A Raytheon spokesman said, "we believe there will remain substantial and robust competition in the markets going logward" and that the deal doesn't present antitrust problems.

The Hughes antitrust investigation has focused on air-to-air missiles and so-called focal-plane arrays, which are systems that help missiles find their targets. Raytheon has argued that the market should be defined to include ship-to air and ground-to-air missiles where its market share is lower.

Raytheon and Hughes historically have dominated aur-intercept missile sales, but they contend they have lost ground lately to Lockheed Martin Corp A Raytheon executive yesterday said that in fiscal 1996 the combined Raytheon Hughes had 58% of air-intercept missile sales and Lockheed Martin had 37% But Raytheon and Hughes won just under 40% of the research and development budget for future missiles, compared with 54% for Lock heed Martin, this executive said

Paul Nisbet, a defense analyst with JSA Research. Newport. R.I., said Pentagon officials "don't have any choice" but to allow further concentration because military spending has dropped sharply He added that Pentagon missile spending dropped to \$5 billion last year from \$15

billion in 1990

Raytheon said yesterday that it expects to complete the Texas Instruments transaction by the end of June and still expects to complete the Hughes acquisition by the end of September

A spokesman for Hughes Electronics said the company "bas seen nothing to indicate there are showstoppers" that would block the acquisition.

In composite trading yesterday on the New York Stock Exchange. Raytheon closed at \$47 125, up 75 cents, while GM closed at \$56 75, down 75 cents.

Lockheed Martin, the leader of one of two teams working on a demonstration contract for the next generation, radar-evading plane, said the addition of Northrop Grumman provides important assistance in several significant technical areas Northrop Grumman's experience with so-called "low observable" aircraft such as the B 2 Stealth bomber, according to Lockheed Martin, will provide the expanded team with a "significant advantage." And Lockheed Martin, based in Bethesda, Md, said the new team also will be better positioned to help meet the Pentagon's cost targets for the program.

Boeing Co is the leader of the other team developing a version of the new plane

The latest alliance indicates the changing nature of the affiliations among major defense companies as the industry continues to consolidate Northrop Grumman, for example, is heavily dependent on Boeing for work related to Boeing's commercial jets, while Boeing and Lockheed Martin are part of a team building the Air Force's F 22 fighter jet

U.S. Serviceman, AWOL in 1965, Reported Living in North Korea

An American reported to have deserted his Army post in South Korea in 1965 is alive and well in the communist North, North Korean officials have told his sister.

"I have to believe them. Yes, I believe them," said Pat Harrell, of Roanoke Rapids, N C Her brother, Charles Robert Jenkins, is among four U.S soldiers reported to have defected to North Korea in the 1960s and thought still to be alive

The Defense Department disclosed in January 1996 that it believed the four were living in North Korea, but the Korean government had not confirmed it until now

Harrell said she and an American television reporter met Wednesday with North Korean government officials in New York, and they assured her that her brother is in good health. She was told he has a North Korean wife and is a citizen of that

"They said he has children at the university there," she said in a telephone interview yesterday. There has been no word from Jenkins since he was reported absent without leave from his Army unit in South Korea on Jan. 5, 1965, Harrell said.

The Army filed court-martial charges against Jenkins after determining he participated in North Korean propaganda broadcasts in the 1960s in which he said he enjoyed life in the North and urged U.S. soldiers in the South to desert.

An internal Defense Department report made public last year said a North Korean defector reported having met Jenkins in a coffee shop in the capital, Pyongyang, and that Jenkins said "he is now ready to return to America"

Gadhafi Violates Air Traffic Ban

NIAMEY, Niger—Libyan leader Moammar Gadhafi defied a U.N ban on air traffic in and out of Libya yesterday by flying in a flotilla of four Boeing 727s to Niger to lead Muslim prayers

The State Department said Gadhafi's flight would be a serious violation of the U.N ban, which was imposed over Libya's failure to extradite two people linked to the bombing of a Pan Am jetliner over Scotland in 1988. The State Department added that the United States would "pursue this matter in the U.N. Security Council and in the sanctions commuttee."

The Libyan news agency JANA said Gadhafi would lead prayers in Niger and neighboring Nigeria during a visit to West Africa

U.S. deserter caught in Cold War hotspot

TOKYO, Japan (AP) - Former U.S. soldier Charles Jenkins and his Japanese wife, Hitomi Soga, were brought together decades ago in North Korea by a strange Cold War twist He was an accused U.S Army deserter, she was kidnapped from Japan by communist spies.

