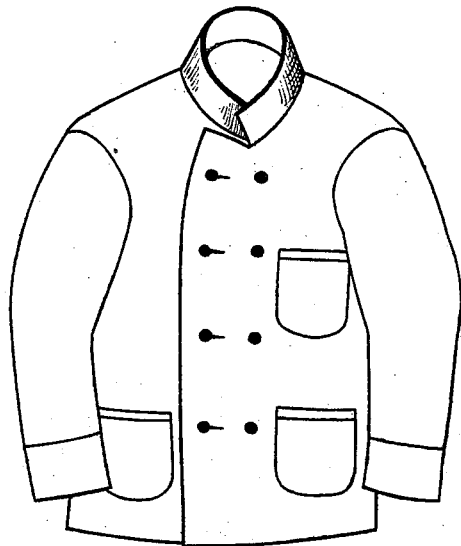

## IMPROVEMENT IN REVERSIBLE COATS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **212,479**, dated February 18, 1879; application filed August 27, 1878.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, NICOLAY H. LUND, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a certain new Article of Manufacture; and I do hereby declare the following to be a description of the same, and of the manner of making and using it, in such full, clear, concise, and exact terms as to enable any person skilled in the art to which it appertains or with which it is most nearly connected to make and use the same.

My invention consists of a reversible coat composed of woven fabric and sheep-skin dressed in imitation of goat-skin.

The accompanying drawing shows my invention as applied to a coat, the same being reversible, and constructed in the manner and of the material hereinafter specified.

The coat is really two coats united in one, with a double face. The one face is made of cloth, and has all the completeness and finish of the outside of a cloth coat. The other face is made of sheep-skin tanned and dressed in imitation of goat-skin, and has all the completeness and finish of the cloth face, or all the

completeness and finish the outside of a coat can have made of skin.

There is nothing new in the style or cut of the coat, as the invention is not limited to the style or form of the coat, but extends to any kind of a coat, pants, or vest having two finished sides or faces, the one composed of cloth woven or felted, and the other composed of sheep-skin tanned and dressed in imitation of goat-skin.

I am aware that reversible coats have been made of cloth and skins, and I therefore lay no claim to such an invention, broadly; but

What I claim as my invention is—

As a new article of manufacture, a reversible coat having two finished sides or layers, one of which is of cloth, and the other of sheep-skin or other animal skin except goat, finished in imitation of genuine goat or kid skin, as set forth.
