## IMPROVEMENT IN POMADE.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 188,286, dated March 13, 1877; application filed May 27, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MACK CULBERTON, of Lake City, in the county of Wabashaw, in the State of Minnesota, have invented a certain compound, called "Toilet Pomade," for cleansing and purifying the scalp and hair of the human head, of which the following is a specification:

The invention consists in compounding together the ingredients in the proportion and in the manner as hereinafter fully set forth.

Take of cocoa or palm soap, one and onehalf pound; salts of tartar, six ounces; glycerine, four ounces; oil lavender, one ounce; and citronella, ten drops. Mix them together, and submit to heat until the mass is reduced to the consistency of paste. When cool it is ready for use.

This pomade, when applied to the hair with water, produces a fine lather, with an agree-

able perfume, and quickly dissolves all extraneous adhering particles to the hair or scalp; can then be removed with the addition of more water as a wash, thus leaving the scalp free from dandruff, and the hair perfectly clean, soft, and pliable; is free from the odor or effects of ammonia, as none is used in preparing this composition; is easily compounded, cheap, and can be kept an indefinite length of time.

Having thus fully stated my invention, what I claim is—

The hair-pomade composed of cocoa or palm soap, salts of tartar, glycerine, oil lavender, and citronella, in the proportions substantially as above described.
