OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, GENERAL REPROGRAMMINGS  
Annual Reprogramming Limits for District and MSC Commanders 1/

Groupings for Reprogramming Purposes	Individual Project or Activity Reprogramming Limits (To or From) <u>2/</u>
Basic project operation and maintenance for Channels and Harbors, Locks and Dams, Reservoirs, Channel Improvements, and Multi-purpose with Power projects.	Up to 35% of the base with a maximum of \$500,000, but up to \$200,000 regardless of the base; and up to \$200,000 additional authority in the 12th month.
Great Lakes Diked Disposal(Navigation)	
Channels and Harbors, Mitigation of Shore Damages	
Scheduled Reservoir Operations (non-Corps)	Unlimited.
Inspection of Completed Works (non-Corps maintained local protection)	
Protection of Navigation (Classes 410 through 480). Each class constitutes a separate group.	Unlimited.
Cost Shared Recreation Development (Navigation, Flood Control, and Multiple Purpose)	Up to 15% of the base to a maximum of \$50,000, but up to \$25,000 regardless of the base. <u>3/</u>
National Emergency Preparedness Program (Classes 510 through 540)	Up to 50% of the base for the class, but aggregate of reprogrammings may not exceed 25% of the total base for the category. <u>4/</u>

1/ In accordance with applicable general guidance in paragraphs 6a and b and specific limitations on District and MSC Commander authorities in 6c(1).

2/ No increase or decrease in funding may be made for law enforcement contracting and contract supervision without HQUSACE approval, due to legislative limitations (PL 94-587).

3/ Only if the project received the equivalent of an initial work allowance in the current or the prior fiscal year. Further, no reprogramming may be made for the purpose of initiating unfunded new design or construction for any separable recreation area.

4/ No reprogramming authority between districts or between district and division offices. Further, all reprogrammings must be approved by the MSC Commander.
