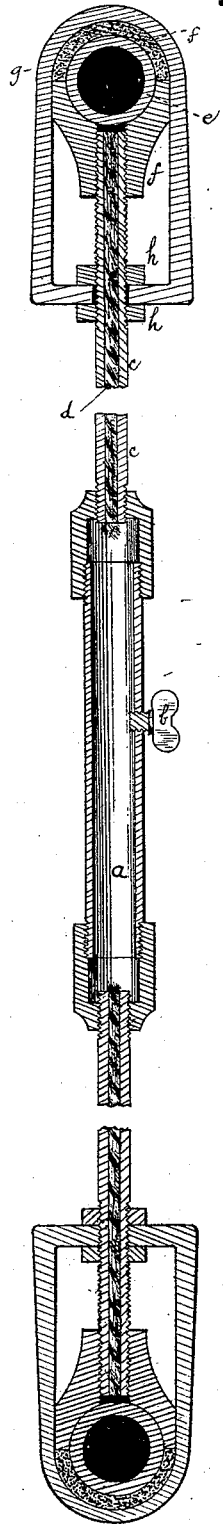

IMPROVEMENT IN PITMEN AND CONNECTING-RODS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **184,911**, dated November 28, 1876; application filed August 24, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, BOZIL S. ROY, of Rockville, in the county of Tolland and State of Connecticut, have invented certain new and useful Improvements pertaining to a Pitman or Eccentric Rod, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which is a view in central vertical longitudinal section.

The letter *a* denotes the central hollow sleeve, designed to be filled with oil through the hole stopped by the thumb-screw *b*. Into each end of sleeve *a* screws a hollow rod, *c*, in

which lies a wick, *d*, to conduct the oil to the bearings, and to filter it. The letter *e* denotes journal-pins; *f f*, boxes for the same; *g*, the encircling loop, and *h h* adjusting-nuts.

I claim as my invention—

The central oil-vessel *a*, the hollow conduit-rods *c*, and the boxes *f*, all combined to form a pitman or eccentric rod, substantially as described.
