


Ehrlichman and Haldeman are clearly too good a team to split up. Interestingly, NASA has long wanted to try an experiment critical to any eventual manned flight to Mars: Can two men exist together in a compartment not much larger than a septic tank for twelve months without going crazy or killing each other? Those two fellows could make a heck of a contribution to the nation's space program.

There's a great piece of our American heritage going down the drain: Indian ceremonial songs, particularly Hopi. Tribal elders absolutely refuse to permit recording equipment or photography. John Dean, with his phenomenal memory and his flexible personality, could get into their good graces and snaffle up the whole shebang in that mushy gray tape recorder he has in his head. Mardian, La Rue, Chapin, Strachan, and the rest of them-well, look, can a man survive total immersion in untreated sewage for five minutes or can't he?; wouldn't it be nice if just a few of the seriously disturbed individuals in asylums across the land had a sympathetic ear for their tales of molestation by larger than average garden vegetables from the Planet Whizbang?; and wouldn't the country as a whole benefit if at least a start were made on converting the Library of Congress to the simple, clearly understandable Dewey Decimal System?

Of course, alternatively, all of the draft evaders and deserters could just be admitted unconditionally, but after all, they did break the law, and in this great country of ours, we have always abided by the principle that no one, great or small, should escape the consequences of his unlawful acts.

The blatantly obvious decision by a number of National Football League team owners to cut players, regardless of playing ability, who were leaders of the unsuccessful football strike has reportedly helped to revive the faltering Players' Association, and some of its original organizers are optimistic that a more modest form of job action during the NFL season may prove highly effective. Rather than seeking support for another total walkout, they are said to be planning to try out a number of traditional labor tactics to force the NFL owners to come to terms. Among these are: holding lengthy "chapel huddles" on the field during an actual game and suing referees who impose delay-ofthe-game yardage penalties for "unfair labor practices"; refusal on the part of firm union members to pass the ball or make hand-offs to nonunion members; staging regular "slowdowns" in which participating players would walk through plays; institutionalizing the already considerable specialization of the game by forbidding tackles to do the work of blockers, or blockers to tackle; and "playing to rule"-that is, scrupulously observing every regulation in the NFL rulebook, and thus, for example, insisting that the game be halted every few minutes so that the football can be inspected to see if it has the precise allowable pressure and just before kickoff, calling for a complete relining of the field prior to play if a scrupulous measurement by laser surveying techniques reveals that it is off in length or width by so much as an inch.

It really does seem that the only decent, the only truly fair thing that President Ford can do to resolve the awesome inequity of his ill-considered resort to the Presidential powers of pardon is just to go right ahead and pardon the entire country, all 202 million citizens. And not just for serious crimes, like burglary and murder, but for traffic tickets, minor income tax discrepancies, cheating on exams, marital infidelity, shoplifting-everything. Frankly, there are several good reasons for doing it. First, much of the nation is in ill health (some 30 million citizens suffered from serious diseases or were injured in accidents during 1974, and in the last few years, just about everyone has been sick with at least a cold). Then, too, there is the argument that the nation has already suffered enough. The war, inflation, unemployment, the constant threat of nuclear catastrophe, the spectacle of our government falling into ruin-let's face it, we've been hung, there's no need to draw and quarter us. Why pick the carcass? We've been through an American tragedy. Oh, yes, we did bomb the bejesus out of Indochina, and we do support some of the nastiest sons-of-bitches who ever graced a Presidential Palace or warmed a throne, but we're not crooks. We thought what we were doing was right; we did it in the interest of national security. And we're willing to come right out and say that some of the things we did may look now, in hindsight, like they were mistakes, but at the time, we were just reacting to events. We'll sign the statement tomorrow; we'll confess to misjudgements and bad decisions. And then maybe we can get on with the business of America and put this all behind us: shred a few history books, discreetly deduct a couple of zeros off those Vietnamese casualty statistics. forget about that little matter of all those billions spent spiffing up the privileged portions of our homeland and paranoiacally protecting ourselves against international assassins, and then, in a couple of years, we'll see this whole thing in perspective for what it was: a conspiracy by the biased media and a few self-appointed radical critics to make our nation look bad.

Now that it's all over, the incredible story of how a handful of writers and editors at the National Lampoon brought down the Nixon Administration can at last be told. Unfortunately, we recently inked a hardcover contract with the Distinguished Publishing Co., Inc., which came up with an advance in the high three figures on the condition that prepublication excerpts be strictly limited, and so the short section that follows can only hint at the extraordinary revelations contained in the book:

The next time I saw Deep Throated Laugh was just after the Saturday Night Massacre. The issue was going to press in a couple of days, and we needed some more of the devastatingly accurate jibes at Nixon and the White House staff that had already earned us a second alternate slot on the Enemies' List.

We had developed an elaborate system for arranging meetings designed to protect Deep Throated Laugh's identity as a *NatLamp* source. If he wanted a meeting, I would find two pages stuck together in my weekly subscription copy of *Wet Lust*. I never found out how he

managed to intercept it.

If I wanted a meeting, I'd call him up at the White House and say, "Do you have Prince Albert in the can?" If his answer was no, that meant he couldn't make it, and I would hang up and call again in a day or two. If he said yes, I'd reply, "Well, why don't you let him out?" and we'd meet, exactly six hours later, in a parking place in downtown Washington.

The arrangements for the meeting went off without a hitch. I had called at three. That meant the meeting would be at nine. I set off for the rendezvous at 8:30 to give plenty of time to take a circuitous route. To make sure I wasn't being followed, I took the precaution of having the taxi driver drive in reverse the entire way.

When I arrived at our regular meeting spot, I was horrified to find that a Volvo was occupying the parking space we always used. Deep Throated Laugh was extremely cautious—the slightest departure from routine could spoil everything. But no sooner had I arrived than the owner of the car stepped out of an apartment building nearby, got in, and drove away. With a sigh of relief, I put two quarters in the meter and sat down on the curb to wait.

Deep Throated Laugh arrived five minutes later. He looked tired. Behind the gag glasses with a large rubber nose and heavy mustache he wore to disguise himself, his face was pale, and as I shook hands with him, I realized that he had forgotten to wind up his hand buzzer.

