

## IMPROVEMENT IN DEAD-CARTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 168,438, dated October 5, 1875; application filed June 12, 1875.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS F. WHITE, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Dead-Animal Truck, of which the following is a specification:

My invention consists of a box for a deadanimal truck, with air tight packing for the door through which the animals are taken in and discharged; also with a door at the front end for the hauling-chain, having air-tight packing, the object being to prevent the offensive smells to which people are now exposed when dead animals are carted through the streets.

Figure 1 is a longitudinal sectional elevation of my improved dead-animal truck, the section being taken on line x x of Fig. 2. Fig. 2 is an end elevation, and Fig. 3 is a section of Fig. 1 on line y y.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A is the close box, which is made air-tight, and is provided with packing B, of rubber or other flexible material, at the joints of the door C, and has a door, E, at the front end, to close the space through which the hauling-chain F works, the chain being detached after the animal has been hauled in, the said door being also provided with packing G, thus making an air-tight box for retaining the offensive

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A dead-cart whose air-tight body is provided with front as well as back door, as and for the purpose specified.
