

## IMPROVEMENT IN SPRING-CLASPS FOR HOLDING CURRENCY, &c.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 166,613, dated August 10, 1875; application filed May 25, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, BUSHROD W. JAMES, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented an Improved Spring-Clasp for Holding Currency, Cards, &c., of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to make a cheap clasp for effectually retaining small currency, tickets, cards, and similar articles, and this object I attain in the manner which I will now proceed to describe, reference being had

to the accompanying drawing, in which—
Figure 1 is a perspective view of my improved retaining clasp; Fig. 2, a side view.

The spring-clasp is formed of a strip of steel or other elastic metal, bent so abruptly at a as to bring the surfaces of the opposite arms b binto close contact with each other, a small opening being formed near the bend for receiving a suspending string or cord. The extreme ends b b of the arms are bent outward from each other, so as to facilitate the introduction

of notes and tickets. In order to obtain a more effectual hold upon the paper introduced into the clasp I corrugate or wave the elastic arms b b where the surfaces of the same come in contact, (see Fig. 2;) or, if preferred, a slight twist may be imparted to the arms first in one direction and then in the other, the corrugations of one arm coinciding with those of the other.

I claim-

A spring-catch for tickets, currency, &c., consisting of a strip of steel or other elastic material, bent and corrugated as described, and presenting clastic arms, corrugations on one arm coinciding with those of the adjoining. arm, all substantially as set forth.
