Diagram for MSCD Planning

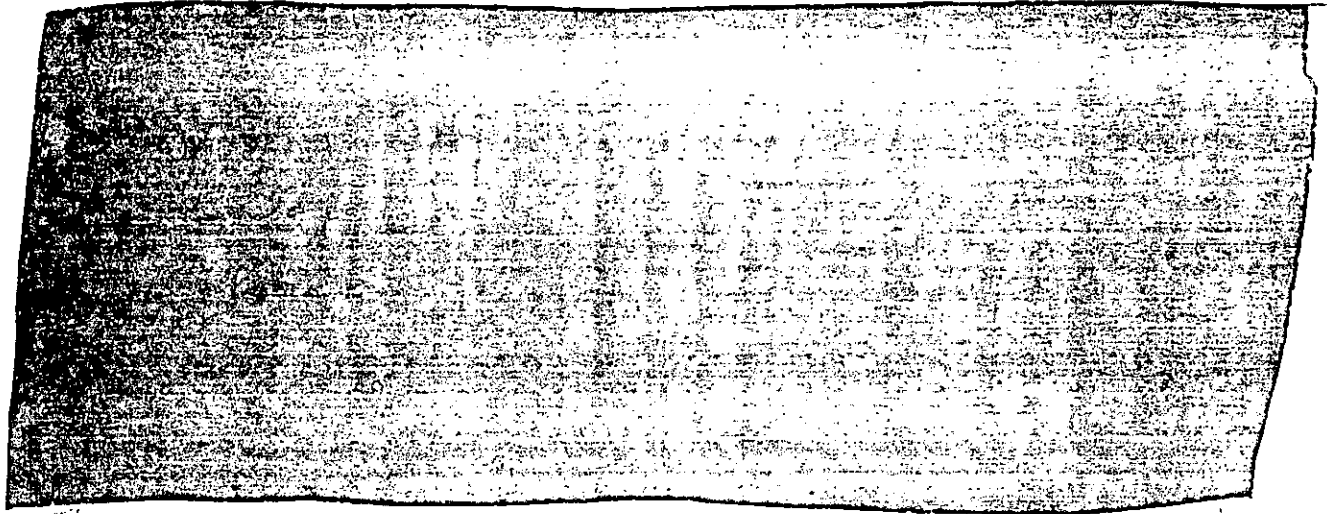

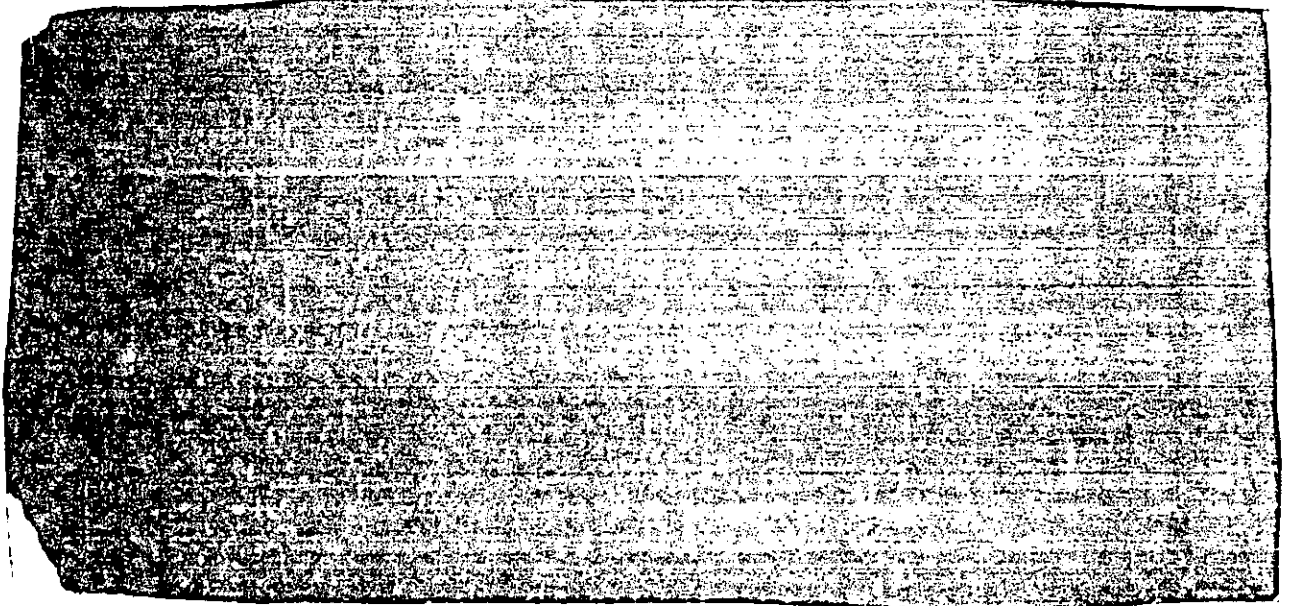

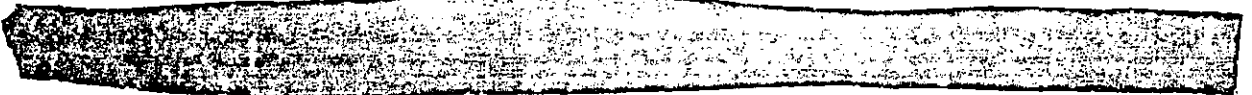

(U) DETAILED EVALUATION REPORT

1. (U) General

a. (S) Authority. Exercise NIGHT TRAIN 84 was one of a series of JCS-sponsored worldwide general war command post exercises (CPXs). The JCS-sponsored CPX program is the basis for the analyses and evaluations of selected WWMCCS procedures and components. Memorandum of Policy (MOP) Number 177 establishes the JCS-sponsored CPX program. Staff Memorandum (SM)-218-82, "Exercise Planning Guidance for FY1984-1988 JCS-Directed and JCS-Coordinated Exercises," provided the strategic setting and direction for exercise planning. The JCS-approved Concept and Objectives Paper specified the evaluation objectives for the exercise. The evaluation objectives were grouped into broad evaluation areas to assist detailed evaluation. Appendix 1 to Annex G to the Control Staff Instructions (COSIN) contains system descriptions of the broad evaluation areas. The systems descriptions were the baseline for the evaluation because they describe how the systems and procedures should perform. Appendix 2 to Annex G to the COSIN contains the evaluation and data collection plan (E&DCP) which delineates the evaluation and data collection methodologies.

b. (U) Purpose and Scope

1. (U) This two-volume report contains the detailed evaluation of the systems and procedures the Joint Chiefs of Staff selected for examination in Exercise NIGHT TRAIN 84. Volume I contains a brief discussion of the observed performance of each system and procedure evaluated and a conclusion concerning the efficacy of the system or procedure. Volume II contains a comprehensive assessment of the exercise results and includes the following:

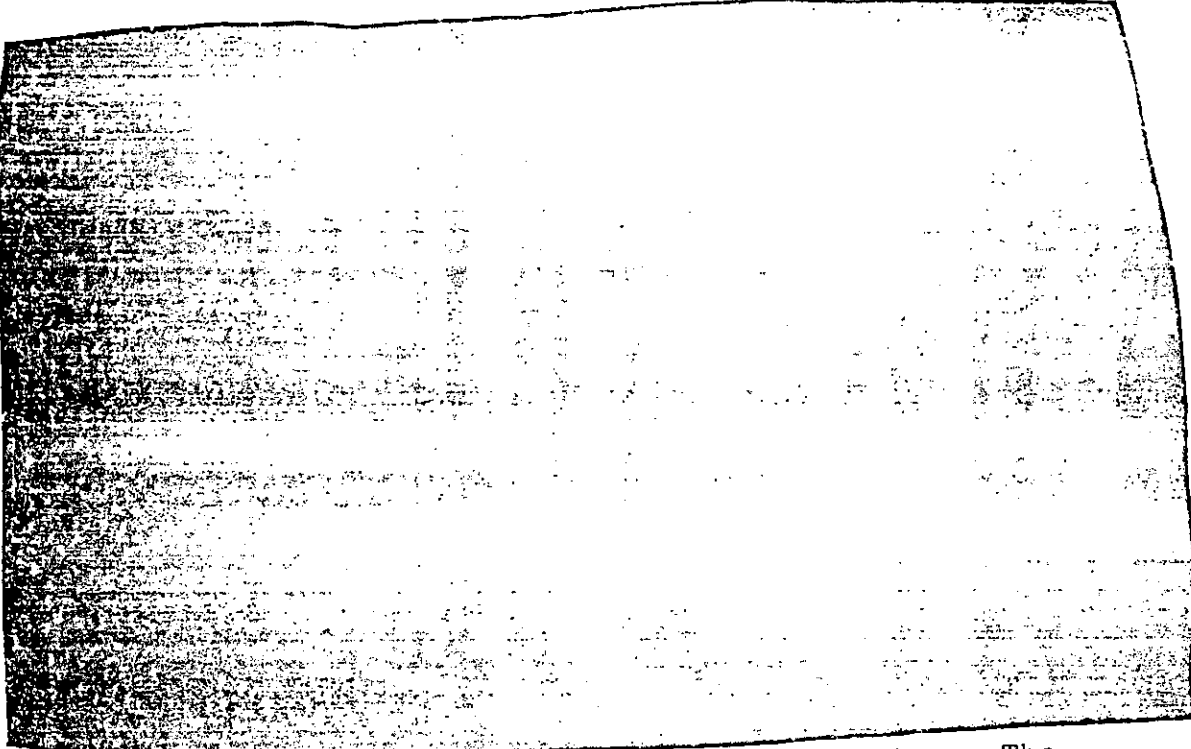

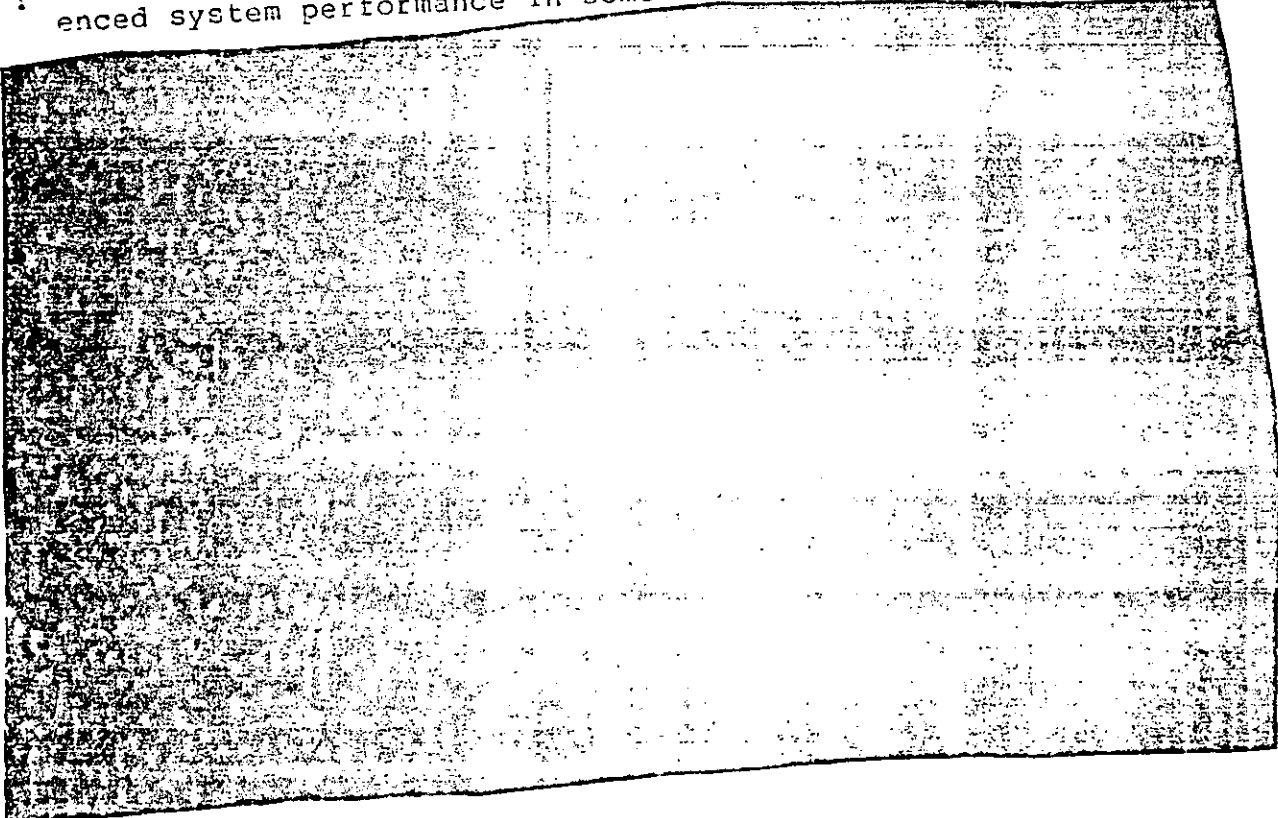


c. (U) Data Sources. This evaluation is based primarily on the results of Exercise NIGHT TRAIN 84 conducted by the Joint Staff during the period 5-13 April 1984. Data from previous exercises and other relevant tests and studies were reviewed in preparation of the evaluation and are cited appropriately. A complete list of references is in the bibliography.

d. (U) Adequacy of the Exercise. Exercise NIGHT TRAIN 84 was adequate for the evaluation of each of the following systems and procedures unless otherwise stated.



e. (U) Exercise Limitations and Artificialities. The following exercise limitations and artificialities influenced system performance in some areas.




