


IMPROVEMENT IN PACKING-CASES FOR CRACKERS AND CONFECTIONERY.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 181,329, dated August 22, 1876; application filed June 20, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH GARNEAU, Sr., of St. Louis, in the county of St. Louis and State of Missouri, have invented a new and Improved Packing-Case for Crackers, Confectionery, &c., of which the following is a specification:

The invention will first be described in connection with the drawing, and then pointed out in the claim.

Figure 1 is a sectional elevation of my improved packing-case, taken on the line y y of Fig. 2. Fig. 2 is a horizontal section on the line x x of Fig. 1.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

A is the main case, and B the sample-case, the latter being provided with a transparent side, C, of glass or other approved material,

and being detachably connected to one side of the case A by an extension, D, thereof at the bottom and the cover E, the said case corresponding in length and breadth with the side of the case.

The usefulness of a case of this character is obvious.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The combination of sample-case B, having a transparent side, C, with the main case A, having the extension D, and with the cover E, substantially as specified.
