




IMPROVEMENT IN WASH-BOWLS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 189,844, dated April 24, 1877; application filed April 4, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM H. CLOKE, of the city of Rahway, in the county of Union and State of New Jersey, have invented an Improvement in Plumber's Wash-Bowl, which improvement is fully set forth in the following specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings.

The object of my invention is to form an air and water tight joint between the top of the bowl and the slab forming a coping for the same.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure I is a plan view of the bowl. Fig. II is a vertical section of the bowl and slab, on the line a b. Fig. III is a vertical section of the bowl, on the same line, showing the semicircular groove S. S., together with the packing ring T. T in

said groove before it is compressed by foreing it against the under side of the slab K, as shown in Fig. II. By this means a tight and durable joint is formed between the bowl and slab to which it is attached.

The packing may be made of any durable material, and preferably in the form of an elastic tube to insure more perfect contact between it and the solid surfaces.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of the bowl C, having groove S, the packing T, with the slab R.