(6) (U) The level and location of exercise participation limited Military Support of Civil Defense (MSCD) exercise play and coordination. The major participants at the State and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) region level played with reduced staffs or response cells. State and FEMA region participants were colocated for security purposes.

(7) (U) All MSCD play was treated as classified play. Oral and written communications that normally would be unclassified were classified to safeguard sensitive information. The requirement to classify information exchanges delayed artificially the flow of MSCD information.

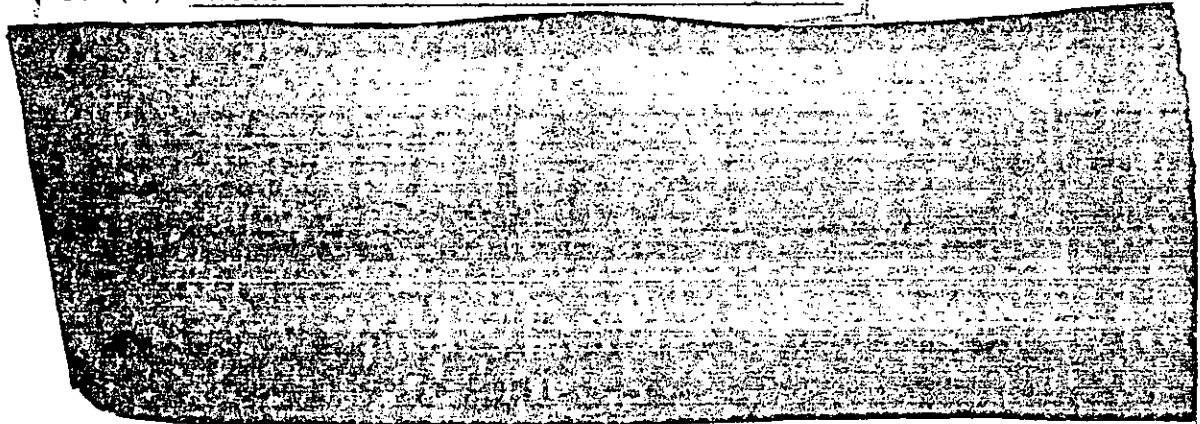
(8) (U) The USREDCOM host computer was available throughout Phase II of the exercise. It was simulated destroyed in Phase I but artificially restored in Phase II. This allowed USREDCOM to have an automated data base for MSCD.



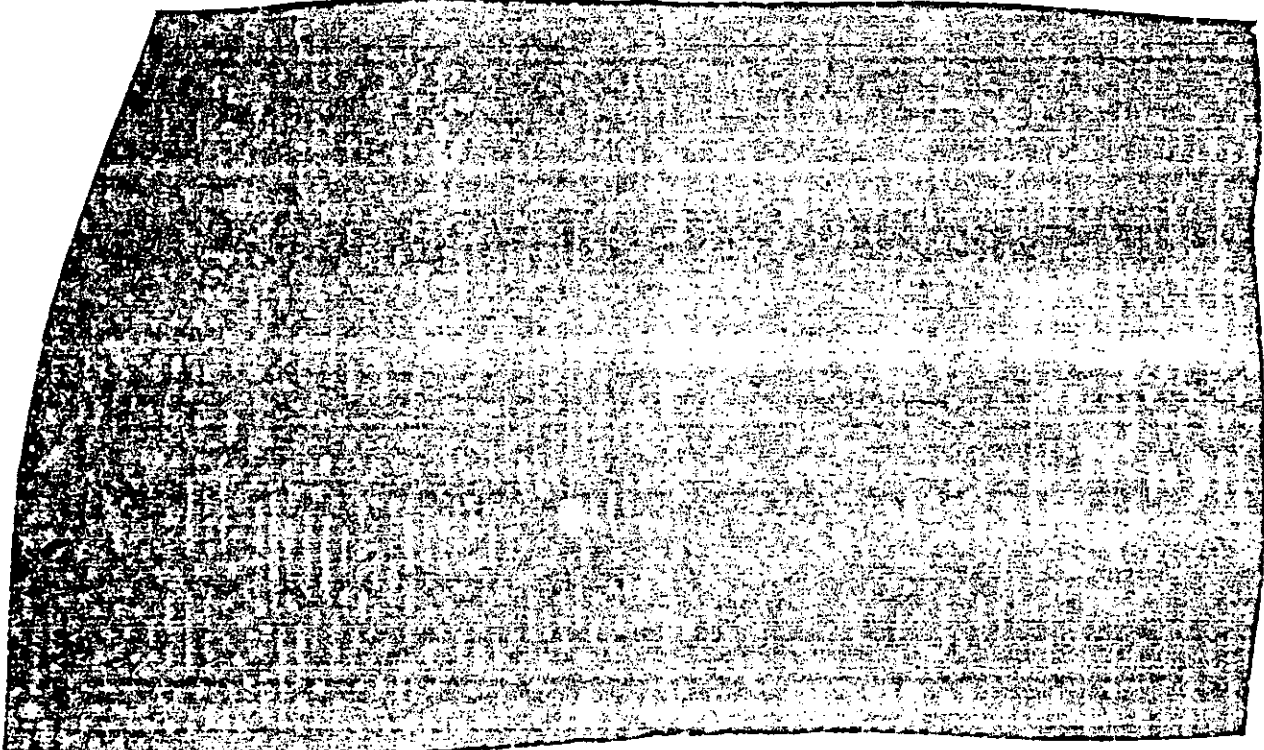
2. (U) Exercise Analysis

a. (U) Issues. Exercise NIGHT TRAIN 84 addressed specific issues the Directorate for Operations, OJCS developed in conjunction with Service planners and proponent staff agencies for each system exercised. The issues were developed to insure each system received a comprehensive exercise in an environment as realistic as possible. To the extent possible, performance criteria also were developed or established for each issue.

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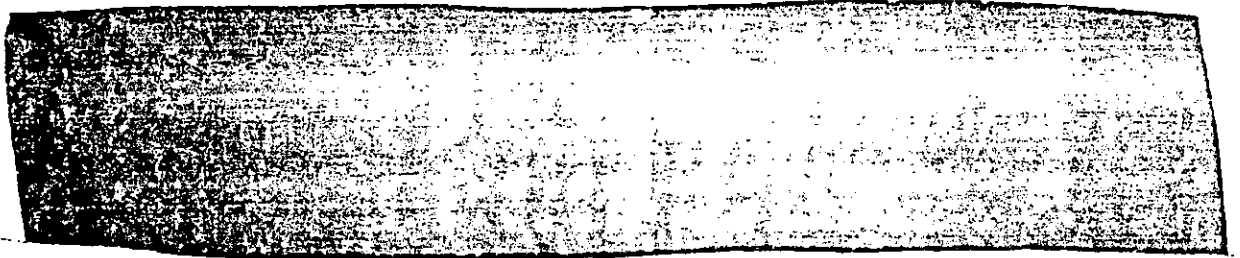
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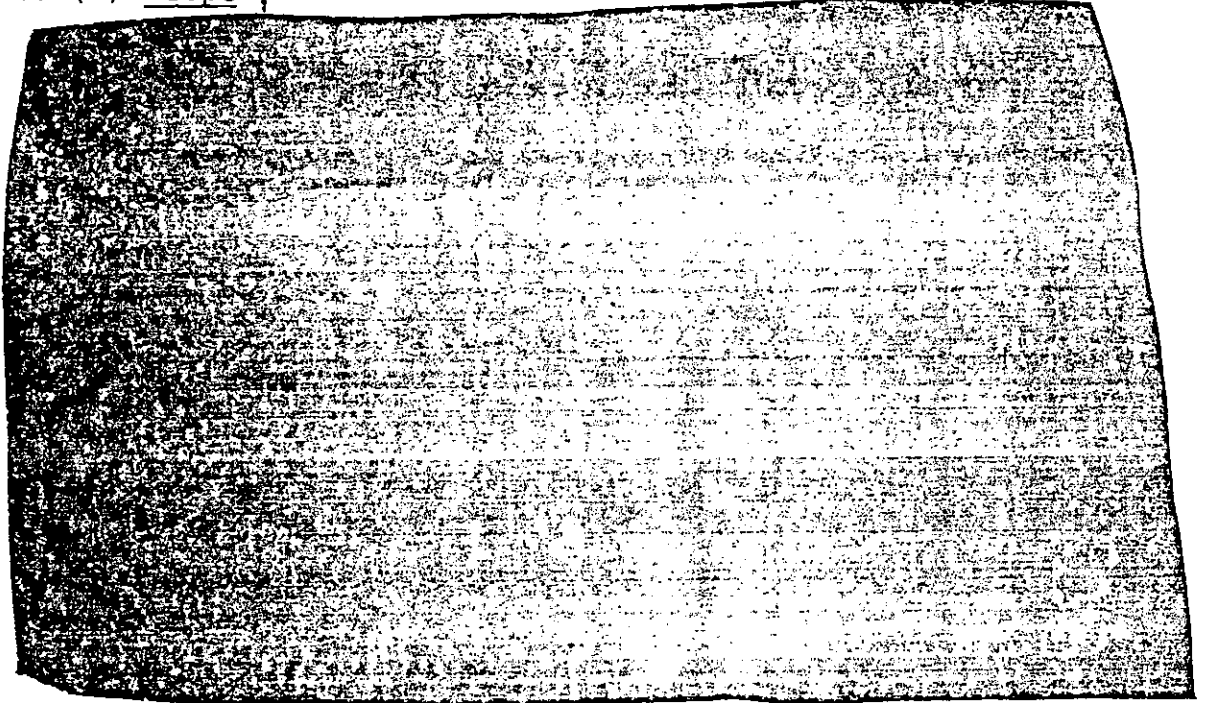
d. (U) Evaluation of Exercise Issues. Evaluation of the exercise issues is based primarily on observations made during Exercise NIGHT TRAIN 84. In addition, comparison of exercise observations with other tests and reports documenting systems' performance gave additional insight to system performance. Paragraphs 3 through 17 contain the evaluations of the issues for each system. The procedure used to evaluate the issues is discussed below. Table 2-6 is a generic outline of the manner in which each paragraph is presented. Each issue is stated, including its scope where appropriate. Criteria and rationale also are given for some issues. The conclusion relative to each issue then is presented. The next paragraph, "Data Source(s)," lists short titles, the agency responsible for the report, and the publication date of references used to address the issue. Letters cross-reference short titles to the complete title in the bibliography. In all areas, except where specifically excluded, Appendix B of this report was used as a data

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source. Appendix B contains raw data compiled from interviews conducted during the exercise and recorded on data collection forms. The paragraph titled "Discussion of Findings" contains the relevant findings and discussion on which the conclusion to the issue is based. Exercise conditions also are presented along with pertinent data summaries, figures, and tables to clarify the discussion. The last paragraph concerning each specific issue, "Corrective Action," assigns corrective action where appropriate. Paragraph 18 presents an overall evaluation of the systems' performance in aggregate. Appendix A is an outline of areas warranting possible future exercise or more comprehensive exercise.



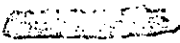
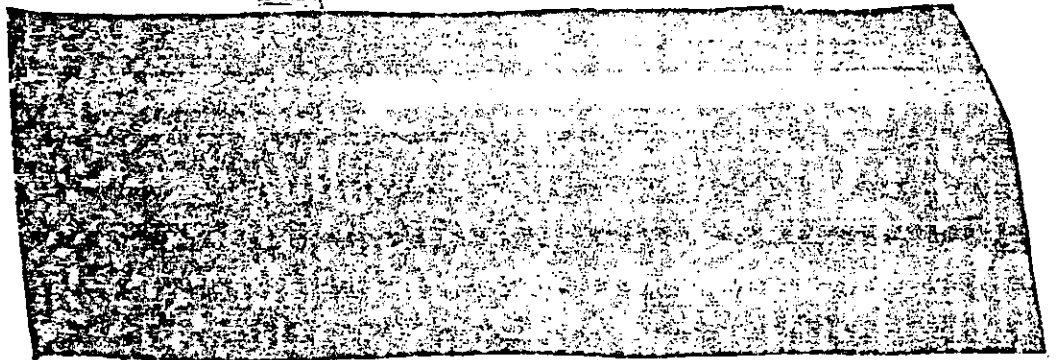

