DESIGN FOR AQUARIUMS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **8,060**, dated February 16, 1875; application filed January 18, 1875.

CASE C.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH W. FISKE, of New York, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain Improvements in Design for Aquarium, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my invention is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made. It consists of a round base supporting a column ornamented by a representation of plants and cranes, on which is mounted on octagonal vessel, the bottom of which is composed of an ornamental bowl, the sides being of glass held

in a frame composed of uprights, connected at their top by a top rail, as represented. From the center of the vessel a small ornamental column or tube, which supports a small basin or bowl near its top, and terminates in a tip through which water may be forced to produce a jet or spray.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for an aquarium, substantially as herein shown and described.
