


IMPROVEMENT IN TOY PISTOLS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 192,890, dated July 10, 1877; application filed June 11, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES BARRY, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Toy Pistol, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a longitudinal section on line x

x in Fig. 2. Fig. 2 is a top view.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

My invention relates to a toy to be used for exploding fulminate-paper; and it consists of a tube having in it a side opening, and an anvil upon which the paper is laid, and a spring-actuated plunger for striking the fulminate-

paper.

In the drawing, A is a tube, having one end stopped and provided with a lateral opening, a, in which is placed an anvil, a'. B is a plunger, having a head, B', which is grooved to receive the elastic rubber band C, which extends along the sides of the tube A and across its end. The plunger B is of sufficient length to extend from the open end of the tube A to the anvil a', and in its side a notch, b, is cut to retain the plunger when it is drawn out.

The manner of using the toy is as follows: The plunger is drawn out until the notch b slips over the end of the tube A. A percussion-wafer or piece of fulminate-paper is placed on the anvil a', and the plunger B is tripped and is carried by the contraction of the rubber band against the fulminate with sufficient force to explode it.

The toy may be made of metal or wood; if of metal, the anvil will not be inserted, as in

the present case.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Pat-

ent-

The combination, with a plunger, B, notched, grooved, headed, and provided with propelling rubber band, of the tube A having closed end, anvil a', and lateral opening a, arranged as and for the purpose specified.
