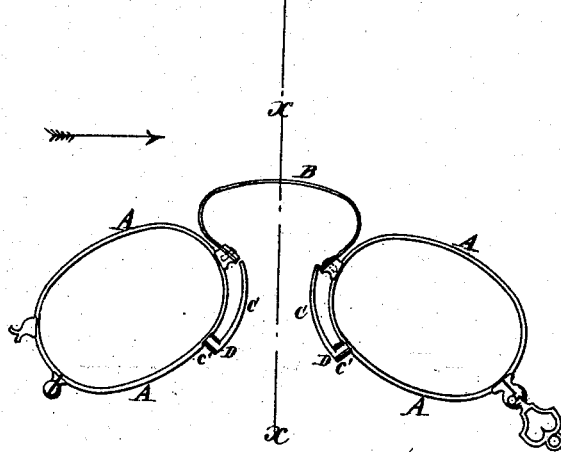
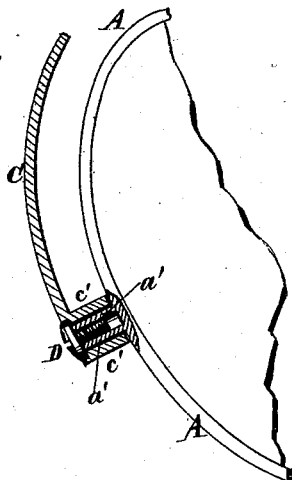

IMPROVEMENT IN EYEGLASSES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **168,122**, dated September 28, 1875; application filed August 28, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES T. L. ANDERSON, of Brooklyn, E. D., Kings county, State of New York, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Eyeglasses, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a plan view of a pair of eyeglasses to which my improvement has been applied. Fig. 2 is an edge view of the inner end of one of the lens-frames, showing the inclination of the nose-rest, the bridge-spring being shown in section through the line *x x*, Fig. 1; and Fig. 3 is a detail view of the nose-rest and a part of the lens-frame enlarged, and partly in section to show the construction.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

The invention will first be fully described in connection with drawing, and then pointed out in the claim.

A are the lens-frames, upon the upper parts of the inner ends of which are formed projections, to which are secured the ends of the bridge or connecting spring B. C are the nose-rests, the upper ends of which are free,

and upon the lower ends of which are formed hubs *c'*, to receive and fit upon studs *a'*, formed upon or attached to the lower parts of the inner ends of the frames A, where they are secured in place by screws D, screwed into the outer ends of the said studs *a'*. The nose-rests C may be adjusted at such an angle with the plane of the lens-frames as the form of the wearer's nose may require, so that the rests C may be parallel with the bridge of the nose, and may fit into the angle between the nose and brow, instead of resting against the sides of the nose transversely, in the manner of ordinary eyeglasses.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A pair of spring-connected eyeglasses, provided with clamps or nose-rests C C', movable on studs *a'* out of the plane of the glasses, as and for the purpose specified.
