

## IMPROVEMENT IN CAMP-STOOLS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **180,610**; dated August 1, 1876; application filed February 28, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES M. LUNGREN, of Toledo, in the county of Lucas and State of Ohio, have invented a new and Improved Camp-Stool, of which the following is a specification:

The invention consists of a double ferruleand-hook attachment for the top of the legs, comprising in one casting the hook and the ferrule for connecting the hook to the leg, and also a socket for the attachment of the backsupport.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my improved camp-stool in position for use. Fig. 2 is a perspective view of the stool packed up for transportation. Fig. 3 is a section of the legs and the center-piece, to which they are pivoted. Fig. 4 is a side elevation of one of the legs, back-support, and the hook-and-socket attachment; and Fig. 5 is a plan of a portion of the seat.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A represents the legs, which are pivoted to a center-piece, B, by pivots C, so that they can fold up parallel to each other, as repre-

sented in Fig. 2; or extend for supporting the seat D, as in Fig. 1, said legs having a hook, E, at the upper end, for attaching the seat to, the seat having an eyelet, F, at each corner for that purpose. G is the handle on the under side of the seat, and H the straps for fastening the seat, back-supports L, and the legs together in a compact bundle for carrying. The hook E is cast together with the ferrule J for connecting it to the leg, and a socket, K, is cast together with the ferrule and hook, for attaching the back-support L, making a simple contrivance, by which the legs, seat, and back-supports are firmly and substantially connected together.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent.

The ferrule J, hook E, and socket K, cast in one piece, and combined with the legs A and back support L, substantially as specified.
