## IMPROVED LINIMENT.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 52,697, dated February 20, 1866.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID EDWARDS, of St. Anthony, in the country of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, have invented a new and useful Composition of Matter for a Medicinal Liniment, called "D. Edward's Monitor Liniment;" and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the ingredients thereof and the manner of combining them in the composition of said medicinal liniment, to wit:

Spirits of turpentine, one pint; alcohol, one pint; gum-camphor, four ounces; oil of cedar,

three gills; aqua-ammonia, four ounces; oil of spike, three ounces; origanum, three ounces. Put the ingredients in a glass vessel in the order named and agitate the compound well before using.

Having thus described my invention what

A liniment composed of the ingredients in the proportions herein described.
