## IMPROVEMENT IN COMPOSITIONS FOR PAVEMENTS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 185,064, dated December 5, 1876; application filed September 23, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PHILIP F. BALDAUFF, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, Ohio, have invented a new and useful Composition for Pavements, of which the following is a specification:

To six measures of coal-pitch I add two measures of coal-tar, and heat the same until thoroughly blended and in the condition of thick molasses. I prepare a powder of two measures each of gypsum, of white chalk, and of white cement, and stir the same into the above. I then add four measures of broken marble in particles from the size of a pea to that of a walnut, according to the use or purpose of the composition. Finally, I mingle actively with the above one measure of melted zinc. The composition is then run into suita-

ble molds, whose forms and dimensions may be such as to fit the castings for immediate use, such as for street-thoroughfares, sidewalks, mantel-pieces, &c., or into slabs for shipment and remelting.

I claim as new and of my invention-

The paving composition consisting of coal pitch and tar, gypsum, white chalk, white cement, broken marble, and molten zinc, compounded in the manner substantially as set forth.
