

IMPROVEMENT IN PITCHERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 191,771, dated June 12, 1877; application filed September 22, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES MOYER, of Trenton, in the county of Mercer and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Connecting Covers to Pitchers, Jugs, or similar vessels, which improvement is fully set forth in the following specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing.

The object of my invention is to connect covers to vessels in a cheap, simple, and effective manner; and it consists in the peculiar construction and arrangement hereinafter more specifically pointed out in the claim.

In the drawing, A denotes a pitcher, jug, or other similar vessel, made of any suitable material, and having its rear top portion perforated in two places, a a, the said perforations being about half an inch apart, and on a line with each other. B denotes the cover, of any suitable material, but preferably of metal, and having two hooks, b b, attached to its under side,

about half an inch from its rear edge. C is a spring, of rubber or metal, which is passed through the perforations a a in such a manner that its two ends may be fastened to the hooks b b, and that its middle part shall bear against the outer surface of the vessel between the perforations.

The rear edge of the cover, the spring, and the hooks b b, bearing upon the rear top edge of the vessel, together form a hinge at once cheap, simple, and effective.

I claim as my invention-

A molasses or other pitcher having a cover secured thereto by an elastic strap passing through perforations in the body of the pitcher and secured to the cover, substantially as specified.
