TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS

Local supplementation to this regulation is prohibited without approval of HQUSACE (CELD-T). If exceptions are granted, commanders of major subordinate commands, district commands, field operating activities, and laboratories will furnish two copies to HQUSACE (CELD-T), Washington, DC 20314-1000.

AR 55-355, 13 July 1986, is supplemented as follows:

Chapter 1, Introduction, Paragraph 1-4, Responsibilities

Add the following as subparagraph e(1) thru (4):

e. Elements of the Corps of Engineers will:

(1) Establish and apply such traffic management procedures as required to ensure effective and economic use of military and commercial transportation. Particular emphasis will be placed on those phases of logistics and supply management which affect storage, procurement, distribution operations, maintenance, contractual services, regulatory requirements, industrial mobilization plans, retrograde movement and determination of distribution mission areas.

(2) Conduct continuous studies and analyses of traffic management aspects involved in supply management actions. Ensure that such studies and analyses are on the basis most advantageous to the Government, full consideration will be given to economic potentialities.

(3) Ensure that applicable traffic management provisions are incorporated into procedures, practices, contract clauses and terms, shipping schedules, stock positioning and installation missions.

(4) Require, to the extent practicable, traffic management personnel to furnish advice, assistance, or information, and bring to the attention of responsible officers, traffic management matters which should be considered.

Chapter 3, General Traffic Management Policies

Add the following as paragraph 3-13 (a-c):

3-13. Traffic Management Assistance

Traffic management advice, technical assistance or guidance is available from the following sources:

a. Traffic management personnel of the respective Engineer installations or activities as available.

b. HQUSACE (CELD-T).

c. The Military Traffic Management Command or its appropriate area office. With respect to Civil Works, the services of the Military Traffic Management Command are available to Division and District Commanders in connection with selection of routings and methods of shipments, furnishing of rates and consultation on traffic matters. The use of these services is recommended; however, the furnishing thereof will not serve to reduce in any manner the authority and responsibility of Division and District Commanders over Civil Works traffic operations, including reports, records and audit thereof, essential for executing Civil Works programs as vested in the Chief of Engineers by law.
