## HAIR-RESTORATIVE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 260,570, dated July 4, 1882.

Application filed April 10, 1882. (Specimens.)

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, CHARLES HUGHES, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Hair-Restorative Composition, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

My composition consists of the following ingredients, combined in the proportions stated, viz: neat's-foot oil, two gills; crude petroleum, one and one-half table-spoonful; alcohol, (proof-spirit,) one gill. These ingredients are to be thoroughly mixed by agitation at about blood heat.

In using the above-named composition for restoring or invigorating the hair, a small quantity is to be poured into the palm of the hand and applied to the hair or scalp, with vigorous rubbing of the scalp, either with the hands or with a hair-brush.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The herein-described hair restoring and invigorating compound, consisting of neat's-foot oil, petroleum, and alcohol, in about the proportions specified.
