


IMPROVEMENT IN FOOT-RESTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 183,695, dated October 24, 1876; application filed August 16, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWIN F. MERSICK, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Foot-Rests; and I hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute a part of this specification, and represent, in-

Figure 1, a view of the foot-rest open for use; Fig. 2, a view of the same folded.

This invention relates to an improvement in the construction of foot-rests, and consists of so constructing the upper part of each leg that it shall be either a part of or the support of an attachment intended to be used as a slipper-case or the receptacle of any other articles; and also the method of construction, whereby the covering used over the top of the frame for the leg-support shall also form the joint whereby the lid-cover of the slipper case or box is retained in a proper position in opening, the weight of said lid keeping it

closed unless overcome by the necessary power to lift it; all of which may be more fully understood by reference to the drawings, of

The letters a represent the legs; b, the covering of the top; \hat{D} , the box or slipper-case; d, the lid; c, the side; e, the hinge-fastening of lid.

I do not confine my invention to making the improved foot-rest with cross-legs-using them only as illustrating it because of the convenience of doing so; nor to making the boxlid hinge of same material as the covering of the top; but—
What I desire to claim as my invention is

the following:

A foot-rest, consisting of the cross-legs a a, top b, and receptacles $\bar{\mathbf{D}}$ \mathbf{D} , the latter being formed by the side c, lid d, and upper extremities of the legs a a, as and for the purpose set forth.
