


IMPROVEMENT IN CURRY-COMBS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 191,559, dated June 5, 1877; application filed May 12, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, THOMAS D. BENNETT and HORACE B. MOODY, of Harrisonville, in the county of Cass and State of Missouri, have invented a new and Improved Curry-Comb, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawing, Figure 1 represents a top view, and Fig. 2 a side view, of our improved curry-comb.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

This invention relates to an improved currycomb for horses; and consists of rotary combs, and an arc-shaped stationary comb, attached to a suitable handle.

In the drawing, A represents a metallic frame, that is let into a handle, C, and carries at the semicircular front part an arc-shaped stationary comb, a, and back of the same, pivoted to a cross-bar, b, the rotary combs B, with circular teeth and open backs, to let the dust pass through.

The cross bar may be plain or provided with teeth on upper side, to serve as a mane and tail comb. The rotary combs raise the hair and admit the stationary comb to enter with great facility, so as to effectively clean the skin of horses and other animals.

Having thus described our invention, we claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

A curry-comb composed of a supportingframe, with an arc-shaped stationary front comb, and circular rotary combs back of the same, substantially in the manner and for the purpose set forth.