Whenever I met with him, I had to be careful not to push him too hard. He was our best source of comedy material, and we didn't want to lose him. He always continued

MY BILL AWAITS ACTION BY CONGRESS; VITAL TO SAFETY, JOBS, FEET

Progressive steps are being taken to promote safety and local industry in the 19th District as my bill nears a vote in the House this fall.

As voters will remember from previous *Reports*, the Curb Extention/Soft Shoulder and Bridge Abutment Abatement (HR 17533) which I drafted and sponsored provides for the replacement of brittle, nonresilient concrete paving surfaces with water-resistant, impactretardant asphalt road toppings. Not only does this measure promote traffic safety (and by extention, pedestrian safety), but it will benefit Southwest-Central Ohio's asphalt producers—an industry generating 8,000 fine jobs in the greater Dacron area alone.

My bill is a five-point proposal designed to be a major step forward for safe streets (and by extention, safer sidewalk and school bus stops) and will be eligible for 90 percent federal funding, thus relieving greater Dacroners of a severe tax bite when we need it like a hole in the road.

In addition, a growing body of evidence pointing to the traction/impact dangers inherent in concrete pavings and "toppings" underlines the urgency of this legislation.

In brief, my bill will:

 Initiate immediate construction of solid, raised asphalt curbs along all twoand four-lane (federally funded) interstate highways. • Extend all soft shoulders at least 3' (three feet) beyond current inadequate berm specifications.

• Subsequently "top" these lethal motoring hazards with a minimum 3½" (three-and-a-half-inch) thick "buffer face" of pure 100 percent Southwest-Central Ohio asphalt.

 Begin further safety studies on concrete's non-shock-resistant inflexibility under stress.

 Encourage the eventual conversion of existing interstate thoroughfares to heavy-duty, rustproof, top-grade asphalt compositions.

In addition, I am now engaged in long-range research with the U.S. Army Engineers on feasibility projections for the asphalt sealing and refilling of Ohio's own 719 miles of navigable inland waterways and freight canals. With increasing asphalt-awareness in all phases of government on the rise, perhaps someday my proposed Mad Anthony Wayne Memorial Water Causeway linking the sister cities of Dacron and Sandusky may one day become a reality.

SWEATTER INAUGU-RATES FRESH AIR FUND

Recently I took time off from my busy schedule to accept the title of Honorary President of Greater Dacron's Petey Cooper Memorial Fresh Air Fund. The ceremony was held on the site of the soon to be completed "Hall of Asphalt." (When completed, the totally asphaltsheathed, 35-foot edifice will showcase the crucial role asphalt has played in our history—from the first crude Conestoga caulkings to today's playgrounds and proposed safer highways.)

Petey Cooper's tragic loss of over 80 percent of his feet in a motoring mishap involving nonelastic concrete pavement last fall spurred Dacron-area residents to action. A fund was created to enable similarly afflicted kids to spend their Christmas holidays watching amateur hockey matches and special skating fetes at the proposed Dacron National Asphalt Quarry Park & Waterskiing Lake during the off-season.

"Research on concrete is far behind that of other, better-publicized cripplers," I told Asphaltitorium listeners, "and it is up to us to find—and I use the word advisedly—some concrete answers."

"There're a lot of Petey Coopers who are going to have a real fresh air Christmas for a change," my personal legislative assistant Elaine Czyzncky told *Dacron Beacon Journal* newsleuths, "and with the successful passage of Rep. Sweatter's proposed highway curb extention/abatement act, there'll be a lot fewer of them next Christmas."

MY CONGRESSIONAL "REPORT CARD": "A" FOR ASPHALT

 This year I joined with concerned highway construction experts in successfully fighting for an amendment to HR 13667 requiring all future Post Office truck-loading dock and parking lot construction be open to bids from all paving and topping contractors. "King Gravel" and "Boss Concrete," beware!

· I worked for and helped win an additional million dollars for curb-impact and pavement-traction studies.

 I successfully passed legislation making it illegal to use any paving materials in federally-funded road construction projects should they prove in upcoming studies to compare unfavorably in traction durability or impact-resistance with other suitable though less commonlyused paving and roadbed topping materials such as asphalt.

 I proposed that the presently abandoned asphalt quarry in suburban Dacron (the oldest abandoned asphalt quarry of its kind in the tri-state area) be designated a National Monument with provisions for a publicly run, privately owned waterskiing lakeside resort and winter fresh air camp.







Watergate Book Club Every Beard, Bill Effros, and Sean Kelly

GOD IS MY UNINDICTED CO-**CONSPIRATOR** by Charles Colson Colson, a recent convert to evangelical Christianity, tells the inspirational story of his transformation from a ruthless White House aide into a "hatchet man for Christ." Always something of a mystic-he claims to have often heard "voices" on other people's telephones-he describes a vision he had which convinced him to "accept a high-ranking staff position in God's administration." As Colson relates it, an angel appeared in his bedroom disguised in a red halo and told him that God took the position that people who weren't with Him were against Him, and if he didn't support Christ, well, maybe he should eyeball the Old Testament some time and see what happened to certain folks who got in His way. Profoundly moved by his experience, Colson, a lapsed Catholic, began reading the Bible regularly and discovered, as he put it, that "God was no candy-ass" who balked at politicizing the locusts or using a plague or two to achieve His objectives. Colson also was very impressed by what he calls "St. Paul's Memos to the Corinthians" and by Christ's refusal to testify before Pontius Pilate. In an emotional conclusion, he urges everyone to "let Christ break into his heart on an Inner Security basis" and "to leak the good news of the Gospel and plant the word of God."