Now, the couple could be torn apart by an equally unlikely turn of events an emerging tug-of-war over their fate between North Korea, Japan and its top ally, the United States

Soga is one of five known survivors among at least 13 Japanese abducted to the North by communist spies in the 1970s. Along with the other four, she is now in Japan for her first homecoming in nearly a quarter

Tokyo wants to bring all the families of the abductees to Japan for good including Jenkins, who remains in the North, and the couple's two North Korean-born teenage daughters

In 1965, Jenkins was posted in South Korea when he allegedly left his patrol, crossed the demilitarized zone and joined the communists. He left four defection notes in his barracks

Jenkins conceded his legal predicament earlier this month, while bidding farewell to Soga in Pyongyang as she boarded a Tokyo-bound jet for her Japanese homecoming. He told a Japanese diplomat that he decided to stay behind because of the problems he might face

So, as his wife's plane climbed into the sky, Jenkins waved through a security fence

"He looked very lonely," said Kyoko Nakayama, special adviser to the Cabinet of Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi

Jenkins' wife, Hitomi Soga, is one of 13 Japanese nationals North Korea admitted to have kidnapped in the 1970s

Jenkins, 62, spent 15 years in the North before he met Soga, 43. The couple married in 1980. Their daughters, aged 19 and 17, are students at Pyongyang University of Foreign Studies, according to North Korea

Amnesty

Now Jenkins fate is literally married to that of the five Japanese abductees

While the returnees' current homecoming was intended to last no more than two weeks, the Japanese government now says they won't go back to the North until the children and Jenkins are allowed to join them here

Japan's deputy chief Cabinet secretary, Shinzo Abe, petitioned the State Department to grant Jenkins amnesty last week so he could resettle with his family ın Japan

Stover, the Army spokesman, said that if Jenkins came to Japan, Army intelligence officers would want to ask him about his experiences in the North. After that, they would deade whether to bring charges against him

Under war conditions, desertion is punishable by death. When done with the "intent to avoid hazardous duty or shirk important service," it brings dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of pay and up to five years in prison

N Korea rejects 3rd country reunion of abductees

Friday, November 1, 2002 at 17 30 JST

TOKYO — North Korea has ignored a proposal for a reunion in a third country between five abducted Japanese now in Japan on a homecoming visit and their families left in North Korea, sources familiar with the negotiations said Friday.

In negotiations on normalization of relations held Tuesday and Wednesday in Kuala Lumpur, Japan asked the North Korean side to indicate when the families in North Korea will be allowed to visit Japan, according to Japanese officials

But North Korea criticized Japan for keeping the five abducted Japanese in Japan, saying it broke an agreement that they would return to North Korea after about two weeks

In the course of these exchanges, the sources said Japan suggested that the five be allowed to meet their families in a third country, possibly China, if bringing the families to Japan immediately is impossible

North Korea did not respond to the suggestion, the sources said

It also rejected a proposal that the five returnees be allowed to contact their families in North Korea by phone, insisting that they first return to North Korea


The five returned to Japan on Oct 15 for the first time since being abducted in 1978. The Japanese government, in accordance with the wishes of their relatives in Japan, has decided to keep them in Japan.

The five, two couples and a woman, have seven children born in North Korea, and the American husband of the woman, who is listed as a deserter by the U.S. military

Japan also wants the daughter of another abductee, who North Korea claimed is dead, to visit Japan, where she has grandparents (Kyodo News)

The United States recently told Japan it would seek to court-martial former U.S. Army Sgt Charles Robert Jenkins, who is listed by the U.S. military as having deserted to North Korea in 1965 while stationed in the demilitarized zone separating the two Koreas, if he visits Japan

Deputy Chief Cabinet Secretary Shinzo Abe will go next week to Soga's hometown of Mano on Sadogashima Island, Niigata Prefecture, to tell her about the exchanges between Japan and the U.S. and is expected to tell her Japan will make its utmost effort to enable a reunion, according to the sources

Japan asked the U.S. last month to pardon Jenkins, 62, so he could settle in Japan with Soga, 43, and their two daughters, aged 17 and 19, who also remain in North Korea

Meanwhile, in Niigata, Soga expressed regret at the breakdown of talks on establishing diplomatic ties between Japan and North Korea in Kuala Lumpur on Tuesday and Wednesday. During the talks, Japan demanded North Korea allow relatives of five abductees in the North to be reunited with them in Japan

"I cannot help but feel regret that the realization of reuniting with my family at an early date has become distant," she said

Reading a prepared statement, Soga said, "I sincerely wish for the resolution of the abduction issue and for me to reunite with my family without further delay "

Soga is one of five Japanese abducted by North Korea in 1978 who came to Japan on Oct 15 for what was supposed to be a temporary homecoming, but ended up staying longer than the scheduled stay as agreed between Tokyo and Pyongyang (Kyodo News)

Although I never met Charles Robert Jenkins, the Army sergeant from Eastern North Carolina who defected to North Korea, he was the focus of my life for a couple of months almost 38 years ago

Jenkins walked away from a patrol near the Demilitarized Zone separating North and South Korea on Jan 5, 1965 One week later, I arrived in South Korea as a newly minted Army Intelligence Corps Special Agent fresh out of spy-catcher school I was assigned to the Jenkins investigation team

For the next two months, we turned Jenkins' life inside out, looking for clues as to how and why this anonymous infantryman became a traitor. We talked to soldiers who knew him. We retraced his steps on the night he left. We studied the notes he left behind. Stateside, agents in Northampton County talked to people who had known him in civilian life.

