them up with a new wooden worktop. They then laid laminate wood flooring throughout the downstairs and a neutral coloured carpet upstairs. They also replaced the family and en suite bathrooms. 'Both of the bathrooms are small, so we couldn't alter the layout in either. We just replaced the dated, beige suites and tiles,' says Bea.



It was a really stupid layout but we couldn't afford to change it straight away so had to live with it until we had saved up the funds to knock the walls down to create one big room,' explains Bea. 'We're so glad that we did, the kitchen-diner is at the centre of family life and has turned it into a far more sociable house for us all,' says Bea. 'Holly and Lewis sit in there doing their homework or chatting while I am cooking. We can now have big family parties at Christmas, and hold dinner parties for friends, which we never had the space for before.'

Bea says the house is a good, colourful, family home but admits that it will

continue to evolve over time. 'We're going to wallpaper the hall in a geometric print,' she says. 'I'm also planning to change our dining table top,' she adds, 'It's about time.'

# My new-look flat is full of space-saving ideas

Joy Plaskitt used her long-standing passion for interior design to turn a modest city centre apartment into a stylish pied à terre



here is a map of the world in the hall of Joy's city centre apartment which is covered with red dots. Each one represents a place she has visited – but there are still plenty of spaces to fill. 'I love travelling and it's the reason I decided to move into a flat, so I could just lock up and go whenever I felt like it,' Joy explains.

But there was no walking away from the amount of work which needed doing to the top floor pied à terre in order to bring it up to scratch. 'It had been tenanted for 20 years and poorly maintained, so it was very

tired and shabby,' says Joy. 'The kitchen was installed in the Eighties and the units were all over the place. I was going to have to take it back-to-basics to get it as I wanted.'

Joy continued to live in her last house in a nearby village while the work was carried out. She wanted the flat to be light and open, with the rooms made to feel as spacious as possible. She started by clearing out 23 bin bags of rubbish left by the previous tenant, carrying them down four flights of stairs and taking them all to the tip.



However, the disheartening start soon turned into excitement when the floorboards came up for rewiring. 'I found two shoes hidden away under the boards,' says Joy. 'One was a buttoned Victorian bootie and the other was a woman's shoe from the 1920s. I thought it was such a lovely idea that I wrapped them both in bags, wrote a note on one of my business cards and, along with a photograph of myself, put them back under the floorboards. I hope that someone else will find them in the future and continue the link.'

In the sitting room the fireplace had been boarded over so Joy opened it all up again only to discover the skeletons of dead crows that had fallen down the chimney. She had a new fire fitted from Old Flames in Easingwold, then turned her attention to the general layout of the apartment.

'There was a narrow corridor leading from the main living area to the large bedroom and a bathroom,' says Joy. 'It was wasted space, so I took out a flimsy stud wall and made the two rooms bigger.'

Joy also put in secondary double glazing at the windows to reduce traffic noise without damaging the original windows. The old kitchen units and melamine worktops were taken







A sticking point arose when the bi-fold door installation came in more expensive than planned, so the couple negotiated with their builder and exchanged all their previous appliances, in excellent condition, for labour costs.


With a degree in textile design specialising in knitwear, Cassie is naturally inventive, has an eye for detail and has created a distinctive look without spending a fortune. She began upcycling furniture a few years ago and has reinvented various pieces including the dresser and dining chairs, that were bargain finds from a pub.

'My parents have always lived in character houses and my mum has a great eye for detail. I've picked up tips from her over the years, as she loves to mix different styles of furniture. We spend most of the school holidays visiting my parents in Dorset where there are some fabulous interior shops. We love Sandbanks and going across the water to Studland Beach where you can walk for miles on natural sandy beaches, where we love collecting pebbles and Violet and I are always on the lookout for shells with holes in to make coral necklaces,' says Cassie. 'I love eclectic items and traditional pieces with character and I'm drawn to rustic wood.