ASK ME NO QUESTIONS by Richard Helms

In an in-depth account of his activities during the planning of the Plumbers' various break-ins and the subsequent cover-up, former CIA Director Richard Helms pulls no punches as he describes in detail his role in the affair. He begins at the beginning with a description of the long afternoon

naps he took while others-unbeknownst to him-were authorizing the delivery of special CIA equipment to Hunt and Liddy, then goes on to tell of the hours spent at home puttering around in his workshop or weeding his vegetable garden while subordinates were attempting to call off the FBI investigation; his habit (carefully concealed to prevent kidnapping attempts) of strolling in the Virginia woods surrounding the Agency's massive headquarters in MacLean to get a little time off from the hectic pace of his job to consider long range CIA strategy, a habit which coincidentally led to his deputy, General Walters, making the key decisions to aid the White House in its effort to conceal its involvement in the Watergate burglary; the visits to his bedridden Aunt whose grave condition consumed more and more of his vital time and kept him away from his office when important discussions of cover-up tactics were being held; the deteriorating health of his Grandmother, which, in one of fate's bitter little tricks, always seemed to worsen when his Aunt's improved; the secret visits to a doctor for a long and painful series of rabies shots necessitated by his having been bitten by a rabid trout during a lengthy fishing trip he took at the very height of the affair; and the malfunctioning elevator in the CIA building which made him a critical twenty minutes late to a decisive meeting at which lower echelon officials pledged cooperation with the White House in an illegal attempt to suppress evidence and obstruct justice. All in all, a fascinating insight into one of the most interesting aspects of the Watergate case.

biographical books to come out of Watergate; Rose Mary Woods, Mr. Nixon's longtime executive secretary, has produced a handy manual which is likely to prove a boon to everyone from the average reader who never seems to have enough time to get through all the books he's been meaning to read to the harried secretary or stenographer who finds there just aren't enough hours in the day to finish everything her boss gives her to do. There are some similarities between Miss Woods' system and the famous Reading Dynamics course of her namesake, Evelyn Wood-but Rose Mary Woods' technique is simpler and requires no protracted studying or practicing to master. For the average individual who wishes to increase his reading speed, Miss Woods prescribes a foolproof method: Whenever the reader gets to a chapter he doesn't like or finds himself in the middle of a section that isn't holding his interest, he just skips through it until he gets to a part he finds interesting, then tears out all the intervening pages and throws them away. Needless to say, this vastly reduces the time required to read even the longest book, and depending on the individual preferences of any given reader, it can cut a hefty tome like War and Peace down to a lunch-hour browse. For secretaries, Miss Woods offers some simple advice: When in doubt, take it out. Business letters, files, and memos are all improved by judicious cutting, according to Miss Woods, and she makes a strong case for leaving gaps in business corre-spondence. "A good big gap attracts the reader's attention faster than the sharpest paragraph of purple prose,' she writes, adding, "If the page is white, you know it's all right!" As far as dictation goes, she urges stenographers to "go on a word diet" and

adjectives and adverbs—and stick to the "meat and green vegetables" verbs and nouns. "Remember," she counsels, "words you leave out are words you won't have to eat!"

SECRETS OF THE WATERGATE by Martha Mitchell

The mercurial ex-wife of former Attorney General and Nixon Campaign Director John Mitchell spent many long hours in the Watergate office building/apartment complex where she and her husband lived making a comprehensive study of the perplexing structure which gave its name to the nation's worst political scandal. Often alone because of Mr. Mitchell's heavy work load, she explored the Watergate from top to bottom, and in the process, came up with some startling and controversial conclusions. For example, according to Mrs. Mitchell, the dimensions of the Watergate building, when divided by 134³/₈, yield the approximate date of the Russian Revolution, and the office space formerly occupied by the Democratic National Committee, site of the break-in, forms a perfect pentagram with Moscow, Peking, Havana, and Mars, the "Red" planet. Mrs. Mitchell further claims that milk put into a container in the shape of the Watergate will spoil within a day, and pencils, razor blades, and knives placed in a similar receptacle will lose their points or edges within a week. She speculates that the building was deliberately designed without any straight lines to unhinge its occupants-chiefly high-ranking members of the Nixon Administration and other Republican political figuresby mesmerizing them with its sinuous curves. She attributes her own emotional difficulties to "ultracurvaceous wavy thingamabobs" that penetrated her "lymphatic plumbing," causing her to become "loonified" when enormous "pinwheels" secreted in a hidden subbasement were turned on, and by heavy doses of "pink goo" put into the Watergate's drinking water by Viet Cong who slipped up the adjoining Potomac River in submarine sampans.

POLITICAL SCIENCE AND HEALTH, AND A KEY TO THE

TRANSCRIPTS by John Ehrlichman Former close Presidential adviser John Ehrlichman, a longtime devout Christian Scientist, has undertaken a highly ambitious analysis of the Watergate affair, and his role in it, based largely on the teachings of Mary Baker Eddy, the founder of Christian Science. According to Ehrlichman, his alleged participation in the attempted cover-up from the very

day of the break-in, as revealed in the transcripts, was not the illegal attempt to obstruct justice by a politically motivated White House aide that it appeared to be, but the deeply felt, almost automatic spiritual response of a "Christian Political Scientist" following his religious instincts. As Ehrlichman explains it. one of the fundamental beliefs of Christian Science is that all disease and illness are psychosomatic-the result of insufficient faith-and thus, when John Dean reported that there was a cancer on the Presidency, Ehrlichman's immediate reaction was to help the Presidency overcome its "imaginary" affliction through positive moral and religious support. Ehrlichman stresses the importance of "an affirmative frame of mind" in curing "sickness on the body politic," and explains how in the hard struggle of mind over matter, "the voicing of a higher truth might appear to some to be perjury." He concludes his book with an eloquent plea that he not be prosecuted for what was, in fact, the natural exercise of his religious beliefs guaranteed by the First Amendment.

INSIDE OUT

by H. R. "Bob" Haldeman

This intensely personal account of his years in the Nixon Administration by one of its most powerful members will come as quite a surprise to many people who will find the private, troubled man who reveals himself in these pages hard to reconcile with the public image of Mr. Haldeman as a tough, ruthless man who ran the White House like a Drill Sergeant in boot camp. Here is a different Mr. Haldeman indeed, a lonely, tortured man, his every day in the White House turned into agony by a grave hearing defect which he spent virtually every waking moment working desperately-and, as it turns out, successfully-to conceal. Mr. Haldeman dwells at length, but without bitterness, on this tragic condition, which suddenly struck him without warning in early 1970, ironically making him -the man closest to President Nixon -probably the least aware of anyone of what was going on in Watergate. He describes the long hours he spent in secret trying to master lip reading, only to be frustrated by the inevitable collection of sweat on the President's upper lip which would catch the light and momentarily blind him. He tells of his heroic efforts to try to make sense in normal conversations-efforts that sometimes failed as the publicized tape transcripts, filled as they are with disjointed sentences and non sequiturs, so clearly show; and of his habit of

making safe little affirmative noises like "yeah" and "uh-huh" to carry him through rough spots, a habit which now, he sadly admits, makes it appear he was participating in a criminal conspiracy. But the book ends on a happy note. Only a month or so after his departure from the White House, he abandoned his traditional brush cut hair style, and his hearing was miraculously restored.

