









NAVY GUARDS THE FLEET THAT HELPS FEED BRITAIN













MAN OVERBOARD!!!

A thrilling midnight rescue at sea

CLARENCE LETTENEY,

'I was one of a crew of seven', writes Clarence Letteney of Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, 'on the ship 'Accuracy', carrying lumber from Apple River, N.S., to Boston.

to Boston.

'A few hours out in the Bay of Fundy, our ship ran into a gale. The shipper sent me out on deck to tighten the chains around the lumber. A great wave broke completely over us and almost lay the ship on her beam ends.'




