

IMPROVEMENT IN PUMPS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 182,363, dated September 19, 1876; application filed May 16, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID NEWTON GREEN, of Rockbridge, Hocking county, State of Ohio, have invented a new and improved Pump, of which the following is a specification:

The invention consists in the improvement

of pumps, as hereinafter described.

Figure 1 is a sectional elevation of the pump, on line x x, Fig. 2; and Fig. 2 is a side elevation.

A is the pump-stock, in the upper part of which are two pump cylinders or barrels, B, each containing a plunger, C, the rod of which is connected to the crank-shaft D to be turned by a handle, L, or by any approved application of power. The barrels B connect below the cheek-valves F with the suction-tube G by the branches H, and at the lower end they are fitted with removable plugs J to let the water run out in cold weather, said plugs being kept in place by the sliding keys K. The top of the pump-stock is closed by a cap, which is firmly secured by the yokes N fitted under

the shoulders O, and connected to the cross-bars M on the top. The spout P is fitted for screwing on a hose or a cap to close it, and in the cap L is a screw-hole for attaching the pipe P, if desired, said hole being closed by a screw-plug, Q, which may be secured in the spout-hole, whereas the spout is fitted in the top. The journal-bearings of the shaft are packed by clamps R, or stuffing-boxes may be used, if preferred. This construction makes a very simple suction and force pump for farm and railroad use, as well as for extinguishing fires, and being suitable for hand or power.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The detachable plugs J, held over lateral apertures in pump stock by sliding keys, as shown and described.