I WAS DEEP THROAT by Patrick J. Buchanan DEEP THROAT, THAT'S ME by Raymond K. Price THEY CALLED ME DEEP

THROAT by Leonard Garment Unless Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein step in to resolve the dispute-and presumably a combination of journalistic ethics and a sensible disinclination to become involved in the tangle of litigation that is sure to attend the publication of these three books will keep them out of it-it will remain anybody's guess which of these three former White House insiders really was the key source who helped the Washington Post break the Watergate case and who are making a belated attempt to associate themselves with the downfall of Richard Nixon. Mr. Buchanan's height—at six feet two inches, he is by far the tallest of the three—seems to give him an edge (readers of All the President's Men will recall that Deep Throat once left a message for Woodward on a ledge which the five-ten reporter couldn't begin to reach), but Mr. Price offers the most credible account of how Mr. Woodward's home-delivered copy of the New York Times was intercepted so that it could be marked on page twenty to signal Woodward that Deep Throat wanted to have a meeting. According to Mr.' Price, he simply called up and cancelled Mr. Woodward's subscription, then became in effect a newspaper delivery boy-an inveterate early riser and obsessive walker, he regularly took a route to his office in the White House that led past Woodward's apartment building, stopped in a luncheonette next door around 6:30 A.M. for a cup of coffee, read the Times, marked it if he wanted to have the meeting, put Mr. Woodward's name and apartment number in the right hand corner, then dropped it off on the stack of papers outside Woodward's building, having discovered that the doorman never picked them up before 6:45. On the other hand, Mr. Garment's description of the garage where he claims to have met Woodward puts him ahead in this category (Mr. Buchanan in his book has it on the wrong side of the street and Mr. continued

Price incorrectly describes an automobile elevator, whereas the parking facility in question had only ramps). The true story may well never be known, and to make matters even more complicated, there have been persistent rumors in the publishing industry that a planned Watergate reminiscence by Presidential Counselor Bryce Harlow, to be entitled *Confessions of Deep Throat*, has been shelved.

I'M SO CLEAN I SQUEAK by Hugh Sloan

Like so many other Watergate figures, Hugh Sloan, the Treasurer of the Committee to Reelect the President, had to face a hard moral choice when the arrest of CRP staffer James McCord brought the investigation into the highest levels of the campaign organization. Basically, Sloan had to wrestle with two alternatives: He could stick it out and risk going to jail for a year or more for perjury by participating in a coverup to help protect associates whom he didn't like and whom he felt had belittled his role in the campaign, blocked his advancement in the hierarchy, and deliberately frustrated his ambitions, or he could stand alone, and as he put it, "face the Muzak," and tell his story in return for an ironclad pledge that he wouldn't face prosecution. This is a heartening story of one man who couldn't be bought-only leased-and the description of the long, agonizing seconds he spent over his decision on a holiday he took in Bermuda at the height of the investigation will go far towards restoring faith in the younger generation. There are some light moments in the book as well: the time he tripped over a wastebasket and a bundle of important documents he was carrying accidentally fell into a shredder and the balky adding machine in his office which kept coming up with the ridiculous total of \$199,-000 in cash which had been given by him to Gordon Liddy without his having questioned its recipient as to the purpose to which it was to be put. In the end, it is a most reassuring book, and it strongly underscores the sympathy that so many Americans felt as they watched this attractive, likable young man fearlessly implicating all of his superiors in testimony before the Senate Watergate Committee.

I'M UNDER ARREST! by L. Patrick Gray

The one-time Acting Director of the FBI has written a real, old-fashioned, can't-put-it-down kind of book that tells the story of how, as a dedicated FBI man, he spent nearly a year tracking himself down for destroying evidence vital to a criminal trial. The reader is on the edge of his seat throughout the entire remarkable manhunt as Gray puts on disguise after disguise so he won't recognize himself in the mirror while shaving in the morning, avoids friends and family who might call him by name and thus cause him to give himself away, and in countless attempts at flight, tries to shake himself by getting onto planes and buses whose destinations he doesn't know in the futile hope that he can end up someplace and not know where he is. There are heartbreaking scenes as he pleads with himself to surrender, reminding himself of his wife and children and his responsibilities to the office he holds, and then in a climactic, suspense-filled moment, his mind wanders long enough for him to manage to slip the cuffs on himself before he knows what he's doing. Captured at last, he is inclined to throw the book at himself, but, in the course of his seemingly endless pursuit, he has come to know and respect himself, and with the cooperation of key Justice Department officials, he lets himself off with a reprimand.

HOW TO BE YOUR OWN BEST WITNESS—THE MITCHELL MEMORY METHOD by John N. Mitchell

Here is another handy "how-to" book produced by a major Watergate figure, and it's one that lawyers are likely to find particularly useful when preparing their clients for grand jury appearances and trials. Mr. Mitchell has put together a clear, easy-to-learn, foolproof method for "instant amnesia" and, he promises his readers, "even if you've never forgotten anything in your whole life, you can forget everything-quickly, positively, efficiently," with his "anti-mnemonic inoperative recall technique." In addition to a lucid explanation of how to construct "discrepancy disavowal phrases" and "sequence phase dislocations," how to compose "chronology obfuscations" and "non-recollection variations," and how to cause "subject disruption" and "point camouflage," Mr. Mitchell provides the reader with an exhaustive list of what he calls "standard nonresponses" culled from his long experience giving testimony on the Watergate affair and observing the testimony of others. Among the most useful phrases, which he urges the reader to memorize while he's forgetting everything else, are such legally unchallengeable prevarications as:

"Do I recall that? No, I don't!" "Whatever I said I stand on."


