Subj: MISSION AND FUNCTIONS OF NAVAL LEGAL SERVICE OFFICES AND

TRIAL SERVICE OFFICES

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To promulgate the assigned geographic areas of responsibility and functions to be performed by Naval Legal Service Offices (NLSOs) and Trial Service Offices (TSOs).
- 2. Cancellation. NAVLEGSVCCOM Instructions 5450.1D and 5450.15.
- 3. <u>Mission</u>. As outlined in this instruction, the mission of NLSOs and TSOs is to provide legal services within a given geographical area and to perform such other functions or tasks as may be requested or directed by competent authority. Reference (a), the Naval Legal Service Office/Trial Service Office Manual, shall govern the general administration and operation of NLSOs and TSOs, except as modified by this instruction.

4. Status and Command Relationships.

- a. NLSOs and TSOs are shore activities under the command of Commander, Naval Legal Service Command, an echelon 2 commander. NLSOs and TSOs are subject to the area coordination authority of the commands listed in enclosure (1), or to such other commands and activities in the applicable geographic area as may be designated by appropriate instruction.
- b. This instruction is effective immediately for NLSOs modified and TSOs established under the NLSO/TSO reorganization plan. Those activities which have not yet reorganized will, until the effective date of their reorganization, continue to operate under previously issued instructions. Responsibility for Cuba, the Caribbean Sea, and the islands of the West Indies (i.e., Greater Antilles, Lesser Antilles, and the Bahamas) will shift to NLSO Southeast and TSO Southeast effective 1 January 1998.

5. Action

- a. Each NLSO shall, except where specifically indicated, provide all legal services set forth in enclosure (2) within the geographic area of responsibility assigned in enclosure (1). Each TSO shall, except where specifically indicated, provide all legal services set forth in enclosure (3) within the geographic area of responsibility assigned in enclosure (1). Individual NLSOs and TSOs, however, should be responsive to requests for the provision of legal services to commands, activities, and individuals outside of the assigned geographical area as the need arises. To that end, direct liaison among commanding officers of NLSOs and TSOs in affected regions is appropriate. The Commander, Naval Legal Service Command, shall be consulted for resolution of functional assignment issues not readily resolvable at the local level.
- b. Commanding Officers of NLSOs and TSOs with command authority and responsibility for detachments or branch offices shall delineate and assign, in writing, the mission, functions and tasks for such detachments or branch offices in a format consistent with this instruction. These mission, function and task directives shall be submitted to Commander, Naval Legal Service Command, for approval prior to promulgation.

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NAVAL LEGAL SERVICE OFFICES (NLSOs) AND TRIAL SERVICE OFFICES (TSOs), WITH AREA COORDINATORS AND GEOGRAPHIC AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY

1. NLSO Central

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Chief of Naval Education and Training.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) for Alabama; Arkansas; the Pensacola and Panama City areas of Florida (Zip 324-325); Kentucky; Louisiana; Mississippi; Missouri; Tennessee; Texas; that portion of Mexico east of the states of Chihuahua, Durango, Nayarit, Jalisco, and Colima; the Gulf of Mexico west of longitude 87W; and the Central American countries of Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama. In addition, provide consolidated claims services in Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), Military Claims Act (MCA), and Medical Care Recovery Act (MCRA) for the following areas: all of Florida and the other states listed above, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

NLSO Europe and Southwest Asia (EURSWA)

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Naval Forces, Europe, exercised through Commander Fleet Air, Mediterranean.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) -- except for claims services under the FTCA, MCA, MCRA, and the Foreign Claims Act (FCA) -- for the United Kingdom; Ireland; Europe; the Mediterranean Sea; the African Continent; and the Eurasian Continent and Indian Ocean areas/islands lying west of longitude 60E. Per DODDIR 5515.8[series] (Subj: Single-Service Assignment of Responsibility for Processing of Claims), the Navy has the single service assignment of responsibility for processing claims arising in Bahrain, Iceland, Israel, Italy, Portugal, Tunisia, Greece, Spain, and UAE. NLSO EURSWA may be asked to assist the adjudicating authority in processing various aspects of MCA, MCRA, and FCA claims cases arising in these countries and in its area of responsibility.

3. NLSO Mid-Atlantic

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, exercised through Commander, Naval Base, Norfolk, VA.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) for North Carolina, Virginia (less Northern Virginia area (ZIP 220-223)), West Virginia, Azores, Bermuda, Greenland, Iceland, and all Atlantic (excluding the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico) and Arctic Ocean areas and islands not otherwise assigned. In addition, provide consolidated claims services in FTCA, MCA, and MCRA for the following areas: all of Virginia and the other states listed above, Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, and the District of Columbia.

4. NLSO North Central

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, exercised through Commandant, Naval District Washington, D.C.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) -- except for claims services under the FTCA, MCRA, and MCA -- for Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, the Northern Virginia area (Zip 220-223), Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, Wisconsin, and Canada (provinces of Manitoba, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Northwest Territories, Nova Scotia, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, and Saskatchewan only).

