
ANNEX B TO JCS/FEMA EXPLAN NINE LIVES (U) EXERCISE SCENARIO (U)

げ. (U) GENERAL

- .a. (U) the scenario for Exercise NINE LIVES consists of two major parts: The Background Scenario and the Control Staff Instructions (COSIN) Chronology.
- b. (U) The Background Scenario is a summary of the worldwide situation prior to STARTEX. It provides players an overview of the world situation as it affects their region or field of operations and is the rationale for the majority of prescripted exercise controlled events.
- only as an annex to the Control Staff Instruction (COSIN), is a programmed sequence of events, injected into exercise play by the controllers. These events are designed to trigger players' response/action.
- G. (C) Appendix I contains the intelligence Background Scenario for NINE LIVES. The political and military situations provided by the scenario do not reflect official intelligence estimates of existing real-world conditions, trends, or problems, nor are they to be interpreted as projections of future international developments. The scenario has been devised to portray hypothetical situation in the world which requires US military forces and governmental agencies to implement appropriate plans and exercise procedures.

VANNEX K TO JCS/FEMA EXPLAN NINE LIVES (U) VCOMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS (U)

1. (6) General. This Annex provides instructions and guidance on the communications background scenario and subsequent communications play during Exercise NINE LIVES. The communications segment of the exercise is designed to exercise communications systems. personnel, and procedures of the participating civil agencies


(2. (U) Exercise Scenario

- a. (U) The communications scenario for this exercise is comprised of two major elements, the background scenario and the Master Scenario Event List (MSEL). The background scenario describes the principal events that have led up to exercise start. MSEL items are a series of key events injected in the exercise which will stimulate and develop player actions, desired by major elements participating in the exercise.
- players with an understanding of the preexercise situation as it affects their region or area of operations. It furnishes the rationale for most of the events depicted by MSEL items when they are injected into exercise play.

THE REAL PROPERTY.

Outlines certain assumptions and/or hypothetical actions to set the stage for the execution phase of the exercise.

Assumptions related to communications which will govern the development of the Scenario, MSELs, and active play are as follows:



4- (U) Tasks and Responsibilities

- :a. (U) MINIMIZE will not be automatically imposed at FAST
 -PACE. The imposition of MINIMIZE will be a player action
 and imposed at their discretion.
- only participating activities are included as addressees, on AIG addressed messages, is essential. Real world AIGs will it used throughout the exercise. However, if during the course of the exercise an agency determines that they need to establish an AIG, they will be permitted to do so in accordance with ACP 121 US Supp-1.

c. (U) Telecommunications Economy and Discipline:

Exercise participants insure that as a minimum, the

APPENDIX 1 TO ANNEX K TO JCS/FEMA EXPLAN NINE LIVES (U) TELECOMMUNICATIONS ECONOMY AND DISCIPLINE (U)

CHILLIPS HE LEDGE AND LOS

- provided for those agencies participating in Exercise NINE LIVES that utilize DOD telecommunications during the exercise. This policy and guidance is provided to insure the optimum, most responsive, and cost-effective use of telecommunications, by the application of sound management practices and administrative techniques. It applies to the overall writer-to-reader environment.
- v2. (U) General. Consistent with mission requirements, the use of telecommunications, including record and voice, will be limited to the transaction of essential exercise business which cannot be handled effectively by other means.
 - va. (U) The decision to originate voice or record telecommunications traffic is based upon the urgency of the subject and the attendant requirement for speed-of-service delivery within timeframes which cannot be accommodated by other means.
 - tb. (U) The use of telecommunications must be cost-effective when measured against other means of delivery which could be used to satisfy the speed-of-service requirements of the originator.
- 23. (U) Policy. To foster improved telecommunications economy and discipline, exercise participants will adhere to and enforce the following:
 - Ta. (*) Limit the authority to originate voice or release record telecommunications, especially those assigned

 authorized for exercise traffic.
- \(\nu\)b. (U) Considering the inherent time constraints of the
 exercise, review reports that use telecommunications
 facilities to insure that:
 - (1) (U) Reporting by use of telecommunications is required.
 - (2) (U) Redundant or duplicative reports are combined where feasible.
 - (3) (U) Maximum use is made of ADP formatting and processing where feasible.
 - (4) (U) Reports are brief, addressed only to essential addressees, and the precedence is consistent with the urgency of the subject.
- >c. (U) Institute procedures at all echelons to insure that:
 - personnel on a continuing basis with information and instructional materials which specify the type and availability of communications services and systems and emphasize the necessity for their effective use.
- [2] (**) Message writers and releasing officials are indoctrinated concerning their responsibilities specified in current joint/allied publications regarding the preparation and release of record traffic and data pattern messages, including card and magnetic tape.