- "I do not know of my own knowledge—no."
- "I don't believe that I knew that."
- "I don't recall offhand."
- "I am not sure that I did."
- "I don't recall any such set of facts."
- "I do not have a present recollection of the document."
- "My statement and testimony will be based on my best recollection after a careful review of logs, notes, etc., to try to reconstruct the facts as best I can. I am severely limited in this effort because most of these things were not of great importance."
- "I do not recall it with any clear recollection."
- "I don't recall he so informed me, but I don't recall any of the other 30 or 29 decision items that were apparently also covered in that memorandum and it is not surprising that I wouldn't."
- "I am under that impression, but it is not based on any personal knowledge."
- "I didn't even know, as a matter of fact, until I was told in the rather recent past."
- "I don't recall that."
- "I do not have a present recollection of the document."
- "I am not sure that we know."
- "I am not going to foreclose the possibility that such things may have happened. Neither am I going to assert at this moment that they did."
- "It happens to be a palpable, damnable lie."
- "I do not recall seeing any White House correspondence on the subject."
- "Not to my recollection."
- "I have to give, I guess, the most incredible answer. I don't know ... I simply don't remember."
- "I'll recollect anything you want me to."
- "It is quite possible that was done. I recall no such request."

and, of course, the classic, "I am afraid that I am not your best witness." Judging by Mr. Mitchell's success thus far with his own technique, Mr. Mitchell's book is likely to find a place in years to come on defense tables in every court jurisdiction in the country, and it's a safe bet that scores of witnesses who suddenly find they can't remember their own names will be able to quote whole pages of it verbatim.


Hoover Dams

This photo is conclusive proof that the Hoover Dam was built twice. This is Hoover Dam number one. A surveyor's error (a misplaced decimal point) resulted in the dam's construction a little over one hundred miles too far to the left. Located outside the small desert community of Mesquite Spring, this enormous structure has yet to arouse curiosity. The area's inhabitants think it's a drive-in. Fearing adverse publicity, the Department of the Interior has kept a lid on the multimillion dollar blunder since 1935 by providing the movies. Showing the day this photo was taken was *High Noon* and a short feature, *Wonderful World of Grenades*. The latter is an Army training film.

A lone speaker stand indicates the size of Mesquite Springs; the projector is placed on a card table. Ironically, electricity is supplied by a one horsepower gasoline generator.

Several dozen badly damaged bulldozers, in various states of decay, were found in the vicinity. This lends credence to the theory that there was some attempt by the construction companies involved to push the dam into position on the Colorado River, 112 miles away.





Model 27-D

Above is a reproduction of page 6 from the 1875 Gay Parce Novelty Lighthouse Catalogue (English Language Edition). Rising to a height of 151 feet from toe to torch, the 27-D was by far Gay Parce's largest product. Models 27-A and 27-B were identical in design except that they were, respectively, nine and twelve inches high, thus reflecting the company's original line of business—quality cycling trophies. At the peak of its success in the trophy business, Gay Parce's Research and Development division suggested an expansion into either all-metal headstones or the novelty lighthouse market. The latter course was chosen, and the company foundered. Billions of francs were spent on the prototypes of "major" novelty lighthouses—two 27-Cs and the 27-D. The 27-Cs were fashioned from tin and stood little more than shoulder high. One was purchased by a brothel, and the other was lost at sea en route to the International Exposition in Vienna.

Construction of the larger 27-D drained the corporate treasury. For a short while it was leased to the Marseillaise Boardwalk Concession, but was soon condemned as an eyesore and ordered dismantled. For eight years, 27-D lay in storage while creditors of the now-defunct Gay Paree Company engaged in an acrimonious bankruptcy suit. Finally seized by the French government in lieu of back taxes, its component parts were shipped to New York, where the lighthouse was presented as a gift to the American people.

Unfortunately, the directions for putting it together were in French, and July 4, 1884, found the U.S. unveiling an incorrectly assembled monument. This same language problem occurred in translating the French Government's dedication of the statue. The official inscription should read: "Thanks for taking our tired, our poor, our huddled masses we were yearning to be free of. Now the wretched refuse is teeming on your shore."





The Only Voyage of the Hindenberg

Shown is part of a major discovery made last year on a rundown North Dakota ranch. The bunkhouse and three outbuildings were found to contain vast quantities of motion picture equipment —cameras, editing machines, sound gear, special effects devices, and costumes from the 1930s. Local townspeople said they knew little of the ranch or its history, only that it had been abandoned for over thirty years.

Months of investigation revealed that the original owner was a wealthy Japanese-American named Gerald Kikkoman. Amassing a fortune from his successful soy sauce vending machine company, Kikkoman bought the ranch in 1936, and there pursued his hobby of home movies. The most elaborate of these cinematic undertakings centered around a seventy foot papier maché mockup of a German dirigible, which he named *Hindenberg*.


Thousands of dwarves, secretly recruited from all over North America, were used in the close-up shots of pasengers boarding the zeppelin. This bizarre casting technique, combined with clever use of camera angles, produced the illusion of an immense, 800-foot-long airship. An eleven-inch model was used in the subsequent "fiery crash" scene. A somewhat faded photograph survives (see inset) showing how the model was hung by wires over a tabletop landing field. Notes on the back explain that the fuselage was stuffed with oil-soaked cotton balls and set on fire. The dramatic sound effects were produced by crinkling cellophane in front of a microphone at a Baptist Tent Revival.

Renting thousands of theatres, Kikkoman premiered his film nationwide on May 6, 1937. It proved so convincing that audiences believed they were viewing a newsreel. That it was all fiction and that there never was a Hindenberg or a Lakehurst, New Jersey (the fictitious scene of the tragedy), was never grasped. Letters of sympathy and offers of blood flooded the New Jersey Red Cross. A total of eighty-one funerals were held by families who thought relatives had perished in the conflagration. In Vatican City, the Pope held a Solemn High Mass for the few survivors and offered a prayer for blimps. The world was stunned.

Four years later (1941) was a bad time to be a Japanese-American. After transferring military men there for more than three years, the government discovered that Lakehurst Naval Airfield didn't exist. Compounding that embarrassment was the attack on Pearl Harbor. On December 8, 1941, military police arrested Kikkoman and, under the auspices of the Japanese Relocation Act, quietly airlifted him to Manila. Eventually making his way to Japan, Kikkoman turned to production of lowbudget horror movies and eventually headed one of the largest movie studios in the world until his death in 1963.


The St. Louis Space Needle

October 28, 1965—The disastrous fall of the tallest space needle ever erected is captured here on film by an Iowa tourist. (Both photographer and negative later disappeared under mysterious circumstances.)