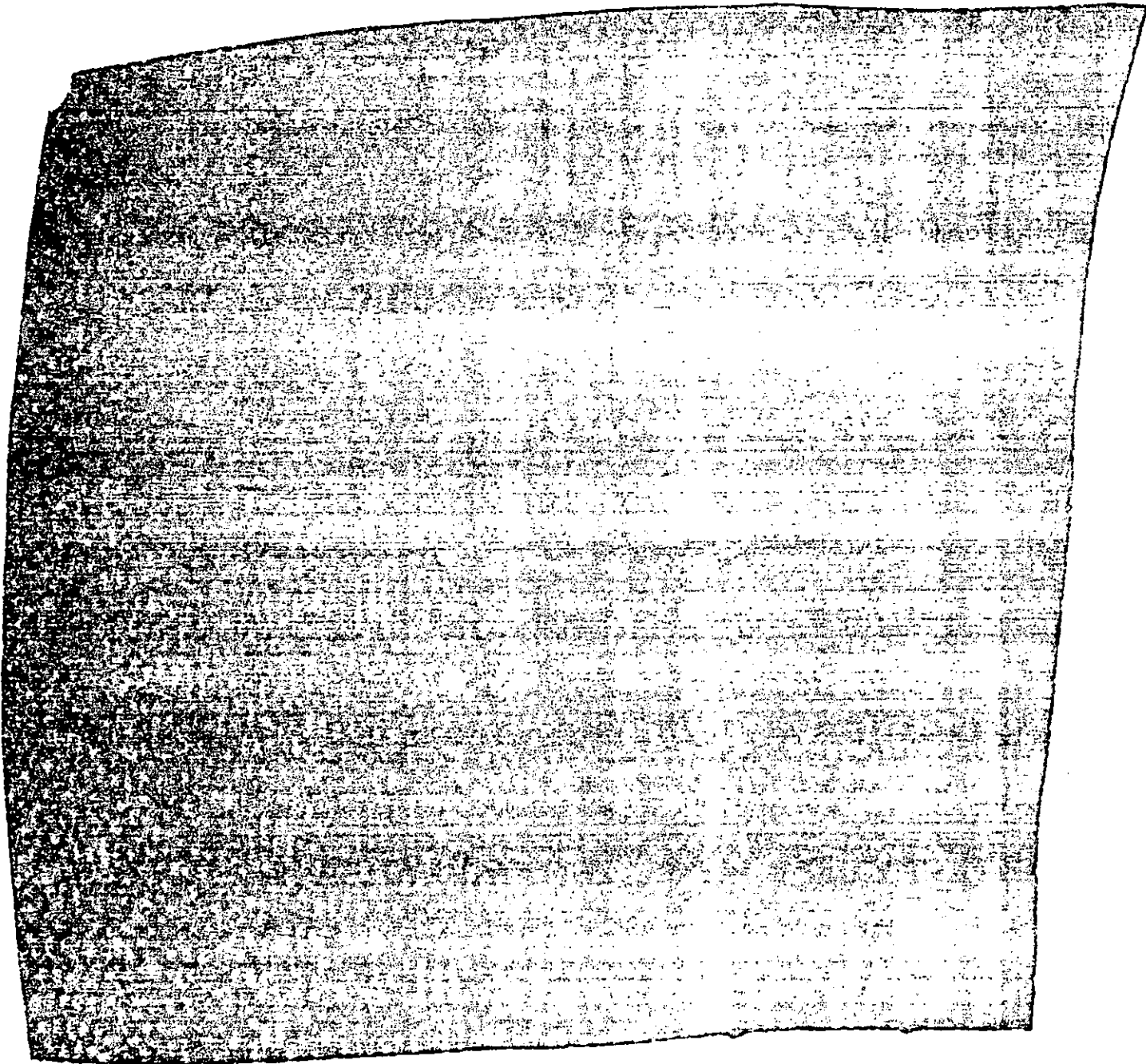
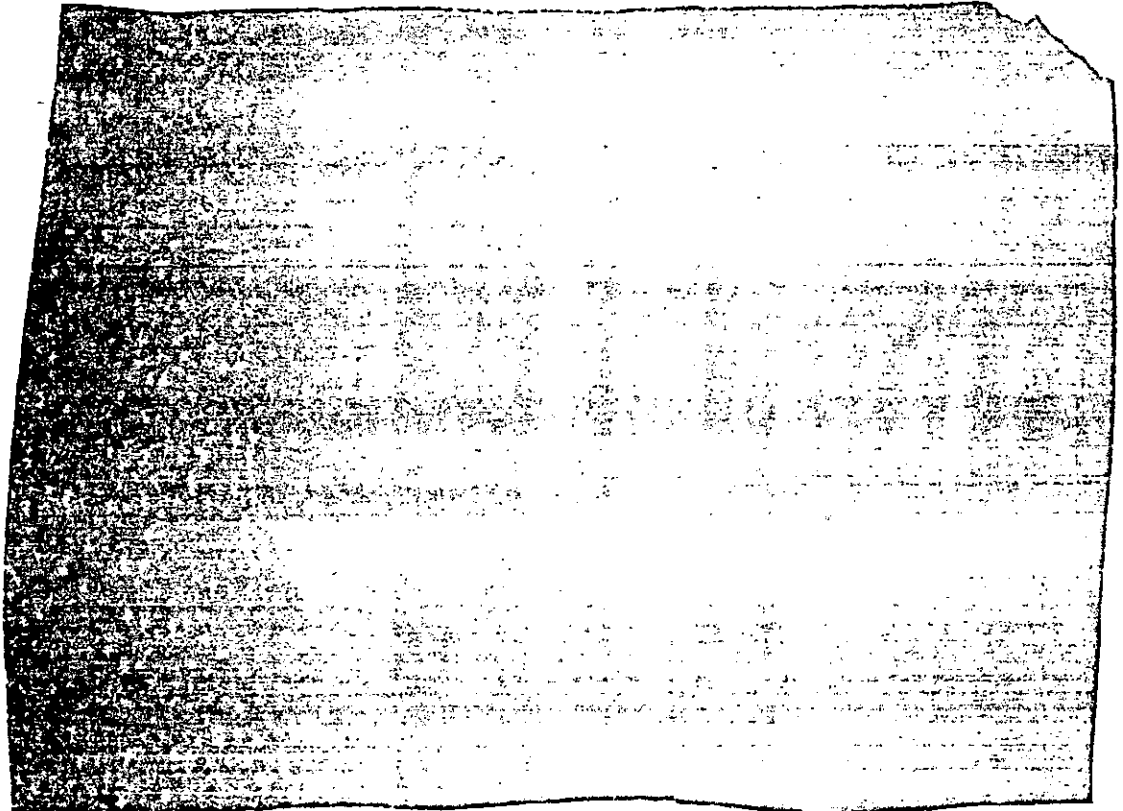
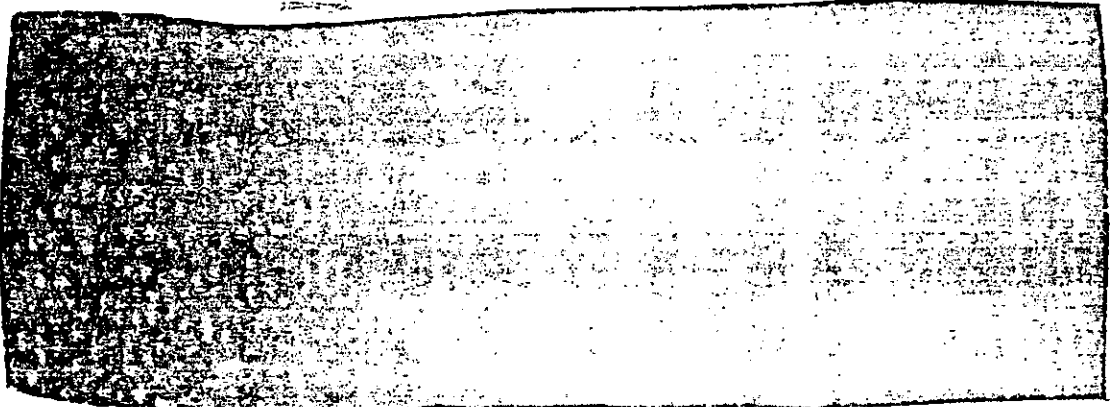


Figure 6-1. (b) Cumulative Distribution of SCA Times from Message Receipt to Assignment

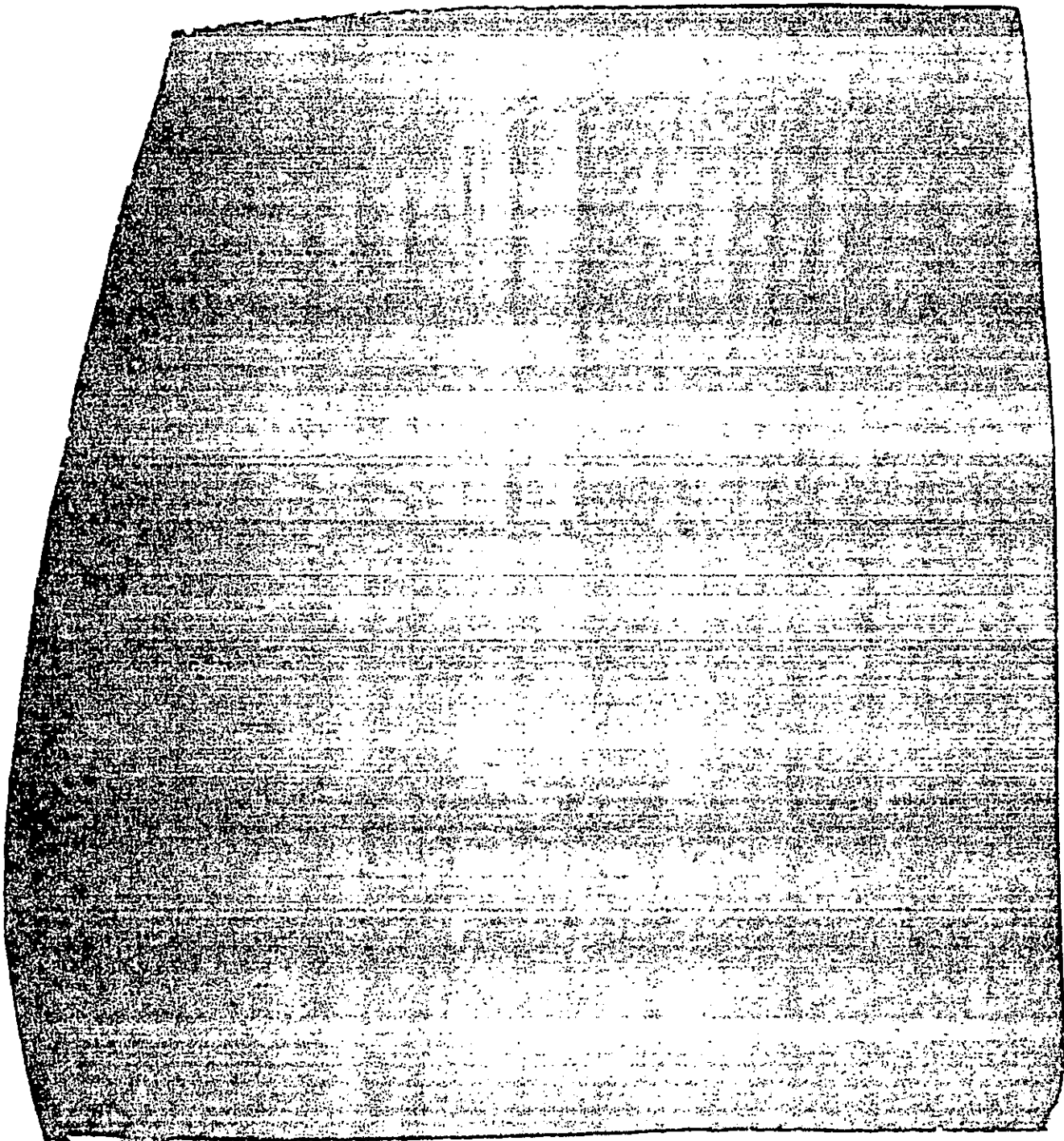
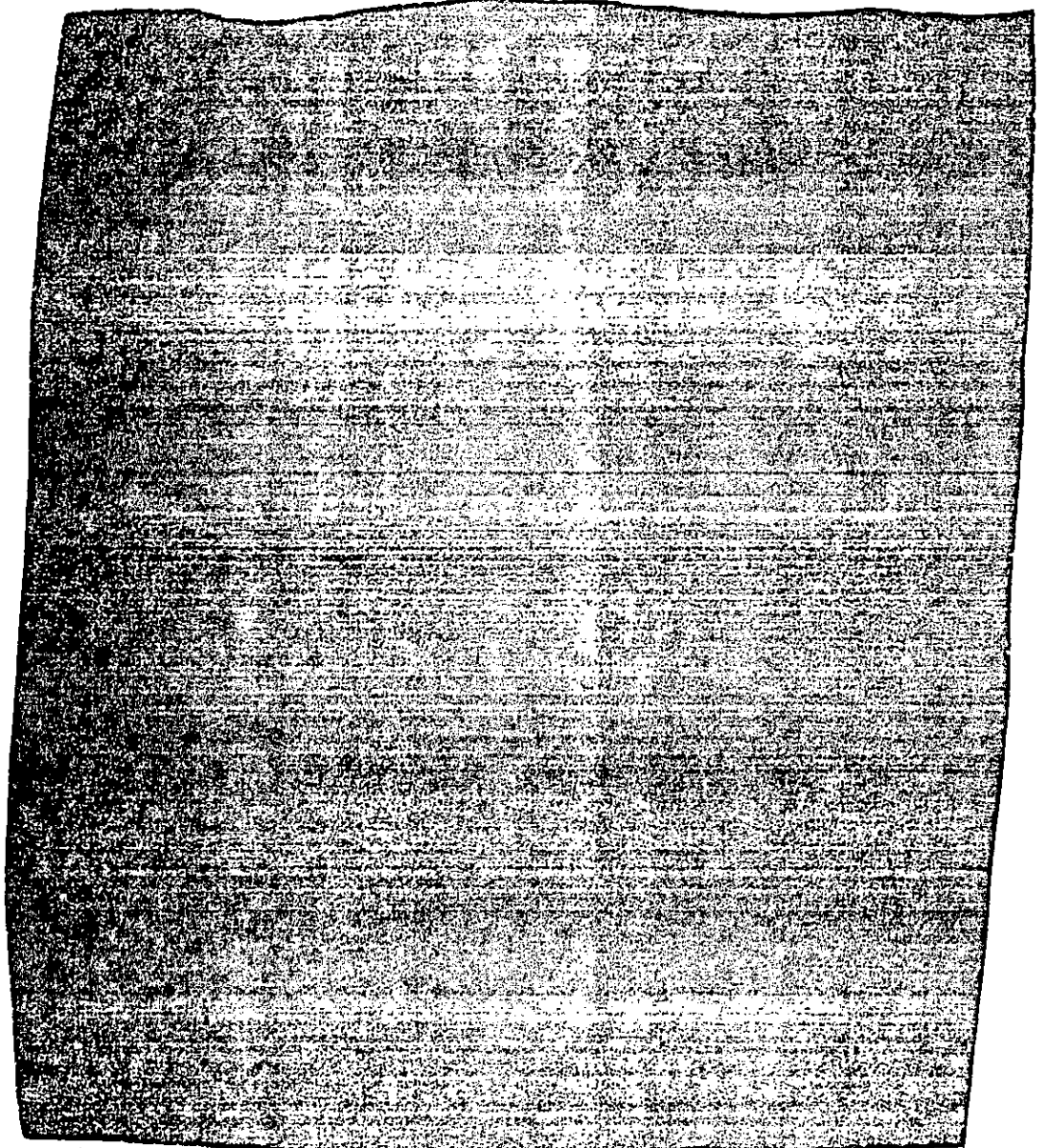


