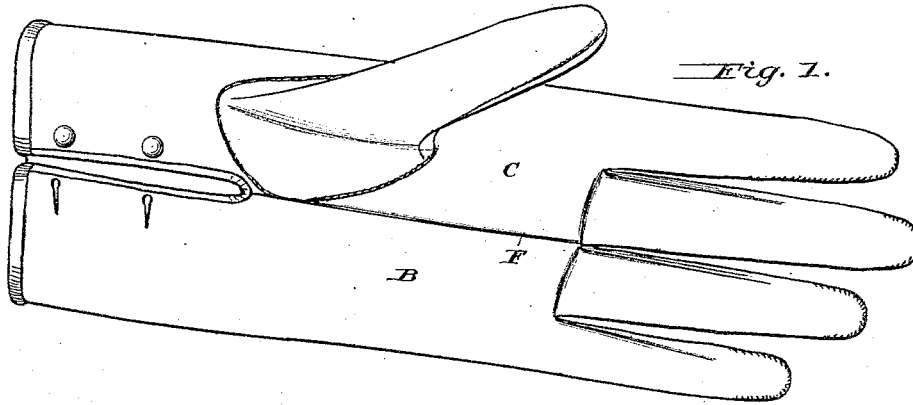

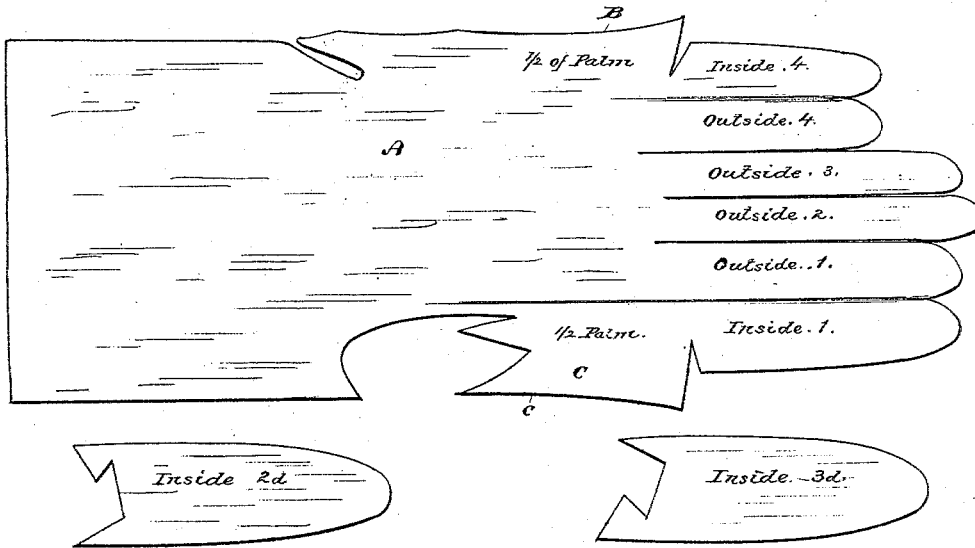

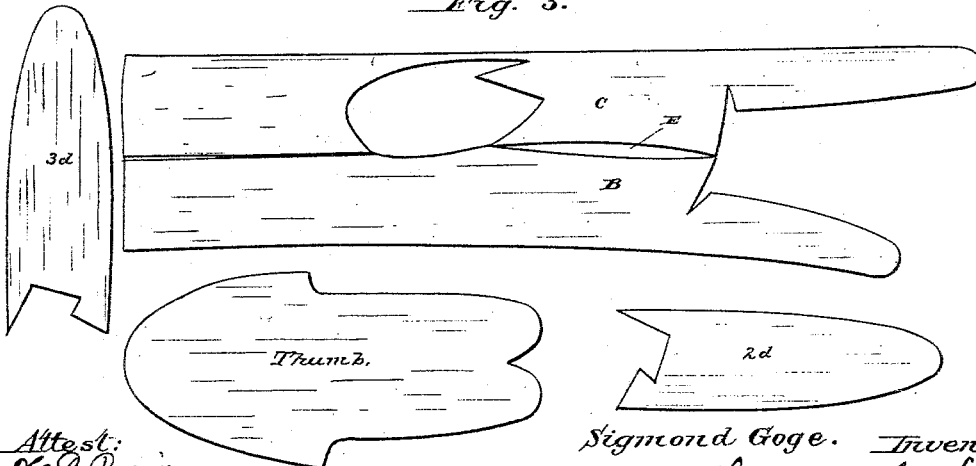

## IMPROVEMENT IN GLOVES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **210,775**, dated December 10, 1878; application filed June 20, 1878.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, SIGMOND GOGÉ, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Gloves; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

This invention relates to certain improvements in gloves; and the invention consists in a glove constructed as will be hereinafter more fully set forth.

In order to enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains to make and use the same, I will now proceed to describe its construction, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms a part of this specification, and in which—

Figure 1 is a view showing the glove complete; and Figs. 2, 3, and 4 are views in detail.

In the manufacture of my glove, I cut a blank, A, forming both sides of the first and fourth fingers, and the outside of the second and third fingers, the part B forming one half of the palm, and the part C forming the other half, as shown in Fig. 2 of drawing.

The edges of the parts B and C of the palm are curved inwardly, so as to form a double convex-shaped slot, E, as shown in Fig. 3 of drawing.

By this construction, when the seam F is formed, the palm decreases in size from where the fingers are joined to the middle of the palm, then increases in size upwardly to conform to the shape of the hand. The inside of the second and third fingers and the thumb are secured in place in a manner understood by any glove-manufacturer.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

A blank for forming gloves, having the edges of the parts B and C of the palm concaved in order to make the glove conform to the hand, as set forth.
