

### IMPROVEMENT IN DOOR-CHECKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 181,865, dated September 5, 1876; application filed July 31, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES PEIRCE, of Nora, Jo Daviess county, Illinois, have invented a new and Improved Combined Door Check and Buffer, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a plan of a door in section, showing the manner of attaching my improvement; and Figs. 2 and 3 are detail views of the attachment.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

My invention consists in the novel construction and arrangement of a spring-latch attached to the base-board or wall, combined with a catch and buffer that is attached to the door, so arranged that it may act as a latch and buffer combined, or as a latch alone.

A is a latch, that is pivoted to the back piece a, and swings between two curved braces, b b. c c are stop-pins, that limit the motion of the latch up and down. A spring, d, rests on the support e, and presses the latch A upward. The spring d is held in place by a pin, f, that passes through both the latch A and support e. The back piece a is attached to a beveled

block on the base-board or wall. g is a frame containing a piece of rubber, h, and having the catch i attached to the door in such a position that the latch A will engage with the catch i as the door is opened. If the door is opened forcibly, the rubber h acts as a buffer and prevents concussion. If it is desired to use the device as a buffer alone, the pin f is withdrawn, and the spring d is removed, when the latch A will rest on the lower pin c, and is incapable of engaging with the catch i, but may act, in connection with the rubber h, as a buffer.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A door-check provided with latch A, pins c f, spring d, and frame g, the latter having spring h and catch i, the spring d and pin f being removable, as and for the purpose specified.