Figure 13-2. (U) NMCS Command Center Transfer

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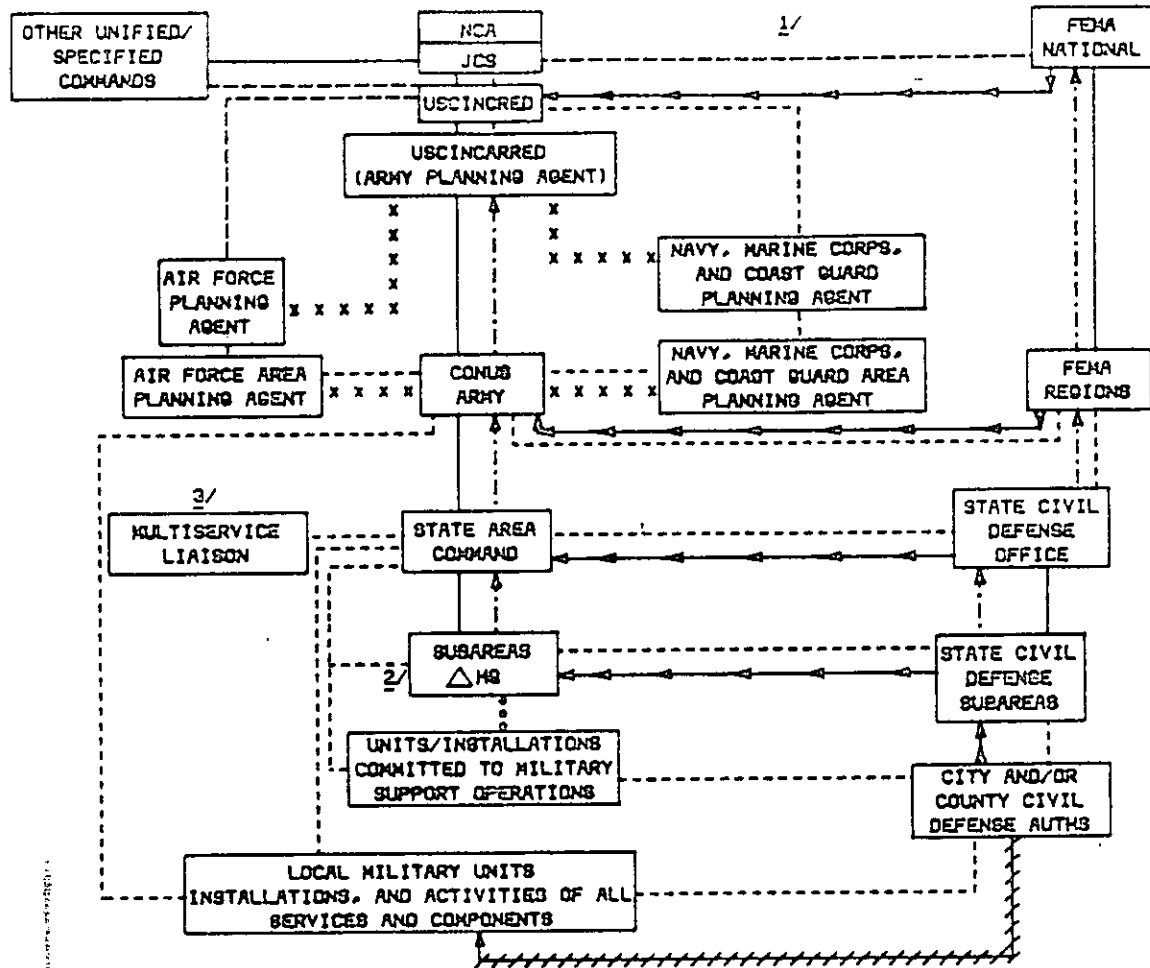
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Figure 15-2. (U) USCINCRCD Command Relationships Diagram for MSCD Planning

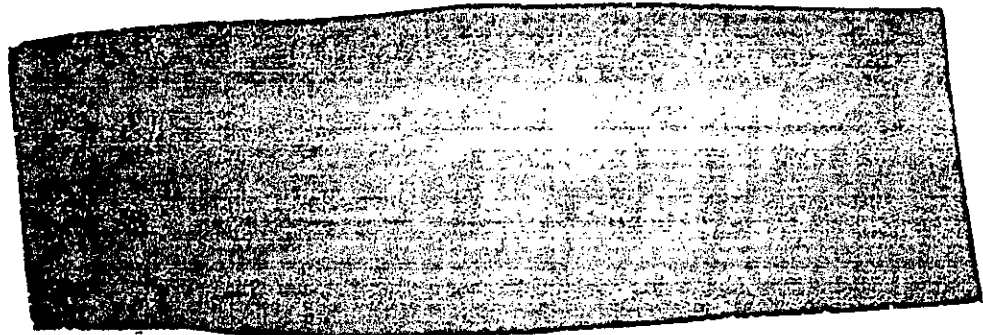

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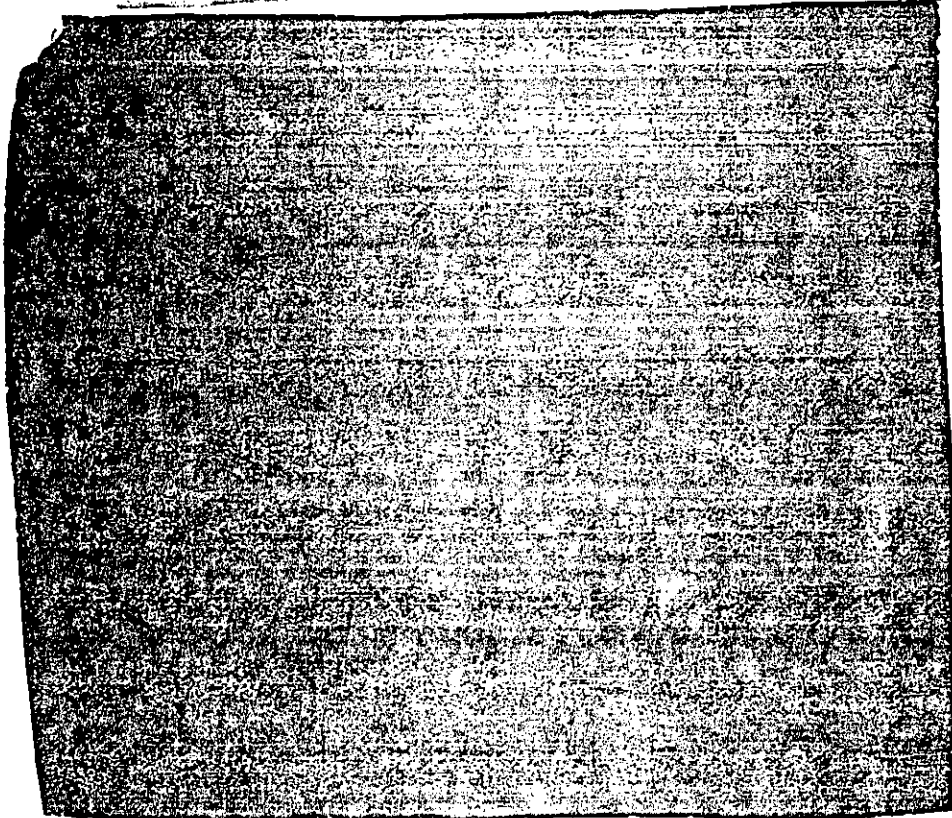
Figure 15-3. (U) USCINCRCD Command Relationships Diagram for MSCD Execution