Although it is natural and touching that his relatives cling to the hope that Jenkins was kidnapped and did not willingly abandon them, the picture our investigation painted was of a troubled man whose life and military career were on the skids. He was in trouble for borrowing money from fellow soldiers. Officers were considering him for a court-martial and possible dishonorable discharge.

What finally drove him to turn his back on his fellow soldiers, family and country may have been a simple misunderstanding. He had heard the 1st Cavalry Division was being sent to Vietnam, and he feared he would be killed

What the eighth-grade dropout did not seem to understand was that while the 1st Cav was indeed being sent to Vietnam, troops in Korea were not going anywhere. The 1st Cav name and colors were going to a new unit, and that outfit was heading for 'Nam. All that would happen in Korea is that on July 1, 1965, we would become the 2nd Infantry Division.

But Jenkins didn't wait Possibly drawn by lurid propaganda leaflets that promised defecting soldiers they would be treated as heroes in the "worker's paradise" of North Korea, he abandoned his patrol and made his way across the five-mile-wide DMZ and into North Korea. He has been there since

Now 62, Jenkins surfaced last month, ironically, as the husband of a Japanese woman kidnapped by North Korean agents 24 years ago. His wife was recently allowed to return to Japan, but U.S. officials have said that if Jenkins follows her, he might have to pay for his defection almost four decades ago.

Maybe I've been mellowed by age, but it seems to me Jenkins has adequately paid for a stupid mistake made when he was 25. He has spent almost 38 years in the hellish "Hermit Kingdom," where human oppression is a way of life and death by starvation is a constant threat

Jenkins has grown old and frail in North Korea He is but a historical oddity now, forgotten by everybody but his family and the former agents who once tried to look into his unfathomable soul

Three other turncoats went north before Jenkins They all deserved the miserable life their bargain with the devil brought them. But now that their lives are almost over, the perfect ending to their saga would be to let them come home to see what they so foolishly left behind

The circumstances of their meeting are simply eerie

But Charles R. Jenkins now thanks his wife for making him a family man, and Hitomi Soga says she is happy

The 62-year-old former U.S. soldier is the stuff of Cold War bulletins in his hometown, where most believe he defected to the North. He is listed by the U.S. Army as a deserter

His 43-year-old wife was abducted to North Korea by agents of the reclusive state as a teenager in 1978. She was working as a practical nurse when she vanished

When Soga left Pyongyang for Tokyo on Oct. 15 for her first trip home in 24 years, Jenkins and their two daughters saw her off at the airport

"Hitomi is almost 20 years younger than me, but she made us a very good family," he told Japanese officials who flew to Pyongyang in a government-chartered jet to escort the five abductees home

"I do appreciate her for that, even though she may have felt lonely for marrying a man this much older," he said through a Korean interpreter

The former U S Army sergeant married Soga in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea) in 1980. She was his English student. The couple have two daughters, 19-year-old Mika and 17-year-old Belinda

Mika closely resembles her father, while the black-haired Belinda looks more like her mother, according to Soga's accounts to her friends

Asked by Japanese officials if he wanted to accompany his wife on the trip, Jenkins said he "would like to visit Japan, but it's not easy "

He said he was assigned to a U.S base in Kanagawa Prefecture in the 1960s.

Jenkins and his daughters reportedly waved good-bye out in the cold until the jet took off.

For her two-week homecoming, Soga packed many photos of her family. They live in a detached house in a residential area in Pyongyang.

Soga gets up at six every day to make box lunches for the daughters, who study at a foreign language university. She has toast and coffee with her husband and later prepares rice-based lunch and supper

These are the kind of everyday details Soga talked about to Yoshiko Kamibayashi, her best friend in high school, on an all-nighter at an inn on Sado Island, Niigata Prefecture, after their tearful reunion

"Were you stuffed into a sack when you were abducted?" Kamibayashi asked Soga about her disappearance in 1978

"Yes, I was I was frightened."

"Did you cry?"

"I cried a lot It was so painful "

But when Kamibayashi asked her if she is happy now, she nodded

"I am happy My husband is kind, though we sometimes argue."

Jenkins went missing in January 1965 while on patrol about 10 kilometers from the truce village of Parmunjom

Pyongyang later announced he had defected to the North.

Jenkins hails from a town called Rich Square, a community of less than 1,000 in North Carolina

Jimmy Outland, a peanut and bean farmer, declined to talk about his former classmate, saying most Americans who know of the incident think Jenkins betrayed his homeland. Mention of the "defection" is apparently taboo in the small conservative community.

An association of families of U S. servicemer missing in action, however, said on its Web site that defection reports about American soldiers cannot be trusted given the lies Pyongyang has told about the abduction of Japanese nationals
