3. RANGE OF NEW JAPANESE ANTI-SHIP MISSILE:
(YOMIURI) - RECENTLY, THE JDA DECIDED IN SECRET TO SET THE STRIKING
RANGE OF A NEW SURFACE-TO-SHIP MISSILE, SSM-1 NOW UNDER DEVELOPMENT
LOCALLY, AT 150 KM. THE AGENCY HAS DETERMINED THE FIGURE, 150 KM,
AFTER ASSESSING THE MINIMUM TACTICAL REQUIREMENTS AND TECHNOLOGICAL
FEASIBILITIES, AND THE DETERMINED STRIKING RANGE CAN COVER SOUTHERN PARTS OF SAKHALIN OR THE NOW SOVIET HELD NORTHERN ISLANDS WHEN
THE MISSILE IS LAUNCHED FROM A POSITION IN NORTHERN HOKKAIDO OR
IN EASTERN HOKKAIDO. AS TO THE REASON WHY THEY HAVE GIVEN SUCH A

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LONG STRIKING RANGE TO THE SSM-1, JDA SOURCES SAY IT IS BECAUSE
THEY WANTED TO USE THE MISSILE FROM AN INLAND POSITION WHICH IS
LESS VULNERABLE TO ENEMY ATTACKS IN THE EVENT THAT FOREIGN AGGRESSION TAKES PLACE AGAINST THIS COUNTRY. IT IS ALSO TRUE THAT THERE
WERE STRONG TACTICAL REQUIREMENTS SEEKING AS LONG A STRIKING RANGE
AS POSSIBLE FOR THE NEW MISSILE IN ORDER TO INCREASE THE FLEXIBILITY OF JAPANESE DEFENSE OPERATIONS SUCH AS IN BLOCKING SEA TRANSPORTATIONS IN THE WATERS BETWEEN THE SOVIET MARITIME PROVINCE AND
SAKHALIN OR THE NORTHERN ISLANDS. THE JDA PLANS TO DISTRIBUTE
SSM-1'S TO THE GSDF BEGINNING FROM JFY88.
4. LDP PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION:
(ASAHI) - AT A MEETING WITH HIS FACTION MEMBERS ON THE STH, EXPRIME MINISTER FUKUDA CRITICALLY COMMENTED ON THE PRESENT ADMINISTRATION, THOUGH HE AVOIDED CALLING THE NAME OF PRIME MINISTER