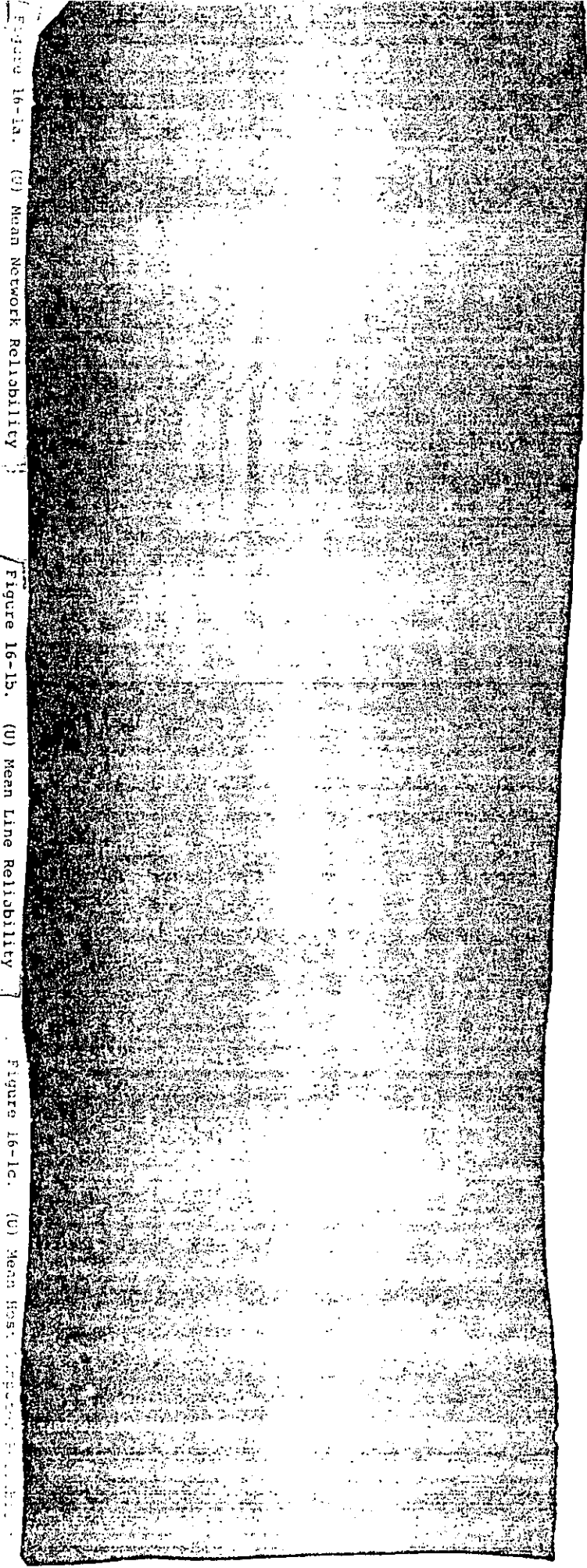


Figure 16-1a. (U) Mean Network Reliability


Figure 16-1b. (U) Mean Line Reliability

Figure 16-1. (U) Comparison of Mean Reliability During Recent Major Exercises





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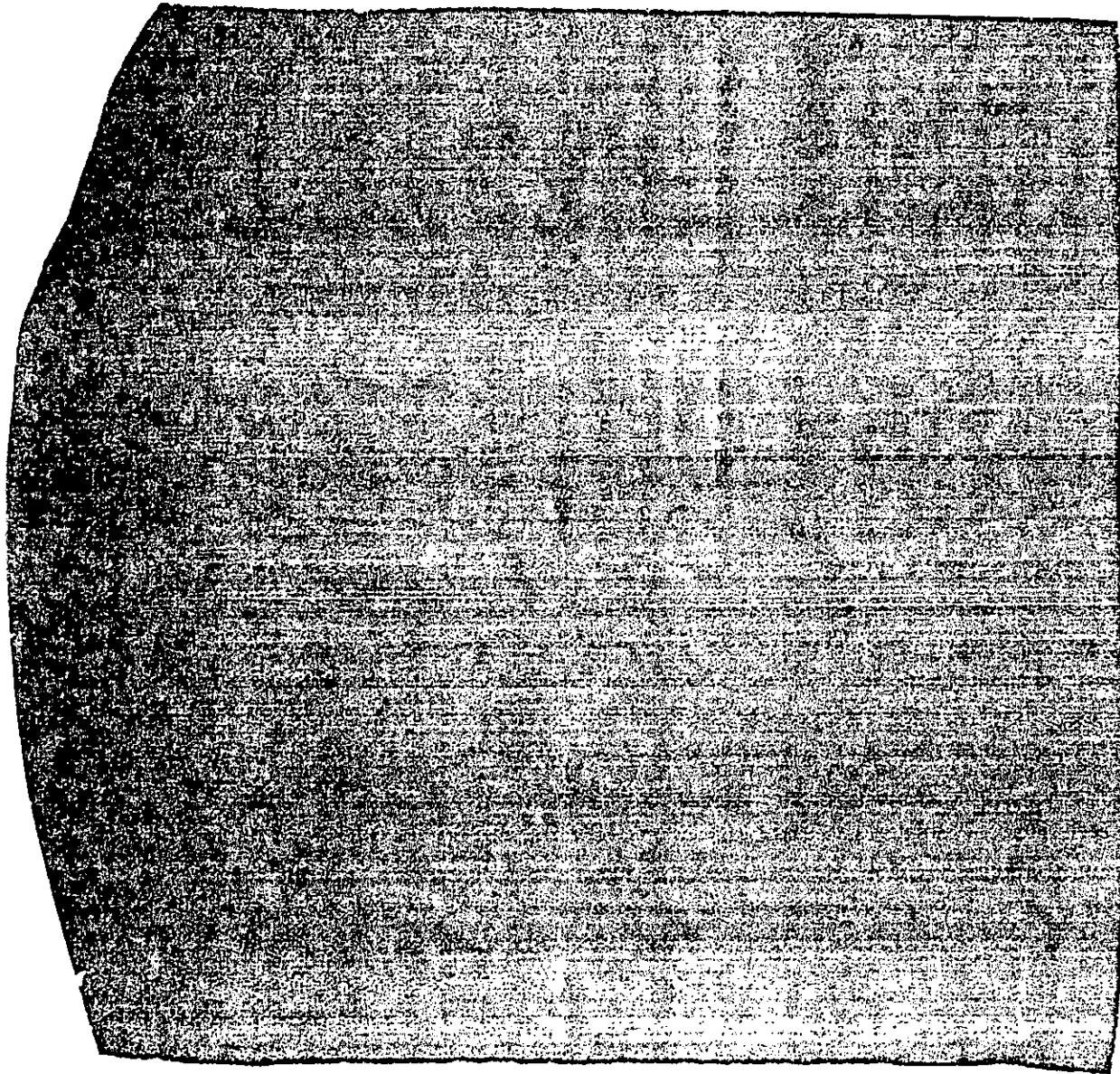


Figure 17-1. (U) Daily Message Volume by Precedence

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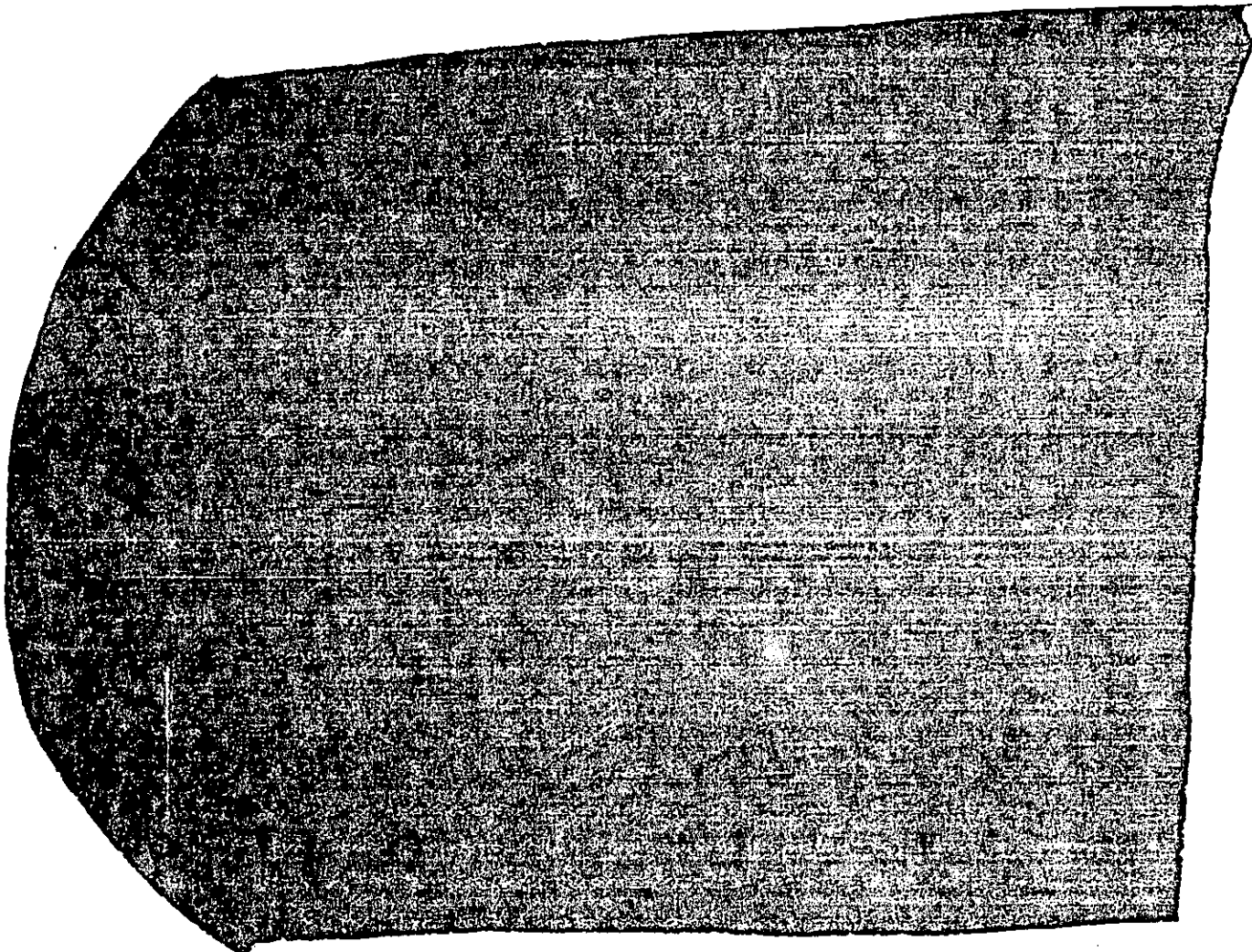


Figure 17-2. (U) Cumulative Distribution by Percent of Messages Meeting SOS Objectives

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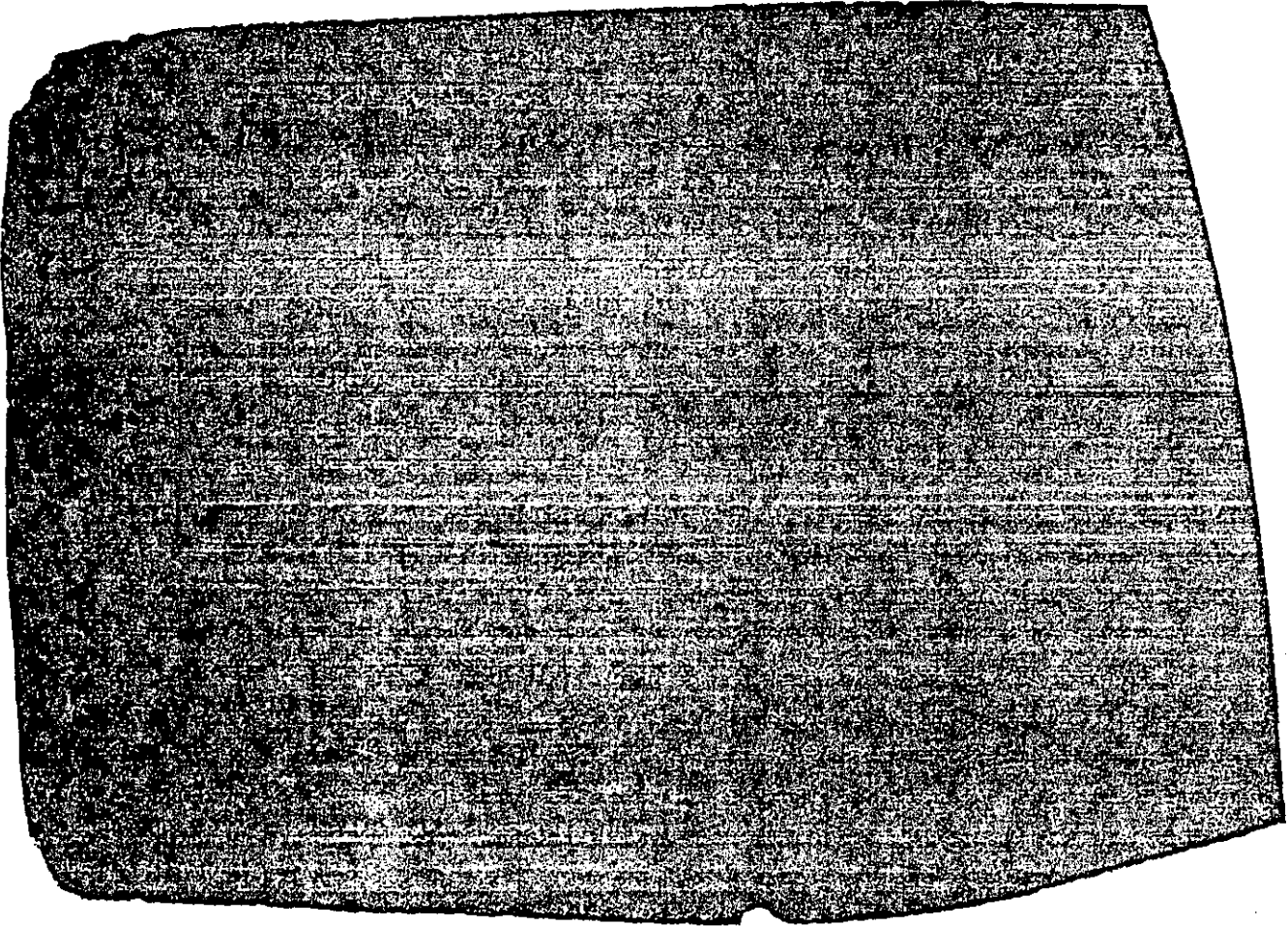


Figure 17-3. (U) Comparison of FLASH and IMMEDIATE SOS Performance Among Recent Exercises