(4) (4) Precedence is assigned in accordance with Allied Communications Publication (ACP) 121, US Supplement-1. Assignment of dual precedence will be stressed. Special care must be taken to insure that messages assigned a FLASH precedence for information addressees are justified only by the necessity for collateral action which would have a positive effect upon mission accomplishment. FLASH precedence messages will not be readdressed using the original precedence unless absolutely necessary. Those messages that are readdressed using the original precedence shall require FLASH releasing authority.

- systems, are used to the maximum extent. When reentry of these types of messages in response to a service message is required, retransmission will be to the affected addressees only. Readdressal of AIG addressed messages should not be initiated unless it is ascertained that the addressee identified for receipt of the readdressal is not listed in the address composition of the AIG.
- (6. (U) The subject line is included, unless the subject is readily apparent in the first lines of the message text or its use will cause an otherwise UNCLASSIFIED message to be classified or will noticeably increase the length of a short message.
- $m ec{V}(7)$ (U) References are used only when essential.

- (8) (U) The text is brief and to the point. When drafting a message that meets the criteria for FLASH precedence the major objective should be clarity and brevity. The text of such messages should be limited to less than 200 words except where extenuating circumstances exist. Amplifying messages should be assigned a lower precedence.
- (9) (U) Internal passing/distribution instructions in the text are eliminated or reduced to the minimum consistent with the necessity for accurate message delivery.
- (10) (1) Special Category (SPECAT) and Limited Distribution-(LIMDIS) caveats are used only within the context of their established definitions as reflected in ACP 121, US Supplement-1. The special handling and distribution of such caveated messages will be in accordance with ACP 121 US Supplement-1.
- used to disseminate information concerning operational matters nor will a "SPECAT EXCLUSIVE FOR" be readdressed. For sensitive information concerning operational matters, which require limited distribution, the caveat "LIMDIS" will be used. Those SPECAT messages involved with code words will be used as prescribed by Service or agency directives.
- (12) (U) Messages are delivered to telecommunications centers promptly. To enable a more even transmission rate messages will not be accumulated and delivered for telecommunications processing and transmission on a bulk basis.

SARE STORES

(13) (U) Speed-of-service procedures are established to aid in detecting message processing delays.

Appropriate definitions are provided in ACP 121 US Supplement-1. FLASH, and IMMEDIATE precedence will not be used to compensate for delays.

- (14) (U) The number of requests for tracer actions and service messages is reduced. Tracer actions will not be initiated as a matter of routine. Messages received at telecommunications centers/communications terminals with minor errors will not automatically be serviced but will be processed and distributed with the notation "WILL SERVICE UPON REQUEST."
- (15) (U) Requests for acknowledgments or confirmations of delivery are normally limited to messages the non-delivery of which would have a severe military, political, or loss-of-life impact.
- (16) (Policies that pertain to AUTODIN and AUTOVON/AUTOSEVOCOM economy and discipline are complied with.

 7 Details are provided in JCS MOP 165, "Automatic Digital Network," and JCS MOP 151, "AUTOVON and AUTOSEVOCOM Service." AUTOVON will not be used to transmit classified or information requiring EFTO protection by unencrypted facsimile, imagery, or data.
- d. (4) JANAP 128(G) establishes the use of special content indicator codes for exercise message traffic (specifies that first character of the four-letter code will be K). In order to facilitate automated exercise message collection and identification and in accordance with reference, CIC will be inserted in the Besignated exercise message position. For NINE LIVES use of the single CIC, KZZZ, is sufficient. Sample exercise message is at Enclosure.