Built to commemorate the St. Louis aero-space industry, it was christened "Pathway to the Moon," and rose to a majestic fourteen hundred feet before buckling twenty minutes after its dedication. Clearly visible is the Observation Deck, which housed a gift shop, revolving restaurant, and a country and western FM station. A sophisticated drive train permitted the radio station's turntable to rotate the restaurant at 45, $33\frac{1}{3}$, or 78 rpm, depending on the record being played. Unconfirmed reports indicate that over 300 patrons, 22 busboys, 6 chefs, and a cashier perished as the twirling eatery screwed itself into the Mississippi mudbank.

Numerous lawsuits by the victims' families were thrown out of court when their lawyers found themselves unable to legally prove that the Space Needle had ever existed. All relevant documents had been ordered destroyed by the city council and the structure was immediately rechristened "Gateway to the West." However, it *is* known that the city paid medical expenses for a number of persons maimed by an unexplained shower of Conway Twitty albums.

Only this photo and a hot pink "St. Louis Space Needle Souvenir Pillow," which washed up later at New Orleans, bear testimony to the ill-fated tower. \Box



But they did not miss the exiled Spigger. Rats do not know the meaning of loyalty or friendship or compassion. They know only greed and guile and fear. 




















The case for bottling up rage. Many therapists trace man's violence to bottled-up anger. But now a psychologist has marshalled evidence to show that venting violent emotions merely strengthens the tendency to behave in violent ways.

Mixed marriages. An in-depth study of 20 blackwhite marriages explores daily life in mixed marriage, reveals problems with family, friends, and community, and undercuts misconceptions.

Emotional effects of jogging. When middleaged men embark upon a regular exercise program, it has been found, their personalities change. They become more self-sufficient, resolute, stable, and imaginative. But they also have increased feelings of guilt and become accident-prone.

Backstage behaviorism. A psychologist who studied acting and directing describes Lee Strasberg's school of Method Acting and explains the scientific control of behavior that is as important to the Stanislavski method as it is to key-pecking pigeons.

The many masks we wear. If you seem like different people at different times, does that mean you're a phony or wishy-washy? A noted psychologist argues that on the contrary having multiple identities is healthy and should be encouraged.

Men drive women crazy. Women, brainwashed by society, are more likely to require psychotherapy than men are. A New York psychologist says that psychotherapists—both male and female—hold up as desirable for women those characteristics that they would never associate with healthy adults.

Brainwashing works. In just 40 minutes, using no coercion, a psychologist can alter your basic values and change your behavior. Students at one university showed changed behavior as long as 17 months after the experiment, says a social psychologist as he ponders the ethical implications of his work.

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

of "I was there" books by individuals marginally related to the Watergate affair is this first-person account of his part in the events by a Washington Post copy boy. The book captures the atmosphere in the city room at the newspaper that virtually singlehandedly pursued the story of the break-in and the cover-up in the face of determined opposition and intimidation by the Nixon Administration. "The rows of typewriters sat like so many squat black lizards, the copy paper darting in and out like tongues," Gibbons writes, "or maybe the paper was so many oblong white flies the lizards were eating, and the incessant click-clack was the sound of their teeth grating, but whichever, it seemed to me that the little bells that sounded when the carriages reached the end of the margins were tolling the end of the Nixon Presidency." Gibbons spends a large part of the book describing the climactic day in May, 1973, when, as he relates it, "I was taking a style piece on spring picnic fashions to the composing room, and whang, there he was, or someone who looked a lot like him, just standing right there in the city room. All I could think of was, he could have just come from a meeting with Deep Throat, or that's what I would have thought of a year later after I read the book. It's a moment I won't soon forget." Gibbons has also included an inside glimpse into the Post-for example, the cafeteria is on the second floor, and the copy paper has thin red margins-and a personal account of his feelings when Mr. Nixon made his resignation speech. "Like a lot of people, I just couldn't believe it was over," he says. "It really seemed like some kind of novel or something."

TEN TO LIFE WITH FATHER by Julie Nixon Eisenhower

No lover of Middle-Americana will want to miss this often pathetic, sometimes hilarious, and occasionally almost human recollection of girlhood in one big house and womanhood in another. Here is the tough but tender tale of a close-knit family, and a father whom the neighbors considered eccentric. Mrs. Eisenhower's anecdotes about almost losing her spaniel, about her father's concern for helicopter-proof hair spray, and of the big masquerade party her dad insisted upon even though the family couldn't afford it ("we'll find the money somewhere, dear"), will raise a smile . . . and the story of the marriage of retarded sister Trish after her museum molestation by left-wing Jews will raise the dander of any redblooded reader. Another winner from the author of I Thought You Promised Me a Rose Garden.

HOW TO AVOID PAROLE by G. Gordon Liddy

The wacky, colorful former Plumber has drawn on his legal background to produce a handy guide for the prisoner who wants to spend the rest of his life in jail. Liddy offers a clear, straightforward explanation of those aspects of criminal justice of greatest interest to the inmate who faces a sudden reduction in his sentence, including trial procedure and the appeals process, and he (in return for cooperation with prosecutors) suggests a number of simple strategems anyone in jail can use to frustrate release-happy parole boards, lenient judges, and plea-bargaining prosecutors. Among his ingenious prison term prolongation techniques are: refusing to state one's name and address when called to testify on the grounds that the information might prove incriminating; piling up lengthy, easily incurred contempt of court sentences to stretch out one's time behind bars; entering pro forma not guilty pleas, but ensuring that the outcome of the trial is a certain guilty verdict by refusing to provide one's own lawyer with any information relating to the case; and, whenever possible, actually insulting the judge in a few well-chosen remarks prior to sentencing. In an increasingly liberal criminal justice system where reduced sentences, generous grants of immunity, and quick parole are the rule, Liddy's own success with his novel technique—he is currently slated to serve approximately half a century in prison-is an impressive testament to the sound legal thinking evident throughout this unusual book.

ARE YOU EQUIVOCATING WITH ME, JESUS?

by Father John J. McLaughlin In a chatty, wide-ranging reinterpretation of the Bible, the controversial Jesuit priest, who was one of a handful of religious figures who supported President Nixon to the bitter end, comes up with a number of new perspectives on the Old and New Testaments. For example, he attributes the expulsion of Adam and Eve from Eden to "poor counsel from a key advisor"; he urges proponents of massive bussing to reread the chapter of Exodus that tells of the destruction of Pharaoh's chariots in the Red Sea; he offers a ringing defense of the moneychangers in the temple; he enumerates the many accomplishments of Christ's "Messiahcy," including his vital support of the tax concept ("render unto Caesar") and his rejection of the cumbersome and outdated Ten Commandments in favor continued on page 92

The Runaway Grand Jury


President Nixon—How about the other probabilities? Dean—We have a runaway Grand Jury up in the Southern District.