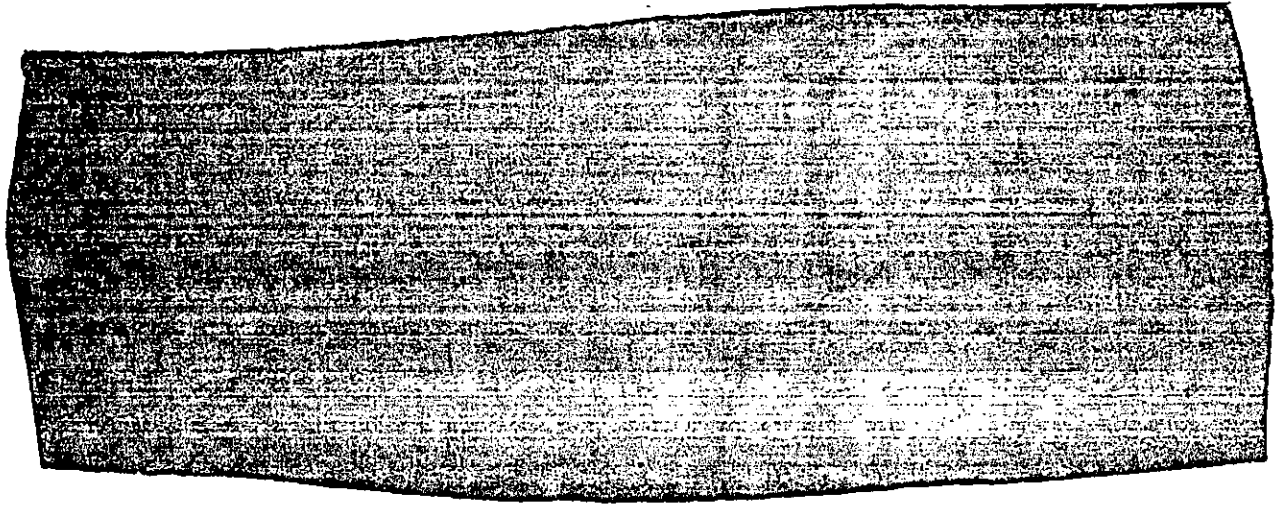


Figure 17-4a. (U) FLASH SOS Performance

Figure 17-4b. (U) IMMEDIATE SOS Performance

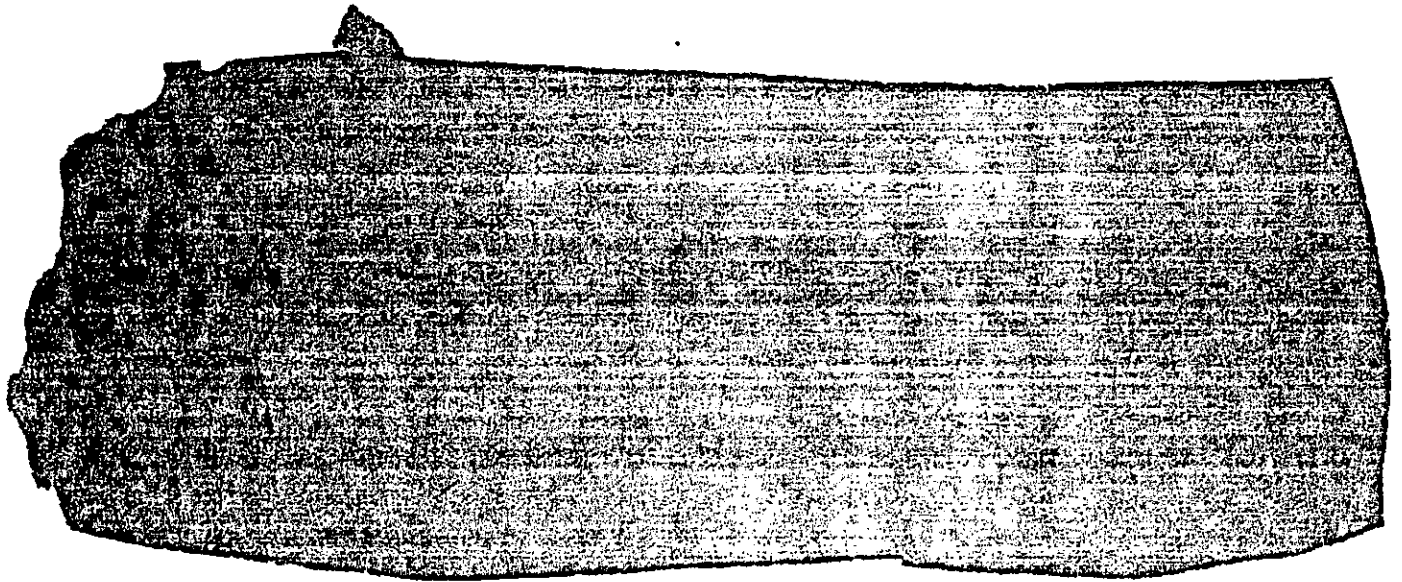


Figure 17-4c. (U) PRIORITY SOS Performance

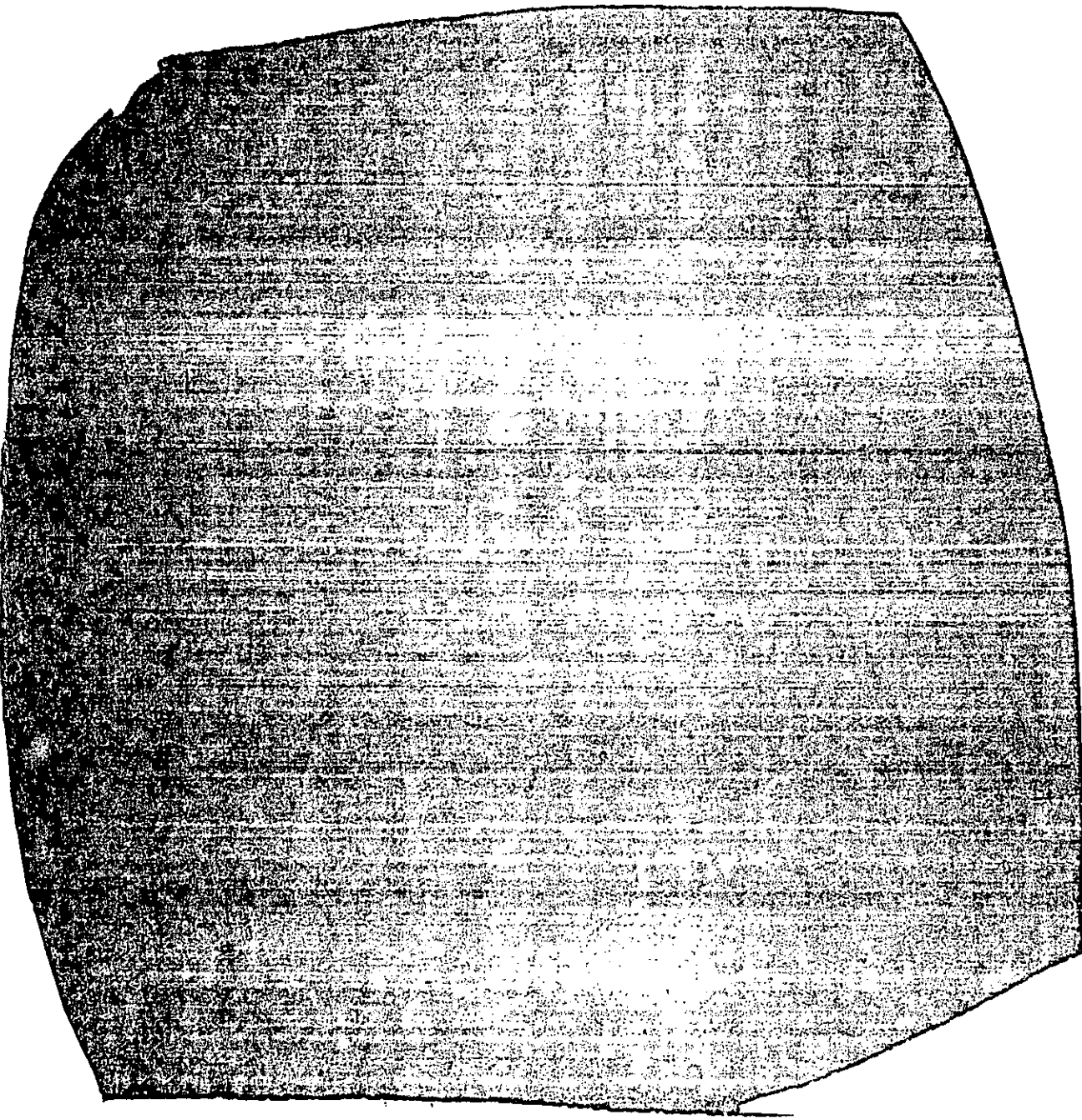
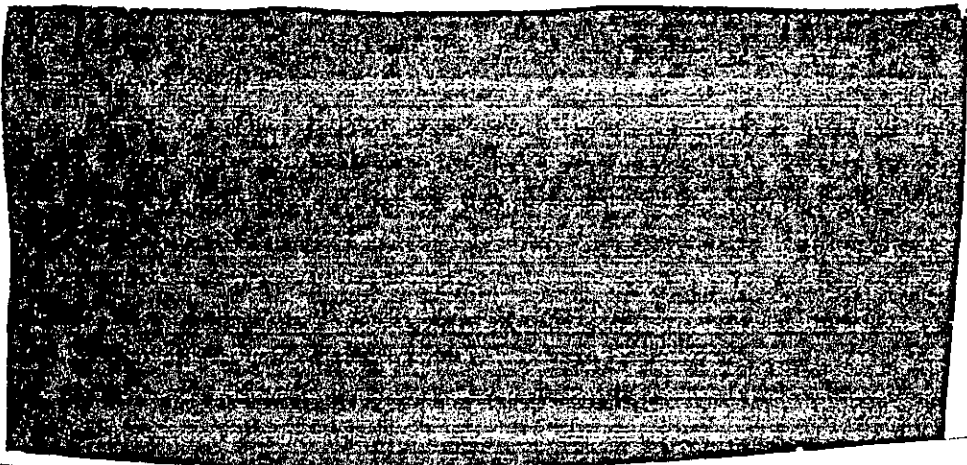
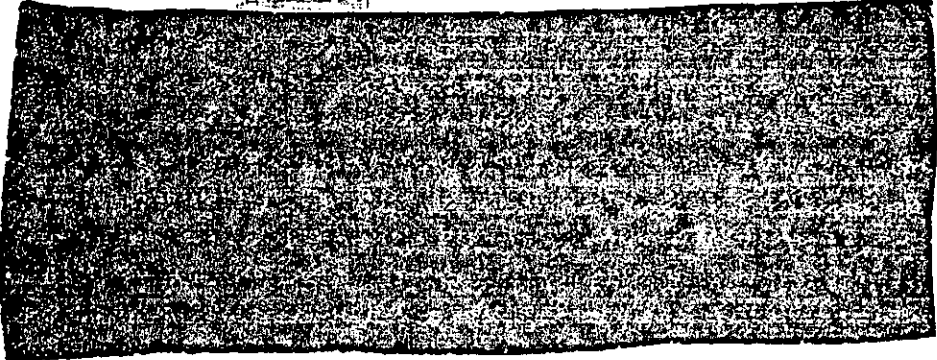
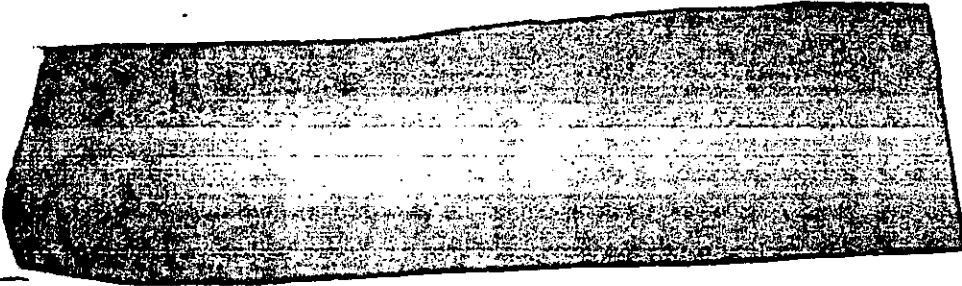


