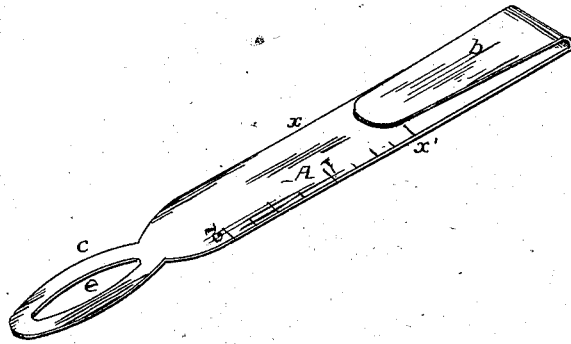

IMPROVEMENT IN BOOK-MARKERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **194,305**, dated August 21, 1877; application filed
July 18, 1877.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, THOMAS P. MARSHALL and S. BROWN MARSHALL, of Trenton, Mercer county, New Jersey, have invented a Combined Implement, of which the following is the specification:

The object of our invention is a combined implement, constructed as fully described hereinafter, to serve as a book-mark, page and paragraph register, paper-folder, paper-cutter, rule and measure, and glove-buttoner.

The implement, as shown in perspective in the drawing, consists of a blade, *A*, of steel or other metal, of nearly uniform width, having a sharp edge, *x*, folded at one end to form a clamping-tongue, *b*, and formed into a pointer, *c*, at the opposite end, one side or edge, *x'*, of the blade being graduated, and marked in inches or fractions thereof. The center of the pointer is cut away, forming an opening, *e*.

The blade, with its sharp edge, serves as a paper folder and cutter, and, being graduated on the side, serves also as a measuring-rule. The tongue *b* clamps it to the leaves of a book, so as to constitute a book-mark and register

of page and paragraphs, designating any desired portion of the page, the open end of the pointer rendering it further available as a glove-fastener.

We claim—

1. As a new article of manufacture, a compound implement consisting of the blade *A*, sharp at the edge *x*, graduated at the opposite edge, having a recessed finger at one end, and folded at the other to form a tongue, *b*, as specified.

2. A compound implement consisting of the plate, its clamping-tongue *b*, and graduated edge, as set forth.

3. The compound implement consisting of the plate, its clamp, and recessed finger, as set forth.
