

MATCH-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 457,560, dated August 11, 1891.

Application filed September 25, 1890. Serial No. 366, 104. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EBERHARD JUNGINGER, a subject of the Emperor of Germany, residing at Stuttgart, Würtemberg, Germany, have 5 invented certain new and useful Improvements in Match-Boxes, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to improvements in match-boxes of that construction in which the 10 matches are automatically ignited by being

withdrawn from the box.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a vertical transverse sectional view of my improved match-box. Fig. 2 is a vertical 15 longitudinal sectional view of the same; and Fig. 3 is a plan view of the same, parts being broken out.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

The casing a is provided with a series of partitions b b'. To the lower parts of the partitions b the lower ends of spring-strips c are fastened, the upper ends of which bear against the sides of the partitions b'. The partitions b' and the outer side walls a', as well as the springs, are provided with a covering of paper, which is saturated with any suitable substance so as to form a friction or igniting surface. Said coverings are held in 30 place by the spring c. The matches are inserted from the bottom, between the igniting-surfaces d, to such an extent that their upper ends—that is, the ends opposite to the ones provided with the heads—project from the 35 top of the casing so that they can be grasped conveniently and pulled upward. The heads e' are below the friction or igniting surfaces I

d. The casing a, filled with matches, is placed in a suitable box f, and secured in the same in some suitable manner. By pulling the 40 matches upward, the igniting or friction surface causes the igniting of the head. Each match is held independent of the others by a spring c, so that by withdrawing one match the others are not displaced or ignited. 45 The friction-surfaces d are provided on both sides of the coverings, so that when one face is worn out the paper can be reversed and the other face used.

Having thus described my invention, I 50 claim as new and desire to secure by Letters

Patent-

In a match-box, the combination, with a casing having a series of partitions extending from about the top to within a short distance 55 of the bottom of the same, of a series of springstrips secured to the lower ends of some of the partitions and projecting upward, the free ends of said springs resting against the other partitions, prepared paper covering the 60 springs and partitions, a suitable holder for the casing, there being as many springs in the casing as the same is adapted to hold matches, so that each match will be held by a separate and individual spring, substantially as set 65 forth.