I also love the clean lines and simplicity of Scandinavian design with calm grey and white shades. I have tried to use a mixture of those styles to create a relaxed, homely house that isn't too precious.'

For the kitchen design, Calvin's father lent a hand, as he owns established family business, HE Hill & Son, started by his great-grandfather Horris, some eighty years ago. The spacious kitchen features country elements including a butler sink, range cooker and oak worktops with contrasting black slate floor and brickstyle ceramic wall tiles.

'Before we didn't have much worktop or cupboard space so you would open up a cupboard and everything would fall out! I love the larder cupboard and the kitchen is heaven to work in now,' admits Cassie. 'When I saw my sister's kitchen floor I knew I wanted slate. Before with the previous layout we had no garden view from the kitchen. Now, with the bi-fold doors open in the summer it's so nice to see the children playing out in the garden. - Cut an aubergine into 4cm cubes. Then cut some halloumi cheese into cubes the same size. Mix 1 tbsp of harissa paste with a splash of red wine vinegar to loosen it a little, and season with salt and pepper. Coat the aubergine in the harissa. Thread the aubergine onto kebab skewers, alternating with the halloumi. Cook under the grill or on a griddle pan until browned and cooked through.
- For a guick dinner, halve an aubergine lengthways. Brush with **oil** and bake in the oven for 30 minutes at 200°C/400°F/Gas Mark 6. Top with a thin layer of **pesto**, **slices of tomato** and torn mozzarella, and bake for another 5 minutes until the cheese has melted.
- To make baba ganoush, a smoky aubergine dip, prick 3 aubergines with a fork and grill until the skin is blackened and the flesh is really soft, this should take 15-20 minutes. Crush 3 garlic cloves and mix with the juice of 1 lemon, 3 tbsp olive oil, 2 tbsp tahini and a pinch of **salt and pepper**. Remove the skin from the aubergine and discard. Combine the flesh with the other ingredients. Drizzle with olive oil and sprinkle with cumin before serving with flat breads.

### RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES

### 'Downsizing meant swapping our country home for a town house'

e n i s e and Dick Allen's move to rural Devon from south London back in the 90s was all about giving space and freedom to their sons, then aged four and six. Fast forward 20 years and with

both boys having flown the nest, the ancient mill house with its two and a half acre garden was now far too big for the couple. With Dick's retirement imminent, it was also placing too much of drain on their resources. 'We thought long and hard about downsizing and realised we wanted to make a fresh start in a completely different style of house and in a new area, so that we wouldn't constantly be making comparisons,' says Denise. With no ties and more free

time for travel, they also wanted a more manageable, easy-to-maintain home they could lock up and leave.

Location was key, and the Allens spent many weekends driving around the south east in search of their ideal home - near the sea, with good local transport, easy access to the cinema or theatre and within reasonable distance of an airport. They also spent hours house-hunting online, where they came across the six-year-old semi in Hampshire that they eventually bought. 'At first sight we thought it might be too modern, but once inside we were impressed by a real feeling of light and space,' continues Denise. 'And with the garden backing on to a common and surrounded by trees, it was like being in the countryside although close to the town; the fact we already had friends living nearby clinched it for us.'

Downsizing possessions was a tough job – there were eight sofas in the old house – but one thing Denise was reluctant to leave behind was the plant

This month property developer, architect and presenter of Channel 4's The Restoration Man, **George Clarke**, discusses the pros and cons of leasehold versus freehold

reehold and leasehold are the most common forms of property ownership in the UK. I often feel that the difference between them can be skimmed over by estate agents as they assume that everyone knows the complexities of the ownership market, but the reality is quite different. Very few people understand the legal complexities and the costs and restrictions that can be imposed on you, particularly with regard to leasehold properties. The decision as to whether you are buying a freehold or leasehold home really shouldn't be taken lightly at all.

