This mission directive implements policy guidance in AFD 38-1, Organization, and AFI 38-101, Air Force Organization, and sets forth the mission and assigned duties of the United States Air Force Academy (USAFA), a direct reporting unit to Headquarters United States Air Force (HQ USAF).

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.

- 1. Authority.** Title 10, United States Code, and Department of the Air Force, AFOMO 330j, letter, subject: "Establishment of the United States Air Force Academy," dated 27 July 1954.
- 2. Mission.** To develop and inspire air and space leaders with vision for tomorrow.
- 3. Organization.** The Headquarters USAFA is comprised of two wings: 10th Air Base Wing, and 34th Training Wing; plus four additional mission elements: the Dean of the Faculty, Department of Athletics, Preparatory School, and Admissions.
- 4. Responsibilities.** Responsibilities for primary named and numbered units are provided below. To prevent duplication of primary and secondary responsibilities, certain subordinate unit responsibilities are covered in the broad statement of the parent unit.
 - 4.1. 10th Air Base Wing.** Provides base-level services, support functions, and personnel in support of the operation and maintenance of the USAFA.
 - 4.2. 10th Mission Support Squadron.** Provides Education Services, Family Support, Airman Leadership School, Civilian Personnel, and Military Personnel services in support of the Headquarters USAFA.

- 4.3. 10th Medical Group.** Provides or arranges for the full scope of preventative and clinical health care services for all assigned personnel or eligible beneficiaries, students, both cadet and preparatory, and retired personnel and eligible dependents.
- 4.4. 10th Civil Engineer Group.** Provides new and protects existing facilities, protects air, land, and water resources.
- 4.5. 10th Communications Squadron.** Provides all communications and computer support, base-level information management, and visual information services.
- 4.6. 10th Services Squadron.** Provides morale, welfare, recreational, and services support.
- 4.7. 10th Security Forces Squadron.** Provides protection of government resources, patrol coverage and response, crime prevention activities, investigative services; administers information security, personnel security, industrial security programs, and small arms training.
- 4.8. 10th Logistics Division.** Provides supply, logistics support, logistics plans, Cadet Issue, Test, Measurement and Diagnostic Equipment Laboratory, transportation, and contracting services and support.
- 4.9. 34th Training Wing.** Provides military education, training, character development, and aviation/airmanship programs.
- 4.10. 34th Support Group.** Provides food services, dormitory management, advanced information technology, and specialized services to the Cadet Wing.
- 4.11. 34th Training Group.** Provides guidance and leadership to the Air Force Academy Cadet Wing.
- 4.12. 34th Education Group.** Provides professional military and undergraduate aviation education and develops officership and leadership skills.
- 4.13. 34th Operations Group.** Provides airmanship programs, pilot screening, soaring, powered flight, parachuting, and airfield operations.
- 4.14. 34th Training Wing, Center for Character Development.** Provides philosophy and methodology to train and assess character development in cadets and staff.
- 4.15. Dean of the Faculty.** Provides education, research, administration, and support operations for a fully accredited academic bachelor of science degree program, including a broad, balanced academic core and a selection of academic majors.
- 4.16. Directorate of Athletics.** Provides intercollegiate, intramural, and physical education athletic programs.
- 4.17. Directorate of Admissions.** Plans, develops, and administers the admissions program, processes appointees, controls admission to the USAF Academy Preparatory School, and develops and directs marketing of the USAF Academy.
- 4.18. United States Air Force Academy Preparatory School.** Provides instruction and motivation in academics, athletics, character development, and military training to potential cadet selectees.

5. Relationships to Other Units or Agencies. Reports directly to CSAF. Direct communication between the Academy Superintendent or designated representatives with other agencies and activities on matters concerning the Academy or academic programs is authorized.