-White House Transcripts, Meeting of March 21, 1973

Of all the institutions in the Anglo-Saxon legal tradition, none is more powerful than the grand jury. Composed of up to twenty-three members and serving for as long as eighteen months in some courts, it can act by majority vote to compel the testimony in secret of any individual without benefit of counsel; it can command the delivery for its inspection of anything it regards as relevant evidence; it can grant immunity from criminal prosecution to any individual, thus compelling him to testify even if he has pleaded the Fifth Amendment; and, in its basic function, it can issue indictments, thus forcing individuals to stand trial for crimes, even when the evidence against them falls far short of the strict definition of proof beyond a reasonable doubt required in a criminal trial.

It has been argued by some who fear the inquisitorial nature of such bodies that powers as sweeping as these ought not to be entrusted to ordinary citizens lacking in experience in the involved and delicate processes of the courts. But in practice, the grand jury, hamstrung as it is by its ignorance of the law, is virtually always a creature of the prosecutors who summon it, and is invariably content to follow their lead. The real danger lies in its use for improper purposes by a politically minded or vindictive prosecutor bent on furthering his career or exacting revenge on opponents. For it is a fact that even if, in an ensuing criminal trial, the charges against him are proven to be totally baseless, in the mind of the public the individual under indictment is inevitably assumed to be guilty. And, in those rare cases where a grand jury, disapproving of the prosecutors' conduct of the proceedings, decides to take actions on its own, its very unwieldiness is a more than sufficient safeguard against abuse. In a panel made up of nearly two dozen citizens chosen at random from computerized jury selection lists, the odds against there occurring even a tiny minority inclined to misuse their high authority are obviously overwhelming. There is always the chance of one or two rotten apples turning up. But a whole barrelful—it just can't happen.*

Articles of Impeachment exhibited by the House of Representatives of the United States of America in the name of itself and of all of the people of the United States of America, against JOHN F. KENNEDY, President of the United States of America, in maintenance and support of its impeachment against him for high erimes and misdemeanors.

RESOLVED

That John F. Kennedy, President of the United States, is impeached for high crimes and misdemeanors, and that the following articles of impeachment be exhibited to the Senate.

ARTICLEI

2 Whereas in his conduct of the office of the President of the United States, John F. Kennedy, in 3 violation of his constitutional oath faithfully to execute the office of President of the United States 4 and, to the best of his ability, preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States, 5 and in violation of his constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed, has prevented, obstructed, and impeded the administration of justice in that: In the matter of Bobby G. 6 Baker, Secretary of the Senate Majority, it having been disclosed as a consequence of a civil suit 7 8 filed against Baker, an employee of the government of the United States from the time he first served 9 in the United States Senate as a Page, then being fourteen years of age, until the present time, that Baker, whose salary has never exceeded \$19,600 per annum, has nevertheless amassed a personal 10 11 fortune in excess of \$2,000,000 through the misuse of the powers and privileges of his position of 12 trust to cause legislation favorable to individuals and companies to be passed by the United States Senate, and to cause individuals and companies seeking the award of government contracts and 13 other benefits to do business with certain enterprises with which he was associated and to patronize 14 15 certain establishments in which he held an interest, receiving in return: options to purchase stock at less than the market price; part ownership of a vending machine company entirely capitalized 16 by individuals linked to organized crime; 50 percent ownership of a motel in Ocean City, Maryland; 17 a secret partnership in a life insurance brokerage that sold extensive coverage to Vice-President 18 19 Lyndon B. Johnson, who was then Majority Leader of the United States Senate, with the under-20 standing that part of the commission received from the sale of the coverage would be invested in 21 worthless advertising in the Vice-President's radio station in Austin, Texas; and part ownership 22 in two exclusive social clubs whose members included high ranking individuals in business and 23 government. 24 And whereas, subsequent to these disclosures, John F. Kennedy, using the powers of his high 25office, engaged personally and through his subordinates and agents in a course of conduct or plan 26 designed to delay, impede, and obstruct the investigation of such unlawful activities; to cover up, 27 conceal, and protect those responsible; and to conceal the existence and scope of other related 28 unlawful activities.

29 The means used to implement this course of conduct or plan have included one or more of the 30 following:

31 (1) Making or causing to be made false or misleading statements to lawfully authorized in-32 vestigative officers and employees of the United States.

(2) Withholding relevant and material evidence or information from lawfully authorized
 investigative officers and employees of the United States.

(3) Approving, condoning, acquiescing in, and counseling witnesses with respect to the
giving of false or misleading statements to lawfully authorized investigative officers and employees
of the United States and false or misleading testimony in duly instituted judicial and Congressional
proceedings.

39 (4) Disseminating information received from officers of the Department of Justice of the 40 United States to subjects of investigations conducted by lawfully authorized investigative officers continued

1 and employees of the United States, for the purpose of aiding and assisting such subjects in their 2 attempts to avoid criminal liability; or

3 (5) Making false or misleading public statements for the purpose of deceiving the people of 4 the United States into believing that a thorough and complete investigation had been conducted 5 with respect to allegations of misconduct on the part of personnel in the executive and legislative 6 branches of the United States and that there was no involvement of such personnel in such mis-7 conduct.

8 Wherefore John F. Kennedy by such conduct warrants impeachment and trial, and removal 9 from office.

ARTICLEII

11 Whereas, using the powers of the office of President of the United States, John F. Kennedy, in 12 violation of his constitutional oath faithfully to execute the office of President of the United States, 13 and to the best of his ability preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States, and 14 in disregard of his constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed, has repeat-15 edly engaged in conduct violating the constitutional right of citizens, impairing the due and proper 16 administration of justice in the conduct of lawful inquiries, of contravening the law of governing 17 agencies of the executive branch and the purposes of these agencies.

This conduct has included one or more of the following:

(1) He has, acting personally and through his subordinates and agents, substituted partisan
political considerations for Department of Defense requirements in the selection of a contractor
for the TFX air superiority fighter over the objections of both the Air Force and Navy review
boards which had recommended a different contractor.