So what is the difference? Freehold is the simplest and most straightforward form of home ownership. With freehold you are regarded as the 'freeholder' and you in effect own the building or the land outright with no other owner or landlord involved in the ownership of the property at all. The house is yours forever (in perpetuity) and the land registry will state that you own the 'title absolute'. You are free to do whatever you'd like to do with the property under the usual planning laws and building regulations that apply to everyone. It is more common for whole houses to be sold as freehold properties, unless it is part of a large historic estate where the estate prefers to remain as freeholder. For example, the Duke of Westminster's 'Grosvenor Estate' owns a substantial amount of land and buildings in Mayfair and Belgravia. The estate retains as much ownership of the properties as possible (they are the freeholder) but they grant leases on entire homes, apartments, retail and commercial property to generate huge amounts of income. The 500 acres of land his ancestors inherited north of the Thames in 1677 and then developed have made the current Duke the 9th richest person in England! Remaining a freeholder for many years certainly pays.

As you can gather from the Duke's property

portfolio, leasehold means that you simply have a lease with the

freeholder or landlord and you are buying a lease to live in the property for a certain period of time. In a residential scenario leases are more common with apartments and flats because the freeholder retains overall control of the building and grants long leases to each individual apartment. Long leases are often 90 to 125 years, but some developers offer 999year leases, which can sometimes be referred to as 'virtual freehold'. Don't get confused by this phrase because you are definitely not the freeholder in any sense of the word. A leaseholder of a home has many restrictions upon them and can be liable to many different costs, so you need to be 100% clear what these restrictions and costs are before buying a leasehold property. Under a lease you will be required to obtain 'Freeholder's consent' for any building works or alterations you wish to carry out to a building. Gaining these consents can take long periods of time and you may even need to pay a fee to the freeholder for the work to be carried out. With any long lease you will also be required to pay a 'ground rent' to the freeholder every year. This is a small rent that can range from as little as £50 to a few hundred pounds a year. It may not sound like much, but it's still a cost. You may also be required to pay an annual service charge for the maintenance and upkeep of the common parts of the building, such as lobbies and stairwells, but also for the upkeep of the building's exterior and possibly even the roof. These service charges can be substantial payments, particularly if your flat is in a large apartment block with large areas of external landscaping and maintenance requirements. I paid a service charge on an apartment a few years ago and if was nearly £3,000 per year. In my experience the annual


service charge is always the main item of dispute between leaseholders and freeholders as a leaseholder rightly wants to know what their money is being spent on and that they are being given value for money. I think it's fair to say that disputes between freeholders and leaseholders are common.

The other major concern is the length of your lease. Leases of less than 90 years can very soon start to be problematic and I tend to avoid them unless an extension of the lease can be negotiated fairly. Any lease of less than 80 years can start to significantly affect the value of the house. As a short lease period reduces then the value of the house will reduce too. Just this week I spotted an apartment for sale that seemed to be incredibly cheap, nearly 50% less than you'd normally expect to pay for a dissimilar property in that area. When I requested the details from the agent I soon found out that the property was leasehold and there was only 40 years left on the lease with no option to extend. Fewer people will want to buy this property and the banks will be reluctant to lend against it. When the term of the leasehold goes down to zero years, then the property is worthless and reverts back to the freeholder.

There is nothing wrong with buying a leasehold property, but make sure your lawyer checks any leasehold purchase thoroughly and makes you aware of all restrictions, potential costs and annual charges. You need to know exactly what you are signing up to otherwise you could be making an expensive mistake.

# The only way is up


Think upwards as well as outwards to create a garden to be proud of



Achieve a cascade of colour with this tiered wooden planter design

here has been somewhat of a vertical revolution taking place in cities around the country over the past few years, with walls of buildings, indoors and out, sporting lush green walls to rival a tropical rainforest. Although many of these installations would be impossible to recreate at home, there are plenty of ways in which you can jump on the bandwagon and introduce vertical planting into your outside space, whether you have a large garden or just a small balcony. Green walls are becoming an increasingly popular feature in gardens, and the benefits of larger systems still apply - they can be fed by stored rainwater, provide habitats for insects and even help to insulate the building to which they are attached. Popular plants include ferns, grasses, ivy and succulents, but herbs, vegetables and smaller fruit such as strawberries can also thrive.

