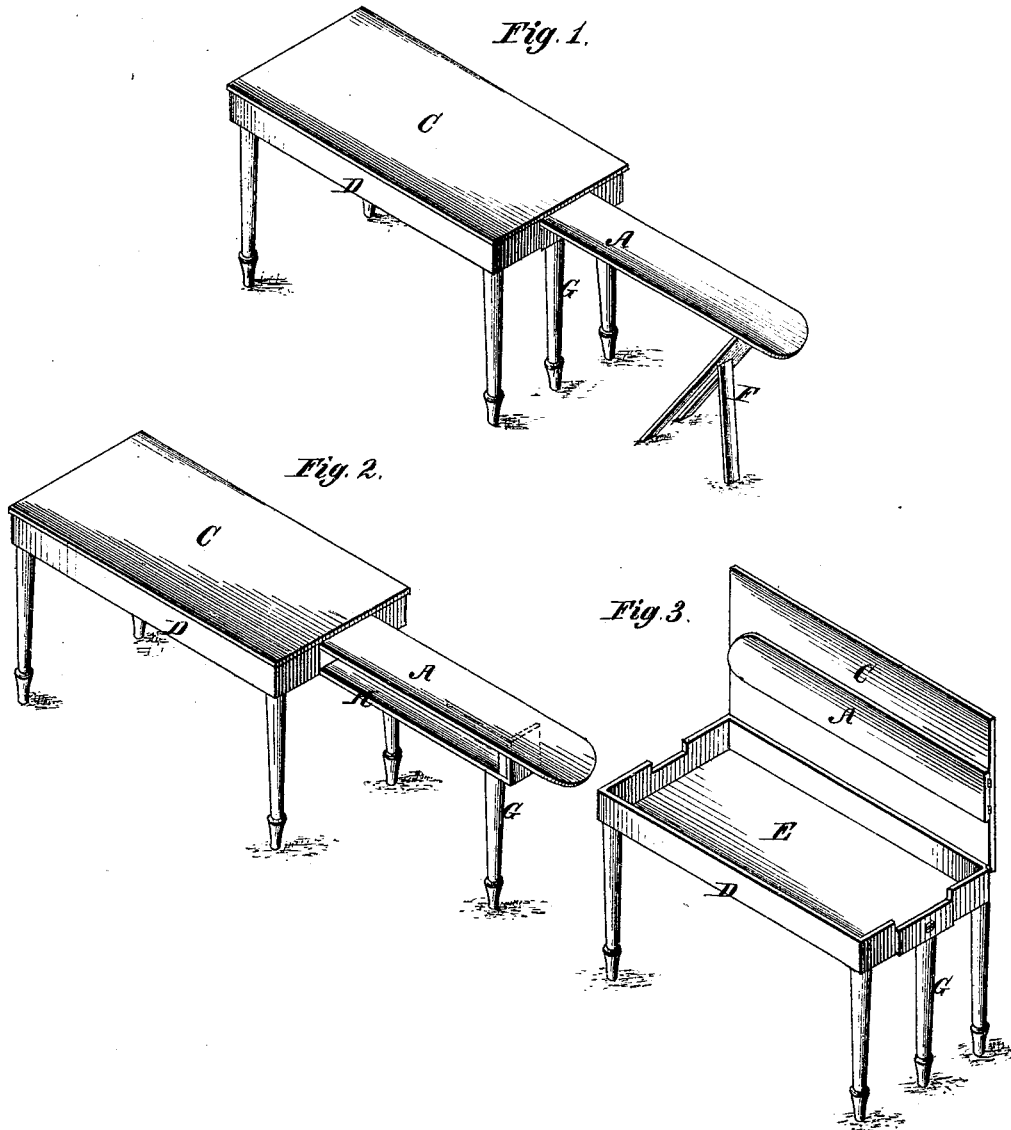

IMPROVEMENT IN IRONING-TABLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **188,161**, dated March 6, 1877; application filed February 23, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD S. McENTIRE, of Burlington, State of Iowa, have invented an Ironing-Table, of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to produce a convenient and substantial combined ironing-table and skirt-board, which is obtained by fastening a skirt-board, A, to the table-top C in such a manner as to allow the skirt-board to be folded under the table-top, and having combined therewith a closet, E, for the storage of ironing-blanket, &c., and a suitable sliding support for the board when unfolded.

In the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 represents the device with the skirt-board A attached to the table-top C, the extreme end of the said skirt-board being supported by a tripod, F, or the said skirt-board may be supported by a leg, G, that can be drawn out

from the table D, while it is secured thereto by the slide H. Either G or F may be used, as occasion may require. The top C is secured to the table D by hinges or butts, Fig. 2.

In Fig. 3 we have the table-top C open, with the skirt-board A folded against the under side of the said top C. This view also shows the closet E constructed in the upper part of the table D, to which the top C forms a cover.

I claim as my invention—

The combination of the table D, having a closet, E, and folding top C, with the folding skirt-board A attached to the top, and the sliding support G H, as and for the purpose set forth.