(2) He has, acting personally and through his subordinates and agents, in violation or disregard of the constitutional rights of citizens, authorized and permitted to be maintained specialunits within the Departments of State and Defense which reviewed and passed on the acceptability
of all public statements by members of those departments in violation of every citizen's constitutional right of free speech.

(3) He has failed to take care that the laws were faithfully executed by failing to act when he
knew or had reason to know that his subordinate, Secretary of the Navy Fred Korth, who had
supported the decision to award the TFX contract to the General Dynamics Corporation, in violation or disregard of his oath of office, simultaneously negotiated, or took part in, the decision of
the Continental National Bank of Fort Worth to lend money to one of that bank's best customers,
the General Dynamics Corporation.

(4) He has misused the powers of the Presidency to further the well-being of his relatives, in
that he appointed a brother Attorney-General of the United States; he assisted a second brother in
his campaign for a United States Senate seat from Massachusetts; and he appointed his sister's
husband head of the newly created Peace Corps.

38 (5) He has failed to take care that the laws were faithfully executed by failing to act when 39 he knew or had reason to know that his close subordinates endeavored to impede and frustrate 40 lawful inquires by duly constituted executive, judicial, and legislative entities concerning the 41 unlawful dealings of Billie Sol Estes with regard to the fraudulent sale of thousands of chattel 42 mortgages on nonexistent fertilizer tanks; the transfer under suspicious circumstances of Govern-43 ment owned surplus grain from Kansas to Billie Sol Estes' Texas grain elevators; the illegal trans-44 fer of cotton acreage allotments; the violent and unexplained death of the official who had stated 45 his intention to disallow the cotton acreage transfers; and concerning a course of conduct or plan 46 designed to delay, impede, and obstruct the investigation of those activities and protect those 47 responsible by persons within the administration who had themselves received money and gifts 48 from Billie Sol Estes.

Wherefore John F. Kennedy by such conduct warrants impeachment and trial, and removalfrom office.

52 Whereas in his conduct of the office of President of the United States, John F. Kennedy, in violation of his constitutional oath faithfully to execute the office of President of the United States 53 54 and to the best of his ability to preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States 55 and in disregard of his constitutional duties to take care that the laws be faithfully executed ; au-56 thorized, ordered, and ratified the concealment from the Congress of the facts, and the submission 57 to the Congress of false and misleading statements concerning the existence, scope, and nature of 58 American military involvement in Vietnam, Laos, and Cuba, in derogation of the power of the 59 Congress to declare war, to make appropriations, and to raise and support armies, and by such 60 conduct warrants impeachment and trial and removal from office.


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Just a Little Straight Talk among Friends


There was a scuffle on the wharf. Shouts, shrieks, and squealing. Slapping sounds that might have been traps. Then silence.



WHITEHOUSE HALL by Patricia Nixon

In her first piece of sustained writing, the former First Lady has tried her hand at a unique form-a gothic roman a clef. Always her husband's most devoted supporter, Mrs. Nixon spins a thinly disguised tale of heartbreak and woe in the fictional Newcombe family. As the book begins, Robert Newcombe arrives at Whitehouse Hall, a giant, brooding mansion, to take office as President of Wales. With him are his wife, Petunia, and his two lovely daughters, Junie and Trudy. The early years are full of hope and accomplishment as the new Master of Whitehouse Hall puts a stop to crime on the heath, settles a long war in the Isle of Man, makes important diplomatic trips to Jersey and Guernsey, and stops enforced carting of school children across parish lines. For Pet it is a time of joy, marred only by her daughter Junie's marriage-to help her father politically-to the village idiot, Daniel Osierbower, grandson of a previous President of Wales. Newcombe is reelected by the happy Welsh, who reject his evil opponent, Gregory McGudgeon, who has been secretly planning upon gaining office to implement mad schemes like making everyone wear their underwear outside their clothes and turning all of Wales into a free love dude ranch. After the election, it seems to Petunia that everything is perfect, but a wicked witch who publishes a magic newspaper that makes men who read it believe its fantastic lies sets out to destroy the good Master of Whitehouse Hall. Using her devilish powers, she manages to make a harmless attempt by some of Newcombe's madcap retainers to hange wiretapestries in Mad Gregory's headquarters, Watergate Castle, seem like an un-Welsh activity. Shortly thereafter, strange things begin to happen at Whitehouse Hall. Some sinister force plays havoc with Newcombe's tape recorders, the desk lamps begin to emit humming noises, and one by one, his faithful servants desert him. Junie's father puts up a good fight, but he is no match for the devious witch and her hordes of dedicated minions who mount a massive whispering campaign against him. Finally, Newcombe decides to abandon Whitehouse Hall. "One year of this is enough," he cries. "Let us leave this cursed mansion with its secondrate paintings." The family moves to a lovely castle overlooking the sea which Newcombe has built with money he amassed honestly by making a killing in the wattle and daub market, and they live happily ever after.

DENIABILITY, KNOWLEDGE-ABILITY, VULNERABILITY by Gen. Alexander Haig

In a memoir reminiscent of Douglas MacArthur's autobiography, Duty, Honor, Country, General Haig spells out the strict code he lived by from his early days at West Point through his meteoric rise in the Army to his appointment as President Nixon's Chief of Staff. A large part of the book is devoted to an interesting exposition on how to advance to the upper ranks of the military, likely to be read and reread by current Army officers, including such handy pieces of advice as the best way of faking a battalion target-fire-for-record report, the proper wording of citations for awarding medals to oneself, and a foolproof method of making a military unit, all of whose equipment is broken or has been stolen by junkie soldiers and whose troops have a level of training sufficient to be barely able, with six months intensive preparation, to direct traffic in a suburban town in daytime, appear on paper to be capable of mounting a major behind-the-lines operation deep in Eastern Europe on four hours' notice. He enumerates what he calls "the three cardinal principles of leadership," Career Defense, Verbal Containment, and Competition Elimination, which he puckishly translates into the somewhat vulgar argot of the professional soldiers as "cover your ass, shut your mouth, and screw your buddies." His description of the last days in the White House provides a fascinating insight into his key role in Mr. Nixon's resignation. and he concludes his book with a moving citation recommending himself for a Medal of Freedom for the courageous part he played in the painful and difficult process of persuading the President to step down.





And, so saying, Nix-One leapt.


He realized he wouldn't be needing the ship anymore.