On a smaller scale, or if you don't have the budget to spend on a whole wall system, there are plenty of options which are the perfect way to make the most of limited space. Consider hanging panels or planters with pockets, which can be attached to plain walls to add colour and interest, or grow climbers up trellis or a structure such as a pergola. Pillar roses,

which have flexible stems, will happily spiral around posts at the back of a border, or create a stunning display over a pergola. Alternatively, pots and planters with different levels are an easy way to brighten up a patio or balcony.

### Bringing walls to life

We asked award-winning garden designer Kate Gould for her top tips...

- Traditionally greening up a wall meant using wires or trellis to provide a framework for climbing plants. We still use this to create naturalistic schemes festooned in scented clematis, honeysuckle, roses and jasmine but over the past few years a new technique has taken hold; the vertical green wall. This is where perennials and shrubs are planted in pockets in what could be described as a vertical hanging basket to create a living wall hanging. By not using climbing plants that naturally want to climb and ramble in a very freeform manner, a much more defined and designed scheme can be created. With careful selection of plants a green wall is something that will look good all through
- Vertical green walls are being used in many different situations, both residential and commercial nowadays. They have been used to provide huge green backdrops to retail areas, such as the wall at the Westfield shopping centre in west London, hotels or even the much visited Olympic site.
- On a smaller residential scale the walls work equally well and can bring a breath of fresh air into a town garden where space is at a premium. They can also be used internally (with a palette of houseplants) which can then be extended outside with exterior plants. This works very well with modern glass extensions or large bi-fold doors.
- Shade-tolerant walls often provide the best coverage and texture: Epimedium, Ajuga, Bergenia, Tiarella, Ferns and Hosta are a good mix to start with in a green wall. They are predominantly green in colour but such wildly different shades of green and create a tonal scheme very pleasing all on its own. If colour is your thing then Heuchera, Viola and Cyclamen can be added to the basic scheme for patches of impact, be it in the form of leaves or flowers. If maintenance is not an issue then the wild and bold colours of Begonia rex varieties can be added seasonally for a really punchy colour scheme.
- All plants require water and green walls are no exception. As a designer I will always specify

the plants I require as well as the layout of the wall but this scheme is then passed over to a specialist to grow on, install, irrigate and maintain.

• A green wall is truly a thing of beauty and can extend the season of interest in a small town garden right the way through the year as well as into the hours of darkness when the walls can be lit or designed to be combined with moving water to create a beautiful

#### EXPERT ADVICE



Julie Kendall, the Eden Project's lead outdoor horticulturalist, offers her top tips on successful vertical gardening...

Vertical garden displays can range from training a clematis up your garden fence, to an extravagant green wall bristling with ferns, herbs and grasses. To create a vertical garden display, you can use annuals or perennial plants. Traditionally gardeners have trained

flowering plants up trellising, walls or free-standing frames. However, fruit and vegetable plants can be used very successfully to create an attractive vertical display. I'd suggest the following plants:

#### Perennials

Vegetables – caucasian spinach Fruit – grape vines, blackberries Flowers – wisteria, clematis

#### Annuals


Vegetables – runner beans, gourds Fruit – tomatoes Flowers – nasturtiums, ipomea

- Preparation of the surface to be covered is really important. A waterproof membrane should be used to stop damp permeating into the supporting structure.
- Ensure whatever system you are fixing to the wall is secure and won't fall down. We use plastic gridding when creating our green walls, with pockets of soil.
- A grow zone needs to be created either using small pockets of growing material or a fibrous surface for the roots to adhere to.
- An irrigation system is instrumental to keeping a vertical garden alive as the pockets of growing medium are so small and can very quickly dry out. This can either be done with drip lines or misters on a timer.
- Think of how plants naturally grow don't think of a plant with a tap root, think about plants that like to grow in walls, crevices or grow epiphytically.
