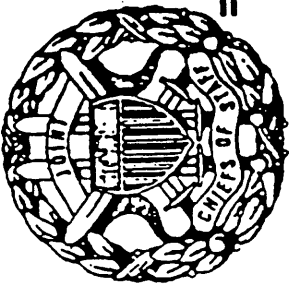


# PSYCHOLOGICAL AND DECEPTION OPERATIONS

- PSYOPS CRITICAL ELEMENT OF CAMPAIGN
- DESTROY IRAQ TV & BROADCAST STATIONS
  - SUBSTITUTE US BROADCASTS
  - SEPARATE HUSSEIN REGIME FROM SUPPORT OF PEOPLE AND MILITARY
- DECEPTION
  - REDUCE CASUALTIES
  - FACILITATE MILITARY OPERATIONS
    - NOT CRITICAL FOR SUCCESS

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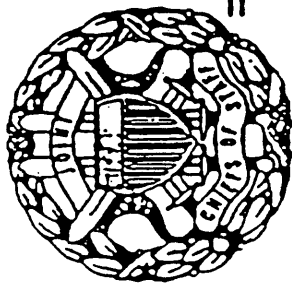




## *EXPECTED RESULTS*

- NATIONAL LEADERSHIP, C2 DESTROYED
- IRAQ'S STRATEGIC OFFENSE & DEFENSE (MISSILES AND LONG - RANGE AIRCRAFT) ELIMINATED FOR EXTENDED PERIOD
- INTERNAL ECONOMY DISRUPTED
- IRAQ'S CAPABILITY TO EXPORT OIL NOT SIGNIFICANTLY DEGRADED
- PENINSULA NATIONS WOULD HAVE COMBAT CAPABILITY TO DEAL EFFECTIVELY WITH RESIDUAL IRAQI FORCES

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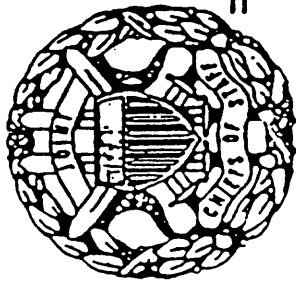

- Available for immediate engagement
  - 4 A-10 Squadrons (96)
  - 2 AV-8B Squadrons (40)
  - 3 F/A-18 Squadrons (36)
  - 2 AH-1W Squadrons (30)
  - 4 AH-64 Squadrons (75)
- Instant Thunder addresses many common targets
  - Air Superiority
  - Command and Control
  - Interdiction
- Combined Instant Thunder and battlefield air operations can stop ground advance
- Minimal impact on Instant Thunder

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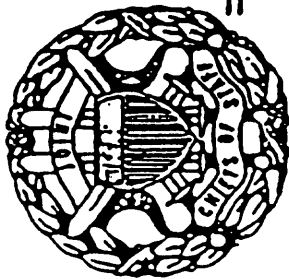
## LOGISTICS AREAS OF CONCERN

- HARM (AGM-88) -- 1100 IN USAFE AWAITING LIFT
- I-2000 (FOR GBU-27) -- 163 IN USAFE AWAITING LIFT
- AIRBASE FUEL OPERATIONS -- GROUND REFUELING MAY NOT MEET SORTIE SURGES. IN-THEATER ANALYSIS AND AUGMENTATION SOURCING STUDY REQUIRED.
- MUNITIONS BUILD-UP -- AVAILABILITY OF COMPLETE ROUNDS AT POINTS OF INTENDED USE. ENSURE UNLOADING AT PORT, COMPONENT MOVEMENTS, INTRATHEATER MOVEMENT, AND BUILD-UP AT BASES ARE PHASED.

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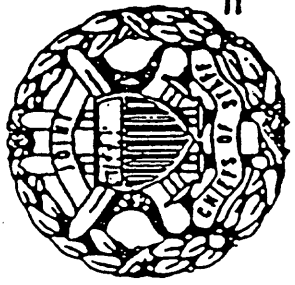
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# ISSUES AND LIMFACS



- Night PGM Capability
  - F-111D's have no laser designation capability
  - More night designators for leadership and air defense targets
- USE OF MULTINATIONAL ASSETS
  - Significant aid to Instant Thunder air superiority and offensive counter-air plan
  - Integration poses a challenge
- AIRSPACE CONTROL PLAN
  - Simple airspace control plan required
  - Must not inhibit air superiority weapons employment
- MUNITIONS DISTRIBUTION
  - Must get to proper bases

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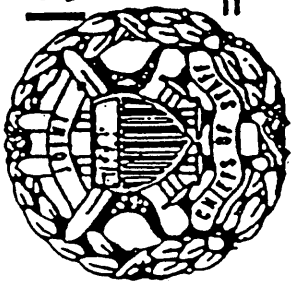

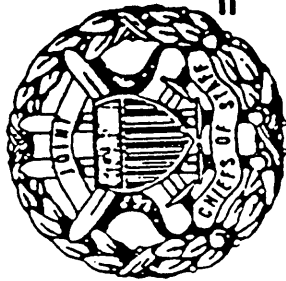
- Targeting
- Must refine constantly to meet strategic situation and new intelligence information
- For example, need to target National Palace Guard and Muhabarat headquarters, dispersal fields, etc
- Long-Range Missiles
- Chemical-capable long-range SCUDs present real problem
- Political
- Status of Turkey, Iran
