

CHAPTER 10

PERFORMANCE ORIENTED PACKAGING (POP)

NOTES

Pre 1 Jan 88. Hazardous material that was physically packed prior to 1 Jan 88 is authorized for movement by vessel or military air without performing POP tests or remarking and labeling the containers. The only requirement for material meeting this condition is annotating the shipping paper with the following statement:

GOVERNMENT OWNED DANGEROUS GOODS PACKAGED PRIOR TO 1 JAN 88

The remainder of the old shipping paper requirements will be the same as those in place prior to 1 Jan 88.

This includes use of the old DOT proper Shipping Name and hazard labels.

POST 1 Jan 88, DOD Policy states:

"To preclude extensive remarking, individual shipping containers on palletized loads shipped internationally need not be remarking with UN Markings. Such palletized loads will; However, be marked on two opposite sides with a plywood panel containing...UN MARKINGS."

Only those UN Marking that are missing need be marked on the plywood panels.

Hazard Labeling: Ammunition is EXEMPT from labeling when shipped in MILVAN or Commercial ISO containers.

Breakbulk shipments---One label only is required per palletized load except UK where four labels are required.

For Conus --- Ammunition is EXEMPT from labeling for full carloads or full truckloads (which includes exclusive use) shipments.