Figure 17-5. (U) Source of Information in the NMCC CAT

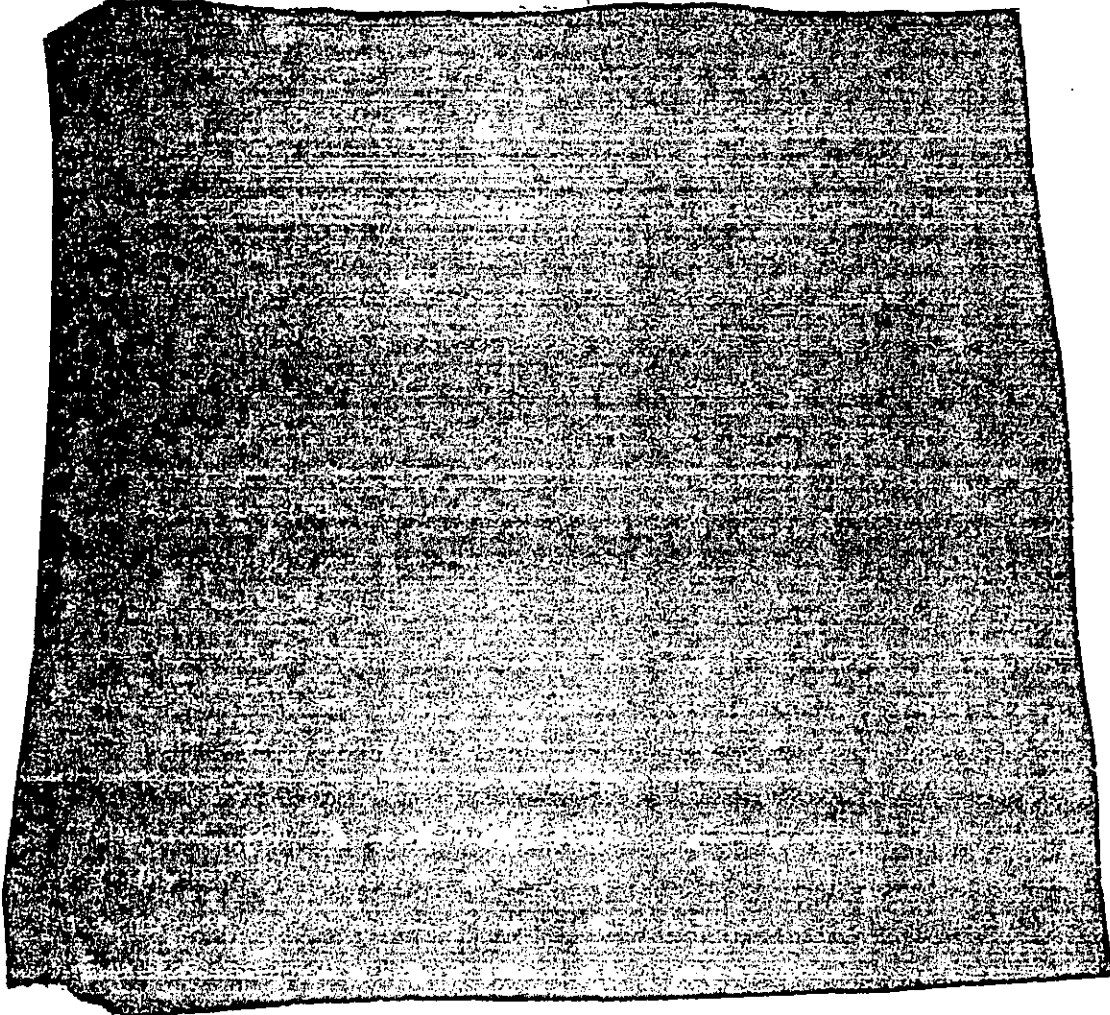

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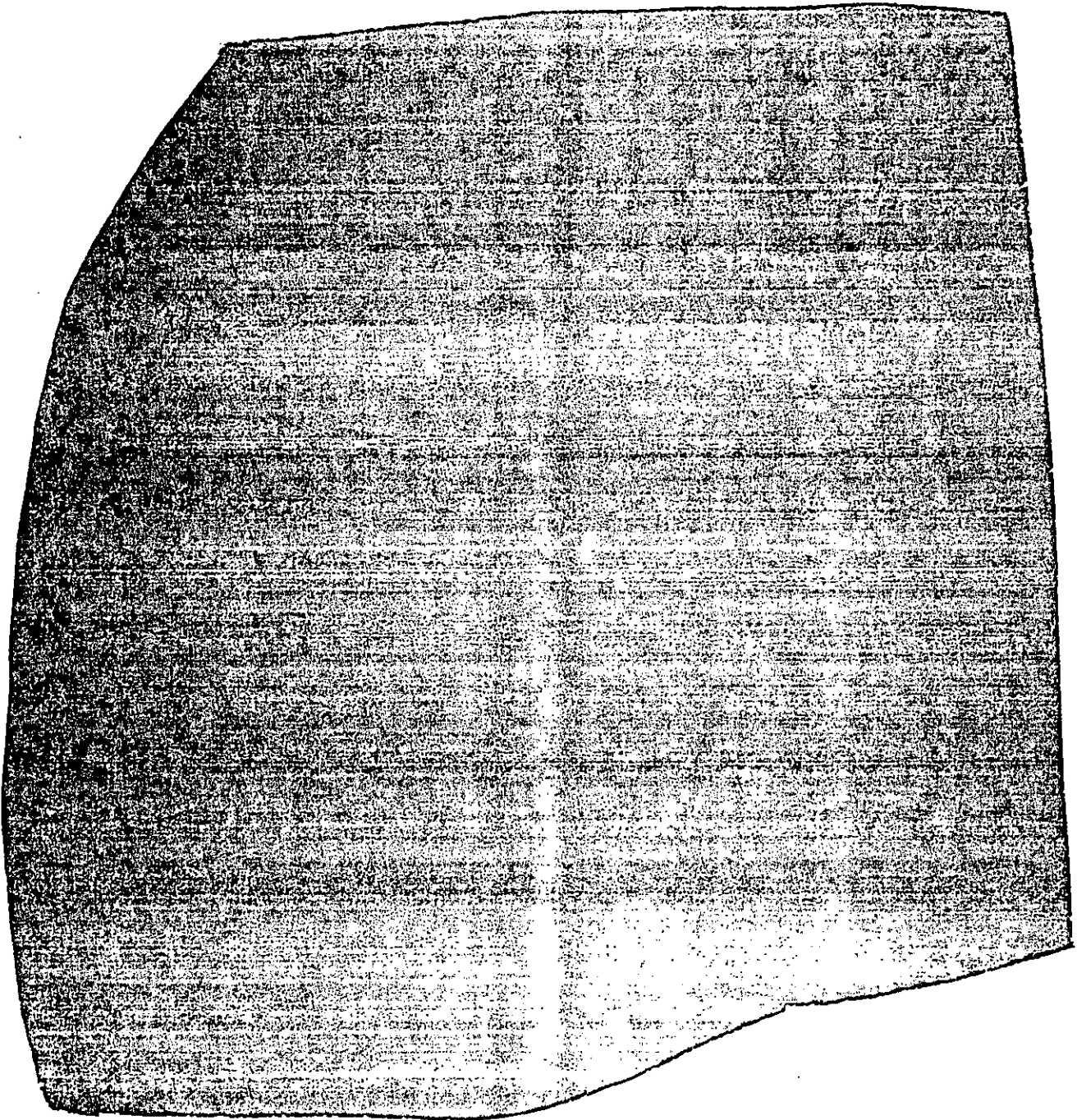


Figure 17-6. (U) Types of JRS Reports Received by the NMCC

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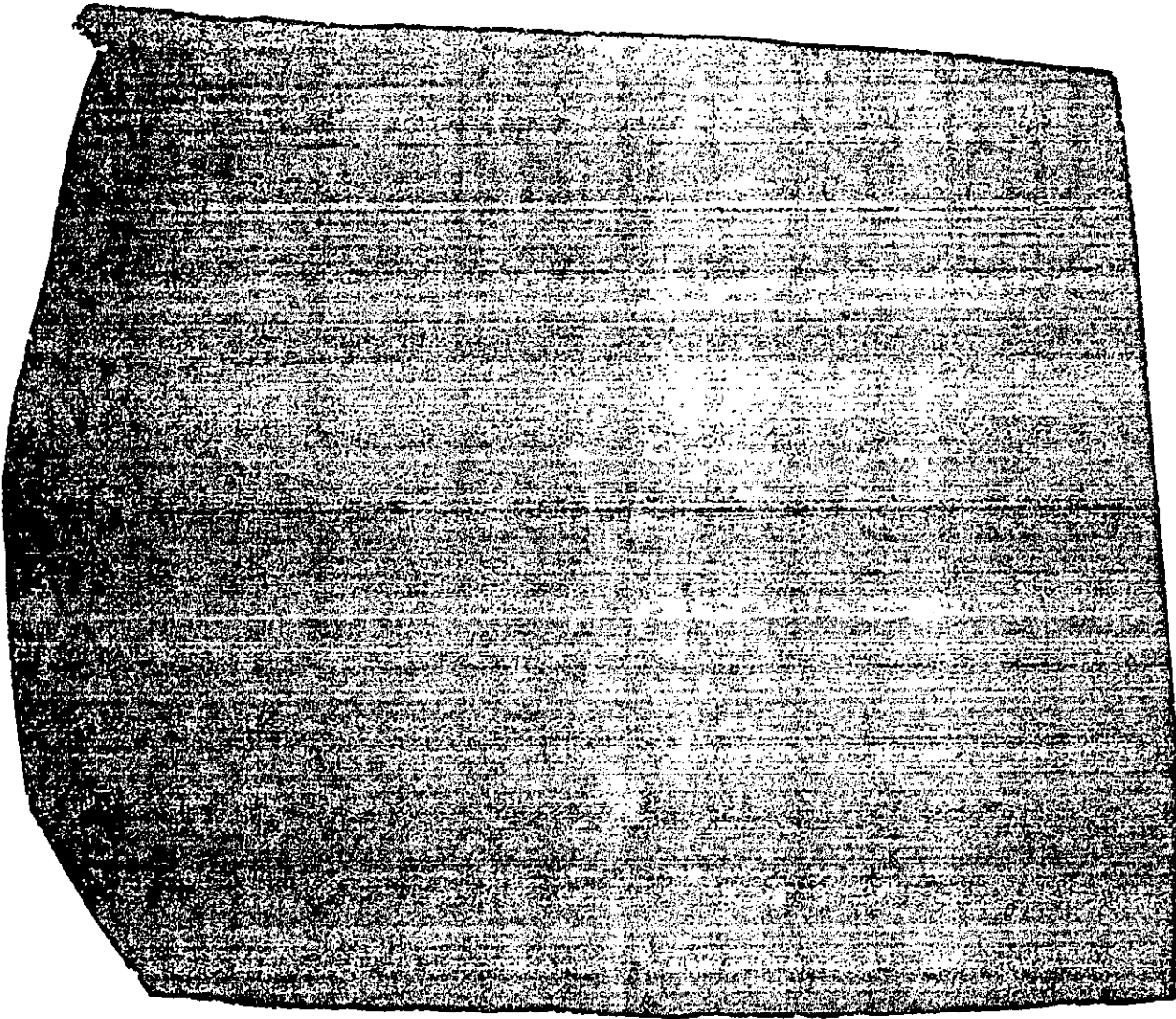


Figure 17-7. (U) Average Percentage of Exercise Messages
Categorized as JRS Reports

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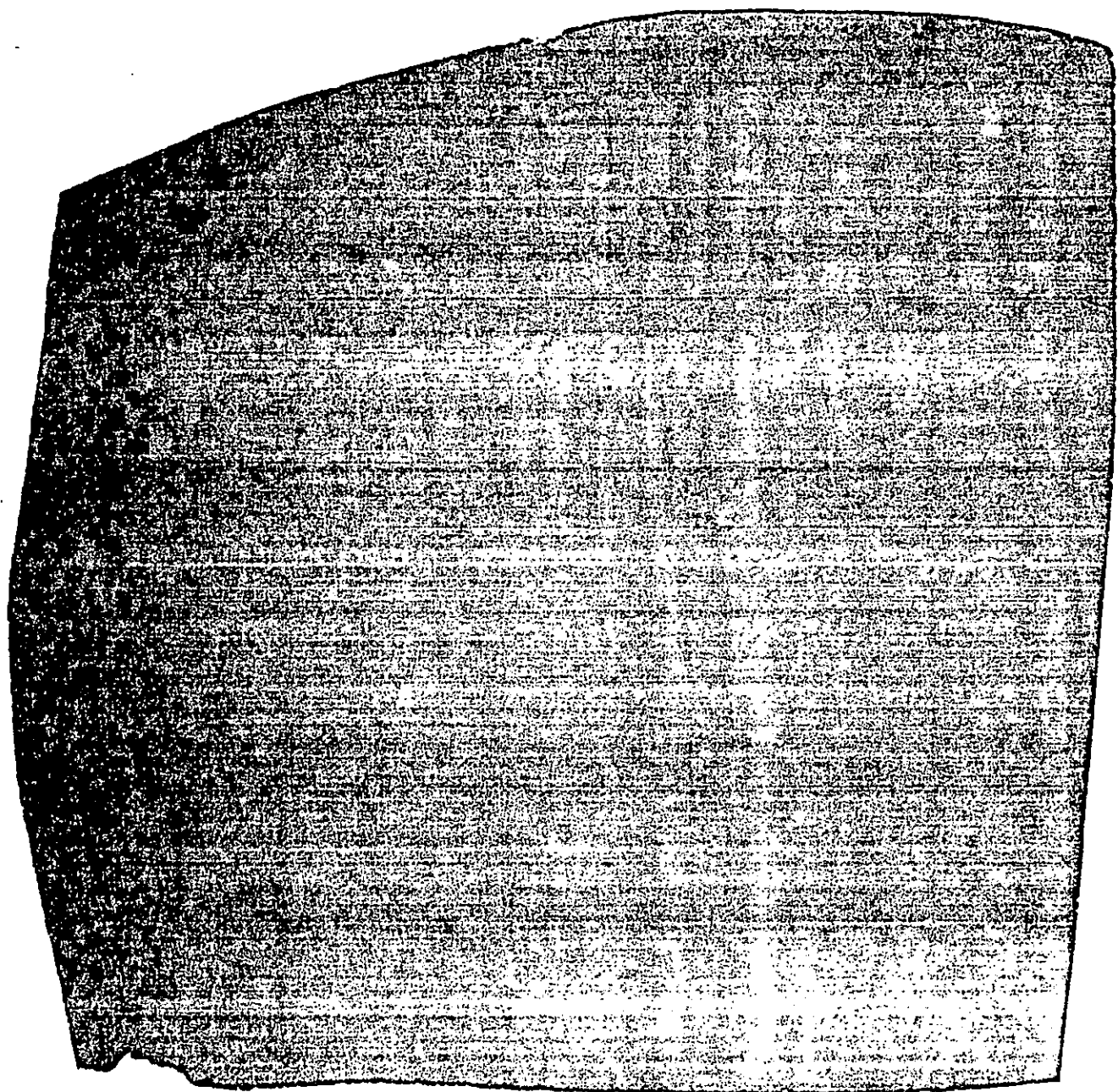


Figure 17-8. (U) Kinds of JCS Incoming and Outgoing Messages by Precedence and Classification