5. NLSO Northwest

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet, exercised through Commander, Naval Base, Seattle, WA.
- b. <u>NLSO geographic area of responsibility</u>: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) -- except for claims services under the FTCA, MCRA, and MCA -- for Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Wyoming, Canada (provinces of British Columbia, Alberta, and Yukon only), and Pacific and Arctic Ocean areas and islands north of latitude 45N and between longitude 120W and the International Date Line.

6. NLSO Pacific

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet, exercised through Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Japan.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) -- except for claims services under the FTCA, MCRA, MCA, and FCA -- for Antarctica; Australia; and all Arctic, Indian, and Pacific Ocean areas and islands and the Eurasian Continent east of longitude 60E and west of the International Date Line (when north of latitude 45N) and longitude 135W (when south of latitude 45N). NLSO Pacific may be asked to assist the adjudicating authority in processing various aspects of MCA, FCA, and MCRA claims cases arising in its area of responsibility (except for Guam and Hawaii, which will be adjudicated by NLSO Southwest).

7. NLSO Southeast

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, exercised through Commander, Sea Based ASW Wings Atlantic.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) -- except claims services under the FTCA, MCRA, and MCA -- for Florida (less Pensacola/Panama City area (Zip 324-325)), Georgia, South Carolina, the Gulf of Mexico east of longitude 87W, Cuba, the Caribbean Sea, the islands of the West Indies (i.e., Greater Antilles, Lesser Antilles, and the Bahamas), and South America.

8. NLSO Southwest

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet, exercised through Commander, Naval Base, San Diego, CA.
- b. NLSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (2) for Arizona; California; Colorado; Kansas; Nevada; New Mexico; Oklahoma; Utah; that portion of Mexico including and west of the states of Chihuahua, Durango, Nayarit, Jalisco, and Colima; Pacific Ocean areas and islands south of latitude 45N and east of longitude 135W; Ecuador; Peru; and Chile. In addition, provide consolidated claims services in FTCA, MCA, and MCRA for the following areas: the states listed above, Alaska, Guam, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, Wyoming, and Pacific and Arctic Ocean areas and islands north of latitude 45W and between longitude 120W and the International Date Line.

9. TSO East

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, exercised through Commander, Naval Base, Norfolk, VA.
- b. TSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (3) for Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, Virginia, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Azores, Bermuda, Canada (provinces of Manitoba, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, Northwest Territories, Nova Scotia, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, and Saskatchewan only), Greenland, Iceland, and all Atlantic (excluding the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico) and Arctic Ocean areas and islands not otherwise assigned.

10. TSO Europe and Southwest Asia (EURSWA)

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Naval Forces, Europe, exercised through Commander Fleet Air, Mediterranean.
- b. TSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (3) for the United Kingdom; Ireland; Europe; the Mediterranean Sea; the African Continent; and the Eurasian Continent and Indian Ocean areas/islands lying west of longitude 60E.

11. TSO Pacific

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet, exercised through Commander, Naval Base, Pearl Harbor, HI.
- b. TSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (3) for Antarctica; Australia; and all Arctic, Indian, and Pacific Ocean areas and islands and the Eurasian Continent east of longitude 60E and west of the International Date Line, when north of latitude 45N, and longitude 135W, when south of latitude 45N.

12. TSO Southeast

a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet, exercised through Commander, Sea Based ASW Wings, Atlantic.

b. TSO qeographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (3) for Alabama; Arkansas; Florida; Georgia; Kentucky; Louisiana; Mississippi; Missouri; South Carolina; Tennessee; Texas; that portion of Mexico east of the states of Chihuahua, Durango, Nayarit, Jalisco, and Colima; the Gulf of Mexico; the Central American countries of Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama; Cuba, the Caribbean Sea, and the islands of the West Indies (i.e., Greater Antilles, Lesser Antilles, and the Bahamas); and South America.

13. TSO West

- a. <u>Area coordinator</u>: Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet, exercised through Commander, Naval Base, San Diego, CA.
- b. TSO geographic area of responsibility: Provide legal services described in enclosure (3) for Alaska; Arizona; California; Colorado; Idaho; Kansas; Montana; Nevada; New Mexico; Oklahoma; Oregon; Utah; Washington, Wyoming, Canada (provinces of British Columbia, Alberta, and Yukon only); that portion of Mexico including and west of the states of Chihuahua, Durango, Nayarit, Jalisco, and Colima; and Pacific Ocean areas and islands east of the International Date Line, when north of latitude 45N, and longitude 135W, when south of latitude 45N; Ecuador; Peru; and Chile.

FUNCTIONS ASSIGNED TO NAVAL LEGAL SERVICE OFFICES

<u>Functions</u>

- a. Each Naval Legal Service Office (NLSO) will establish an aggressive outreach program to meet service member legal assistance and claims needs. In order to resolve these needs before scheduled deployments, NLSOs will coordinate with line commands and the local TSO to ensure efficient processing.
- b. All NLSOs will perform the functions and provide the services indicated below:

In the case of deployed units and outlying activities, the use of mobile JAG trial teams (MOJAGs) to provide legal services on site often represents the optimum method of rendering comprehensive and responsive legal services. Accordingly, each NLSO will perform the functions and provide the services indicated above on site to deployed units and outlying activities within its assigned geographic area of responsibility, upon request. This will be accomplished by use of mobile JAG trial teams, or by any other mutually satisfactory method under the attendant circumstances.
