

IMPROVEMENT IN METAL CAPS FOR POSTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 164,979, dated June 29, 1875; application filed April 17, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN DAVENPORT, of Stamford, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and Improved Gate or Fence Post, of which the following is a specification:

The invention will first be described in connection with drawing, and then pointed out

in the claim.

Figure 1 is a side elevation of the metal cap and a portion of the wood part of a gate or fence post, of my improvement. Fig. 2 is a top view; and Fig. 3 is a sectional elevation of the cap, taken on the line x x of Fig. 2.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

A is the wood portion of the post, and B the metal cap, the latter being made in two

parts, a b, and secured by bolts C, the bolts being inserted from the under side of the flange d, forming the cornice, and the nut being confined by the lug d', cast on the inner wall of the part a. The upper part overlaps the lower part at the joint e, so as to effectually prevent the rain from getting inside.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Pat-

ent-

The metallic post-cap B, made in two parts, a b, jointed at e, and provided with fast ningbolts C, passing through flange d and lugs d' as and for the purpose described.