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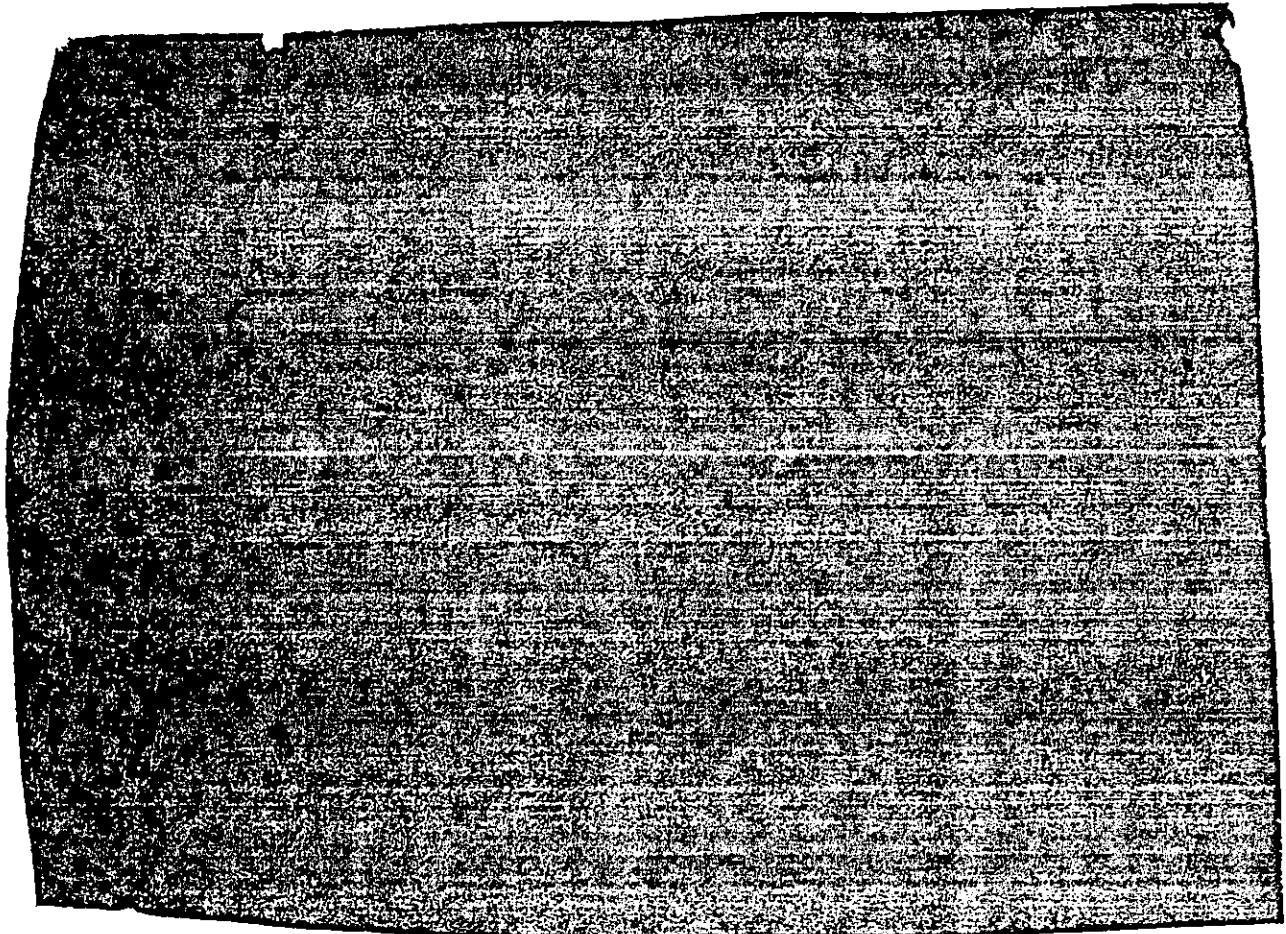


Figure 17-9. (U) Percent of Messages Classified SECRET and Sent Using IMMEDIATE Precedence

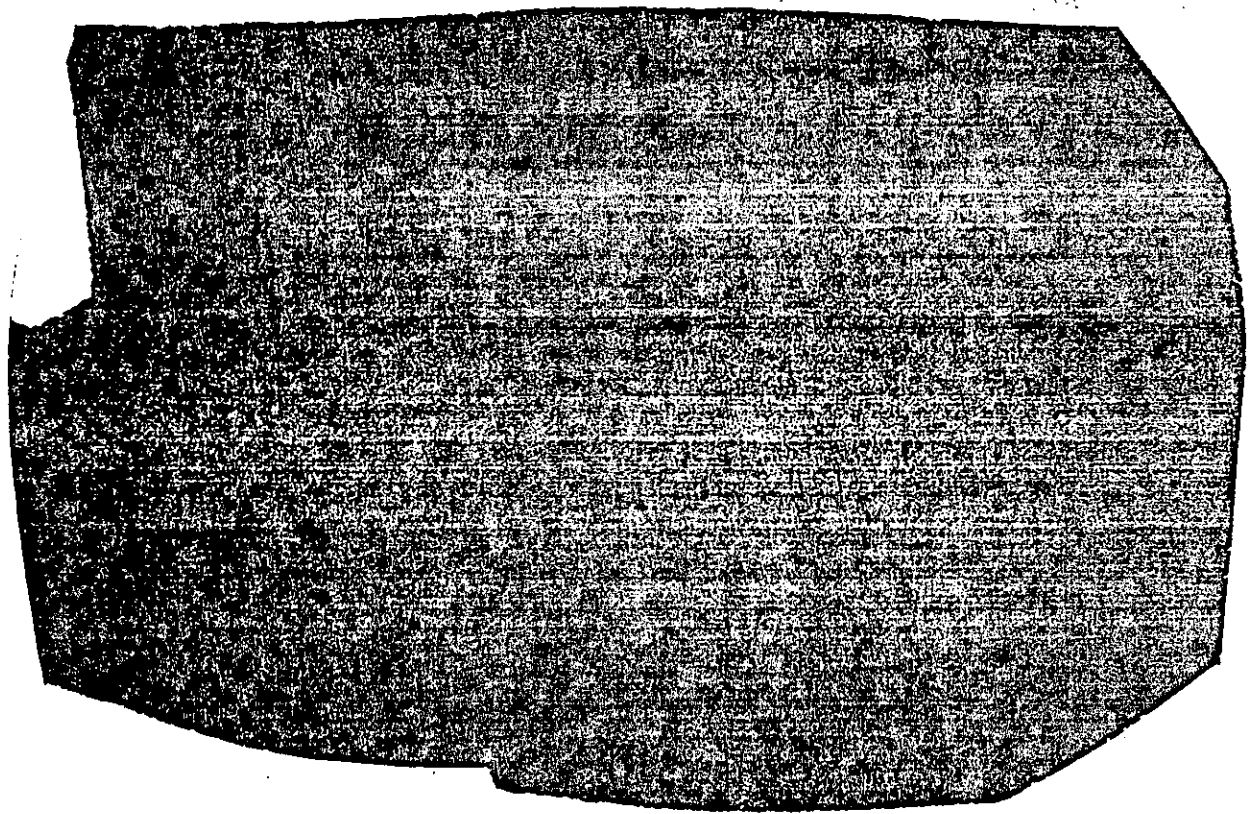


Figure 17-11. (U) Comparison of Precedence Assignment
in Accordance with ACP-121 Guidelines

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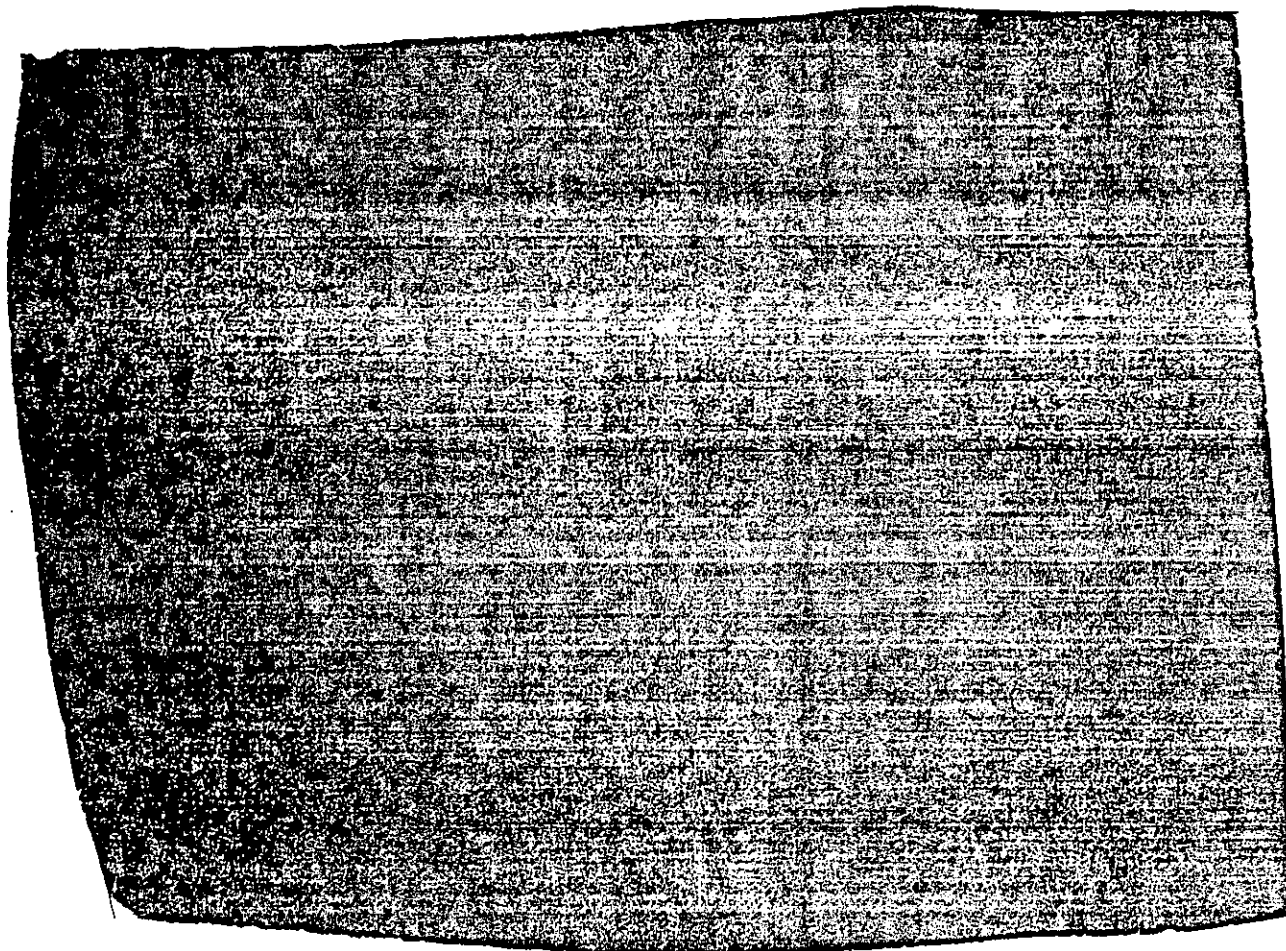
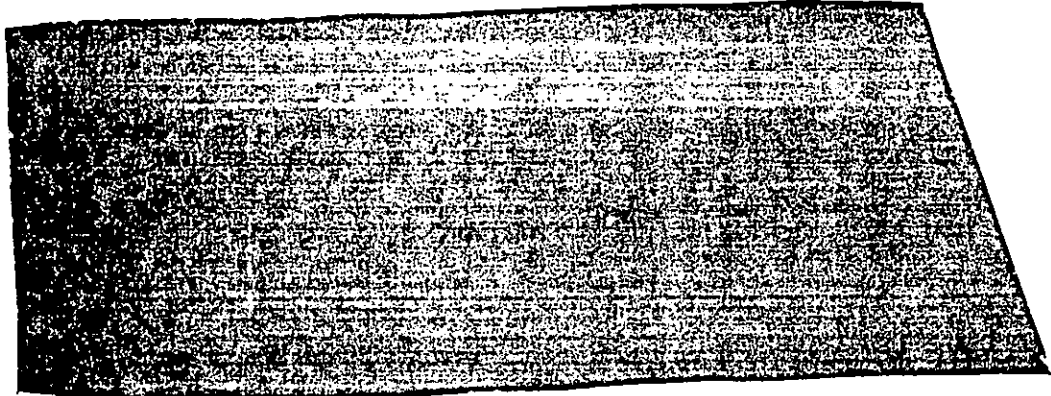


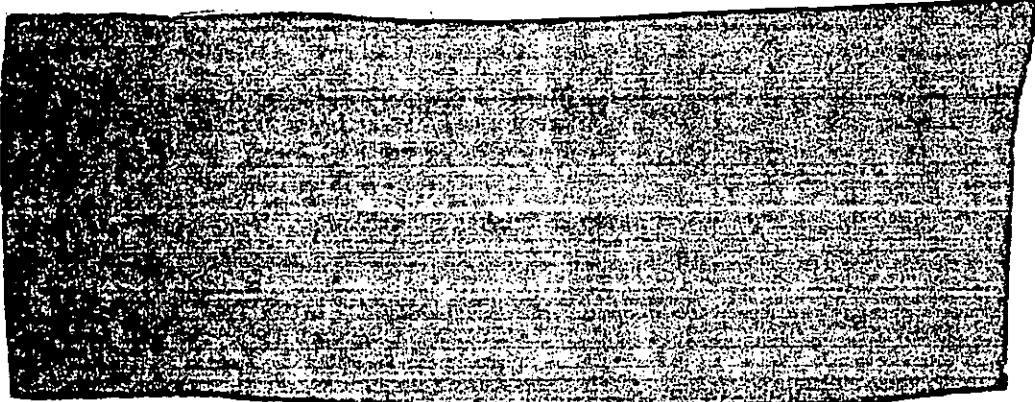
Figure 17-12. (U) Percent of FLASH and IMMEDIATE Messages Meeting Length Criteria

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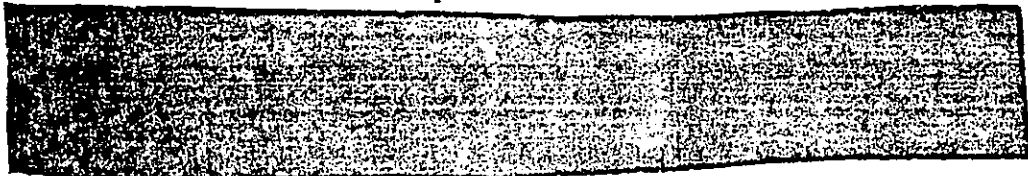
